2007 SEASON IN REVIEW

Michigan became the first Big Ten team since 2003 to advance to NCAA Super Regionals, but the Wolverines saw their postseason cut short, dropping two games to defending national champion Oregon State, the eventual winner of the 2007 Men's College World Series.

One of three conference teams to earn a bid to the NCAA Championship, Michigan pulled off an upset over top-ranked Vanderbilt in the regional finals when a solo home run off the bat of freshman **Alan Oaks** broke a 4-4 tie in the 10th inning. The long ball was Oaks' second of the season and came at the expense of Commodore ace David Price, the first overall selection in the 2007 MLB draft.

In Game 1 of super-regional action, Michigan sophomore **Zach Putnam** held the Beavers hitless through 8.2 innings, but an RBI single in the ninth was all Oregon State needed to earn the 1-0 win and take a one-game lead in the best-of-three series. Wolverine pitching struggled in Game 2, giving up eight runs as U-M saw its season end with an 8-2 loss. Michigan senior **Eric Rose** belted solo home runs in his final two collegiate at-bats to provide the Wolverines' only offense.

The regional title was the first for the Wolverines since 1984 when they advanced to the World Series, which also marks the most recent appearance by any Big Ten team. The conference had not advanced a team to super regionals since 2003 when Ohio State swept through the Auburn Region.

Michigan received an at-large bid into the NCAA Championship after posting a 39-16 record in the regular season. The Wolverines compiled a 21-7 conference mark to earn the Big Ten regular-season title. Minnesota finished second in the conference standings and compiled an overall mark of 40-16 to earn its conference-leading 28th NCAA invitation. Ohio State earned its national bid after becoming the first six seed in history to win the Big Ten Tournament, automatically qualifying for NCAAs. Three teams marked the most conference representatives to the national championship since 2000.

Michigan finished the year ranked No. 18 in the final ESPN/USA Today coaches poll and No. 20 in the final National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) poll, marking the highest end-of-season placement for a Big Ten team since Ohio State came in at No. 17 following the 2003 season. The Buckeyes and Golden Gophers each received votes outside the top 30 in the NCBWA's final rankings.

2007 MLB DRAFT

Twenty-four Big Ten baseball players representing each of the conference's 10 teams were taken in the 2007 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, June 7-8.

Ohio State's **Cory Luebke**, the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, was the first conference standout to be selected as he was taken in the supplemental first round by the San Diego Padres with the 63rd overall pick. Illinois' **Lars Davis**, the Big Ten Player of the Year, was also taken on Day 1 of the draft, going to the Colorado Rockies in the third round with the 102nd overall selection.

Penn State had more draftees than any other Big Ten team with five selections, including right-handed pitcher **Drew O'Neil**, who went in the eighth round to Cincinnati with pick No. 259. Ohio State was second with four selections, while Iowa and Minnesota each had three. Illinois, Michigan and Michigan State each had two representatives drafted, and Indiana, Northwestern and Purdue each had one.

Twelve All-Big Ten team members were taken in this year's draft, including first-team honorees Davis of Illinois, **Jason White** and **Travis Sweet** of Iowa, **Mike Mee** of Minnesota, Luebke of Ohio State, and O'Neil and **Craig Clark** of Penn State.

2007 AWARDS & HONORS

BIG TEN POSTSEASON AWARDS

On the afternoon before the first pitch of the conference tournament, the Big Ten Conference office announced the 2007 Baseball All-Big Ten teams and individual awards, recognizing Illinois catcher **Lars Davis** as Player of the Year and Ohio State's **Cory Luebke** as Pitcher of the Year. The conference also handed out awards to Purdue's **Matt Bischoff** as Freshman of the Year and Michigan's **Rich Maloney** as Coach of the Year. All awards were voted on by the coaches.

Davis, a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes and Johnny Bench awards, is the seventh Illini to receive the award and the second in the last three years as Drew Davidson was honored in 2005. During the regular season, the junior racked up a conference-leading 13 home runs in all games played for a Big Ten-best .673 slugging percentage. Davis also led his team in virtually every offensive category, including average (.416), runs (53), RBI (56) and on-base percentage (.473). The backstop also gunned down 23 would-be base stealers from behind the plate.

Luebke is the fifth Buckeye to be honored as the conference's top pitcher and the first to win the award since Scott Lewis took home the honors in 2003. In regular-season games this year, the junior put up a 1.94 ERA and held opponents to a stingy .215 batting average. The Big Ten's 2007 strikeout king, Luebke fanned 50 batters through 56.1 innings of work in the conference season while walking just 24 batters. In the regular season, the left-hander recorded a WHIP (walks-plus-hits-per-innings pitched) of 1.06 and struck out an average of eight batters per nine innings while putting together a strikeouts-to-walks ratio of 3.45. Luebke finished the regular-season schedule with a 7-1 overall record and went 3-1 in conference.

Bischoff, the first Boilermaker in history to receive Freshman of the Year honors, sat among Big Ten leaders in nearly every pitching category during the regular season. The freshman compiled a 2.85 ERA in all games played and held opponents to a .243 batting average on the season. The right-hander was fourth in the conference with 61 strikeouts during the regular season - 27 of which came looking. Bischoff finished the regular season 3-2 in 14 appearances, including six starts.

Maloney led his 2007 squad to the program's 34th all-time conference title and its second consecutive crown, putting together a 21-7 record in Big Ten play. The Wolverines finished the regular season 39-14 overall and were ranked as high as 16th in the Baseball America Top 25 on back-to-back weeks (April 30 and May 7). Michigan reached 13th in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Poll on April 30, marking the highest rating for a Big Ten team this season. Maloney is in his fifth year as head coach of the Maize and Blue.

The 2007 All-Big Ten first team includes 13 different players from seven schools and one multiple honoree. Michigan's **Zach Putnam** became the first player in Big Ten history to make the first team in two positions in the same year as he was honored as a designated hitter and a starting pitcher. The sophomore was a second-team pitcher in 2006. Also on the 2007 first team, Purdue's **Ryne White** was a unanimous selection at first base after earning a spot on the second team last year, and Ohio State's Luebke earned a unanimous first-team bid after making the third team in 2006. Minnesota's **Mike Mee** was a unanimous selection in the outfield, and was joined by teammates **Matt Nohelty** (OF) and **Nate Hanson** (3B) on the first team.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

The Big Ten Conference recognized 84 of its baseball players with spots on the Academic All-Conference team. To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten selection, student-athletes must be letterwinners in at least their second academic year at their institution and carry a career grade-point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better.
