BC HOSTS FORDHAM

• The Boston College baseball team hosts Duke in its last regular-season weekend of the 2012 season.

• The Eagles (21-31, 9-18 ACC) split a non-conference, two-game series with Fordham and lost to Maine on Tuesday.

• The Blue Devils (19-33, 7-20 ACC) dropped three conference game to No. 7 North Carolina over the weekend and lost to Presbyterian, 3-2, on Tuesday.

• BC holds a 12-6 advantage over Duke since 2006, when the Eagles joined the ACC. They are also 6-3 at Shea Field and completed series sweeps in 2007 and 2008.

• Last year, BC took two-of-three from the Blue Devils in Durham, dropping the first game, 10-6, but rallying to win the next two, 5-3, and 6-4, in 11 innings. In the first game, Current sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** drove in a career-high four runs in a 1-for-3 performance. Senior OF **Marc Perdios** went 3-for-5 with two doubles and scored three times. In game two, junior OF **Matt McGovern** drove in four of the five BC runs on a 4-for-5 day and John Leonard allowed three runs through 7.0 innings to lead the Eagles to the win. In the rubber match, BC scored four runs in the last three innings to force extras and senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** hit a two-run single in the top of the 11th to lead the Eagles to the win. He went 3-for-6 at the plate with two doubles and McGovern was 4-for-5 with an RBI and two runs. Senior RHP **Kyle Prohovich** earned the win on the mound after throwing 3.2 innings of relief. He struck out five and allowed just two hits.

EAGLES SPLIT WITH FORDHAM

• On Saturday, BC fell, 7-4, as freshman INF/1B **Tyler Hinchliffe** led the way for the Eagles at the plate, going 2-for-3 with a double, a run and a walk. Senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** was 2-for-4 with an RBI. Junior RHP **Hunter Gordon** (2-7) shouldered the loss, pitching three innings of relief, allowing three runs, three hits, three walks and struck one out.

• The Eagles stormed back on Sunday to tally a 15-3 win, recording their largest margin of victory in 2012. BC tied a season-high with 19 hits and 14 RBIs as six Eagles tallied at least two hits and five recorded at least two RBIs. Junior OF/1B **Rob Moir** led the way with a career-high four hits and a career-tying three RBIs. Sophomore C **Nate LaPointe** also had three RBIs on a 2-for-4 day, while senior OF **Andrew Lawrence** was 3-for-4 with three runs and two RBIs and Hinchliffe was 3-for-5 with two runs batted in. Senior LHP **Nate Bayuk** (3-2) tallied the win, pitching two scoreless innings, allowing just two hits.

• BC finished off its non-conference schedule with a 9-4 loss to Maine on Tuesday evening. Lawrence tallied a 2-for-4 performance with a home run and a single. Senior RHP **Kyle Prohovich** (1-3) shouldered the loss, pitching 1.1 innings of relief, giving up two hits, three runs and one walk, while striking out two.

EAGLES QUICK HITS

- Senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** has compiled 201 hits, eighth all-time in BC record books.
- The Eagles' 15-3 win over Fordham on Sunday marked the largest margin of victory in 2012 for BC. Their 19 hits and 14 RBIs tied season highs and junior OF/1B **Rob Moir** tallied a career-high four hits and tied a career-high three RBIs.
- Sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** is third in the ACC with 74 hits and second 121 total bases. He ranks 17th with a .322 batting clip while Melchionda is 19th with a .315 average.
- The Eagles tallied their first ACC sweep since 2010, defeating Wake Forest in a three-games series. It marked the first sweep under second-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. In 2010, BC took down Wake Forest and NC State.
- BC is 2-0 in extra innings, tallying its first extra-innings win over Bryant on March 28, in a 5-3, 10-inning victory on a walk-off home run by senior INF **Spenser Payne**. On March 31, the Eagles defeated Maryland, 5-4, on a walk-off single by Butera in the 12th inning. Last season, the Eagles were 2-3 in extra innings.
- BC's 17 runs in the 17-6 victory over then-No. 1 Florida State on April 15 was the most runs allowed by the Seminoles in an ACC game since the 2004 season. It also marked the most runs the Eagles have scored since they tallied 19 in a 19-13 win over Samford on March, 1, 2009.
- The Eagles surrendered a season-high 19 hits in the loss to NC State in the 16-9 loss on April 21. Twice this season, BC has allowed 16 runs (Rhode Island, 4/17).
- Georgia Tech was 8-0 when scoring first before coming to The Heights, but the Eagles won two of the three meetings after allowing GT to get on the board first (March 23-25).
- The Eagles have won three games on walk offs and lost two. Butera tallied a walk-off single in a 4-3 win over Georgia Tech (3/24) with two-out, bases-loaded heroics and then hit one with runners on first and second to score the winning run against Maryland (3/31) in the 12th inning. Payne hit the game-winning, walk-off home run against Bryant (3/28). In Orlando, the Eagles pulled ahead of UCF (2/26) on in the top of the ninth on a two-run double by freshman INF/P **Tyler Hinchliffe**, but the Knights came through with their own walk-off double with the bases loaded and two outs. Against Northeastern (3/27), BC gave up a four-run lead in the ninth and lost on a walk-off wild pitch run scored by the Huskies.

