## UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION

**KEN STARR**

**UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT**  
GEORGE WASHINGTON, 1968

On June 1, 2010, **Kenneth Winston Starr, J.D.**, became Baylor University's 14th president. Judge Starr was elected unanimously by the Baylor Board of Regents on Feb. 12, 2010, following a search process that included representatives from all parts of the Baylor family.

Starr has had a distinguished career in academia, the law and public service. Prior to coming to Baylor, he served for six years as the Duane and Kelly Roberts Dean and Professor of Law at Pepperdine, where he taught current constitutional issues and civil procedure. He also is of counsel to the law firm of Kirkland & Ellis LLP, where he was a partner from 1993 to 2004, specializing in appellate work, antitrust, federal courts, federal jurisdiction and constitutional law.

As Solicitor General of the United States from 1989 to 1993, Starr argued 36 cases before the U.S. Supreme Court. He also served as United States Circuit Judge for the District of Columbia Circuit from 1983 to 1989, as law clerk to Chief Justice Warren E. Burger from 1975 to 1977 and as law clerk to Fifth Circuit Judge David W. Dyer from 1973 to 1974. Starr was appointed to serve as Independent Counsel for five investigations, including Whitewater, from 1994 to 1999.

Starr previously taught constitutional law as an adjunct professor at New York University School of Law and was a distinguished visiting professor at George Mason University School of Law and Chapman Law School. After graduating from San Antonio's Sam Houston High School, he earned his B.A. from George Washington University in 1968, his M.A. from Brown University in 1969 and his J.D. degree from Duke University Law School in 1973. He is admitted to practice in California, the District of Columbia, Virginia and the U.S. Supreme Court.

He is the author of more than 25 publications, and his book, *First Among Equals: The Supreme Court in American Life*, published in 2002, was praised by U.S. Circuit Judge David B. Sentelle as "eminently readable and informative...not just the best treatment to-date of the Court after (Chief Justice Earl) Warren, it is likely to have that distinction for a long, long time."

He has received a multitude of honors and awards, including the J. Reuben Clark Law Society 2005 Distinguished Service Award, the 2004 Capital Book Award, the Jefferson Cup award from the FBI, the Edmund Randolph Award for Outstanding Service in the Department of Justice and the Attorney General's Award for Distinguished Service.

Starr was born on July 21, 1946, in Vernon, Texas, and was raised in San Antonio. He and his wife Alice have three children and four grandchildren. The Starrs made their home in Malibu, Calif., from 2004 to 2010, and lived in McLean, Va., from 1978 to 2004. He has volunteered many hours teaching in the inner city and assisting disadvantaged students with summer internships, after-school programs and guidance for financing a college education.

**MICHAEL ROGERS**

**FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE**  
TEXAS TECH, 1972

Professor **Michael Rogers** has served as Baylor's Faculty Representative to the Big 12 Conference and the NCAA since 2002 and has been a member of the Baylor Law faculty since 1984.

Rogers earned a bachelor of business administration degree and graduated with honors in 1972 from Texas Tech University, where he was a member of the Beta Gamma Sigma and Phi Kappa Phi honor societies and a varsity scholarship basketball player. He received his J.D. degree from the University of Oklahoma in 1974, where he was an editor of the *Oklahoma Law Review* and was admitted to membership in the Order of the Coif.

Rogers was in private practice from 1975 to 1984, during which time he was a founding partner of Gaar & Bell (now Gilmore & Bell), a securities transactions law firm with offices in Kansas and Missouri. He is admitted to practice law in Oklahoma, Kansas and Texas.

During his private practice work, Rogers served as lead counsel in dozens of private securities transactions and over 100 public offerings of tax-advantaged securities. While teaching Securities Regulation at Baylor, he has served as consulting counsel in numerous securities lawsuits. In 1984 he joined the Baylor Law faculty, where his subjects include family law, securities regulation and alternative dispute resolution.

Rogers is an experienced mediator and serves on the panel of mediators for the United States District Court Western District of Texas. He continues to serve as a director (Board Chairman, 2000-2001) of the McLennan County Dispute Resolution Center and on the panel of mediators for the United States District Court, Western District of Texas. Rogers formerly served on the panel of arbitrators for the American Arbitration Association.

For more than a decade, Professor Rogers has served as chair of Baylor's Professional Sports Counseling Panel. In that capacity, he has rendered advice to numerous future professional athletes, including Olympic gold medalist Michael Johnson and Super Bowl champion Santana Dotson.

