BIG TEN CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Mike Conley Jr., Ohio State

Fr., G, Indianapolis, Ind./Lawrence North

Conley shares his first Player of the Week accolade after averaging 18.5 points and 5.0 assists per game and leading the Buckeyes to a 2-0 record last week. The freshman guard tallied a career-high 23 points, while making 9-of-12 shots from the field (.750) in a 76-63 victory over Michigan. He also handed out six assists with just one turnover against the Wolverines. Conley then notched 14 points and four assists versus Purdue, while helping the Buckeyes remain unbeaten at home with a 16-0 mark this season. For the week, Conley shot 61 percent from the field (14-of-23) and 75 percent from the three-point line (3-of-4).

Alando Tucker, Wisconsin

Sr., F, Lockport, Ill./Lockport Township

Tucker was named Co-Player of the Week after averaging 22.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game last week. With a 21-point effort against Iowa, Tucker became the second Badger and the 23rd Big Ten standout to score 2,000 points. He is now only 128 points away from breaking UW's all-time scoring record held by Michael Finley (1992-95). Earlier in the week, the senior forward notched 24 points, while also eclipsing the 700-career rebound plateau with eight boards versus Penn State. Tucker, who currently ranks second in the conference with 19.1 points per game in Big Ten contests only, picks up his fifth career Big Ten weekly laurel as he was also honored on Jan. 29, 2007, Dec. 18, 2006, Feb. 20, 2006 and Nov. 21, 2005.

Big Ten Tournament

Top Attendance: With the return to Chicago in 2007, the Big Ten is back in the United Center, a facility that established several attendance records during the 2005 tournament. For the first time in the



nine-year history of the event, the Big Ten led the nation in tournament attendance in 2005. The conference tallied an average per session attendance of 21,850 at the United Center in Chicago. The Big Ten also set a pair of attendance records in the final two days of the 2005 tournament as the event attracted a single-session record of 23,697 in Saturday's semifinal before breaking the championship game attendance mark with 22,157 fans on Sunday.

BIG TEN NOTES

Tucker Eclipses 2,000-Point Mark: With a 21-point effort against Iowa on Saturday, Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** became the second Badger and 23rd player in Big Ten history to score at least 2,000 points in his career. Currently the senior forward has tallied 2,020 points and is now nearing UW's all-time scoring record held by Michael Finley, whose 2,147 points ranks 12th in conference annals. Tucker is also the first 2,000-point producer for the Big Ten since Indiana's A.J. Guyton tallied 2,100 points from 1997-00.

Top Freshmen Leaders: Ohio State freshman **Greg Oden** currently leads the Big Ten in rebounding (9.0 rpg) and blocked shots (3.64 bpg) in conference games only. Fellow teammate **Mike Conley Jr.** is the conference leader in assists with 6.45 dishes per game. Conley is also tied for first place in steals with two other top freshmen, Iowa's **Tyler Smith** and Purdue's **Chris Kramer**, who are also tallying 2.00 steals per contest in Big Ten games this year.

Making An Impact: Two Big Ten freshmen are currently leading their teams in scoring this season. Ohio State's **Greg Oden** is tallying a 15.3 scoring average in his first season in Columbus. He would be the first freshman to finish first in program history since Michael Redd tallied 21.9 points per game during the 1997-98 season. With his 12.7 ppg average, Northwestern's **Kevin Coble** is on pace to become just the fifth true-freshman to lead the Wildcats in scoring since the 1972-73 season when freshmen became eligible for varsity competition. Ben Johnson was the last freshman to claim NU's scoring title when he averaged 11.6 points per game during the 1999-00 season.

Race for Big Ten Supremacy: With just three weeks left in the Big Ten regular season, six teams are at or above .500 in conference play while the top two squads are tied for first place in the Big Ten standings. Wisconsin and Ohio State have both tallied 10-1 records in conference action, while Indiana follows in third place with a 7-3 record. Of the top three teams, the Hoosiers play four of their final six games away from Assembly Hall, while UW and OSU will hit the road for three of their final five contests. The Badgers face the toughest competition of the top three, as the combined record of their opponents is 22-30 (.423), including road tests at Michigan State and Ohio State. Iowa is in fourth place in the conference standings with a 6-5 record and will face three of its final five opponents at home. Illinois and Michigan are both .500 in conference play and the Wolverines have the toughest slate of the top six teams as their remaining opponents boast a .531 winning percentage.

