## BC MEETS NC STATE IN ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- Boston College and NC State will meet for the third time this season in the opening round of the 2012 ACC Tournament Thursday at Philips Arena in Atlanta.
- BC (9-21, 4-12) enters the tournament having lost five of its last six games. It defeated Georgia Tech in its home finale and lost at Miami last Saturday, 77-56.
- NC State (20-11, 9-7) won its last two outings after dropping the previous four games. The Wolfpack beat Miami and Virginia Tech to close out the regular season.
- NC State won both regular season meetings between the two teams.

## THE SERIES WITH NC STATE

- Boston College is 8-5 all-time against NC State.
- The Eagles are 5-5 against the Wolfpack since joining the ACC in 2005-06.
- NC State won two previous meetings this season. It won, 76-62, in the first contest at the RBC Center and then won again, 56-51, in Chestnut Hill.

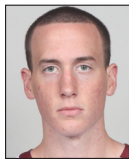

## HEAD COACH STEVE DONAHUE

**SECOND SEASON  
30-34 AT BOSTON COLLEGE  
176-172 OVERALL**

Steve Donahue is in his second season as the head basketball coach at Boston College. He assumed the position on April 7, 2010 after serving 10 years as the head coach at Cornell.

In his first season at the Heights, Donahue guided the Eagles to a 21-13 record, including a 9-7 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference action. BC earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament and advanced to the second round.

Donahue established an up-tempo style of play that allowed the Eagles to lead the ACC in field goals made, and rank second in three-point field goal percentage and assist-turnover ratio, and third in assists.

Donahue led Cornell to three consecutive Ivy League titles (2008-2010) and a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet 16.

In his 10 seasons leading the Big Red, Donahue totaled a 146-138 record. Cornell achieved the best Ivy record over the last five years (55-15) and Donahue was recognized for his work by being named a court coach by USA Basketball for the Under-18 national team trials in Washington, D.C., in July of 2008. Donahue coached and/or recruited seven of the school's top 13 all-time leading scorers, two Ivy League Player of the Year selections, two Ivy League Rookie of the Year players, eight NABC All-District selections, six Academic All-District picks and two Academic All-Americans.

Under his guidance, the Big Red recorded a perfect 14-0 Ivy League mark in 2007-08, joining Penn and Princeton as the only league schools to achieve that record. Cornell reached new heights in 2009-10, winning the program's third straight Ivy League title en route to an Ivy League-record 29 wins, the program's first NCAA win, and a trip to the Sweet 16. Cornell climbed as high as No. 22 nationally in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, the program's first national ranking in 59 years, and set an Ivy League record for three-pointers in a season (326). The team also set single-season school records in points (2,545), field goals (913), assists (543) and blocked shots (127). The Big Red won the MSG Holiday Festival with a victory over St. John's, Cornell's first win over a Big East school since 1969, and captured a season-opening win at Alabama, the team's first win over a school from the Southeastern Conference since 1972. Cornell went 11-1 at home and won 18 games away from home, the most among any Division I school. The most attention was given to Cornell's effort in a 71-66 loss at No. 1 Kansas, a game the Big Red led with less than one minute to play. The Big Red then shocked the college basketball world as a No. 12 seed, knocking out both fifth-seeded Temple and fourth-seeded Wisconsin by double figures.

For his efforts, Donahue was named the Clair Bee Coach of the Year, the NABC District 4 Coach of the Year, the midseason Hugh Durham Coach of the Year by collegeinsider.com as the top mid-major coach in the country, and was a finalist for both the Hugh Durham Award and the Jim Phelan Award for national coach of the year.

Cornell earned its second consecutive Ivy League title in 2008-09, becoming the first team other than Penn or Princeton to win consecutive outright championships in conference history. The Big Red went 21-10 and won the Ancient Eight by three games with its 11-3 mark. It was the first time Cornell had posted consecutive 20-win seasons.

The 2007-08 district Coach of the Year according to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), the United States Basketball Writers' Association (USBWA) and collegeinsider.com (Hugh Durham National Mid-Major Coach of the Year finalist), Donahue directed the 2007-08 Big Red to a 22-6 record and the program's first Ivy title in 20 years.

