TIMELINE: 1890-1909

1891

The Boston College student body was granted permission, but no money, by President Edward I. Devitt, S.J., to organize a football team.

1893

Boston College began formal football competition. The team's first game was a 4-0 victory over St. John's Institute, an amateur power of the day. The first varsity game was a 10-6 victory over Boston University.

1894

The BC football team got its first compensated coach, William Nagle. The school adopted the team colors of maroon and gold.

1896

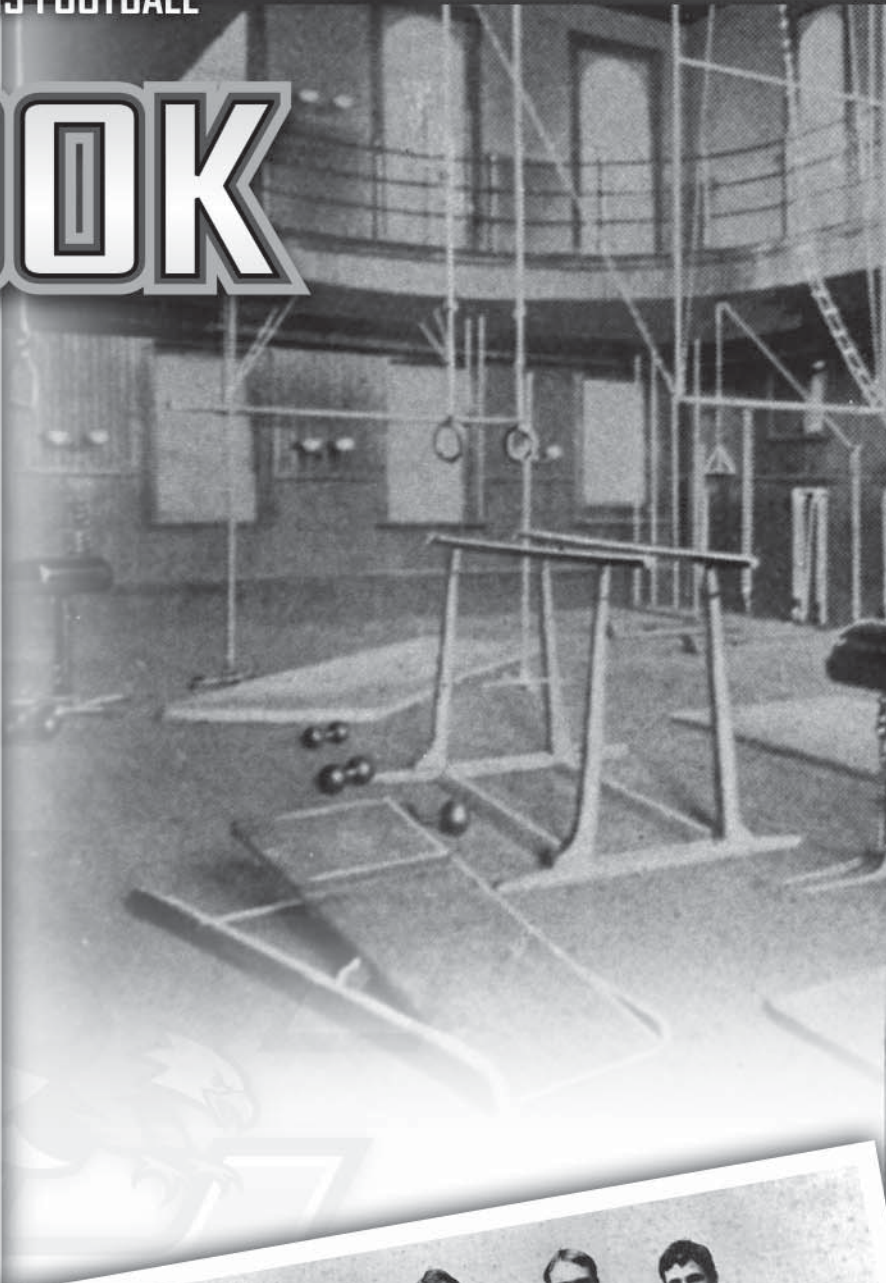
BC and Jesuit rival Holy Cross met for the first time in a home-and-home series. BC won both games, by scores of 6-2 and 8-6.

1903-1907

In a reaction to the growing public outcry against the violence of college football, as well as for economic considerations, the sport was dropped at Boston College.

1908

Varsity football was restored at Boston College. The team practiced on the Massachusetts Avenue Grounds, the site of a former city dump. Team members mowed the grass and lined the field before practice sessions.