Rogers is the son of the late Bob J. Rogers, who served as head basketball coach at Texas A&M University from 1957 to 1963.

## DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



### IAN McCAW

**DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**

LAURENTIAN, 1985

**Ian McCaw** was named Director of Athletics of Baylor's 19-sport, Big 12 intercollegiate athletics program Sept. 8, 2003. Under McCaw's leadership, the department has achieved extraordinary athletics, academic and administrative success.

Since 2003, Baylor has enjoyed the most competitively successful period in the history of its intercollegiate athletics program. During that time, Baylor has captured two NCAA team championships and 33 Big 12 conference championships. In McCaw's tenure at Baylor, only the University of Texas and Texas A&M have won more conference titles.

This period also includes Baylor's five highest finishes in the NACDA Directors' Cup standings highlighted by its best finish ever in 2004-05 with a ranking of 25th. A school-record 14 teams advanced to post-season competition in 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2010-11.

Baylor played in its first bowl game since 1994 when it advanced to the Texas Bowl in 2010. McCaw was named 2010 *Waco Tribune Herald* Central Texas Sportsman of the Year. Student-athletes have thrived in the classroom as Baylor led the Big 12 in graduation success rate for three consecutive years and student-athletes recorded their highest cumulative grade point average on record during 2010-11 at 3.10.

While Baylor Athletics enjoyed extraordinary academic and athletic success, the department has made dramatic strides administratively as well.

A five-year strategic plan for intercollegiate athletics, *Above and Beyond*, was developed and implemented inclusive of department goals and objectives. An outgrowth of this plan was the creation and successful completion of the five-year, \$95 million development campaign *Victory with Integrity*. Increased athletics development activity has led to the funding and completion of the Highers Athletics Complex including the Simpson Athletics and Academic Center and Allison Indoor Football Practice Facility; the Grant Teaff and Letterwinners Plazas at Floyd Casey Stadium; the Lt. Jack Whetsel Jr. Basketball Practice Facility; the Willis Family Equestrian Center; Getterman Softball Practice Facility; and, numerous other physical improvements. Since McCaw's arrival, the athletics endowment has grown from \$14 million to more than \$24 million. In each of the last seven years, the Baylor Bear Foundation has posted a new record for annual funds raised highlighted by its best year ever in 2010-11 when more than \$7.6 million was raised.

McCaw is Baylor's 12th athletic director and arrived from the University of Massachusetts, where he spent the previous year as director of athletics. McCaw was responsible for a 23-sport program and helped develop and implement a five-year strategic plan and secure funding for basketball locker room renovations.

McCaw previously served as director of intercollegiate athletics and campus recreation at Northeastern University from 1997-2002. During his five years at Northeastern, where he implemented a five-year strategic plan for Northeastern athletics inclusive of department goals and objectives. Northeastern graduated 65 percent of its student-athletes during McCaw's final

year at the Boston institution, 14 points higher than the institutional average. Husky student-athletes also gave back to the community, as each team was required to participate in at least one community service project annually. The success of the Northeastern athletic program on McCaw's watch extended beyond the classroom, as the program captured a school-record six America East conference titles in 2001-2002, and five teams finished among the nation's top 20.

McCaw went to Northeastern from Tulane University, where he served as senior associate athletic director for development and associate athletic director for external affairs from 1992-1997, being named Tulane's co-interim director of athletics in 1996. Prior to his years at Tulane, McCaw worked in a variety of athletic administrative posts at the University of Maine from 1986 to 1992 including sports information, marketing and external affairs.

Recognized as a national leader in intercollegiate athletics, McCaw serves as chair of the NCAA Recruiting and Personnel Cabinet. He is a member of the Big 12 television and game management and officiating committees, and Division I-A Athletics Directors Executive Committee. He previously served on the National Association of Collegiate Director's of Athletics Executive Committee.

McCaw earned his master's degree in sport management from Massachusetts in 1987, after receiving a bachelor's degree in sports administration at Laurentian University in Sudbury, Ontario, in 1985. In his nine seasons leading the Baylor women's tennis program, head coach Joey Scrivano has put his Lady Bears among the best in the nation, along with being the top program in the Big 12 Conference nearly every season. Scrivano has led BU to eight Big 12 regular-season titles, a current string of six consecutive Big 12 tournament titles, and seven consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, reaching the NCAA Final Four in 2008 and 2011.