Off the court, Donahue expects his players to succeed in the classroom and contribute in their community. Cornell players made frequent appearances in local schools, speaking to students on the importance of a good education.

Renowned as a top recruiter and for his offensive mind while an assistant at the University of Pennsylvania, Donahue learned the trade from some of the nation's top coaches. Donahue served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Fran Dunphy at Penn for 10 years. During his tenure as a Quaker assistant, he was heavily involved in the recruitment of five of Penn's top 20 all-time scorers. He was also instrumental in the Quakers winning six Ivy League titles in his last eight years there, advancing to the NCAA Tournament five times and earning national recognition with a top 25 ranking.

Prior to joining Dunphy's staff at Penn, Donahue coached for two seasons under Hall of Fame coach Herb Magee at Philadelphia University. During his two seasons there, the Rams won 20 games each season and also competed in the 1989 NCAA Division II tournament.

Donahue served as an assistant for current Lafayette head coach Fran O'Hanlon at Monsignor Bonner HS, helping to guide Bonner to the 1987-88 Philadelphia Catholic League championship. He began his coaching career at Springfield (Pa.) HS under Skip Werley, his former college coach. He served as head coach of the junior varsity and assistant coach for the varsity team for three seasons.

He played both baseball and basketball at Ursinus College, earning four letters in both sports. He served as basketball team captain as a senior. In his freshman season, Donahue helped the basketball squad finish 23-8 and advance to the NCAA Division III tournament's semifinal round. The following year, Ursinus advanced to the tournament's quarterfinal round. He graduated in 1984 with a bachelor's degree in economics and business administration.

Donahue and his wife, Pamela, have four children, Taylor (15), Matthew (14), Katie (9) and Jack (8).

**JANUARY 19 AT NC STATE**

- Freshman **Dennis Clifford** had 12 points and five rebounds as Boston College lost at NC State, 76-62, in front of 16,051 at the RBC Center.
- Scott Wood scored 16 points for the Wolfpack and C.J. Leslie added 14 points. NC State ran off 15 straight points to take control and pushed the lead to 18 by late in the first half.
- NC State led 45-28 at the break and never let BC closer than 16 points until the final minute.
- After BC erased an early 10-point deficit to tie the game at 21, five different NC State players scored during the 15-0 spurt that put the Eagles away early.
- Howell scored five during the run, which ended when Wood buried a jumper to make it 36-21 with 3:11 left. Boston College ended its 6-minute drought with a 3-pointer from freshman **Jordan Daniels**, but NC State answered with a turnaround jumper from Williams, a transition layup from Howell and a driving reverse layup by Leslie that made it 42-24 with about 90 seconds left before the break.
- The Wolfpack opened the second half with six straight points, including consecutive baskets from Williams that made it 51-28 and forced BC coach Steve Donahue to burn a timeout 3 1/2 minutes in. By that point, NC State had outscored Boston College 30-7 over a 12-minute span.

**FEBRUARY 1 vs. WOLFPACK**

- Junior **Matt Humphrey** paced Boston College with 15 points as the Eagles lost to NC State, 56-51, in front of 3,611 fans at Conte Forum.
- Humphrey went 6-for-14 from the field and also had a pair of steals. Freshman **Lonnie Jackson** had 10 points with eight of them coming in the second half. Freshmen **Ryan Anderson** and **Dennis Clifford** both had eight rebounds.
- NC State led in the early going and was up by six points twice, including a 19-13 advantage with 8:23 left in the half. BC responded with the next six points in 56 seconds to force the second tie of the game. Sophomore **Gabe Moton** scored four points in the run. The Wolfpack went into halftime with a 25-23 edge.
- The Eagles scored the first six points of the second half to take their first lead, 29-25, since it was 5-4. Jackson converted a 4-point play and Clifford got a dunk off an Anderson assist.
- NC State responded with the next seven points to stop the BC momentum and retake a 32-29 lead. The two teams played within a possession of each other for the next 14 minutes - the game featured six ties and 12 lead changes. C.J. Leslie broke a 44-44 tie with four straight points to give NC State a 48-44 lead with 3:55 left. After Anderson connected on a pair of free throws, the Wolfpack scored the next six points to build a 54-46 lead with 48 seconds left. Scott Wood connected on all four of his free throws to extend the lead.
- BC cut the deficit to three points, 54-51 with seven seconds left, when Humphrey hit a 3-pointer, but that is as close as the Eagles got.
- Wood led all scorers with 16 points for NC State. Leslie had 13 points and six rebounds.

