2007 NCAA REGIONALS

Michigan, Minnesota and Ohio State were selected to participate in the 2007 NCAA Baseball Championship, the NCAA announced on Monday. Three teams is the most the conference has sent since 2000, when Illinois, Minnesota and Penn State received tournament berths.

The Wolverines (39-16) will be making their third-consecutive NCAA appearance and 20th overall, coming in as the No. 2 seed in the Nashville Regional. The regular-season Big Ten Champion, Michigan will open competition against Memphis (36-25) on Friday. No. 1 overall seed Vanderbilt (51-11) and the Commodores' Hawkins Field will serve as host of the regional, while fourth-seeded Austin Peay (39-20) rounds out the field in Nashville.

The Golden Gophers (40-16) are making their Big Ten-leading 28th NCAA appearance, entering the field as the No. 3 seed in the San Diego Regional. Minnesota will square off against second-seeded Cal State Fullerton (33-23) on Friday. San Diego (43-16), the overall eight seed in the tournament, and Tony Gwynn Stadium will host the regional, with fourth-seeded Fresno State (36-27) completing the four-team bracket.

Big Ten Tournament Champion Ohio State (37-22) received the conference's automatic bid and is making its first NCAA trip since 2005 as the No. 3 seed in the College Station, Texas Regional. The Buckeyes begin play on Friday against second-seeded Louisiana-Lafayette (43-15). Texas A&M (44-16) and Olsen Field will serve as host of the regional, which also includes fourth-seeded Le Moyne (34-17).

The opening weekend of the NCAA Championship features 16 four-team regionals playing double-elimination format. Regional play runs from June 1-5, with the 16 winners advancing to the next round of competition. The eight two-team super regional sites will be determined on Monday, June 4, with play scheduled for June 8-11 in a best-of-three series. The Men's College World Series will take place June 15-25, at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb.

2007 AWARDS & HONORS

BIG TEN POSTSEASON AWARDS

On the afternoon before the first pitch of the conference tournament, the Big Ten Conference office announced the 2007 Baseball All-Big Ten teams and individual awards, recognizing Illinois catcher **Lars Davis** as Player of the Year and Ohio State's **Cory Luebke** as Pitcher of the Year. The conference also handed out awards to Purdue's **Matt Bischoff** as Freshman of the Year and Michigan's **Rich Maloney** as Coach of the Year. All awards were voted on by the coaches.

Davis, a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes and Johnny Bench awards, is the seventh Illini to receive the award and the second in the last three years as Drew Davidson was honored in 2005. During the regular season, the junior racked up a conference-leading 13 home runs in all games played for a Big Ten-best .673 slugging percentage. Davis also led his team in virtually every offensive category, including average (.416), runs (53), RBI (56) and on-base percentage (.473). The backstop also gunned down 23 would-be base stealers from behind the plate.

Luebke is the fifth Buckeye to be honored as the conference's top pitcher and the first to win the award since Scott Lewis took home the honors in 2003. In regular-season games this year, the junior put up a 1.94 ERA and held opponents to a stingy .215 batting average. The Big Ten's 2007 strikeout king, Luebke fanned 50 batters through 56.1 innings of work in the conference season while walking just 24 batters. In the regular season, the left-hander recorded a WHIP (walks-plus-hits-per-innings pitched) of 1.06 and struck out an average of eight batters per nine innings while putting together a strikeouts-to-walks ratio of 3.45. Luebke finished the regular-season schedule with a 7-1 overall record and went 3-1 in conference.

Bischoff, the first Boilermaker in history to receive Freshman of the Year honors, sat among Big Ten leaders in nearly every pitching category during the regular season. The freshman compiled a 2.85 ERA in all games played and held opponents to a .243 batting average on the season. The right-hander was fourth in the conference with 61 strikeouts during the regular season - 27 of which came looking. Bischoff finished the regular season 3-2 in 14 appearances, including six starts.

Maloney led his 2007 squad to the program's 34th all-time conference title and its second consecutive crown, putting together a 21-7 record in Big Ten play. The Wolverines finished the regular season 39-14 overall and were ranked as high as 16th in the Baseball America Top 25 on back-to-back weeks (April 30 and May 7). Michigan reached 13th in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Poll on April 30, marking the highest rating for a Big Ten team this season. Maloney is in his fifth year as head coach of the Maize and Blue.

The 2007 All-Big Ten first team includes 13 different players from seven schools and one multiple honoree. Michigan's **Zach Putnam** became the first player in Big Ten history to make the first team in two positions in the same year as he was honored as a designated hitter and a starting pitcher. The sophomore was a second-team pitcher in 2006. Also on the 2007 first team, Purdue's **Ryne White** was a unanimous selection at first base after earning a spot on the second team last year, and Ohio State's Luebke earned a unanimous first-team bid after making the third team in 2006. Minnesota's **Mike Mee** was a unanimous selection in the outfield, and was joined by teammates **Matt Nohelty** (OF) and **Nate Hanson** (3B) on the first team.

