

When head coach Glenn Moore was preparing for the 2007 season, he had a slogan: 'It's Time.' It was time for the Baylor softball program to take the next step... And did they ever! The 2007 Lady Bears pieced together the greatest season in program history, as the 2007 team became the first to hoist a Big 12 regular-season championship and earn a berth in the Women's College World Series. Baylor ended the year ranked fifth, tying its highest ever ranking, after finishing with a 51-16 record and announcing to the rest of the country that Baylor softball was here.

Baylor began the season ranked No. 18 as it hosted the Gettnerman Classic. The Lady Bears started hot, beginning with an 18 run performance against Southern Miss that featured four home runs and a no-hitter by senior Lisa Ferguson. In the tournament's six games, Baylor outscored its opponents, 52-8, and won its home tournament for the fourth time in the event's six-year history.

The Lady Bears continued their solid play as they headed to Lafayette, La., for the Ragin' Cajun Invitational. After wins over Ole Miss, Purdue and Iowa State, Baylor dropped its first contest of the year, losing to 13th-ranked Louisiana Lafayette. Baylor picked up another win over Ole Miss and advanced to the championship game for a rematch against the host school. But the Lady Bears could not avenge the loss and finished the tournament with a 4-2 record.

Baylor got back on track with a pair of wins over Houston in a mid-week doubleheader before heading

back to the southeast for the NFCA Leadoff Classic in Columbus, Ga. The Lady Bears got off to a bad start with a loss to Georgia Tech, but bounced back with wins over No. 24 UMass, DePaul and No. 19 Florida before a surprising loss to Illinois State to end the tournament.

The team regrouped and was back on the field just two days later to take on Stephen F. Austin. Baylor won the doubleheader and kept on rolling with a three game sweep over Louisiana Tech and two more wins over Sam Houston State.

Riding a wave of momentum and a seven-game win streak, the 14th ranked Lady Bears hosted No. 2 Arizona in the Compass Bank Challenge. After dropping the opening game, Baylor took game two after junior Alex Colyer blasted a home run in the bottom of the sixth for a 3-2 win. The deciding game three proved to be just as exciting as the game came down to the final inning. Tied at two in the bottom of the seventh, senior Chelsi Lake delivered a two-out single for the game and series winning RBI.

A trip to Honolulu followed the emotional weekend and the 10th-ranked Lady Bears dropped the opening game of the Hawai'i Invitational to No. 25 Cal before defeating host Hawai'i. Losses to Nevada and Liberty followed before the squad avenged its loss to Cal, but fell to Hawai'i to end the pre-conference tournament season.

Baylor returned from the islands and took care of Oklahoma Baptist with a pair of 6-1 victories as it prepared to open conference play against Nebraska.

With the team coming together, the Lady Bears began their run at history with a pair of wins over the Huskers. Baylor followed with two wins apiece over Texas-San Antonio and at Kansas before taking a pivotal road win at fourth-ranked Texas A&M.

The team continued its swing of five straight road games with a win over Texas Tech (game two was canceled due to weather) and ended with a great 6-0 win at No. 11 Texas.

Ranked ninth in the country, the Lady Bears returned to the friendly confines of Gettnerman Stadium for a series against Oklahoma State. Baylor kept its undefeated conference record going with a pair of wins to move to 9-0 in league play and 39-9 overall.

The streak was snapped at No. 4 Oklahoma as Baylor dropped a pair of games in Norman. The Lady Bears rebounded with wins over Iowa State and Texas State before splitting a home series with Missouri. A home win over Texas gave Baylor the season series and set up one of the biggest games in Gettnerman Stadium history to date. With a Big 12 title on the line for Baylor, the Lady Bears defeated Texas A&M and took the outright crown.

Fifth-ranked Baylor headed to the conference tournament as the No. 1 seed, but was upset in the first round by Texas Tech who went one to play for the tournament title. Despite the loss, the Lady Bears were awarded the No. 8 overall seed and sent to Hempstead, N.Y., for the NCAA Regional.

Baylor breezed through the Regional, outscoring its opponents 25-4 and set up a showdown back in Waco against 10th ranked Michigan.

No. 7 Baylor was ready for the challenge, coming out of the gate swinging with a five inning, 9-0 win over the Wolverines in game one behind a five RBI, two home run game for senior Ashley Monceaux. Michigan answered in game two, defeating Baylor, 3-0 to set up the deciding game three. Playing in front of a sellout crowd, the Lady Bears scored four runs in the first two innings and rode the arm of Ferguson the rest of the way. A pop up to Monceaux for the final out sent the stadium into a frenzy and the Lady Bears to Oklahoma City for their first WCWS appearance.

Baylor arrived at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium ready to show the nation what Lady Bear softball was all about. The squad found a familiar foe in Arizona for the opening game, and the two teams played a classic. Despite a great pitching performance from Ferguson, Baylor dropped its first game in eight innings, 2-1.

After a day to regroup, the Lady Bears took on Texas A&M for the right to stay alive in the WCWS. With a 2-1 lead, freshman Courtney Oberg delivered a three-run blast to give Baylor the lead as Baylor beat the Aggies for the third time in 2007 and kept its National Championship hopes alive.

Later that evening, Baylor took on Northwestern, but the magic ended. The Lady Bears fell behind early and couldn't crawl out of the hole.

Despite the loss, Baylor had shown the nation that its time had come and that Lady Bear softball had arrived. With a season full of firsts, the 2007 squad produced the most memorable year to date and set the bar for future teams to follow.

"Our team had lofty goals and reached them," said Moore. "Now, they'll pass the bat to next year's team and hopefully they'll go a few games deeper in the World Series. But there's no doubt this team set the standard here."