**THE BROADCAST TEAM**

Jon Meterparel and Malcolm Huckaby will call all the Boston College basketball action during the 2011-12 season. This will mark the pair's second season together with the Eagles.

Meterparel, who also serves as the play-by-play voice for Boston College football, joined the Dennis and Callahan morning show on WEEI in 2000. Prior to that, he had worked at WFNZ radio in Charlotte, NC, for nearly three years. A native of Weston, MA, Meterparel also worked with the Triple A Charlotte Knights (baseball), UNC Charlotte (basketball color analyst) and New England Revolution (soccer).

Huckaby is no stranger to BC basketball fans. He starred for the Eagles from 1990-94, finishing his 126-game career with 1,316 points. He currently ranks 18th on BC's career scoring list. Huckaby also ranks fourth on the career three-point field goals list, having sank 199 treys in his brilliant four-year career.

**BC LOSES REGULAR SEASON FINALE AT MIAMI**

- Junior **Matt Humphrey** led Boston College with 16 points as the Eagles lost at Miami, 77-56, in front of 3,834 fans at BankUnited Center.
- Freshmen **Dennis Clifford** and **Jordan Daniels** both had 11 points, and classmate **Ryan Anderson** hauled in 11 rebounds.
- Kenny Kadji and Durand Scott scored 14 points each to lead Miami.
- The Hurricanes broke open a close game with a 16-1 run during a 6:13 stretch midway through the first half. Malcolm Grant keyed Miami's surge with consecutive 3-pointers. Scott's 3-pointer with 4:55 remaining capped the run and gave Miami a 36-19 lead.
- Clifford's basket with 3:20 remaining in the first half ended a field-goal scoring drought of 8:08 for Boston College.

**BC IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT**

- Boston College is 6-6 all-time in the ACC Tournament.
- The Eagles have never faced NC State in the conference tournament.
- BC has not advanced past the quarterfinal round since 2007. It reached the ACC Tournament game in its first season in the conference in 2006 and advanced to the semifinals the following year.

**ANDERSON NAMED TO ACC ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM**

- Freshman **Ryan Anderson** was unanimously selected to the Atlantic Coast Conference All-Freshman Team, announced Monday by the league office.
- Anderson and Duke's Austin Rivers were the unanimous choices, getting a vote in all 61 ballots cast.
- Anderson is the second player from Boston College to be selected to the All-Freshman Team. Tyrese Rice was voted to the team in the Eagles' first season in the conference in 2005-06.
- Anderson was joined on the All-Freshman Team by Rivers, Virginia Tech's Dorian Finney-Smith, Miami's Shane Larkin, and Maryland's Nick Faust.
- The Lakewood, Calif., product leads all conference freshmen by averaging 7.2 rebounds a game, which ranks seventh overall. He is also second among ACC freshmen in points (10.8) and 24th overall. Anderson has led BC in scoring nine times and in rebounding a team-high 20 times, including each of the last nine games. Anderson has accounted for all six of BC's double-doubles this year.
- Anderson earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors on February 19 after averaging 21.5 points and 9.0 rebounds against Maryland and Duke.

**ANDERSON GETTING BETTER**

- Anderson has been one of Boston College's most reliable players all season, but he has taken it to another level in the last seven games.
- Anderson is averaging 15.4 points and 8.6 rebounds in that span - both team highs.
- He is also leading the team in field goals (39), field goal percentage (.527) and free throws (26-for-42) in that span.
- The Lakewood, Calif., product had a career game at Maryland with 22 points and 10 rebounds. He hit a career-high nine shots in the game. He followed that up with 21 points and eight rebounds vs. Duke.
- Anderson has accounted for all six of BC's double-doubles this season and three of them have come in ACC play.
- He had 13 points and 10 rebounds in the season-opener against New Hampshire and recorded 12 points and 12 boards December 18 versus Bryant.
- He recorded 18 points and 14 rebounds in a double-overtime loss to Rhode Island.
- Anderson had 13 points and 11 boards against Wake Forest on January 21 before recording 12 points and 10 rebounds the following game at Virginia.

