**2006:** Appeared in all 33 matches and saw action in 119 games in her freshman season...Led Baylor, and ranked ninth in the Big 12, with 11.37 assists per game...Recorded 1,353 assists on the season, the fifth-most in Baylor history...11.37 assists per game ties for sixth all-time in a single season in school history...Led the Big 12 with 61 service aces, 0.51 aces per game...61 service aces in one season ranks second in Baylor history, while 0.51 aces per game is the fourth-best total in school history...Led all Big 12 setters in points and points per game with 229.5 and 2.21, respectively...Recorded her first career triple-double against 24th-ranked Kansas State (09/13) with 11 kills, 52 assists and 15 digs in a 3-1 win...Accomplished the feat for a second time on Oct. 20 versus No. 16 Missouri, recording 10 kills, 61 assists and 13 digs in a 3-2 victory...Accounts for the only two triple-doubles in Big 12 play on the season...Set a Big 12 and Baylor record with 11 service aces at No. 19 Missouri (09/27)...Her five service aces against Texas A&M (11/01) tie the fourth-best total in school history in a four-game match...Tied an NCAA record by serving 12 consecutive points to begin a match against Louisiana-Monroe (09/01)...Ranked third on the team with 83 total blocks (0.70 bpg)...Fourth on the team in digs with 245 on the season, 2.06 digs per game...Recorded four or more kills in 21 matches, including a streak of eight straight...Had 50 or more set assists in eight matches...Recorded double-digit digs in 10 matches...Named to the fall Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