Scrivano has compiled an astounding 92-7 mark in the Big 12, along with a 218-56 mark overall as the leader of the program. In his time at BU, he has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year three times (2006, 2008, 2009) and the ITA Regional Coach of the Year three times (2006, 2008, 2010). Scrivano's squad has dominated the Big 12 during his tenure, especially over the past three seasons, where they have a 75-2 record, including 43-match regular-season Big 12 win streak and a 57-match overall win streak over conference opponents.

Individually, Baylor has had an enormous amount of success under Scrivano. In 2005, Zuzana Zemenova became the first unseeded player in NCAA history to win the NCAA singles title. Zemenova, a five-time NCAA All-American, also earned her way back to the singles title match in 2008. Most recently, Scrivano coached standout Lenka Broosova to BU career records for singles and doubles victories over her four years at Baylor. Scrivano has coached his student-athletes to 19 All-America honors in his tenure, including Broosova's six and Zemenova's five honors.

The 2011 season was the most recent one in a historic string of success for the women's tennis program. Scrivano led the Lady Bears to their second NCAA Final Four appearance in the last four seasons and finished the year with a 29-4 record, including Big 12 regular season and Big 12 tournament championships. Baylor ended the season ranked No. 6, marking the fourth consecutive season ending the year in the top six.

In 2010, Scrivano's team completed their third consecutive undefeated 11-0 Big 12 regular season, then went on to win their fifth consecutive Big 12 Tournament championship. Baylor, who achieved the program's first No. 1 ranking, entered the NCAA Team Championship as the top overall seed, but fell to eventual champion Stanford 4-2 in the quarterfinal round. Baylor held the nation's No. 1 ranking five weeks during the season.

The Lady Bears were represented in the NCAA Singles Championship by Broosova, who finished in the Round of 16, and Nina Secerbegovic, who earned a spot in the quarterfinals and ended the season with a team-best 43 singles victories. Secerbegovic and Broosova were each named All-Americans for their performance, while Broosova teamed with Csilla Borsanyi in the doubles tournament to earn All-America honors, reaching the quarterfinal round as well.

Scrivano kept the Bears at the top of the Big 12 and on the brink of a second Final Four appearance in 2009. After winning his fifth consecutive Big 12 regular season title and fifth consecutive Big 12 Tournament title, Scrivano led the Bears to the Elite Eight before losing, 4-3 to fifth-seeded Notre Dame, ending the season ranked sixth nationally. In addition, Scrivano's doubles tandem of Broosova and Borsanyi made a spectacular run to the Final Four in NCAA Doubles action.

2008 was a banner year for the Lady Bears: 32-3 dual match record, 11-0 in Big 12 regular season play, midseason ranking of No. 2 in the nation (program high) and finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally.

Scrivano coached his 2007 Bears to their third consecutive Big 12 regular-season title. Scrivano's squad finished the season with a 24-7 record, capturing the Big 12 Tournament championship for the second straight season and advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 for the third time in as many years.

In 2006-07, Baylor saw a 25-match Big 12 regular season win streak come to an end, but the Bears quickly put the loss behind them, finishing the season with a 10-1 conference mark. In the Big 12 Tournament, held in Kansas City, Mo., Baylor marched past Nebraska (4-0) and No. 71 Oklahoma State (4-0) before facing No. 37 Texas in the championship match for the third consecutive season. The Bears out-lasted the Longhorns in a highly contested battle, earning a 4-3 victory and the tournament championship.

Baylor hosted a regional and quickly advanced to the NCAA Championship, defeating Oral Roberts (4-0) and No. 26 Texas A&M (4-1) to earn a spot in the Round of 16. For a third straight season the Bears were pitted against a top-five Florida squad that ended Baylor's season with a 4-2 victory; the Florida loss marked the third consecutive season that the Gators ended Baylor's tournament run. At season's end, the Bears earned a No. 13 ranking.

Scrivano has also had several successful individuals since coming to Baylor. In 2007, Zemenova earned her third consecutive Big 12 Player of the Year award and earned the Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award, an honor not bestowed upon a Baylor athlete since 1997. Along with Zemenova's storied success, first-year member Broosova made her mark, winning the Big 12 No. 3 singles title and earning Southwest Region Rookie of the Year honors.

In 2005-06, the Bears claimed their third Big 12 regular-season title, going undefeated (11-0) for the second-straight year, and also tallied their first-ever Big 12 postseason championship after defeating Texas in the finals. At the NCAA Tournament, Baylor soared through the first three rounds before falling to No. 4 Florida. Baylor's advancement to the quarterfinals became a first in program history.