**BENCH POINTS**

- Boston College upset #15 Florida State on February 8 without the benefit of any bench points.
- It was the first time the Eagles' bench didn't score in a game since February 7, 2007. BC defeated Miami that night, 75-68.
- The five BC reserves contributed six rebounds, five assists and three steals in a combined 48 minutes in the win.

## THREES

- Boston College ranks third in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 3-point field goals made per game with 7.3.
- Duke leads the league with 8.3 per game and Miami is second at 7.7.
- The Eagles have sunk five or more 3-pointers in 26 of 30 games this season. They hit a season-low three on December 29 against Harvard.
- BC has made eight from beyond the arc 16 different times this year. It had a season-high 12 triples against Bryant on December 18 and then 11 vs. Sacred Heart three days later.

## YOUNG GUNS

- Boston College has four freshmen that average 8.0 or more points per game.
- **Ryan Anderson** (10.8), **Dennis Clifford** (9.2), **Patrick Heckmann** (8.5) and **Lonnie Jackson** (8.2) are leading the freshman class in points.
- Junior transfer **Matt Humphrey**, another newcomer this year, is the other player in double figures with 10.5 points per game.
- Newcomers have accounted for 84 percent of the total minutes played, 91 percent of the scoring, 80 percent of the rebounds and 85 percent of the assists.

## RIGHT THERE

- Boston College was within striking distance late in each of its losses from January 29 to February 16.
- The Eagles were down early in the second half at Virginia, 34-23, but battled back to tie the game, 44-44, with 10:24 left in the game. From there, the Cavaliers ended the game on a 22-5 run to win the game.
- BC and Miami played within a possession of each other in the second half with both sides gaining leads. The 11th tie of the game came with 6:58 to play and the score, 49-49. Miami finished the game on a 29-6 run in the last 7:56. The Hurricanes held BC without a field goal in the game-ending run after freshman **Lonnie Jackson** hit a three to give BC a 48-47 lead.
- The Eagles deliberately slowed the game down against NC State.
- The game featured six ties and 12 lead changes and BC led, 42-41, with 6:23 remaining. The Wolfpack's C.J. Williams hit a 3-pointer to put them on top for good.
- The game at Georgia Tech February 4 was tight the entire way, as neither team had more than a six-point lead.
- Freshman **Ryan Anderson** nailed a 3-pointer with 3:14 left to tie the game, 44-44. The Yellow Jackets took it from there though as BC went the rest of the way without a field goal.
- BC held the lead for most of the game at Virginia Tech Sunday before the Hokies came out on top. The Eagles were up by six points with 1:44 to play but Virginia Tech climbed to within one with 28 seconds left.
- The Hokies' Robert Brown missed a 3-pointer with four seconds left, but the rebound went straight up and Dorian Finney-Smith tipped it in with 2.4 ticks. Lonnie Jackson missed a long 3-pointer as time expired.
- Despite a strong final push that closed that gap to seven points with three minutes left, the Eagles couldn't capitalize and lost at Maryland, 81-65.

## STIFLING DEFENSE

- The Boston College defense held Stony Brook to just 11 first-half points on December 11, which was a Conte Forum (opened in 1988) record low by any team in a half.
- The previous low was held by Georgetown which scored 12 in the first half on January 29, 2005.
- The Seawolves were held without a point for the final 11:50 of the first half as the BC offense rattled off 22 unanswered points.
- SBU went 0-for-16 from the floor in the final 11:50 and went 0-for-8 from beyond the arc. It also committed five turnovers.
- Stony Brook was 5-for-33 from the field in the half (15.2 percent) and shot 29.7 percent for the game.
- It was the first time a BC defense held its opponent under 30 percent shooting since November 30, 2004 when it did it against Long Island.
- The Eagles committed just five fouls in the game, including one in the first half, and allowed SBU to take five free throws the entire game.
- The five BC fouls were also the fewest by any team in Conte Forum history. The previous low was six which the Eagles did twice, the last time versus Bucknell on December 22, 2010.