To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten selection, student-athletes must be letterwinners in at least their second academic year at their institution and carry a career grade-point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better. 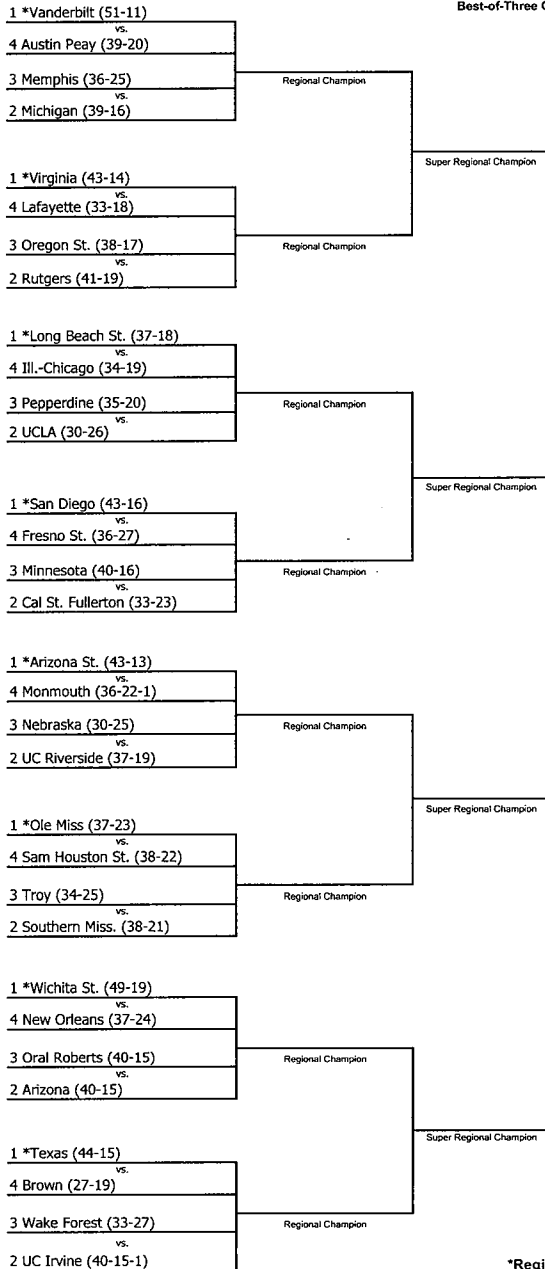

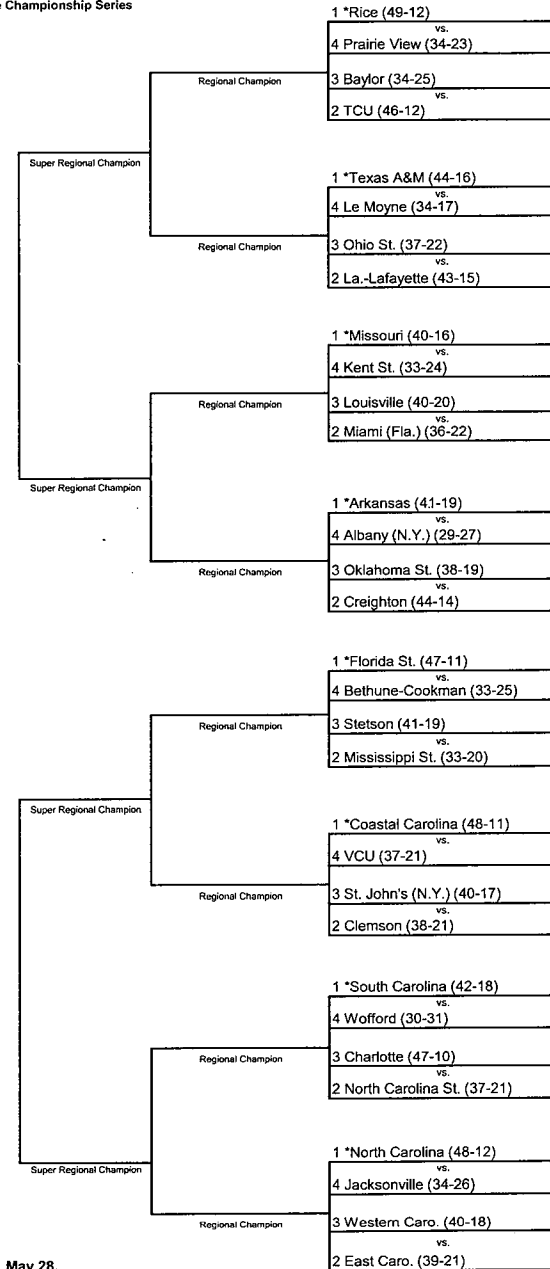
