BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

David Teague, Purdue

Sr., G, Indianapolis, Ind./Pike

Teague earns his first Player of the Week accolade after scoring a career-high 32 points and leading Purdue to an 81-68 victory over No. 24/19 Indiana last week. The senior guard was 11-of-18 from the floor (.611), while tallying six three pointers. Teague also added seven rebounds, two assists and two blocked shots against the Hoosiers. The Indianapolis, Ind., native has helped the Boilermakers win four of their last six games with their only losses coming against No. 2/2 Ohio State during that stretch. In the last three home games, Teague has connected on 10-of-15 shots from the three-point line. He currently ranks fourth in the conference in three-point field goal percentage (.473) and ninth in scoring (14.1 ppg).

NO. 1 AND NO. 2 IN THE POLLS

**Big Ten Nabs No. 1 and No. 2 in the Polls:** Wisconsin garnered the No. 1 ranking and Ohio State followed at No. 2 in the latest Associated Press Poll, while the Buckeyes claimed the top ranking in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and the Badgers nabbed the No. 2 spot. For the first official time, the Big Ten claims the top two rankings since the AP began weekly polls in 1948. Michigan and Indiana were ranked No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the Nov. 30, 1992 poll, however the Wolverines' 1992-93 season was later vacated by the NCAA. The last time a conference claimed the top two rankings in the AP poll was the Big East with No. 1 Connecticut and No. 2 Villanova on March 7, 2006.

**No. 1 vs. No. 2:** For the first time in conference history, two Big Ten teams ranked first and second in the national polls will meet on the court this Sunday when No. 2/1 Ohio State hosts No. 1/2 Wisconsin. For the first time in school history, the Badgers have earned the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll. It also marks the first time a Big Ten team has garnered the top ranking in the Associated Press poll since Illinois was No. 1 throughout the 2004-05 season. Earlier this year, the Buckeyes were ranked No. 1 in the ESPN/ USA Today Coaches Poll the week of Nov. 27, 2006.

**NCAA Tournament Preparation:** Since the inception of the Big Ten Tournament in 1998, the conference has sent seven teams to the Final Four and has won over 60 percent of its NCAA



Tournament games. The Big Ten (7) trails only the ACC (9) in Final Four appearances since 1998. The Big 12 and SEC follow with five appearances over that time span, followed by the Big East (3) and Pac-10 (3). Since 1998, conference teams that have won the Big Ten Tournament have combined to post an 18-6 (.750) record in the NCAA Championship.

**BIG TEN NOTES**

**Best Freshman Class Ever?:** This year, freshmen are not just making an impact, but also leading in several statistical categories. In conference games only, Ohio State freshman **Greg Oden** leads the Big Ten in rebounding (9.1 rpg) and blocked shots (3.54 bpg). Teammate **Mike Conley Jr.** is the conference leader in assists (6.69 apg), steals (2.23 spg) and assists/turnover ratio (3.63) in Big Ten games only. In comparing other conferences, only the Big Ten has a freshman leading in five statistical categories. The Big East has a first-year standout leading in four categories, while the Big 12 and the ACC follow with three freshmen leaders. Other Big Ten freshmen appearing in the top 20 in conference games only statistics include Indiana's **Armon Bassett**, Iowa's **Tyler Smith**, Michigan's **Ekpe Udoh**, Michigan State's **Raymar Morgan**, Northwestern's **Kevin Coble** and **Jeff Ryan**, Ohio State's **Daequan Cook**, Purdue's **Chris Kramer**.

**Tucker Eyes UW's Career Scoring Record:** With 2,071 points, Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** is looking to break UW's all-time scoring record held by Michael Finley, who tallied 2,147 points from 1992-95. Last week, Tucker became the second Badger and 23rd player in Big Ten history to score at least 2,000 points in his career. The senior forward became the first 2,000-point producer for the Big Ten since Indiana's A.J. Guyton who registered 2,100 points from 1997-00. Tucker currently ranks 19th on the Big Ten's scoring chart and is vying to surpass Purdue's Dave Schellhase (2,074 points from 1964-66).