## OVER THE HUMP

- Junior **Matt Humphrey** has stepped up his performance in the last 10 games.
- The Oregon transfer is second on the team with 12.5 points per game and 22 assists, and is third with 3.6 rebounds per game. He leads BC in minutes (34.5) and steals (15).
- Humphrey has scored in double figures in eight of the last 10 contests, his best streak this season.
- Humphrey is second on the team this year with 10.5 points per game and leads the team with 28 starts.

## DANIELS SPARKS UPSET OF FLORIDA STATE

- Freshman **Jordan Daniels** was the catalyst behind Boston College's upset of #15 Florida State on February 8.
- Daniels had his best game of the season with a career-high 21 points and five assists, three rebounds and three steals. He committed just one turnover in his 36 minutes of play.
- For the season, Daniels is averaging 6.3 points per game and has an assist/turnover ratio of 1.3.

## CLIFFORD NAMED ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Freshman **Dennis Clifford** was selected ACC Rookie of the Week for the week ending January 15.
- Clifford was the second BC player to receive league rookie of the week accolades this season. **Lonnie Jackson** earned the honor in December.
- Clifford averaged 15.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game as the Eagles posted wins over Clemson and Virginia Tech. The Bridgewater, Mass., freshman had 15 points and seven rebounds in the 59-57 win over the Tigers and 15 points and four rebounds in a 61-59 victory over the Hokies.
- On the year he is averaging 9.2 points and 4.8 rebounds per game and is shooting .527 from the floor.

## JACKSON'S DAY AGAINST BRYANT

- Jackson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on December 19 for his performance against Bryant.
- He erupted for a career-high 26 points on December 18 to lead BC to a 75-55 win.
- He went 8-for-13 from the field and 7-for-11 from 3-point land. Those seven 3-pointers are the second most by a player in the ACC this season. It is also the second best 3-point percentage (.636) among those with 10 or more attempts.
- Jackson is the first BC player to hit seven 3-pointers in a game since Tyrese Rice did it against North Carolina on March 1, 2008. He also hauled in five rebounds.
- The Valencia, Calif., product has reached double figure scoring in six of the last nine games. He is averaging 10.0 points per game during that span and is shooting 38 percent from beyond the arc.

## HECKMANN'S DAY vs. UC RIVERSIDE

- Freshman **Patrick Heckmann** poured in 32 points in a 66-62 overtime win against UC Riverside November 25 in the 76 Classic.
- He went 9-for-13 from the field, including 4-for-5 from beyond the arc. He was also a perfect 10-for-10 from the foul line.
- His 32-point performance was tied for the second most in 76 Classic history. Arizona State's James Harden holds the record with 40 and also had a 32-point game in 2008.
- Heckmann's point total is also tied for the eighth-most all-time in the ACC by a freshman and is the fourth most in the conference this season. It is the most points in a game by an ACC freshman this year.
- Twenty-one of Heckmann's points came in the second half and overtime.
- He missed seven games due to Mononucleosis. He sat out for the first time vs. Miami (1/29) and returned to action at Wake Forest (2/25).

## PLAYING TIME

- Boston College has used 10 different starters in 30 games this season.
- The Eagles have also utilized nine different starting lineups this year while starting five newcomers in each of the last 22 games.
- Junior **Matt Humphrey**, freshman **Ryan Anderson**, freshman **Dennis Clifford**, freshman **Jordan Daniels** and freshman **Lonnie Jackson** have started each of the last 15 games.
- Humphrey started the first 13 games of the season - the only player to do that - and has 28 overall.
- Freshman **Ryan Anderson** has 27 starts while classmates **Dennis Clifford** and **Jordan Daniels** both have 24.
- The Eagles have nine players who average 10 or more minutes a game.