HOT HIT STREAKS

- Ten members of the BC baseball team have tallied career-long hit streaks in 2012, including freshman INF **Blake Butera**, who leads the team with a 13-game hit streak that ended on April 10. In that time frame, he went 15-for-41 (.366) with six runs, three doubles, six RBIs and seven walks. He also reached base safely in 16 straight games.
- Sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** also tallied a career-long hit streak, going eight games. He tallied 12 hits in 38 at bats, scored six times and drove in three runs. He has currently reached base safely in 14 straight games.
- Junior OF/1B **Rob Moir** recorded a career-long, 11-game hit streak in which he recorded 15 hits, including two doubles and a triple, nine runs and two RBIs while batting .341.
- Senior OF **Marc Perdios** recorded career-long 10-game hit streak. In that span, he went 15-for-37 (.405) with five doubles, eight runs, seven RBIs, three walks and one stolen base.
- Senior OF **Andrew Lawrence** tallied a career-long, eight-game hit streak, racking up 12 hits, including a triple, three runs, six RBIs, two sac flies and a sac hit. He tallied a .364 batting clip during the span. He currently on a five-game hit streak.
- Senior INF **Spenser Payne** also recorded a career-long eight-game hit streak, from the first game of the season to March 4. He registered a team-leading .371 batting average with 13 hits, including a double, triple and home run, four runs, eight RBIs and five walks.
- Freshman 1B/RHP **Tyler Hinchliffe** recently put together a five-game hit streak in his young career, tallying eight hits, six runs, an RBI and two walks. The Eagles won the first four

games of the streak. He has currently reached base safely in the last nine games.

ACC RACE IS ON

• The top eight teams make the ACC Tournament in Greensboro, N.C., beginning on May 23. The Eagles currently have nine ACC wins, tying for 10th in the league with Maryland. Wake Forest has 10 wins. BC holds the tie breaker over both teams as the Eagles swept the Demon Deacons and took two-of-three from the Terrapins. Wake plays Clemson the final weekend, while Maryland has to play No. 19 Virginia. Virginia Tech and Georgia Tech are tied for seventh place with 11 wins each, and the Eagles took two-of-three from the Yellow Jackets at Shea Field, holding the tie breaker. The Hokies swept BC in Blacksburg in April. GT plays Miami and VT plays No. 6 North Carolina.

EAGLES HOST ALS AWARENESS GAME

- On April 28, the Boston College baseball team recognized former captain and current director of baseball operations, **Pete Frates**, in a pregame ceremony before the ALS Awareness game.
- A record 2,286 fans showed up in support of Frates and promoting ALS research and fundraising.
- Frates was recently diagnosed with Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS). A Beverly, Mass., native, he played in the outfield for the Maroon and Gold from 2004-07. He was named the director of baseball operations and has been traveling with the team and attending the home games.
- Before the game, Frates, along with his family, was presented with his framed BC jersey by athletics director Gene DeFilippo, head coach **Mike Gambino** and the entire Eagles baseball team.
- The ALS Association Massachusetts Chapter provided information to fans to learn more about the disease, sold \$1 bracelets and accepted donations.
- Supporters could also donate to the Pete Frates #3 Fund (www.petefrates.com), which was set up to help subsidize Frates's medical care and expenses not covered by health insurance.
- BC and Virginia Tech also raised awareness of ALS during their April 6 game at English Field in Blacksburg. Both teams wore special batting practice jersey during warm ups and Frates gave a pre-game speech to the Eagles before they took the field for BP. The jerseys were sold before the Wake Forest game with the proceeds going to Frates's fund.