**The Conference Leaders:** Wisconsin established a school record in wins with 26 victories on the season. The Badgers currently are tied with Ohio State for the conference lead with a 12-1 record in Big Ten action. The Buckeyes have tallied their best start in Big Ten action since beginning the 1990-91 campaign with a 15-1 mark.

**Non-Conference Success:** On Wednesday, Northwestern will step out of conference play and take on Texas-Pan American. With 117 wins this season, the Big Ten has posted the most non-conference victories prior to postseason play in conference history, eclipsing last year's mark of 112 wins. Last season, the conference tallied a 112-28 mark before heading into NCAA Tournament action. The Big Ten then closed out the season with the best out-of-conference winning percentage in over six years at .767 (115-35).

**ESPN's College Basketball GameDay:** Michigan State will host the popular ESPN College Basketball GameDay television show at the Breslin Center this Saturday, prior to the Indiana-MSU men's basketball game. ESPN College Basketball GameDay activities begin at 9 a.m. with the live TV show originating from the Breslin Center. Hosts of ESPN College Basketball GameDay include Rece Davis, Digger Phelps, Jay Bilas, Hubert Davis, Dick Vitale and Andy Katz.

**Big Ten Scoring Race Heats Up:** Iowa's **Adam Haluska** remains in first place among the conference's scoring leaders with 21.5 points per game in Big Ten only contests, but is closely followed by Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** (20.1 ppg), who captured the Big Ten scoring title last season. If Haluska continues to lead the conference in scoring, he would be the first Hawkeye to accomplish that feat since Andre Woolridge in 1997.

**The Final Stretch:** With just two weeks left in the Big Ten regular season, eight teams at or above .500 in conference play as Wisconsin and Ohio State currently lead the Big Ten with matching 12-1 marks. Indiana follows in third place (7-5), while Illinois and Iowa are tied for fourth place with 7-6 records. With victories this past week, Michigan, Michigan State and Purdue are just a half game behind in sixth place with matching 6-6 records. Of the top three teams, Wisconsin wraps up the conference slate with two of its three contests on the road and faces the toughest competition as the combined record of the Badgers' opponents is 24-13 (.649), including road tests at Michigan State and Ohio State. The Spartans face the toughest slate of the top eight teams as their remaining opponents boast a .740 winning percentage.

**Big Ten's Grand Company:** The conference's group of 1,000-point scorers has more than doubled from the start of the season as 10 standouts are now above that scoring plateau, including three teams with two players or more players. Four Big Ten seniors began the season

on the 1,000-point list in Iowa's **Adam Haluska**

(1,786), Michigan's **Dion Harris** (1,490), Ohio State's **Ron Lewis** (1,544) and Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** (2,071). Six more players joined the list this season in Michigan's **Lester Abram** (1,205) and **Courtney Sims** (1,265), Penn State's **Geary Claxton** (1,182), Purdue's **Carl Landry** (1,030) and **David Teague** (1,258) and Wisconsin's **Kammron Taylor** (1,113). With 969 points, Minnesota's **Lawrence McKenzie**, who transferred from Oklahoma and sat out last season, is vying to become the next member of the conference's 1,000-point club.

**NCAA RPI Rankings:** The Big Ten has six teams in the top 45 of the RPI rankings which were released by the NCAA on Monday. Ohio State leads the Big Ten contingent with a No. 4 ranking, while Wisconsin (5th), Indiana (17th), Purdue (40th), Illinois (41st) and Michigan State (42nd) round out the top 45.

**Big Ten's Homecourt Records:** Ohio State has the fourth-longest home winning streak in the country with 24 consecutive triumphs at Value City Arena while Wisconsin follows in fifth place with a 21-game home winning streak at the Kohl Center. Air Force leads the nation with a 30-game homecourt winning streak. The Buckeyes' last home loss was on Jan. 15, 2006, in double-overtime, 62-59, against the Spartans. Wisconsin's last loss at home occurred on Jan. 31, 2006, when the Badgers fell to No. 6/6 Illinois, 66-51. OSU and UW still trail the Big Ten record of 53 straight home triumphs set by Michigan State from 1998 to 2002 -- a winning streak that was ended by the Badgers.