## JOHN BAGLEY NAMED 2012 ACC TOURNAMENT LEGEND

- Former men's basketball great John Bagley has been named Boston College's representative in the 2012 class of Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Basketball Tournament Legends, announced by Commissioner John Swofford.
- Bagley, one of the top playmaking guards in Boston College history, played three seasons (1979-82) for the Eagles for Coach Dr. Tom Davis and led BC to a 64-27 record and one NIT and two NCAA tournament appearances. The first Eagle to earn Big East Player of the Year honors (1980-81), Bagley was an explosive scorer who averaged nearly 18 points per game and led BC in scoring in each of his three seasons at the Heights.
- A two-time All-Big East selection, he averaged 20.4 points per game in leading the Eagles to the 1980-81 Big East regular-season championship and the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16. The following year, Bagley upped his production to 21.1 points per game and led BC to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight. He was named to the NCAA all-tournament teams for both the 1981 Mideast Regional and the 1982 Midwest Regional.
- Bagley left BC after his junior season and was the 12th overall pick in the first round by the Cleveland Cavaliers in the 1982 NBA Draft. He enjoyed an 11-year career in the NBA for the Cavaliers, the New Jersey Nets, the Boston Celtics and the Atlanta Hawks.
- Inducted into the Boston College Varsity Club Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995, he currently resides in Stratford, Conn., and is working to reintroduce athletics into the middle school system of his hometown, Bridgeport, Conn.
- Bagley joins previous Boston College standouts who have already participated in the Legends program, including Dana Barros (2006), Jay Murphy (2007), Bill Curley (2008), Danya Abrams (2009), Terry Driscoll (2010) and Michael Adams (2011).

## FRESH FACES

- Boston College has an entirely new look this season as it welcomed 12 newcomers to the program.
- Among the 12 newcomers are nine freshmen and a trio of transfers.
- There are four freshmen that hail from California, two from Massachusetts and one each from Germany, Florida and Pennsylvania.
- BC also gained transfers in **Salah Abdo** (Trinity graduate), **Matt Humphrey** (Oregon) and **Deirunas Visockas** (Lafayette graduate).

## WHAT WAS LOST

- BC lost 10 lettermen from the 2010-11 team.
- Included in that list is the leading scorer and assister in Reggie Jackson (18.2 ppg, 152 ast) and leading rebounder Joe Trapani (7.0 rpg).
- Statistically, BC lost 92 percent of its blocks, 89 percent of its scoring and assists, 80 percent of its rebounding and 78 percent of its steals.

## THE RETURNERS

- Boston College retained the services of sophomore **Danny Rubin** who played in 29 games and started 23 of them.
- He averaged 4.1 points, 1.6 rebounds and 0.5 assists in 16.8 minutes a game.
- Graduate student **John Cahill** was added to roster in November after coming on strong late last season. He started the last seven contests and averaged 2.1 points per game. He averaged 27.7 minutes a game in the final 10 games of 2010-11.
- The Eagles also got **Gabe Moton** (2.5 ppg, 1.3 rpg) and walk-on **Peter Rehnquist** (0.6 ppg, 0.3 rpg) back on the roster.

## DONAHUE'S DISCIPLES

- Last season, Donahue's Disciples showed up to Conte Forum when Boston College hosted North Carolina and then after the season, Ryan Dunn and his fellow Disciples met with **Steve Donahue** to figure out how to get more students to games.
- Donahue sent out a tweet (@Coach\_Donahue) reaching out to the Disciples in September and the rest is history.
- The Disciples' (@BookofDonahue) 12 members have a goal of bringing the team and the student body closer together and to ultimately create an excitement and buzz around Conte Forum during games.

## EAGLES SIGN TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

- Two high-school standouts – 6-foot-3-inch guard **Olivier Hanlan** and 6-foot-2-inch guard **Joe Rahon** – have signed national letters of intent to play at Boston College.
- Hanlan is a standout at the New Hampton (N.H.) School. A native of Gatineau, Quebec, he also plays in the Albany City Rocks AAU program. Hanlan has also played for Dave Smart, who has won seven Canadian National Championships, as part of his Ottawa Guardsmen program. His coach at New Hampton is Pete Hutchins.
- Rahon, who plays at Torrey Pines (Calif.) High School, earned All-CIF first team, All-San Diego Section first team and All-North County honors as a junior. Also the Palomar League Player of the Year, he averaged 16.3 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.7 assists in 2010-11. Rahon shot 55.0 percent from the field, including 44.0 percent from long range (51 treys made). He also plays in the Dream Vision AAU program. Rahon, whose brother James plays for San Diego State, is a member of the Union-Tribune All-Academic Team with a 4.0 grade-point average.