TAKING A RUN AT THE RECORD BOOKS

- Senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** has tallied 201 career hits and 112 career RBIs in his four years at The Heights. He is currently eighth on BC's all-time hits list, chasing Tony Sanchez ('10), who tallied 202. Melchionda is on the verge of breaking into the career RBI top 10, as Chang Choe ('98) and Joe Kealty ('01) recorded 115 in their careers.
- Senior RHP **Matt Brazis** has 15 career saves. Mike Belfiore, who wore the Maroon and Gold from 2007-09 holds the modern school record with 18 single-season saves.
- Sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** has 74 so far this season, which is two away from breaking onto BC's single season top-10 list. Ryan Leahy hit 76 in 2004. Robbie Anston holds the record with 85 in 2009.

EAGLES TALLY FIRST ACC SWEEP SINCE 2010

- The Eagles swept Wake Forest last weekend, marking the first conference sweep for BC since 2010 and the first under second-year head coach **Mike Gambino**.
- On Friday, BC tallied a 1-0 victory behind the pitching arm of junior RHP **Hunter Gordon**, allowing a career-low two hits in 7.0 innings of shutout baseball. He struck out five and walked five on his way to his second win of the season. Senior RHP **Matt Brazis** tallied his fifth save, pitching a 1-2-3 ninth with one strikeout. Junior OF/1B **Rob Moir** drove in the only run of the game in the first on a double.
- The Eagles took game two, 6-1, on Saturday in front of a record 2,286 fans. Sophomore RHP **Eric Stevens** tallied the win, pitching 6.1 innings, allowing only four hits, one run and striking out five. He retired 10 straight batters from the fourth to the seventh. Senior OF **Marc Perdios** drove in three of the Maroon and Gold's six runs on a 2-for-4 afternoon.
- BC completed the sweep with a 9-5 victory on Sunday. Freshman RHP **Geoffrey Murphy** recorded the win, pitching three innings of scoreless relief. He allowed just one hit and one walk and struck out two. Freshman INF **Blake Butera** led the way for the Eagles at the plate, going 3-for-4 with one run and two RBIs. Senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** was 2-for-3 with two runs, an RBI and two walks.

ACC NOTES

- The Eagles occupy the eighth spot in the conference in hitting with a .277 team batting average and they are tied for seventh in the league with 498 hits. They are sixth with 33 home runs and fourth with 106 doubles.
- Sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** is 17th with a .322 clip and senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** is 17th with a .315 average.
- Bourdon is third in the ACC with 74 hits and second with 121 total bases. He is also tied eighth with nine home runs and tied for seventh with 18 doubles.
- The team's .266 league average ranks seventh among conference teams, while its 243 hits in ACC games is tied for fourth. The Eagles' 51 doubles ranks third.
- Melchionda's .354 conference batting average ranks fifth in the ACC, while senior 1B/OF **Rob Moir's** .296 is 24th.
- The Eagles pitching staff ranks 12th in the ACC with a 5.45 team ERA.
- Senior RHP **Matt Brazis** is tied for eighth with five saves and freshman RHP **John Gorman** is 10th with four save.
- BC holds a .962 fielding percentage, good for 11th in the ACC.
- The Eagles have turned five double plays twice (at FIU, vs. JMU), which is tied for the most in the ACC this season. Virginia also tallied five DPs.
- The 25 runs the Eagles and the Wolfpack scored in NC State's 16-9 victory over BC were the most combined runs in the ACC this season. The night before, the two teams combined for 11 doubles in the Eagles' 11-10 win, also a league high.
- BC and Georgia Tech recorded 31 hits and 54 total bases together in the Eagles' March 23 victory over the Yellow Jackets, marking the most hits and total bases by two ACC teams in 2012. The game also saw five home runs, tying for the most this season.

CLUTCH HITTING

- So far this season, the Eagles have 111 two-out RBIs, 44.8 percent of their RBI total. Freshman INF **Blake Butera** leads the way with 19 and sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** has 16. Butera is batting .469 with two outs.
- Last year, 44 percent of the RBIs recorded came with two outs.
- BC also has registered a .369 batting clip with bases loaded. Junior OF **Matt McGovern** is 3-for-7 (.429) while senior OF **Andrew Lawrence** is 3-for-3 and junior C **Matt Paré** and senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** are 2-for-3.