## CELEBRATING THE 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

**Winningest Coaches:** Only five coaches boast winning percentages of .600 or better in Big Ten Tournament play, and three will be returning to the United Center in 2007. After claiming the 2006 Big Ten Tournament title, Iowa's **Steve Alford** leads all coaches in winning percentage with a record of 13-5 (.722). Illinois' **Bruce Weber** and former Illini coach Bill Self are tied for second place with a .714 winning percentage. Another former Illinois coach Lon Kruger ranks fourth (6-3; .667), while Ohio State's **Thad Matta** follows in fifth place with a 3-2 mark (.600). Alford leads all coaches with 13 triumphs, while Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** has tallied 10 victories and two titles in nine events.

**Top Tourney Teams:** Illinois leads the conference in winning percentage and total wins in Big Ten Tournament play with a record of 16-7 (.696) over nine years. That mark includes two tournament crowns and three second-place finishes. The Fighting Illini won the 2005 crown, the last time the tournament was held in Chicago. Iowa boasts the league's second-best winning percentage with a record of 13-7 (.650), including two tournament titles (2001 and 2006) while Michigan State follows in third place with a 10-7 mark (.588). The Spartans join the Illini and the Hawkeyes as the only two-time winners in the event after MSU claimed the 1999 and 2000 titles.

**Throw Out The Records:** History has shown that every team at the Big Ten Tournament will have a shot at leaving town with the title. Last year, Michigan State advanced to the semifinals as the No. 6 seed, defeating No. 3 Illinois before falling to second-seeded Iowa. In 2003, Ohio State advanced to the title game despite holding the No. 8 seed. In 2002, Iowa reached the finals as the ninth seed, just one season after becoming the lowest-seeded team to win the Big Ten Tournament, as the sixth-seeded Hawkeyes won four games in four days to earn the league's NCAA automatic berth in 2001. In addition to the magical runs of OSU and Iowa the last five years, the No. 4 seed has advanced to the finals three times. In only the last three years has the No. 1 and the No. 2 seed faced off in the championship final. Last season, No. 2 Iowa downed Ohio State, while No. 1 Illinois defeated second-seeded Wisconsin for the 2005 Tournament title. In 2004, the No. 2 Badgers defeated the No. 1 seeded Fighting Illini.

**Native Sons Return to Chicago:** The Big Ten Conference includes at least 22 men's basketball players from the state of Illinois, as six of the 11 schools carry at least one Illinois native on the roster. Illinois leads the conference with nine native sons while Northwestern can put as many as six in-state products on the floor. Indiana, Iowa, Purdue and Wisconsin each feature one player from Illinois. The five schools without an Illinois product on the team include Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Penn State.

**All-Tournament Selections:** Ohio State's **Jamar Butler** and Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** return after earning All-Tournament honors in past Big Ten Tournaments. Last year, Ohio State's Butler led the Buckeyes to a runner-up finish at the 2006 Big Ten Tournament, while earning All-Tournament accolades. Wisconsin's Tucker claimed All-Tourney laurels in 2005. Illinois leads the conference with eight All-Tournament selections, while Ohio State follows with seven honorees. Every Big Ten squad has placed at least one student-athlete on the All-Tournament team.

## 2007 BIG TEN MEN'S BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

**Media Advisory:** The deadline for Big Ten Men's Tournament credentials is Friday, Feb. 23.

**Credential Information:** The 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament credential website is now online and available for media use. Please contact the Big Ten Communications office for access information to the website. After you have read and accepted the credential criteria and policies, the following web page will ask you to "Please select the Big Ten university you usually cover. If you do not cover a specific Big Ten school on a regular basis, select 'Other Media.'" **If your media agency normally covers a Big Ten team**, you must select that university when applying for credentials on the website. Upon filling out and submitting your credential application, you will receive an automated confirmation that your form has been received by that school's men's basketball SID. After the SID reviews your application, you will receive an acceptance or denial email. If you receive an acceptance email, your name will be added to that school's media list and **pending final approval of the Big Ten Conference**, will be approved for credentials. You do not need to contact the Big Ten Communications office to verify your credential approval. By Friday, Feb. 23, you will receive additional tournament media information via email from the Big Ten Communications Department. The SIDs will also have a limited number of parking credentials to distribute in advance to their media outlets. **If your media agency does not normally cover a conference team**, just click on the "Media Type" drop-down box and select "Other Media" at the bottom of the list and follow the instructions noted above. If you discover that you need to

make changes to your application after you submit it, please contact the men's basketball SID at the school you cover.