## EAGLES IN THE NBA

- There are currently three former Eagles playing professionally in the NBA.
- Jared Dudley was the 22nd overall pick of the 2007 draft, taken by the Charlotte Bobcats. He was traded to the Phoenix Suns late in 2008.
- Reggie Jackson was drafted 24th overall by the Oklahoma City Thunder in 2011 and is seeing increased playing time after backup point guard Eric Maynor was lost for the season to a torn ACL.
- Craig Smith was a second round rick (36th overall) of the Minnesota Timberwolves in the 2006 draft. Smith was traded to the Los Angeles Clippers in 2009 before signing with Portland prior to this season.

## BC TO HOST 2012 NCAA REGIONAL

- Boston College is serving as the host institution for the East Regional of the 2012 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, set for March 22-24, 2012 at the TD Garden.
- The 2012 championship begins with the First Four, four first-round games taking place in Dayton on March 13 and 14. Second- and third-round action takes place in Albuquerque, Louisville, Pittsburgh and Portland on March 15 and 17; while Columbus, Greensboro, Nashville and Omaha will host second- and third-round games on March 16 and 18.
- Boston will serve as the East Regional site and Phoenix will host the West Regional on March 22 and 24. Atlanta will host the South Regional and St. Louis will be the site for the Midwest Regional on March 23 and 25.
- The 74th Men's Final Four will take place March 31 and April 2 in New Orleans.

## GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE SECOND IN NATION

- Boston College, along with Duke University, tied for second in the nation for overall Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in all sports among FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) schools, according to data released by the NCAA in late October.
- The 97 percent that both schools registered was second only to Notre Dame's 99 percent.
- Twenty-one BC sports teams received a perfect GSR score of 100, the most teams with a perfect score of any FBS athletics program in the country. This marked the third consecutive year the Eagles recorded the most perfect scores among their FBS counterparts. In addition, the football team's score of 93 was one of only six FBS programs in the country to receive a score of 90 or better.
- The 21 Boston College teams that recorded a perfect GSR score of 100 included men's baseball, fencing, golf, skiing, sailing, swimming and tennis along with women's basketball, cross country/track, rowing, fencing, field hockey, golf, ice hockey, sailing, skiing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball.
- The five FBS institutions that received scores of 90 or better were Notre Dame (97), Duke (93), Northwestern (94), Rice (93), BC (93) and Navy (91).

Anderson rattled off seven-straight points for BC to help close the gap to 22-21. Clifford gave the Eagles their first lead in more than nine minutes with a jumper in the lane to make it 23-22, which capped a string of seven-straight BC points. The Eagles turned those seven points into a 14-1 run over the final 4:37 of the half for the seven-point cushion.

The Eagles extended the lead to 10 points, 39-29, with 15:18 showing on the clock after halftime. BC maintained the healthy advantage at 51-40 but the Wildcats stormed back with 10-straight points to make it a one-point game with 9:28 to go.

New Hampshire stayed within arm's reach the rest of the way. Abreu came up with a big 3-pointer with 12 seconds left to cut the lead to 66-64 with nine seconds remaining, then freshman **Jordan Daniels** hit the first of two free throws for BC with eight seconds on the clock. Benson collected the rebound on the missed second attempt and with time running out, Abreu lost the ball near the top of the arc.

Jackson went 8-for-13 from the field and 7-for-11 from beyond the arc. He is the first BC player to hit seven 3-pointers in a game since Tyrese Rice did it against North Carolina on March 1, 2008. Jackson also hauled in five rebounds.