MAKING IT HAPPEN

- BC has tallied a .600 batting average as a team with runners on third and less than two outs.
- Junior OF **Matt McGovern** is 8-for-9 and classmate OF/1B **Rob Moir** is 7-for-8. Senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** is 13-for-20 (.650) while classmate OF **Andrew Lawrence** is 10-for-14 (.714).
- The Eagles have also had success advancing the runner, recording a .464 average. Five players have tallied an average above .500. Sophomore INF **John Hennessy** leads the way with a .556 clip.

TAKING ON THE RANKS

- The Eagles have played nine ranked teams this season, tallying a 7-16 record.
- BC kicked off the 2012 season with a 5-3 win over 17th-ranked Virginia at the Caravelle Resort Tournament in Conway, S.C., and went on to defeated No. 35 Coastal Carolina in a decisive 8-3 win.
- The following weekend, after garnering votes in the NCBWA poll, the Eagles played a three-game series with 19th-ranked UCF. All three contests were decided by one run. The Eagles earned one victory, but mounted a comeback to lead heading into the bottom of the ninth in the rubber match on in the final game.
- The Maroon and Gold took two of three from No. 14 Georgia Tech in its first ACC matchup at home.
- The Eagles earned one victory in a three-game series against No. 1 Florida State, marking the second time in two years BC has taken down the top team as the defeated top-ranked Virginia, 5-4, in 11 innings last season.
- In Raleigh, BC earned an 11-10 Friday night win over No. 18 NC State before falling in a doubleheader on Saturday.
- The Eagles have faced 13 teams that made the 2011 NCAA Tournament and BC compiled a 9-18 record in the matchups.

MELCHIONDA TAKES WEEKLY ACC HONORS TWICE

- Senior captain INF **Anthony Melchionda** was named Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week twice in 2012 - the first week of the season (Feb. 20) and the week of March 26.
- At the Caravelle Resort Tournament in Conway, S.C., he tallied a .429 batting clip, including three doubles and a home run, and drove in six runs. The shortstop did not commit an error in 21 chances. He was also part of four of the six double plays the Eagles turned.
- The honor for the Maroon and Gold was the first since April 2010, when centerfielder Robbie Anston earned the accolades.
- The week of March 26, Melchionda hit .421 and drove in seven runs as the Eagles went 3-2, beating 14th-ranked Georgia Tech twice. Three of Melchionda's eight hits on the week were for extra bases, including a home run in the 15-7 win over GT on March 23.
- He went 2-for-5 with two runs and three RBIs in that game and on March 24, he went 2-for-3 with a double and an RBI, sparking BC's 4-3 comeback win.

BUTERA GETTING NOTICED

- Freshman INF **Blake Butera** was named one of CB360 Primetime Performers for the sixth week of the 2012 college baseball season (March 19-25), as presented by CollegeBaseball360.com.
- The second baseman hit the game-winning, walk-off single in the Eagles' 4-3 victory over then-14th-ranked Georgia Tech on March 24.
- He started the series with a 3-for-5 performance in BC's 15-7 win on March 23 and added a hit in the series finale, which the Eagles lost, 2-1.
- The Madisonville, La., native reached base eight times in the series and tallied nine hits during the team's 3-2 week, including a 3-for-5 effort in the 8-5 win at Bryant with an RBI, two runs and a double.
- Butera is the second Boston College player to earn the CB360 honor this season as senior INF **Anthony Melchionda** garnered the accolades the first week of the season for his play in the Caravelle Resort Tournament in Conway, S.C.

EAGLES TAKE SERIES VS. GEORGIA TECH

- The Eagles won the series against then-No. 14 Georgia Tech March 23-24, upsetting the nationally-ranked team.
- BC took game one, 15-7, for its first ACC win of the season, tallying 19 hits, the most since they recorded 20 against Quinnipiac in 2009. Sophomore INF **John Hennessy**, who went 2-for-3 on the day, recorded his first career homer. Sophomore RHP **Eric Stevens** (3-1) tied a career high with seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings pitched.
- In game two, BC used ninth-inning heroics of freshman INF **Blake Butera** to capture the win as classmate INF/P **Tyler Hinchliffe** tied the game with a bases-loaded grounder and with two outs, Butera hit the walk-off single for the 5-3 win. Senior LHP **Nate Bayuk** (1-1) tallied his first win of the season, pitching 1.1 innings. He did not allow a hit, run or walk and struck out two.
- The Eagles fell, 2-1, in the third game, as the Jackets scored two runs in the first, and, while BC cut the lead down to one in the third, they could not mount a comeback.