In The Conference Lead: Wisconsin is 10-1 in conference play for the first time since the 1946-47 season when the Badgers tallied an 11-1 record and claimed the Big Ten title. Ohio State is also 10-1, marking the Buckeyes' best start in conference action since beginning the 1990-91 campaign with a 15-1 mark.

Haluska Earns Academic All-District Honors: Iowa's **Adam Haluska** has been selected to the 2006-07 CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District team. The senior guard has claimed All-District VII recognition for the third straight season and earned third-team Academic All-America honors as a junior last year. To be nominated, student-athletes must be a starter or important reserve and carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or higher. Haluska is now eligible for Academic All-America honors which will be announced in early March.

Big Ten Scoring Title Chase: Iowa's **Adam Haluska** remains in first place among the conference's scoring leaders with 21.7 points per game in Big Ten only contests, but is closely followed by Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** (19.1 ppg), who captured the Big Ten scoring title last season. If Haluska continues to lead the conference in scoring, he would be the first Hawkeye to accomplish that feat since Andre Woolridge in 1997.

Big Ten's Grand Company: Purdue's **Carl Landry** (1,008) became the latest Big Ten standout to break the 1,000 point barrier, tallying 13 points against Ohio State on Saturday. The senior forward is now the 10th active member of the 1,000-point club, joining Iowa's **Adam Haluska** (1,746), Michigan's **Lester Abram** (1,192), **Dion Harris** (1,461) and **Courtney Sims** (1,248), Ohio State's **Ron Lewis** (1,516), Purdue's **David Teague** (1,226), Penn State's **Geary Claxton** (1,148) and Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** (2,020) and **Kammron Taylor** (1,083). Minnesota's **Lawrence McKenzie** (926) is vying to become the next member of the conference's 1,000-point club.

NCAA RPI Rankings: The Big Ten has four teams in the top 40 of the RPI rankings which were released by the NCAA last Monday. Wisconsin leads the Big Ten contingent with a No. 4 ranking, while Ohio State (5th), Indiana (19th) and Michigan State (38th) round out the top 40.

Big Ten's Homecourt Records: Ohio State has the fifth-longest home winning streak in the country with 24 consecutive triumphs at Value City Arena while Wisconsin follows in ninth place with a 20-game home winning streak at the Kohl Center. Gonzaga leads the nation with a 50-game homecourt winning streak. The Buckeyes' last home loss was on Jan. 15, 2006, in double-overtime, 62-59, against the Spartans. Wisconsin's last loss at home occurred on Jan. 31, 2006, when the Badgers fell to No. 6/6 Illinois, 66-51. OSU and UW still trail the Big Ten record of 53 straight home triumphs set by Michigan State from 1998 to 2002 -- a winning streak that was ended by the Badgers.

Rebound Career Leaders: Not only did Michigan's **Brent Petway** (500) lead the Wolverines to an 82-80 victory over Minnesota on Saturday, he also claimed his 500th career rebound. Petway becomes the fifth Big Ten standout to reach the 500-rebound plateau, joining Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker**, who is the conference's active leader with 711 boards, along with Michigan's **Courtney Sims** (665), Penn State's **Geary Claxton** (574) and Iowa's **Adam Haluska** (516). Purdue's **David Teague** (491), Ohio State's **Ron Lewis** (484) and Michigan's **Lester Abram** (443) are also vying to break the 500-board barrier this year.

Big Ten Coaching Milestones: With a 149-103 record in his eighth season as the Iowa head coach, **Steve Alford** only needs one more victory to claim his 150th career victory in Iowa City. Penn State's **Ed DeChellis** is also in reach of hitting the 150th career victory plateau. Currently, DeChellis boasts a career mark of 146-163 in his 11th season.

Big Ten Hosts 2007 NCAA First/Second Round: The Big Ten will host the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds on Friday and Sunday, March 16 and 18, at the United Center in Chicago. It marks the third time in league history that the conference has played host to the NCAA Tournament as the Big Ten welcomed eight teams to the United Center in both 1998 and 2002. Ohio State will also host first and second rounds (March 16 and 18) at the Nationwide Arena in downtown Columbus.

Black History Month: The Big Ten announced the launch of its Black History Month website to commemorate the achievements of African-Americans on Big Ten campuses. During the month of February, the website, which can be accessed at www.bigten.org, will feature a story on a male and female student-athlete from each institution throughout the 28-day celebration. Former men's basketball standouts that will be featured are Illinois' **Kendall Gill**, Michigan State's **Magic Johnson** and Purdue's **Eugene Parker**.