Along with an undefeated Big 12 campaign, 2006-07 saw the netters earn a then-program-best 28-4 record. The team also received its highest ever Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) final ranking, ending the season at No. 6 in the nation.

Under Scrivano's guidance, the 2005 Bears posted a 24-6 mark and ended the year ranked No. 14 in the ITA poll. The Bears produced the program's first perfect Big 12 record, breezing through league play with an 11-0 mark. In addition, freshman sensation Zemenova claimed the NCAA singles championship becoming the first unseeded NCAA champion and en route, became the program's first singles All-American. Zemenova also was named women's tennis Honda Broderick Award winner.

By guiding the Bears to six conference championships in seven seasons, Scrivano is nine-for-10 when it comes to conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances. After leading the University of South Alabama women's tennis team to three-straight conference championships and a like number of NCAA Tournament berths in his first three years as a head coach, Scrivano, in his first year at the helm of Baylor's women's program, accomplished the same feat. In fact, he guided the Bears to their first-ever Big 12 championship in women's tennis.

Scrivano, who was hired in July of 2002 as Baylor's associate director of intercollegiate tennis and head women's tennis coach, inherited a team that had placed fourth in the Big 12 the previous season, was bypassed for the NCAA Tournament, graduated an All-American, lost the Big 12 Freshman of the Year and returned only three position players. Scrivano was able to bring in players to bolster the roster and dramatically improved the players who returned. The result, a 9-2 Big 12 record and a conference championship. The fact that the Bears did so well was impressive given the fact that they had only one player ranked among the top 100 in singles all season and no doubles tandem ranked at all.

Scrivano knew about Baylor and its tennis facilities prior to taking the job. He got a look at the BU tennis program and facilities during the 2002 season when he brought his then-40th ranked South Alabama team to the Baylor Tennis Center and promptly handed Baylor's 19th-ranked women's team a 7-0 blanking.



## COACHING STAFF

While he was head coach at the University of South Alabama, the Jaguars posted a 60-18 record and won three-straight Sun Belt Conference titles in three seasons. In addition, the Jaguars made it to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament in 2000 and to the second round each of his last two years.

During his tenure at South Alabama, Scrivano tutored All-Americans Martina Ondrejкова and Iva Puflerova. Puflerova and Ondrejкова won the 1999 National Claycourt Doubles Championship and he guided them to the 2000 Final Four of the NCAA Doubles Championship. He also coached the combined men's and women's squad that upset Stanford, ranked No. 1 nationally, to win the 2000 World Team Tennis National Championship. Scrivano was twice named Sun Belt Coach of the Year (2001 and 2002) and was selected ITA South Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

Scrivano joined the South Alabama staff in 1999 as a men's and women's assistant coach. He helped guide the women's program to a first-ever NCAA Elite Eight appearance beating No. 8 UCLA and No. 9 Pepperdine along the way. He served as an assistant coach at Northwestern in 1998 and an assistant coach at the University of Mobile in 1997. In addition, Scrivano has coached several NCAA All-Americans and WTA Touring professionals and has also been the head coach three times for the Tennis Europe National Team which prepared U.S. juniors for ITF European tournaments.

His broad range of experiences, both in the collegiate ranks and working with U.S. juniors, serves him well in the tennis recruiting wars which are an important part of building a successful collegiate tennis program.

Scrivano played collegiate tennis at Eastern Michigan University where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in communication in 1997. Scrivano is a native of Cambridge, Ontario, Canada.

### ALISON OJEDA

ASSISTANT COACH ■ SECOND SEASON

Former All-American and all-SEC selection Alison Ojeda enters her second season as an assistant coach at Baylor. She was named an assistant coach of Baylor's women's tennis program on June 30, 2010.

Ojeda has made an immediate impact on the women's tennis program, helping develop players into elite competitors nationally. In her first season, Baylor finished the year with a trip to the NCAA Final Four and compiled a 29-4 record, including Big 12 regular season and tournament titles. Individually, Ojeda contributed to the development of four nationally-ranked singles players, all in the top 65, as well as two top-60 doubles combinations.

Coming to Baylor after five seasons at Middle Tennessee State, Ojeda had inherited an MTSU team with just two returning players in 2005, but took the program back to the national rankings in 2010. Helping the Blue Raiders to their first winning season in six years, Ojeda led MTSU to an 11-10 record, while earning an ITA ranking of No. 75 after a 5-0 start. After winning 15 matches in her first two seasons, she led her team to nine wins in her third and fourth year at the helm.