For the second time in three seasons, the Boston College football team will take the field with a new head coach in charge, but the new man on the sidelines is a familiar face. Frank Spaziani, named head coach in January, is entering his 13th year on the BC coaching staff, having spent his first two seasons as the Eagles' running backs coach and the past 10 as defensive coordinator. Under Spaziani's guidance, the Eagles consistently have fielded one of the top defenses in college football.

Spaziani promoted Bill McGovern, who had served as linebackers coach for nine seasons, to defensive coordinator. McGovern's most pressing concern appeared to be finding replacements for departed defensive tackles BJ Raji, an NFL first-round selection, and Ron Brace, who was selected in the second round. But spring brought two new challenges for the coaching staff – senior co-captain Mike McLaughlin suffered an Achilles injury and his status entering fall drills is unknown. And then, in May, senior All-America linebacker Mark Herzlich disclosed he is suffering from cancer.

Herzlich's battle against cancer, naturally, is the Eagles' first and foremost concern, but there is no doubt his loss from the lineup is a tremendous blow both from a talent and leadership perspective. The good news for the defense is that it lost only strong safety Paul Anderson from a secondary that returns a young but talented group.

On the offensive side of the ball, Spaziani coaxed an old friend, Gary Tranquill, out of retirement to serve as his offensive coordinator. Tranquill's immediate challenge is to find a quarterback to direct an offensive unit that returns key veterans at practically every position. The good news is that offensive line returns four starters, anchored by center Matt Tennant and left tackle Anthony Castonzo. Tailbacks Montel Harris and Josh Haden were the second-most-prolific freshman running back duo in the country last year, and several talented and experienced wide receivers return.

Here's a look at the 2009 Eagles, position-by-position:

The most important position on the team is wide open after Dominique Davis, the only returning experienced quarterback, was suspended for academic reasons and transferred. At this point, it's anyone's guess who will emerge as the starter on September 5. "We are considering every available option," Spaziani says.

Things got much more interesting in early June when 25-year-old Dave Shinskie announced he would be joining the Eagles. Shinskie was a two-sport star (baseball and football) at Mount Carmel High School in Pennsylvania who initially decided to pursue baseball. After graduating from high school in 2003, Shinskie was drafted by the Minnesota Twins as a pitcher and spent six years in the minors. He was released this year and decided to pursue a football career. He will be eligible to play immediately.

The other options include junior Codi Boek, who played the 2007 season as the starting quarterback at American River Junior College after beginning his collegiate career at Idaho State in 2006. Redshirt freshman Justin Tuggle, who earned Greater Atlanta All-Area honors as a senior quarterback, will have an opportunity, as will Billy Flutie, who played quarterback in high school but has played wide receiver and served as backup punter since his arrival at BC two years ago. True freshman Michael Marscovetra, who was ranked as the No. 1 quarterback in New Jersey by ESPN, will also get a shot.


OFFENSIVE LINE

Last season's offensive line was a work in progress in the beginning of the season but grew into a strength. Anthony Castonzo moved from right tackle to left, Thomas Claiborne was a defensive lineman who moved to the right guard spot, and Rich Lapham came off the bench in nine games the previous season.

This year will be a different story for this group as the only loss was Cliff Ramsey at left guard. Center Matt Tennant has anchored the line for the last two seasons and Castonzo has started every game since he arrived on campus. Castonzo was a College Football News All-Sophomore first-team selection and All-ACC second-team selection. The four returning starters lined up to start all 14 games in 2008, so chemistry inside the group should be a strong suit.

The offensive line paved the way for the second-most-prolific true freshman running back tandem in the nation. Josh Haden and Montel Harris combined for 106 yards per game.

TIGHT ENDS

The loss of All-ACC tight end Ryan Purvis would be a much bigger blow, but sophomore Lars Anderson proved himself as a capable starter at the position. He finished the season with nine catches for 84 yards and a touchdown. His biggest play came at NC State, when he scampered for 36 yards to set up the game-winning touchdown drive with time expiring.

Junior Jordon McMichael will be competing for time as well. He caught a nine-yard touchdown pass last season from Billy Flutie on a fake field goal vs. Maryland to help to the Eagles advance to the ACC Championship Game. Redshirt freshman Chris Pantale impressed in spring drills.

WIDE RECEIVERS

The Eagles will miss departed senior Brandon Robinson, who will go down as one of the most consistent wide receivers in recent memory, but a solid corps returns. Senior Rich Gunnell caught a team-high 49 passes and four touchdowns with 551 yards. He also returned punts and brought one back 65 yards for a score vs. Virginia Tech.

Justin Jarvis caught 25 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns last season and will work for the other starting job. The tall Ifeanyi Momah will look to prove that he can be more than just a situational receiver while Clarence Megwa is working to return from a broken leg he suffered in the Clemson game last year. Colin Larmond, Jr. is an athletic receiver who played as a true freshman and could also compete for a starting job.

