2007 YEAR IN REVIEW

The 2007 season will be remembered for a great start and outstanding individual achievements, as the Bears began the season undefeated in their first five games. Along the way, Megan Sherrell had a season for the record books and Ashley Noah became the school's all-time leader in saves with 440.

For the first time since the 2002 season, Baylor outscored its opponents with a 38-36 advantage. Unfortunately, the Big 12 Conference would be its undoing, as the Bears dropped four one-goal games in conference play.

Noah was once again stellar in net, and was named to the All-Big 12 second team, the second all-conference honor of her career. In addition to being the all-time leader in saves, Noah almost moved into second all-time in minutes played (6,297), shutouts (eight) and wins (24). Sherrell also came on for a great senior campaign, scoring nine goals and tallying seven assists for a 25-point season.

Baylor opened the 2007 season with a shutout win over UL-Lafayette, as senior Pat Roscovius and sophomore Beckah Brady buried the two first half goals sending the Bears off on the right foot.

The squad kept the shutout streak alive with a 4-0 win that saw goals from junior Amanda McGrath, freshmen Lindsey Johnson and Lotto Smith and senior Jessica Hutton. A tie against UTSA followed as Sherrell scored in the 85th minute to preserve the undefeated mark for Baylor.

The Bears then headed to Jacksonville, Fla., for the Kick Out Cancer Tournament, and routed host Jacksonville, 6-2 in the opener. Junior Carolyn Lynch scored a pair of goals to lead the way for BU. The unbeaten streak ran to five after Baylor disposed of Stetson, 3-1 behind back-to-back goals by Brady and three assists by Sherrell, pushing the team's mark to 4-0-1.

Sherrell would earn a pair of honors for her performance as the midfielder was named Big 12 Conference Offensive Player of the Week in addition to being named to the SoccerBuzz.com National Team of the Week after scoring two goals and six assists over the three-game span. She became the first Baylor player to earn conference offensive honors since Anna Schuch was named player of the week in September 2005.

The following week, the Bears out to the west coast for a pair of games, but came back with more than just two losses, as McGrath was lost for the season with a knee injury. At that time, she was second on the team in points with two goals and four assists.

Baylor bounced back the following week with a 4-0 home win over Iona, thanks to two goals and an assist by Sherrell. The Bears capped off the non-conference season with a 2-1 overtime thriller over Delaware, as Hutton scored the game-winner in the 101st minute of play.

Conference play began at home, as Baylor played in its second-straight overtime game, tying Kansas 2-2. Missouri came to town two days later, defeating the Bears, 4-2 for its first conference loss.

A string of defeats followed to Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Colorado and Texas, with three of those matches being decided by one goal.

The Bears showed heart and determination with a 4-1 blasting of Nebraska in Lincoln. Sherrell posted a hat trick for Baylor, as the squad picked up its first conference win and evened its overall record to 7-7-2.

After a loss to Iowa State, the Bears returned home for Senior Night, but were stunned by Texas Tech after the Red Raiders scored two goals in the final seven minutes for the 2-1 win. Baylor closed out the season in College Station with a loss to Texas A&M.

Twelve members of the Baylor soccer team were named to the Academic All-Big 12 team, including 10 on the first team and two on the second team. The Bears' 12 student-athletes were the second-most by any school and a new program record.

Beckah Brady, Megan Humke, Jessica Hutton, Betsy Kyle, Pat Roscovius, Megan Sherrell, Nicky Smith, Lauren Weathers, Katie White and Shea Yates earned first-team honors, while Andrea Fagan and Nikki Watson were named to the second team.

Seniors Hutton (accounting), Roscovius (general studies) and Sherrell (sociology/history) picked up their third consecutive academic all-conference honor.