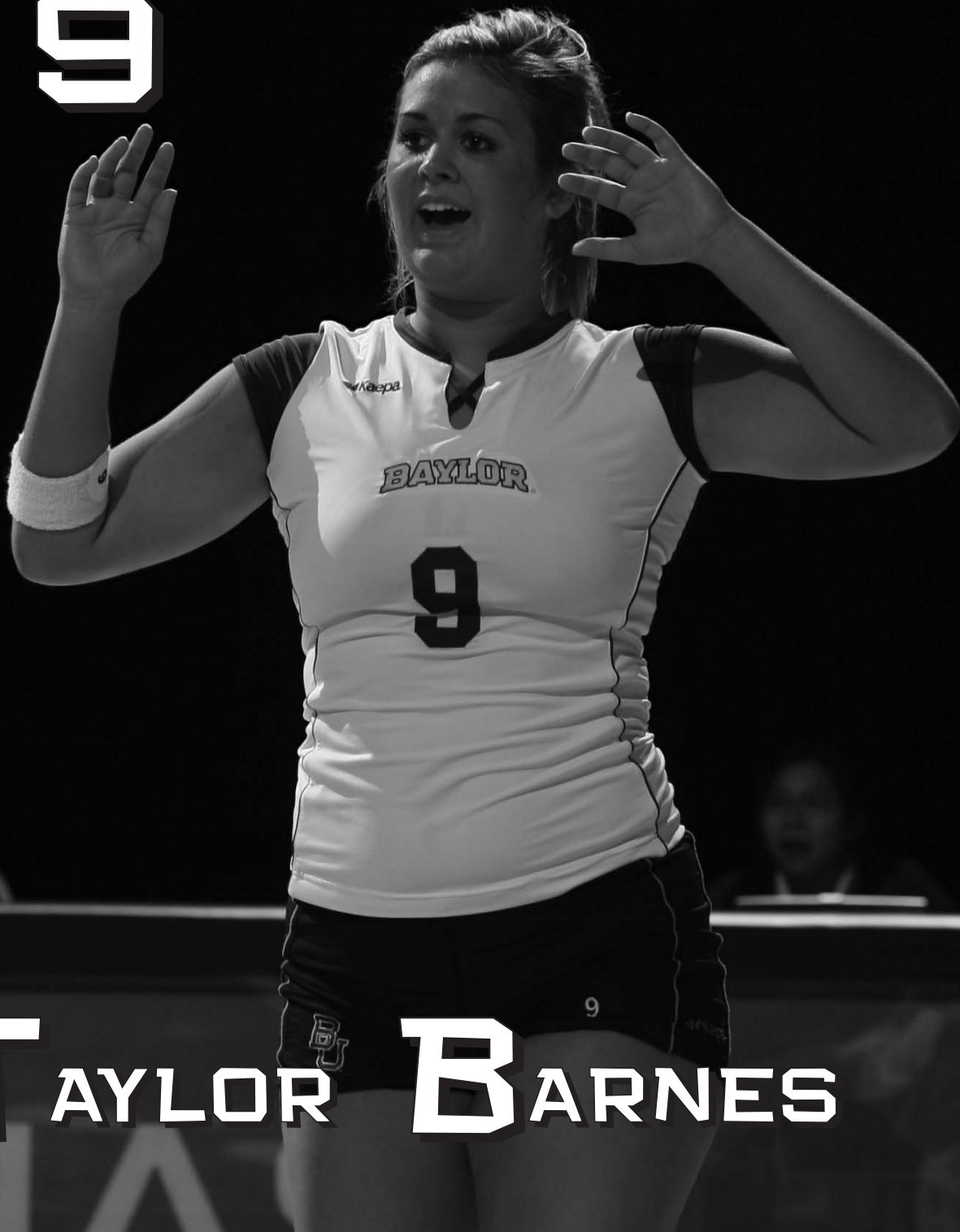

**2006:** Appeared in all 33 matches, seeing action in 114 games on the season...Ranked second on the team in hitting percentage (.310) and blocks per game (1.33), and is the top returner in both categories...Ranks eighth in Baylor history for single-season hitting percentage at .310...Ranks ninth in the Lady Bear record books for single-season total blocks (152)...Tied for tenth all-time in total blocks per game in a single season at 1.33...Recorded 311 kills on the season to rank third for the Lady Bears...Averaged 2.73 kills per game, the highest mark for returning players...Ranked eighth in the Big 12 in blocks per game at 1.33, the only freshman who ranks in the top 10...Hit .786 (12-1-14) against New Mexico (09/01), the highest single-game hitting percentage in the Big 12...Hitting percentage ranked as the second-most efficient match in Baylor history for a three-game match, and the third-highest hitting percentage overall...Recorded a hitting percentage of .615 (17-1-26) against Texas State, the fifth-highest hitting percentage in a four-game match in Baylor history...Recorded 12 total blocks in a match against UC-Davis (08/25), the third-highest single-game total in the Big 12...Ranked as the second-highest block total in a four-game match in school history and the third-highest total in school history regardless of match length...Recorded 10 or more kills in 17 matches, including a streak of five straight between Oct. 18 and Nov. 4...Career-high 20 kills came at Texas (10/06)...Recorded a hitting percentage of .333 or better on 15 different occasions...Tallied five or more total blocks in 16 matches, including a career-best 10 total blocks against Missouri (10/27)...Named to the fall and spring Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

**2006:** Saw action in a team-high 121 games, and all 33 matches...Led the team with 485 digs on the year, a 4.01 digs per game average to rank sixth on the Big 12 list...485 digs on the year rank third on the Baylor single-season record list...1,234 career digs rank sixth all-time at Baylor, and first in the rally-scoring era (since 2001)...Needs three more digs to move into fifth-place all-time at Baylor, and 342 digs to become Baylor's all-time leader in digs...4.01 digs per game in 2006 rank second all-time for a season...Holds her position as the career-leader in digs per game at Baylor...Recorded 34 digs against Missouri (10/27), the highest single-game total in the conference in 2006...Also ranks as the third-highest dig total in school history in a single match...Tallied 25 digs at Texas A&M (11/01), the highest single-game total for a four-game match in conference play...Total ranks as the third-highest single-match dig total in Baylor history for a four-game match...Totaled 24 digs against Arkansas State (09/08), the sixth-highest dig total for a four-game match in school history...Recorded 22 digs in a three-game sweep of Houston (09/09) tying her own school record for total digs in a three-game match...Recorded 10 or more digs on 24 different occasions, topping the 20-dig plateau in seven matches...Recorded five services aces against Texas Tech (09/20), tying her for the second-highest total in school history in a five-game match...Earned Academic All-Big 12 first-team honors for the third straight year...Named to the fall and spring dean's list...Named to the fall and spring Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Rolls.

