BAYLOR OPENS 2008-09 SEASON

The 19th-ranked Baylor Lady Bears open their 2008-09 season facing two opponents within a three-day span, hosting Florida Atlantic and second-ranked Stanford on Friday, Nov. 14 and Sunday, Nov. 16, respectively.

The matchup against the Florida Atlantic Owls will be the season opener for both squads and will be the first meeting between the two schools. The Owls, under the direction of Chancellor Dugan, return five starters off last season's 6-22 squad.

The Stanford Cardinal, led by head coach Tara VanDerveer, return four starters off last season's NCAA Tournament runner-up squad which finished the year at 35-4. Stanford hosts Minnesota in its season opener on Friday, Nov. 14, prior to traveling to Waco.

FORMER LADY BEAR SOPHIA YOUNG TO BE HONORED SUNDAY

Former Lady Bear Sophia Young will have her jersey retired by the women's basketball program at halftime of Sunday's game against Stanford. Young, the Lady Bear program's most highly decorated player, a two-time consensus All-American, was the fourth player selected in the 2006 WNBA draft. She is a two-time WNBA All-Star and was recently named first-team All-WNBA.

HEAD COACH KIM MULKEY

When Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Kim Mulkey accepted the position of women's basketball head coach at Baylor University, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious turn the program was about to take. In just eight years at Baylor, the former All-American and Olympic Gold medalist has guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, the 2005 NCAA national championship, seven NCAA Tournament appearances and eight 20-win seasons.

The 2005 national title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport and the first basketball national title, men's or women's, in the Big 12 Conference's 12-year history.

In winning the 2005 title, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

En route to the NCAA championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and were the league's tournament champion as well.

Mulkey has produced amazing results since taking over the reins of the program on April 4, 2000, averaging 26.1 wins a season. In her eight years at the program's helm, she has posted an impressive 208-60 (.776) record which ranks her No. 8 nationally in winning percentage.

Since taking over a squad that was just 7-20 the season prior to her arrival, Mulkey has guided the Lady Bears to eight postseason appearances, including seven NCAA Tournaments and a trip to the WNIT finals.

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down", hit bookstores on Nov. 1, 2007, the paperback edition became available on Sept. 8, 2008.

BAYLOR IN SEASON OPENERS

The Lady Bears are 27-7 in season openers, including a 14-1 record at home. Under head coach Kim Mulkey, Baylor is 7-1 in season openers including a 4-0 mark in the Ferrell Center:

PRESEASON HONORS

Seniors Rachel Allison and Jessica Morrow were named All-Big 12 preseason honorable mention from the league's coaches.

HALL OF FAME COACHES

With the addition of Leon Barmore to the Lady Bear coaching staff, Baylor becomes one of just three women's programs, joining Tennessee and Rutgers, with at least two Women's Basketball Hall of Fame members on its 2008-09 staff. Head coach Kim Mulkey was enshrined in 2000, while Barmore entered the Hall in 2003. In addition, Barmore was a 2003 inductee into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

MULKEY VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

With Baylor's loss to 20th-ranked Oklahoma State on March 6, 2008, head coach Kim Mulkey is now 39-41 against ranked opponents.

Since a 69-55 loss to No. 15 Texas A&M during the 2004-05 season, Baylor is 24-17 versus ranked opponents.

HOME SWEET HOME

In Kim Mulkey's eight seasons along the Ferrell Center sidelines, her teams have posted some impressive numbers in the venue. The Lady Bears have maintained a 115-15 (.885) Ferrell Center record during that time span. Mulkey's first three seasons produced a 44-8 (.849) Ferrell Center mark while over the past five years the Lady Bears are 71-7 (.910).

The Lady Bears were 17-1 at home in 2007-08 and have won 58 of their last 63 home games.

SERIES RECORDS

Friday's contest marks the first meeting between the Lady Bears and the Florida Atlantic Owls. In games against Sun Belt Conference opponents, Baylor holds a 27-17 lead.

Sunday's contest marks the Lady Bears' third meeting with the Stanford Cardinal. The series is tied 1-1 with Baylor winning, 63-59, on Dec. 2, 1983, in Las Vegas and the Cardinal posting an 87-63 victory last season at Stanford. The Lady Bears are 15-9 against Pacific-10 opponents and will match up twice more this season against the conference with road games at Oregon (Dec. 20) and California (Dec. 22).

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

Florida Atlantic - The matchup against the Florida Atlantic Owls will be the season opener for both squads and the first meeting between the two schools. The Owls, under the direction of Chancellor Dugan, return five starters off last season's 6-22 squad. Leading the Owls are junior guard Carla Stubbs who averaged 12.6 points an outing last season and sophomore forward Jaimie Given's 11.1 points per game.

Stanford - The second-ranked Stanford Cardinal, led by head coach Tara VanDerveer, return four starters from last season's NCAA Tournament runner-up squad which finished the year at 35-4. Stanford hosts Minnesota in its season opener on Friday, Nov. 14, prior to traveling to Waco.