EAGLES DON'T MAKE IT EASY FOR THE SOX

- On March 3, BC played the Red Sox in the 22nd annual meeting.
- While the Eagles lost, 6-3, they put up a good fight, tallying six hits and allowing only seven.
- Sophomore **Tom Bourdon** and junior **Rob Moir** both went 2-for-2 and senior **Andrew Lawrence** tallied two RBIs against the Major League pitching staff.
- Sophomore **Steve Green** started the game and went two innings. Freshman **John Gorman** pitched two innings of relief and freshman **Nick Poore** also went two innings. He did not give up a run and struck out three.

THE TRAVELS OF A NEW ENGLAND TEAM

- BC traveled over 9,500 miles before playing its first home game on March 20.
- Boston College opened the season at the Caravelle Resort Tournament in Conway, S.C.
- The Eagles then traveled to Orlando, Fla., for a three-game series with UCF.
- BC returned home for a short time before leaving on for spring break to Fort Myers, Fla., where the Eagles took on Florida Gulf Coast in a three-games series (March 1-4). Sandwiched in between the series with the FGCU Eagles was the annual exhibition with the Boston Red Sox.
- The Eagles continued on in Florida to play FIU and Florida Atlantic before opening the Atlantic Coast Conference schedule with No. 14 Miami.

- BC returned from the Sunshine State and traveled to Clemson, S.C., to take on the 23rd-ranked Tigers in another conference matchup.
- The Eagles finally settled at Pellagrini Diamond at Shea Field with a home game against in-state rival Holy Cross on March 20., falling 3-1.

HONORING SONNY

- Last year, head coach **Mike Gambino** started a new tradition at The Heights. Each season, a player who has battled adversity and represents the best qualities of BC Baseball will wear No. 8 in honor of former player Peter "Sonny" Nictakis.
- Sonny was a two-time captain for the Eagles in 1998-99 and lost his courageous battle with Hodgkin's disease in the summer of 2000.
- His No. 8 has not been worn since the 1999 season and last year, Gambino tabbed Mike Sudol to be the first to don the number during the 2011 campaign.
- This year, senior captain RHP/1B **Kyle Prohovich** will don the No. 8 on this uniform for BC.
- Prohovich has become the Eagles' go-to guy out of the bullpen. He appeared in 24 games last season with a 3.46 ERA. He was third on the team in appearances and strikeouts (34) and recorded three wins. He also allowed 15 earned runs on 34 hits in 39.0 innings of work. Some of his 2011 highlights included allowing only two hits in a career-high 4.0 innings against Virginia to record the extra-innings win and striking out five in 3.2 innings and allowing two hits at Duke to earn the win. He allowed only four runs in 12 appearances from March 6 to April 10, a total of 15.1 innings.
- Prohovich made eight starts as the designated hitter, recording a .195 batting clip in 41 at bats with one home run and three RBIs. His two-run homer, the first of his career, came against SIU Edwardsville in March.

EAGLES MADE THE POWER RANKINGS

- The Boston College baseball team was ranked 17th in ESPN's first Power Rankings of the season.
- The Eagles were also named the "Off-Radar Team of the Weekend" for their sweep in the Caravelle Resort Tournament.
- The article noted that the Eagles were the only team in the country that beat two ranked teams that weekend.