Ojeda was an assistant coach at Alabama in 2005 and served two years at Texas A&M, earning the 2004 Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year honor. Alabama fell in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and finished the year ranked 38th nationally. TAMU posted a 44-19 record during her two seasons in College Station, winning Big 12 regular season and tournament titles and making a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, including reaching the Sweet 16 in 2003.

While at Texas A&M, Ojeda helped the Aggies finish the 2004 season ranked 16th in the nation. She also coached four All-Big 12 players and one All-American, Jessica Roland.

Ojeda spent eight months on the WTA tour in 2004 between her stops as an assistant at Texas A&M and Alabama. She also was the tournament founder and director for the College Station Open, a 64-player open level tournament, during her time as an Aggie. The San Antonio, Texas, native enjoyed a stellar playing career at the University of Tennessee, posting 102 singles and 100 doubles victories. She earned All-America honors in singles as a junior, was a four-time Academic All-SEC selection, and was voted the national recipient of the Arthur Ashe Jr. Humanitarian Award and Cissie B. Leary Leadership and Sportsmanship Award in 2002. The Cissie B. Leary Award is presented to someone who displays inspiring commitment and dedication to her team, enhancing the team's performance and exemplifying the spirit of college tennis. Ojeda was the Southeast Region winner of the Cissie B. Leary Award as a junior, as well.

Ojeda was also a three-time SEC Sportsmanship Award honoree. During her senior year, she helped captain UT's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Final Four. Ojeda finished her career ranked 26th in the country in singles and 59th in doubles. She finished ranked No. 23 in singles and No. 16 in doubles as a junior, making the NCAA Individual Championships in both events and leading UT to its first-ever SEC championship match appearance. The Lady Vols finished the year ranked No. 6 nationally, the team's first Top 10 final ranking in 25 years.

As a sophomore, she ended the year ranked 38th in singles and 21st in doubles, making her first NCAA Championships appearance in both singles and doubles. She posted a 47-22 combined mark as a freshman, picking up Tennessee's lone point in the NCAA Team Championship in a loss to Stanford.

Ojeda garnered First Team All-SEC honors in singles as a junior and Second Team accolades in doubles as a sophomore. She is one of only three players in Lady Vols history to post more than 100 victories in both singles and doubles.

Ojeda was a three-time all-state selection at Douglas MacArthur High School and registered a 2008 combined singles and doubles mark. She reached the finals of the state tournament as a senior before falling in the title match and also advanced to the state tourney as a sophomore and junior. She played in the Sugar Bowl Tournament and National Indoor Championships in 1996-97.



### JOHN FARIBAULT

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH ■ 10TH SEASON

John Faribault is in his 10th season as a volunteer assistant coach for the Baylor tennis program. Faribault is currently Senior Lecturer in the Department of Health, Human Performance, and Recreation (HHPR) at Baylor University and Director of non-major Human Performance. He is the also Webmaster and Director for Technology for HHPR.

With more than 20 years of teaching and coaching experience at the beginning, intermediate and advanced levels of tennis, Faribault's contribution to the program has been instrumental in player development, assisting in the program's eight Big 12 regular season titles and a current streak of six consecutive Big 12 tournament titles. During Faribault's time with the program, Baylor has earned eight NCAA Championships berths, including five trips to the Elite Eight and two to the Final Four.

"Coach Faribault has been great for our coaching staff," head coach Joey Scrivano said. "We are very fortunate to have his expertise available to us each day. We have seen a difference in our player development since John's arrival."

At the advanced level, his experiences range from private lessons for junior and college players to pro-circuit travel in the U. S. and Europe as a coach.

Due to his early college teaching experiences as an undergraduate and graduate student, including coach for the women's tennis team, John's faculty appointment was originally as a racquet specialist for badminton, racquetball and tennis. John has since garnered over 20 years of teaching experience at the beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels of tennis.

## BIG 12 CONFERENCE STANDINGS

The Lady Bears continued their unprecedented string of Big 12 regular season and tournament championships, collecting their seventh consecutive regular season title and sixth consecutive tournament crown. Baylor's success in the Big 12 under head coach Joey Scrivano has been unparalleled. Since Scrivano took over in 2003, Baylor has a combined league mark of 92-7, including 75-2 run over the past seven seasons. Until an early season conference loss to Kansas State in 2011, Baylor won a string of 57 consecutive matches over Big 12 opponents, including 43 in a row in the regular season. The streak lasted from March 4, 2007 until March 18, 2011, spanning more than four years.