Jayne Appel (junior, 6-3, forward/center) and Kayla Pederson (sophomore, 6-4, forward) averaged 15.0 and 12.6 points, respectively for the Cardinal in 2007-08. In addition, they were the squad's top rebounders with Appel averaging 8.8 a game and Pedersen hauling in 8.4 an outing.

THE COACHES

Florida Atlantic's Chancellor Dugan begins her 10th season at the Owl helm and 18th season overall as a head coach. She is 111-151 at Florida Atlantic and owns a career mark of 270-224.

The 2008-09 season marks Tara VanDerveer's 23rd season at Stanford and 30th overall. She is 572-137 with the Cardinal and 724-188 all time.

ACROSS THE NATION

The Lady Bear roster consists of 12 players from seven states, ranging from coast-to-coast, and four from the state of Texas.

Danielle Wilson hails from New York while Morghan Medlock and Cherrish Wallace call California home. Arkansas boasts Rachel Allison while Melissa Jones is from Colorado, Terran Condrey is from Alabama and Lindsay Palmer hails from Oklahoma. Ashley Field, Kelli Griffin, Jessica Morrow and Jhasmin Player are all from Texas.

LAST TIME OUT

In its final tune-up game before regular season action, six Baylor players scored in double figures to lead the Lady Bears past the Dallas Diesel, 94-63, on Nov. 7.

Sophomore Melissa Jones posted a double-double, tallying a game-high 16 points and 11 rebounds.

Junior Danielle Wilson neared a double-double with 14 points and 8 boards, while junior Morghan Medlock tallied 14 points. Senior Jhasmin Player and freshman Ashley Field added 12 points each, along with senior Rachel Allison's 10 points.

Behind 48.6 percent shooting, the Lady Bears took a commanding 42-20 lead going into the half.

Dallas' Devena Fogarty had the hot hand, scoring nine of the Diesel's 20 points in the first half, eight of which happened in the first 11 minutes. Fogarty finished with a team-high 17 points.

Baylor shot 55.7 percent (39-of-70) for the game and held Dallas to 35.4 percent (23-of-65). The Lady Bears scored 37 points off of 28 Dallas turnovers, while recording 11 steals.

The Lady Bears eclipsed the 50-rebound mark for the second consecutive exhibition game. Baylor also dominated down low with 60 points in the paint.

EXHIBITION STATISTICS

In Baylor's exhibition victories, a 123-70 win over the Houston Jaguars and a 94-63 triumph over the Dallas Diesel, six Lady Bears delivered double-digit scoring averages.

Danielle Wilson averaged 18.0 points while Morghan Medlock scored 14.5, Melissa Jones and Ashley Field each averaged 13.0, Rachel Allison managed 12.0 and Lindsay Palmer and

Jhasmin Player scored 10.0 apiece.

Jones was the only player to average a double-double with 13.0 points and 10.0 rebounds an outing.

FUTURE LADY BEARS

The Lady Bear basketball program signed five players to National Letters of Intent (NLI) on Wednesday, Nov. 12. Inking with Baylor in the early signing period were guards Shanay Washington (Austin, Texas), Jordan Madden (Lepanto, Ark.) and Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden (Dallas, Texas), forward Mariah Chandler (Atlanta, Ga.) and post Brittney Griner (Houston, Texas).

The quintet is definitely the program's top-ranked recruiting class and will contend for the nation's top recruiting class. All of the signees are ranked among the top 60 nationally.

Mariah Chandler - 6-2, Forward, Atlanta, Ga. (Southwest Atlanta Christian)

Chandler is a left-hander who can play both inside and outside and runs the floor well. The 6-2 forward sat out the 2007-08 season rehabilitating a knee injury (ACL) but averaged 16.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 4.0 steals per game as a sophomore. Despite not playing last season, Chandler ranks No. 16 by both ESPNU's HoopGurlz and Allstar Girls Report and No. 29 by the Collegiate Girls Report. Prior to her injury, Chandler had been ranked among the nation's top 10 on every ranking list.

Brittney Griner - 6-8, Post, Houston, Texas (Nimitz, HS)

Griner, at 6-8, is the nation's most dominating prep player and ranks No. 1 by virtually every major national rating service. The athletic post can elevate at the rim and dunk with ease, create off the dribble, post up, and, with her 86-inch wingspan, be an intimidator on defense. Griner averaged 24.6 points, 12.3 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and shot 64 percent from the field as a junior. She recorded four triple doubles and 30 double-doubles as a junior. In the first game of her senior year (Tuesday, Nov. 11) Griner scored 21 points, blocked 25 shots and hauled down 13 rebounds against Alief Hastings HS.

Kimetria "Nae-Nae" Hayden - 5-11, Guard, Dallas, Texas (Lincoln HS)

Hayden, a versatile athlete who can score from the paint or perimeter, averaged 17.9 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while leading Dallas' Lincoln HS to the 2008 Class 4A state title. Hayden was named the 2008 *Dallas Morning News'* Girls Player of the Year and was tabbed the Class 4A state tournament's Most Valuable Player. She is ranked No. 56 by Collegiate Girls Report.