SUCCESS IN MYRTLE BEACH

- The Eagles swept the Caravelle Resort Tournament, hosted by Coastal Carolina, beating No. 17 Virginia, James Madison and No. 35 Coastal Carolina.
- As a team, BC hit .280 with a .477 slugging percentage and a .355 on-base percentage. The pitching staff allowed only four earned runs for a 1.33 ERA. They walked only nine and struck out 17.
- Sophomore OF **Tom Bourdon** and senior SS **Anthony Melchionda** led the way for the Eagles. Bourdon was 8-for-14 (.571) with two doubles, a home run, two RBIs, a .929 slugging percentage and a .600 OBP. Melchionda was 6-for-14 (.429) with three doubles, a home run, six RBIs, a .857 slugging percentage and a .467 on-base percentage. He did not strike out and while playing shortstop all three games, did not commit an error in 21 chances while part of four of the six double plays the Eagles turned.
- On the mound, junior RHP **Hunter Gordon** and sophomores RHP **Matt Alvarez** and **Eric Stevens** earned wins for the Eagles while Gordon tallied a save against UVA. Gordon did not allow a run in his 6.0 innings, only three hits and one walk and struck out seven. Alvarez went 5.2 against James Madison and did not allow a hit until the sixth inning. He gave up one earned run, one walk and struck out one. Green earned the start in the opener against Virginia and tallied six innings worth of work, allowing seven hits, three runs, one walk and one strikeout. In all 10 Eagles saw work on the mound for BC.

CLOSE CALLS AGAINST THE KNIGHTS

- The Eagles lost two of three against No. 19 UCF Feb. 24-26. All three games were decided by a single run.
- In the first game, BC led 3-1 after four, but the Knights used a four-run fifth to pull ahead. After the Eagles tied the game in the top of the seventh, UCF scored in the bottom half of the inning to take the 6-5 win, handing BC its first loss of the season.
- The next day, the Eagles were down by two in the seventh, but they tallied three runs on bases-loaded walks to take a one-run lead. The BC pitching staff prevailed as relievers freshman LHP **Tyler Hinchliffe** senior RHP **Matt Brazis** did not give up a run to preserve the 8-7 victory.
- In another back-and-forth game in the rubber match, the Eagles lost their 2-0 lead in the third when UCF tied the game. The Knights took a one-run advantage in the seventh and held on to

it until the ninth, when Hinchliffe, in his first collegiate at bat, nailed a two-run single with the bases loaded and two outs to give BC the 4-3 lead. The Knights came through in the end, as Darnell Sweeney tallied his own bases-loaded, two-out single down the left-field line for the 5-4 win.

- Senior 1B **Spencer Payne** led the way for the Eagles, going 4-for-10 with three RBIs.
- Freshman 3B **Blake Butera** recorded his first collegiate hit and RBI in the series.

MELCH MOVES TO SHORT

- Senior **Anthony Melchionda** was a solid starter at third base for the last two years, but with the loss of Brad Zapenas, who was drafted in the 42nd round by the Chicago Cubs in the 2011 MLB Draft, the senior moved to anchor the infield.
- In 2011, Melchionda led the team with a .304 batting average, 55 hits, 34 RBIs and 81 total bases. He also tied for a team high with 17 doubles.
- Melchionda recorded nine errors in 145 chances, tallying 42 putouts and 94 assists. He also turned 13 double plays, all to record a .938 fielding percentage last season.

2012 CAPTAINS

- Seniors **Anthony Melchionda** (SS) and **Kyle Prohovich** (RHP/1B) and junior **Rob Moir** (OF) were selected as the captains of the 2012 Boston College baseball team, voted by their teammates.

2011 AT A GLANCE

- BC finished the season 17-33 (7-22 ACC), placing fifth in the Atlantic Division.
- The Eagles started the season winning the first two out of three games, and were 6-5 through the first 11 games. Almost halfway through the season, BC was 10-10, but then lost five straight. The second half the season, with a tough schedule, the Eagles won seven more games and dropped 16.
- For the second year in a row, the top returning hitter in the lineup is senior SS **Anthony Melchionda** who led the team with a .304 batting average. He also had 17 doubles and 34 RBIs.

- The weekend rotation returns two sophomores - RHP **Eric Stevens** and RHP **Matt Alvarez** - and junior RHP **Hunter Gordon**. Stevens went 2-1 last season with a 4.38 ERA while Gordon was 1-4 with a 4.09 ERA. Alvarez lost two games in 2011 and tallied a 5.88 ERA.

OFFENSIVE LOSS

- BC has some big shoes to fill offensively with the loss of three of the top seven of its top hitters from 2011.
- Garret Smith was tied for third-best hitter on the team with a .267 average. He tied for the team lead with 17 doubles and was second with 48 hits.
- Matt Hamlet was fifth on the team with a .264 batting clip with 37 hits and 11 RBIs.
- Brad Zapenas recorded a .229 batting average with 10 doubles and 18 RBIs.

