16 STRAIGHT WINS

Boston College has won each of the last **16** games, a win streak that is currently the longest among all Division I teams. BC's win streak is the longest win streak in the **Jerry York** era (1994-present). During its win streak, BC has captured **4** shutouts and **6** one-goal victories. BC has held its opponent to 2 goals or fewer in 15 of the last 16 games. Junior goaltender **Parker Milner** has started each of the last 16 games. He has stopped 418-of-437 shots faced for a **1.17** goals against average and a **.957** save percentage during this stretch. Freshman forward **Johnny Gaudreau** (11 goals, 11 assists) has a team-high 22 points, while junior wing **Chris Kreider** (8 goals, 10 assists) has 18 points during the team's 16-game win streak.

BC & the NCAA TOURNAMENT

The 2012 tournament marks the 31st time the Eagles have earned an NCAA Tournament berth. It is the team's 13th berth in the last 15 years. BC ranks fourth all-time in NCAA appearances. BC has a **42-38** all-time record in the national tournament. Head coaches **Snooks Kelley** and **Len Ceglarski** both led BC to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, while **Jerry York** has led BC to 13 NCAA Tournaments in the last 15 seasons.

JERRY YORK & the NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Head coach **Jerry York** has led his teams to 19 NCAA Tournament berths -- six at Bowling Green and 13 at Boston College.
- York has a **34-19-1** all-time record in the NCAA Tournament and owns a **29-9** mark at Boston College.
- York's 34 wins are the highest total in NCAA Division I history.
- Eleven York-led teams have advanced to the tournament's semifinal/championship round.

BC at DCU CENTER

The Eagles are **9-1** in the DCU Center during that span, earning playoff victories over Maine (2001), Mercyhurst (2005), Miami (2006), Boston University (2006), Minnesota (2008), Miami (2008), Alaska-Fairbanks (2010), Yale (2010) and Air Force (2012).

MARCH MADNESS

In the last 16 seasons dating back to 1997-98 when coach **Jerry York** led his first (of 13) Boston College teams to the NCAA Tournament, the Eagles have a **82-18-4** record in the month of March (.802 win percentage).

WORCESTER, Mass. (March 24, 2012) - Junior **Chris Kreider** scored two goals and junior **Parker Milner** stopped 20 shots to lead Boston College to a 2-0 win over Falcons on Saturday in the NCAA Northeast Regional. Kreider made it 1-0 just 7:39 into the game on a nice fed from **Kevin Hayes**, who swung around the net and slipped a pass in front. Kreider one-timed it past Torf. His power-play goal with 1:21 left in regulation sealed the win. It was the 16th straight win for the Eagles, and came with a similar pattern. BC has allowed two or fewer goals 15 times during its winning streak. The Eagles, the tourney's overall No. 1 seed, captured the Hockey East regular season and tournament championships. Air Force did the same in its league – the Atlantic Hockey Association. BC, which improved to 9-1 all-time in Worcester, has won all six meetings between the schools.

Summary: Five players scored one goal apiece and Parker Milner recorded 17 saves to lead BC to a 5-2 victory over Michigan State. The Eagles enjoyed three one-goal leads – at 1-0, 2-1 and 3-2 – before scoring twice in the game's final five minutes for the 5-2 final. Sophomore Patrick Brown scored his first collegiate goal in the second period while freshman Destry Straight tallied his first career assist. Three freshmen forwards made their collegiate debuts – Johnny Gaudreau, Danny Linell and Straight. BC improved to 13-5 in season-opening games under head coach Jerry York.

Summary: Linemates Johnny Gaudreau, Pat Mullane and Steven Whitney accounted for nine points – four goals and five assists – and Parker Milner made 22 saves to lead fifth-ranked Boston College to a 6-2 win over third-ranked North Dakota for the 2011 Ice Breaker Tournament title. Gaudreau tallied a game-high four points on a goal and three assists while Mullane had a career-high three points. Bill Arnold also enjoyed a career night, totaling three points while Chris Kreider scored his second goal in as many nights and earned the tournament's most valuable player award. Milner, Kreider, Arnold and defensemen Patch Alber and Tommy Cross each earned Ice Breaker All-Tournament honors.

Summary: Barry Almeida and Kevin Hayes each tallied two points on one goal and one assist to lead top-ranked Boston College, but the host Eagles surrendered three goals through two periods and an empty-net score with 38 seconds remaining in the third period and fell to third-ranked Denver, 4-2, before a sellout crowd of 7,884 fans in Kelley Rink. Hayes, who tallied the primary assist on Almeida's first-period power-play goal that tied the score at 1-1 at 6:05, brought BC to within one goal – at 2-1 – with 2:47 left in the second period.