RUNNING BACKS

BC featured one of the best true freshman running back duos in the country last season with Josh Haden and Montel Harris. The two combined for 106 yards per game, which was second-best true freshman total in the country.

Harris, who was not offered a scholarship until two weeks before signing day, exploded onto the scene and became the most productive true freshman tailback ever at BC. He had a rookie record five 100-yard rushing games and a total of 900 yards on the year.

The Eagles hope fullback James McCluskey can return after suffering an Achilles injury. Mainly used in short-yardage situations, he picked up 84 yards on 23 carries with a touchdown. Junior Jarick Walker is in the mix to see playing time at the fullback position as well.

The obvious concern for the Eagles will be in the middle of the line, trying to replace first-round draft pick BJ Raji and second-round pick Ron Brace. The Eagles have some options in the front as a multitude of players gained valuable experience.

Alex Albright, arguably BC's best pass rusher, returns after being forced to sit out 2008 with a neck injury. Austin Giles replaced him and started 12 games at left end. Jim Ramella started all 14 games on the other end and returns for his senior season.

Damik Scafe, Nick Rossi and Brendan Deska were each second-stringers at the tackle position and look to be the early favorites to replace the NFL-bound tandem. The Eagles also signed a pair of defensive tackles in the offseason, including four-star recruit Dillon Quinn, who could make an immediate splash. Other players on the line who will see significant time and battle for a starting job include Kaleb Ramsey and Max Holloway.

The Eagle linebacking corps – indeed, the entire team – suffered a severe blow when All-America linebacker Mark Herzlich disclosed he is suffering from cancer and will likely miss the entire 2009 season. Herzlich was the reigning ACC Defensive Player of the Year and will be sorely missed.

The Eagles also await the fate of 2008 co-captain Mike McLaughlin at middle linebacker. McLaughlin suffered an Achilles injury and hopes to make it back in time for fall drills, but his recovery process is still ongoing. McLaughlin missed the spring season.

The Eagles also lost the services of departed seniors Brian Toal and Robert Francois, but Will Thompson saw significant time behind Francois after Toal lost the season to a broken leg. Others who will compete for playing time include Darius Bagan, Mike Morrissey and Jarick Walker.

BC's secondary was one of the stingiest in the country last season and its 26 interceptions proved it. That number was tied with Florida for the most in the country. Even though the Eagles lose Paul Anderson, who had six of those picks, there are more options.

DeLeon Gause and Roderick Rollins both started a majority of the games at cornerback and a pair of true freshmen also impressed. Donnie Fletcher may have played his way into a starting role and Isaac Johnson also saw significant playing time. Fletcher played well enough that he earned four starts when Gause went down with a high ankle sprain.

The experience deep will be a huge asset in the secondary as Marcellus Bowman and Wes Davis will most likely be the returning starters. Davis started at free safety while Bowman backed up Anderson and earned a pair of starts when Davis went down with an injury. Dominick LeGrande will see a significant amount of playing time.

The Eagles ranked seventh in the nation in pass efficiency defense (98.81) last season and 18th in pass defense (176.93).

The Eagles will rely heavily on their experienced team of specialists with kicker Steve Aponavicius coming back for his senior year. He went 14-for-21 on field goals last season. Challenging him for the job will be newcomer Nate Freese, who has a big leg. He was rated the No. 11 kicker by the Korneblue Kicking School and kicked a school-record 52-yard field goal. He is a first-team All-State player out of Ohio.

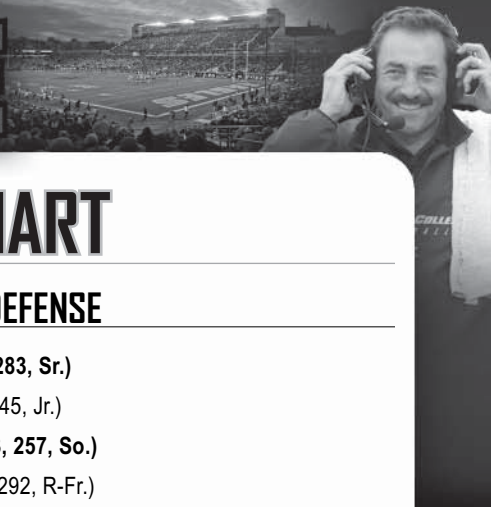
Ryan Quigley and Billy Flutie both return to their punting duties. Quigley serves as the main punter and had a strong freshman campaign, averaging 39.6 yards per kick with nine pinned inside the 20-yard-line. Flutie was used in short situations and pinned opponents inside the 20 seven times.

The unheralded long snapper Jack Geiser also returns. Geiser has been a vital part of the special teams unit for the past three seasons.