EAGLES IN THE DRAFT

- Four Eagles were selected in the 2011 Major League Baseball Draft. Garret Smith was the first BC player selected, going on the second day to the Tampa Bay Rays in the 20th round (630th overall).
- Pitchers Mike Dennhardt and John Leonard were both drafted in the 32nd round. Leonard went to the Los Angeles Dodgers as the 975th pick and Dennhardt went 10 picks later to the Cincinnati Reds.
- Brad Zapenas was chosen in the 42nd round by the Chicago Cubs as the 1269th pick overall.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE SECOND IN NATION

- Boston College, along with Duke University, tied for second in the nation for overall Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in all sports among FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) schools, according to data released by the NCAA in late October.
- The 97 percent that both schools registered was second only to Notre Dame's 99 percent.
- Twenty-one BC sports teams received a perfect GSR score of 100, the most teams with a perfect score of any FBS athletics program in the country. This marked the third consecutive year the Eagles recorded the most perfect scores among their FBS counterparts.
- Baseball was one of the 21 BC teams that recorded a perfect GSR score of 100.
- The five FBS institutions that received scores of 90 or better were Notre Dame (97), Duke (93), Northwestern (94), Rice (93), BC (93) and Navy (91).

BASEBALL RUNS IN RED BANDANNA 5K

- The baseball team took part in the seventh annual Welles Remy Crowther Red Bandanna Run on Oct. 15, 2011 to support the Welles Remy Crowther Charitable Trust.
- Welles Crowther was an equities trader in the south tower of the World Trade Center on September 11. Crowther used the last hour of his life to save the lives of others, using a red bandanna to cover his nose and mouth as protection against smoke and debris. Crowther had carried a red bandanna in his pocket since his father gave him one as a child, and it became his trademark as he wore one under his helmet as a BC lacrosse player. His heroics were documented in the "Outside the Lines" segment on ESPN, produced by ESPN's Drew Gallagher (BC '99), who was a friend of Welles at BC, written by Tom Rinaldi and narrated by the actor Edward Burns.
- The Welles Remy Crowther Red Bandanna Run is a 5k road race on the Boston College campus held as an annual tribute to the September 11 hero. The race is co-sponsored by the Boston College Volunteer and Service Learning Center and the Welles Remy Crowther Charitable Trust.

Mike Gambino, a 2000 graduate of Boston College, was named head baseball coach on July 19, 2010.

Gambino is in charge of rebuilding a program that made an emphatic postseason statement in 2009, earning its first ACC Championship berth and first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1967.

The Eagles went 17-33 in his first season at the helm last year, but he saw four players get selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft.

Gambino, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles from 2003-05, came from Virginia Tech where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach under former BC head coach, Pete Hughes. He served as the Hokies' recruiting coordinator and also worked with the hitters and infielders. Virginia Tech's batting average improved 40 points (from .279 to .319) under his direction since the 2006 season.

With Gambino's help, the 2010 Hokies made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and finished the season ranked No. 20 in the country. Prior to working in Blacksburg, Gambino spent a year as a regional scout for the Detroit Tigers.

Gambino, who played for the Eagles from 1997-2000, started 166 games in the middle infield. He held a career batting average of .313 with 22 doubles, eight homers, 87 RBI and 117 runs. In his final season in 2000, he belted 78 hits and scored 52 times, which ranks tied for fifth and eighth, respectively, in a single season. His 78 hits that year were the most in a single season at the time.

He was a first-team All-Big East, All-New England and All-Northeast region honoree following his senior campaign. He also earned second-team All-New England and Big East Academic Team accolades during his playing career. Following his career with BC, the Garrison, N.Y., native played two seasons in the Boston Red Sox minor league system. He spent the 2000 season with the Augusta Green Jackets before splitting the 2001 season between Augusta and the Lowell Spinners. In 2002, the Red Sox hired Gambino as a special assistant to the Major League staff before heading back to Lowell for a coaching role with the Spinners just prior to the June draft. Following his stint in Lowell, the Red Sox sent Gambino to the Major League Baseball Scout Development Program.

In January 2003, Gambino returned to Boston College as an assistant coach under Hughes.

Gambino received his bachelor's degree from the Heights in English and theology.