Freshman **Ryan Anderson** recorded his second double-double of the season with 12 points and 12 boards. His rebound total was the most by a BC player this year. Freshman **Dennis Clifford** had 10 points and six rebounds and classmate **Jordan Daniels** dished out nine assists while not committing a turnover.

The Eagles had a season-high 21 assists on 28 baskets and turned the ball over a season-low nine times. BC also got 21 points off the bench to Bryant's four.

The Eagles started the game on an 18-4 run in the first 6:43, getting an assist on each of their first six baskets. Jackson led the way for BC with six points in that stretch. BC maintained a double-digit lead until the 5:12 mark of the half when a pair of Frankie Dobbs free throws made it a 27-19 BC lead. Those points were part of a quick 8-2 Bryant run.

The Bulldogs then closed out the half on a 13-5 run to cut their deficit to just two points, 34-32. Dobbs led the Bryant attack with five points.

BC started the second half just like the first, scoring the first 10 points to build a 44-32 lead. Jackson scored eight of the 10 points in the run and 11 of the first 13 points overall. The Eagles maintained the double-digit lead under the 10-minute mark, and then went on a decisive 18-8 run over the next seven minutes to build a 70-49 lead.

URI held a 68-67 lead in the second extra session before rattling off five-straight points, capped by a Baron 3-pointer with 1:07 left to make it a 73-67 game. Freshmen **Dennis Clifford** led all scorers with 15 points to lead Boston College to a 61-59 win against Virginia Tech in front of 5,038 fans at Conte Forum.

Clifford went 5-for-11 from the floor and hit five of his six free throws. Junior **Matt Humphrey** scored 14 points and had eight rebounds. Freshman **Ryan Anderson** had 12 points and also had eight boards.

Boston College led for the first 12 minutes of the game but the advantage was never more than four points. Virginia Tech forced four ties before taking its first lead of the game, 16-15, at the 7:11 mark. The Hokies took their largest lead of the half, 25-20, when Cadarian Raines connected on a jumper. Raines ended the drought at 11:57 with a jumper in the paint to cut the BC lead to 42-38.

The Eagles steadily increased their advantage and took their largest lead to that point with 10:01 left, 48-40, after Humphrey hit two free throws. Anderson made it a 10-point game when he hit a pair of free throws with 7:32 on the clock.

Virginia Tech cut an 11-point deficit to five when Robert Brown sank consecutive 3-pointers with 2:18 to go, but both teams went cold from the field after that. Clifford made it a seven-point lead with a free throw with 16 seconds left before Jarell Eddie hit a three. Freshman **Lonnie Jackson** hit one of two free throws with eight seconds on the clock, then Jarell hit another 3-pointer to make it 61-59 with 0.3 on the clock. BC inbounded the ball and time ran out.

Daniels went 7-for-13 from the field and 4-for-7 from 3-point land. He also had five assists, three rebounds and three steals. Junior **Matt Humphrey** had 15 points, and freshman **Ryan Anderson** had 14 points and six rebounds. Freshman **Lonnie Jackson** recorded 12 points and sank three 3-pointers.

Boston College went 10-for-22 from beyond the arc in the game and eight of them came in the first half. It was the most triples BC has hit in ACC play.

The win marked the first time BC knocked off a ranked opponent since February 24, 2009 when it beat #23 Florida State in Conte Forum.

The first half featured a significant run by both teams and Florida State struck with the first one. The Eagles led early, 5-2, but the Seminoles went on a 12-0 run over the next 2:34 to build a 14-5 lead. Bernard James had five points in the run. The Seminoles' lead reached 23-10 at the 9:37 mark before BC stormed back.

Florida State halted the Eagles' momentum and scored seven of the last eight points in the half to cut the BC lead to 34-33.

The teams played within a possession of each other for the first eight minutes of the second half before BC went on a 9-2 run to build a 55-47 lead with 8:29 to play. Daniels led the way with five points.

The Seminoles cut the lead to 60-57 with 1:27 left when Okaro White hit two free throws, but BC pushed the lead to six points with 11 seconds left when Jackson and Humphrey combined for three free throws. Michael Snaer hit a 3-pointer with five seconds left to make it a one possession game, but Daniels put the game away with a free throw with 3.1 remaining.