CELEBRATING THE 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Winningest Coaches: Only five coaches boast winning percentages of .600 or better in Big Ten Tournament play, and three will be returning to the United Center in 2007. After claiming the 2006 Big Ten Tournament title, Iowa's **Steve Alford** leads all coaches in winning percentage with a record of 13-5 (.722). Illinois' **Bruce Weber** and former Illini coach **Bill Self** are tied for second place with a .714 winning percentage. Another former Illinois coach **Lon Kruger** ranks fourth (6-3; .667), while Ohio State's **Thad Matta** follows in fifth place with a 3-2 mark (.600). Alford leads all coaches with 13 triumphs, while Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** has tallied 10 victories and two titles in nine events.

Top Tourney Teams: Illinois leads the conference in winning percentage and total wins in Big Ten Tournament play with a record of 16-7 (.696) over nine years. That mark includes two tournament crowns and three second-place finishes. The Fighting Illini won the 2005 crown, the last time the tournament was held in Chicago. Iowa boasts the league's second-best winning percentage with a record of 13-7 (.650), including two tournament titles (2001 and 2006) while Michigan State follows in third place with a 10-7 mark (.588). The Spartans join the Illini and the Hawkeyes as the only two-time winners in the event after MSU claimed the 1999 and 2000 titles.

Throw Out The Records: History has shown that every team at the Big Ten Tournament will have a shot at leaving town with the title. Last year, Michigan State advanced to the semifinals as the No. 6 seed, defeating No. 3 Illinois before falling to second-seeded Iowa. In 2003, Ohio State advanced to the title game despite holding the No. 8 seed. In 2002, Iowa reached the finals as the ninth seed, just one season after becoming the lowest-seeded team to win the Big Ten Tournament, as the sixth-seeded Hawkeyes won four games in four days to earn the league's NCAA automatic berth in 2001. In addition to the magical runs of OSU and Iowa the last five years, the No. 4 seed has advanced to the finals three times. In only the last three years has the No. 1 and the No. 2 seed faced off in the championship final. Last season, No. 2 Iowa downed Ohio State, while No. 1 Illinois defeated second-seeded Wisconsin for the 2005 Tournament title. In 2004, the No. 2 Badgers defeated the No. 1 seeded Fighting Illini.

Native Sons Return to Chicago: The Big Ten Conference includes at least 22 men's basketball players from the state of Illinois, as six of the 11 schools carry at least one Illinois native on the roster. Illinois leads the conference with nine native sons while Northwestern can put as many as six in-state products on the floor. Indiana, Iowa, Purdue and Wisconsin each feature one player from Illinois. The five schools without an Illinois product on the team include Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Penn State.

All-Tournament Selections: Ohio State's **Jamar Butler** and Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** return after earning All-Tournament honors in past Big Ten Tournaments. Last year, Ohio State's Butler led the Buckeyes to a runner-up finish at the 2006 Big Ten Tournament, while earning All-Tournament accolades. Wisconsin's Tucker claimed All-Tourney laurels in 2005. Illinois leads the conference with eight All-Tournament selections, while Ohio State follows with seven honorees. Every Big Ten squad has placed at least one student-athlete on the All-Tournament team.

Credential Information: The 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament credential website is now online and available for media use. Please contact the Big Ten Communications office for access information to the website. After you have read and accepted the credential criteria and policies, the following web page will ask you to "Please select the Big Ten university you usually cover. If you do not cover a specific Big Ten school on a regular basis, select 'Other Media.'" **If your media agency normally covers a Big Ten team**, you must select that university when applying for credentials on the website. Upon filling out and submitting your credential application, you will receive an automated confirmation that your form has been received by that school's men's basketball SID. After the SID reviews your application, you will receive an acceptance or denial email. If you receive an acceptance email, your name will be added to that school's media list and **pending final approval of the Big Ten Conference**, will be approved for credentials. You do not need to contact the Big Ten Communications office to verify your credential approval. By February 23, you will receive additional tournament media information via email from the Big Ten Communications Department. The SIDs will also have a limited number of parking credentials to distribute in advance to their media outlets. **If your media agency does not normally cover a conference team**, just click on the "Media Type" drop-down box and select "Other Media" at the bottom of the list and follow the instructions noted above. If you discover that you need to make changes to your application after you submit it, please contact the men's basketball SID at the school you cover. Also if you cannot apply online, please contact our office to apply for credentials.

Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale: All-session tickets for the 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament, along with single-session tickets, went on sale to the general public on Friday, Dec. 1. All-session and single-session tickets for the men's tournament, which includes 10 games over four days, will be available at the United Center box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www.ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (312) 559-1212. The cost for men's tournament all-session tickets will be either \$150 or \$275 depending on seat location. Single-session tickets range from \$30 to \$85 based on seat location and session. Orders will be limited to 12 all-session tickets or 12 single-session tickets for each session.