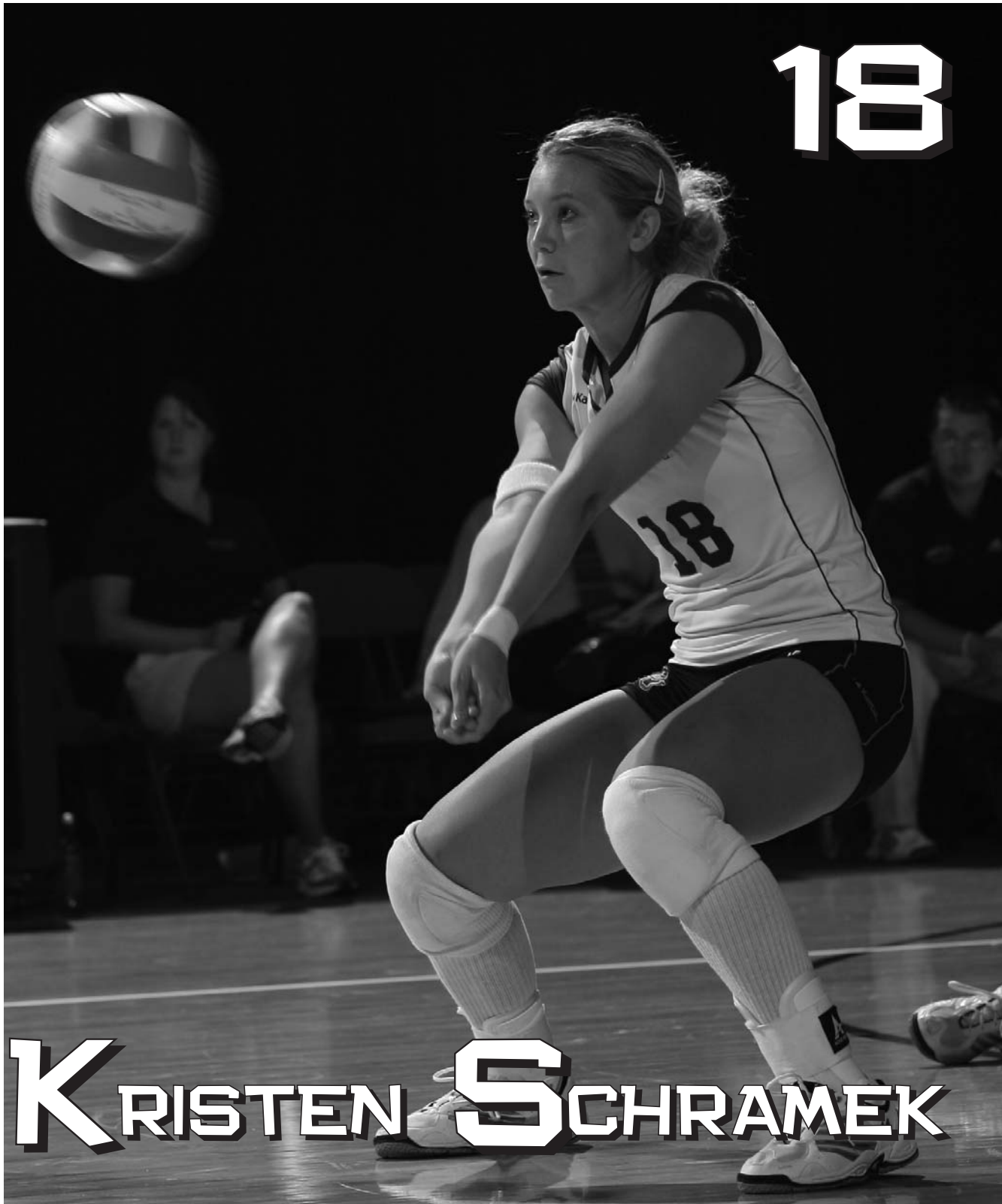

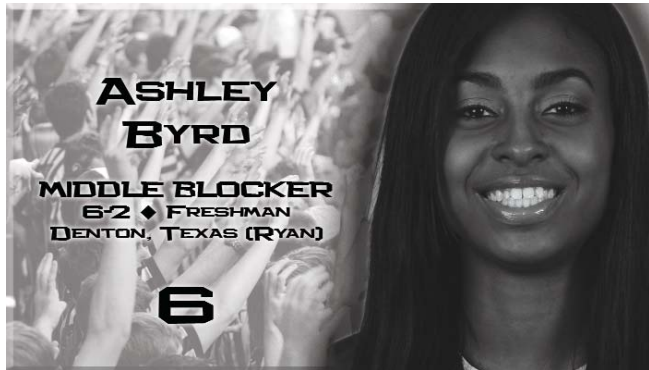
