### Last Time Out

BOSTON (March 19, 2011) - Junior Cam Atkinson scored twice in the third period and senior John Muse stopped 35 shots to lead top-seeded Boston College to a 5-3 victory over No. 4 seed Merrimack in the title game of the 27th annual Hockey East Championship Saturday night at the TD Garden. With the win, the Eagles (30-7-1) captured their second straight and conference-record 10th Hockey East title in their 15th appearance in the finals. Atkinson earned the Hockey East Championship's Bill Flynn Most Valuable Player award. He was joined on the All-Championship Team by teammates Brian Gibbons, Tommy Cross and Muse.

Boston College maintained its position - at No. 2 - in both the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com polls after capturing the Hockey East Tournament title ... BC is 22-2-1 since a 5-3 loss at Merrimack on Nov. 26.

### Series Info

BC and Colorado College have met 17 times in school history, including three times in NCAA Tournament play. The Eagles hold a 12-4-1 advantage in the all-time series, including a 2-0-0 record under head coach Jerry York. BC has won two of three meetings in the national tournament. The teams split two meetings in consecutive seasons in the 1949 and 1950 NCAA Championship and the Eagles captured a 6-1 win over the Tigers on March 29, 1998 in the NCAA East Regional in Pepsi Arena ... Friday's game against Colorado College will mark the first meeting since Dec. 27, 1998 when the Eagles earned a 5-3 win over the Tigers in the opening round of the Denver Cup inside McNichols Sports Arena.

## BC in Brief

### OFFENSE

*Goals Per Game (National Rank): 3.92 (3rd)*

- The team leads its conference and ranks third nationally with an average of 3.92 goals per game.
- Cam Atkinson has 30 goals in 38 games and ranks tied for fourth in the country in goals per game.
- Atkinson was a unanimous selection to the All-Conference first team.
- Atkinson is the first BC player since current Montreal Canadiens captain Brian Gionta (2000-01) to notch back-to-back 30-goal seasons.
- Brian Gibbons has tallied multiple-point performances 13 times in 38 games this winter and has at least one point in 33 (of 38) games. He is a two-time All-Hockey East honoree.

### DEFENSE

*Goals Per Game (National Rank): 2.26 (6th)*

- Goaltender John Muse has started 33 of 38 games and ranks eighth nationally in save percentage (.926) and 10th nationally in goals against average (2.13). He has 30 or more saves in 11 games. He earned All-Conference first-team honors.
- Four sophomores - Patrick Wey (+22), Brian Dumoulin (+21), Philip Samuelsson (+18) and Patch Alber (+17) - lead BC's blueliners in the plus-minus category.
- Brian Dumoulin ranks tied for sixth in scoring among all defensemen in college hockey with 33 points - three goals and 30 assists. He led all Hockey East defensemen in scoring with 23 points - two goals and 21 assists - in 27 conference games, earned the league's best defensive defenseman honor and was a unanimous selection to the All-Hockey East first team.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

*Penalty-Kill Rate (National Rank): 86.9 (4)*

- Boston College went 10-for-14 on the penalty kill over the last two games and owns an 86.9 percent kill rate this season (193-for-222), which is the fourth-best kill rate in college hockey.
- Brian Gibbons (4-2--9) and Cam Atkinson (4-2--6) lead a total of six BC players who have scored the team's 13 shorthanded goals this winter.
- Boston College has scored two shorthanded goals in a game twice this winter - against Northeastern (Feb. 18) and New Hampshire (March 4).

*Power-Play Percentage (National Rank): 24.0 (6th)*

- The team leads its conference and ranks sixth nationally with a 24.0 percent success rate (44-for-183).
- BC's power play went 4-for-10 in the last two games.
- The team's power play has connected for at least one goal in eight straight games.
- Cam Atkinson (8-8--16), Joe Whitney (0-16--16), Brian Gibbons (8-7--15), Pat Mullane (4-10--14), Brian Dumoulin (2-11--13) and Jimmy Hayes (4-7--11) have all recorded double-digit point totals while skating with a man advantage.

## Head Coach Jerry York

### Jerry York, Head Coach, 39th Season

Jerry York is in his 39th season as a head coach and his 17th season at Boston College. He is the second winningest coach in NCAA history and first among active Division I coaches ... In the last 13 seasons, York has guided the Eagles to three national championships - 2001, 2008 and 2010; nine Frozen Four berths - 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2010; seven Hockey East Tournament titles - 1998, 1999, 2001, 2005, 2007, 2008 and 2010; and four Hockey East regular-season trophies - 2000-01, 2002-03, 2003-04 and 2004-05 ... Individually, York has guided 33 players to All-America first-team honors, including 2000 Hobey Baker Award winner Mike Mottau and 2008 USA Hockey College Player of the Year Nathan Gerbe ... York is a 1967 graduate of Boston College where he was a three-year letterman and earned All-America and All-New England first-team honors in 1966-67. He was the 1966-67 recipient of the Walter Brown Award as the top American-born player in New England and scored 134 points - 64 goals and 70 assists - in his 81-game collegiate career.