BIG TEN NETWORK NEWS

Big Ten Network Unveils New Headquarters in Chicago: The Big Ten Network announced on Dec. 20 the official location for its studios and business offices in Chicago. The network will be headquartered in the historic Montgomery Ward building located in Chicago's Near North neighborhood. The Big Ten Network studios will be located in a 44,000 square-foot office space at 600 West Chicago, formerly the Montgomery Ward & Co. Catalog House.

The original section of the building was designated as a national historic landmark in 2000 for its significant role in American retail history. The space will include two studios and three control rooms as well as a 20,000 square-foot office space.

Silverman Named Big Ten Network President: The Big Ten Network announced on Dec. 5 that Mark Silverman will serve as the organization's first president. Silverman will manage the day-to-day operations of the network and will report to its Board of Directors. He comes to the Big Ten Network after serving as the general manager and senior vice president of ABC Cable Networks Group since April of 2004, managing the company's equity in such channels as Lifetime Television, A&E Network and the History Channel, each of which recorded their best financial performance in 2005. Silverman was also responsible for developing and launching new cable channels, shows and other key initiatives. He also served as the general manager of ABC Family Channel from 2003-04. Prior to joining ABC Family, Silverman was co-founder and president of Silverkings Media, a media/entertainment consulting company, from 2001-03, and senior vice president of Broadband Sports, an online sports content company, from 1999-2001. His previous experience also consists of various leadership roles with the Walt Disney Company from 1991-1999, including serving as vice president of business development for ABC, Inc., General Manager of ESPN Zone and vice president of Walt Disney Studios.

Big Ten Network Announces Branding Committee: On Oct. 25, the Big Ten Network announced the four individuals who will comprise its inaugural Branding Committee, a group which will provide oversight to preserve the integrity of the Big Ten Conference brand in all content provided through the network. The members of the Big Ten Network Branding Committee include Michigan State University President **Lou Anna K. Simon**, Northwestern University President **Henry S. Bienen**, Fox Networks Group President and Chief Executive Officer **Tony Vacciniera**, and Fox College Sports Executive Vice President and General Manager **David Rone**. The Branding Committee will serve as consultants to the Big Ten Network in developing and strengthen-



ing the network's brand and ensuring that the core values of the Big Ten Conference are reflected through all programming and advertising.

Big Ten Network Announces Board of Directors: On Oct. 19, the Big Ten Network announced the five individuals who will compose its first Board of Directors. This group will provide leadership and oversight for the network. The

members of the five-person Board of Directors include Big Ten Commissioner **James E. Delany**, Fox Regional Cable Sports Networks President **Randy Freer**, former Vice Chairman of PNC Bank and former chairman of the Board of Trustees of Penn State **Edward "Ted" Junker III**, Fox National Cable Sports Networks President **Bob Thompson** and New York Mets Chairman of the Board and CEO **Fred Wilpon**. The Board of Directors is responsible for providing strategic oversight and corporate governance for the network. The Board will develop the long-term vision of the network and will sustain the ongoing commitment to becoming a premier, nationally distributed channel.

Big Ten Network Set to Debut in August of 2007: Last June, the Big Ten announced a 20-year deal with Fox Cable Networks to create the Big Ten Network, a national network devoted to Big Ten athletic and academic programs, to launch in August of 2007. The Big Ten Network will carry many of the games and events previously available only through syndication and will be available to all carriers and distributors nationwide. In addition to traditional distribution through cable and satellite, select Big Ten Network content will also be available through alternative media platforms. Sports programming on the Big Ten Network will annually include, but is not limited to, 35-plus football games, at least 105 regular-season men's basketball games, at least 55 regular-season women's basketball games, Big Ten Championships and Tournaments, 170 Olympic sporting events and coverage from the conference's vast library of historic sporting events, including bowl games. In addition, each school will have the right to provide 60 hours of its own content annually. Fox has entered into a charter affiliation agreement with DIRECTV, which will carry the Big Ten Network at launch nationwide on Total Choice, which is received by more than 15.4 million households. The Big Ten Network will be majority-owned by the Big Ten Conference, with Fox holding a minority interest. The network will establish its studios and headquarters in Chicago, with Fox handling the administration and daily operations and the Big Ten establishing general guidelines regarding the types of programs and advertising to ensure consistency with the conference's brand values.