### Mike Cavanaugh, Assoc. Head Coach, 16th Season

Associate head coach Mike Cavanaugh is in his 16th season on the BC staff and his seventh as associate head coach. During his tenure at the Heights, Cavanaugh has established himself as one of the nation's finest assistant coaches. He has played an integral role in implementing the program's recruiting strategy that has produced 17 All-Americans, including 2000 Hobey Baker Award recipient Mike Mottau and 2008 USA Hockey College Player of the Year Nathan Gerbe. In his 15 years, 22 BC players have gone on to play in the National Hockey League.

### Greg Brown, Assistant Coach, Seventh Season

Assistant coach Greg Brown is now in his seventh season on the BC staff. Brown began his coaching career in 2004 after completing a 12-year professional playing career. Brown works closely with the team's defensemen and has worked extensively with BC's special teams, particularly the power play. In his tenure, he has played an important role in BC's recent team successes that include four Hockey East Tournament titles, four Frozen Fours and two national championships (2008 & 2010). Since his arrival, eight players have earned All-America honors.

### Jim Logue, Assistant Coach, 18th Season

Former Eagle Jim Logue is in his 18th season as a coach at Boston College. Logue, who starred in net for the Eagles from 1959-61, came to the Heights from Salem State where he served as an assistant coach for the 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons. Logue works closely with the Eagles' goaltenders, molding several into elite goaltenders, most notably Cory Schneider, a 2006-07 first-team All-America goalie. A member of the BC Varsity Club Hall of Fame, Logue's hockey excellence was further recognized in 1999 when he was one of the initial three former players whose BC jersey was retired.

## Quick Hits

- Boston College 30-7-1 this winter, including a 13-1-1 record at home.
- Seven of the team's last 11 games have been decided by one goal (or ended in a draw). BC is 9-1-1 during this 11-game stretch. It is 9-3-1 in games decided by one goal (or fewer) this winter.
- Sophomore center Pat Mullane leads all Boston College centers in win percentage from the faceoff circle. The 5-foot-11, 188-pound forward has registered a 60.2 percent win percentage this winter.
- Boston College is the youngest team among the 49 teams in Division I college hockey reporting birthdates with an average age of 20 years, 297 days as of New Year's Day 2011.
- Boston College finished the conference regular season with a 20-6-1 record and is the first team to capture 20 Hockey East wins in conference play since the league adopted a 27-game schedule prior to the 2005-06 campaign.
- Cam and Tommy Atkinson, Joe and Steven Whitney, and Jimmy and Kevin Hayes are the 13th, 14th and 15th pairs of brothers to play hockey on the same team at Boston College.
- Three players - defenseman Brian Dumoulin, forward Chris Kreider and defenseman Patrick Wey - were among the 22 skaters that were named to the 2011 U.S. National Junior Team and competed at the IIHF World Junior Championship, Dec. 26, 2010 - Jan. 5, 2011, in Buffalo and Niagara, N.Y. It marks the first time since 2006 when Dan Bertram competed for Canada and Nathan Gerbe and Cory Schneider played for Team USA that three Eagles are participating in World Junior Championship play. It also marks the first time since the 1998 tournament that three Eagles represented the U.S. BC had four players - Jeff Farkas, Brian Gionta, Mike Mottau and Bobby Allen - on the 1998 U.S. Junior National Team.
- Ben Smith, assistant captain of the 2009-10 Boston College hockey team, made his NHL debut with the Chicago Blackhawks on Oct. 29, 2010, while Stephen Gionta, assistant captain of the 2005-06 Eagle squad, made his NHL debut with the New Jersey Devils on Nov. 5, 2010. Smith and Gionta join Benn Ferriero, who was recalled to the San Jose Sharks on Nov. 6, to represent the 15th, 16th and 17th former Eagles to have played in the NHL this season, joining regulars Andrew Alberts (Vancouver), Brian Boyle (NY Rangers), Scott Clemmensen (Florida), Patrick Eaves (Detroit), Nathan Gerbe (Buffalo), Brian Gionta (Montreal), Peter Harrold (Los Angeles), Chuck Kobasew (Minnesota), Mike Mottau (NY Islanders), Brooks Orpik (Pittsburgh), Marty Reasoner (Florida), Cory Schneider (Vancouver), Rob Scuderi (Los Angeles) and Ryan Shannon (Ottawa).

### 17 Of 21 Lettermen Return

With the loss of four lettermen - defenseman Carl Sneep and forwards Matt Price, Matt Lombardi and Ben Smith - Boston College returns the bulk of its squad in 2010-11. The 24-man roster features 17 returning letterwinners - two goaltenders, six defensemen and nine forwards. The group helped Boston College to a 29-10-3 overall record, including a 16-8-3 mark in Hockey East play, during a season in which the Eagles earned the Beanpot title, the Hockey East Tournament title and the NCAA Championship.

### The Captains

Boston College elected senior forward Joe Whitney as captain of the 2010-11 Eagle entry. Senior forward Brian Gibbons and junior defenseman Tommy Cross were elected as assistant captains.

### Eagles Chosen As 2010-11 League Preseason Favorite

Boston College has been chosen as the unanimous preseason favorite to win the Hockey East Association regular-season title, according to the Hockey East Coaches' Poll. BC earned nine first-place votes and a total of 90 points. Maine was picked second with 80 points, just four points ahead of New Hampshire. Boston University and Northeastern rounded out the top five selections. The announcement marks the 10th time in the last 13 seasons that the Eagles have been selected as the preseason favorite, or co-favorite, to win the conference crown. BC enters the 2010-11 campaign having captured last year's national title - its fourth national championship in program history. Last winter also marked program's third national championship under head coach Jerry York. York and the Eagles return 17 lettermen from last year's 29-win club.

### Hockey East History

The Eagles have won five of the last seven Hockey East Tournament titles. Overall, BC has posted a 54-23-2 record in the Hockey East Tournament. Boston College has won 10 conference championships, the highest total in Hockey East. BC's league tournament titles came in 1987, 1990, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2011. Under head coach Jerry York, Boston College is 46-11-1 in the Hockey East Tournament. The Eagles have won eight titles - 1998, 1999, 2001, 2005, 207, 2008, 2010 and 2011 - in 11 championship games under York.

### A Glance Back at 2009-10

Boston College finished with a 29-10-3 overall record, including a 16-8-3 mark in Hockey East play. The Eagles earned the Beanpot title, the Hockey East Tournament title and the NCAA Division I championship. As the top seed in the Northeast Regional, BC defeated Alaska in the first round and Yale in the quarterfinals to advance to the Frozen Four in Detroit, Mich., the program's fourth Frozen Four in five years. There, the team defeated Miami 7-1 in the semifinals and earned the school's fourth NCAA title with a 5-0 victory over Wisconsin in the championship game. Junior Brian Gibbons captured All-Conference first-team honors, sophomore Cam Atkinson earned All-Conference second-team accolades and Chris Kreider and Brian Dumoulin earned All-Conference Rookie Team recognition. Atkinson led the nation with 30 goals.

The junior goaltender has started 33 games this season and 143 in his career ... he is 27-5-1 with a 2.13 goals against average and a .926 save percentage this season and is 89-38-16 with a 2.36 goals against average and a .916 save percentage in his career ... he has recorded 30 or more saves 12 times this season, including a season-high 38 saves in a 4-1 home win over Maine (11/21) ... he made at least 30 saves in six-of-nine games to open his senior season and stopped more than 30 shots in recent victories over Northeastern (3/18) and Merrimack (3/19) in the Hockey East Tournament semifinal and final rounds ... ### Muse & the Hockey East Tournament

Muse, a three-time Hockey East Tournament Team honoree, concluded his career with a 13-1 record, a 2.35 goals against average and a .932 save percentage in 14 Hockey East Tournament games. The East Falmouth, Mass., resident led BC to three league tournament titles (2008, 2010 and 2011). Muse finished two wins short of the all-time Hockey East Tournament wins record held by former Eagle Scott Clemmensen (1998-2001).

### Muse & the NCAA Tournament

Muse is 8-0 with a 1.95 goals against average and a .930 save percentage in eight career NCAA Tournament games, back-stopping the Eagles to national championships as a freshman (2008) and junior (2010). He earned 2008 NCAA wins over Minnesota and Miami (Ohio) in Worcester, Mass., and North Dakota and Notre Dame in Denver, Colo. Muse led BC to 2010 NCAA wins over Alaska and Yale in Worcester, Mass., and Miami (Ohio) and Wisconsin in Detroit, Mich.

### Muse in the Postseason

In 21 career postseason games, Muse is 20-1 with a 2.00 goals against average and a .931 save percentage. He has back-stopped the Eagles to three league tournament titles, two NCAA Frozen Four appearances and two national titles - as a freshman in 2008 and as a junior in 2010.