Also if you cannot apply online, please contact our office to apply for credentials.

**Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale:**

All-session tickets for the 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament, along with single-session tickets, went on sale to the general public on Friday, Dec. 1. All-session and single-session tickets for the men's tournament, which includes 10 games over four days, will be available at the United Center box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www.ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (312) 559-1212. The cost for men's tournament all-session tickets will be either \$150 or \$275 depending on seat location. Single-session tickets range from \$30 to \$85 based on seat location and session. Orders will be limited to 12 all-session tickets or 12 single-session tickets for each session.

## BIG TEN NETWORK NEWS

**Big Ten Network Unveils New Headquarters in Chicago:** The Big Ten Network announced on Dec. 20 the official location for its studios and business offices in Chicago. The network will be headquartered in the historic Montgomery Ward building located in Chicago's Near North neighborhood. The Big Ten Network studios will be located in a 44,000 square-foot office space at 600 West Chicago, formerly the Montgomery Ward & Co. Catalog House.

The original section of the building was designated as a national historic landmark in 2000 for its significant role in American retail history. The space will include two studios and three control rooms as well as a 20,000 square-foot office space.

**Silverman Named Big Ten Network President:** The Big Ten Network announced on Dec. 5 that Mark Silverman will serve as the organization's first president. Silverman will manage the day-to-day operations of the network and will report to its Board of Directors. He comes to the Big Ten Network after serving as the general manager and senior vice president of ABC Cable Networks Group since April of 2004, managing the company's equity in such channels as Lifetime Television, A&E Network and the History Channel, each of which recorded their best financial performance in 2005. Silverman was also responsible for developing and launching new cable channels, shows and other key initiatives. He also served as the general manager of ABC Family Channel from 2003-04. Prior to joining ABC Family, Silverman was co-founder and president of Silverkings Media, a media/entertainment consulting company, from 2001-03, and senior vice president of Broadband Sports, an online sports content company, from 1999-2001. His previous experience also consists of various leadership roles with the Walt Disney Company from 1991-1999, including serving as vice president of business development for ABC, Inc., General Manager of ESPN Zone and vice president of Walt Disney Studios.

**Big Ten Network Announces Branding Committee:** On Oct. 25, the Big Ten Network announced the four individuals who will comprise its inaugural Branding Committee, a group which will provide oversight to preserve the integrity of the Big Ten Conference brand in all content provided through the network. The members of the Big Ten Network Branding Committee include Michigan State University President **Lou Anna K. Simon**, Northwestern University President **Henry S. Bienen**, Fox Networks Group President and Chief Executive Officer **Tony Vinciguerra**, and Fox College Sports Executive Vice President and General Manager **David Rone**. The Branding Committee will serve as consultants to the Big Ten Network in developing and strengthen-

ing the network's brand and ensuring that the core values of the Big Ten Conference are reflected through all programming and advertising.

**Big Ten Network Announces Board of Directors:** On Oct. 19, the Big Ten Network announced the five individuals who will compose its first Board of Directors. This group will provide leadership and oversight for the network. The

members of the five-person Board of Directors include Big Ten Commissioner **James E. Delany**, Fox Regional Cable Sports Networks President **Randy Freer**, former Vice Chairman of PNC Bank and former chairman of the Board of Trustees of Penn State **Edward "Ted" Junker III**, Fox National Cable Sports Networks President **Bob Thompson** and New York Mets Chairman of the Board and CEO **Fred Wilpon**. The Board of Directors is responsible for providing strategic oversight and corporate governance for the network. The Board will develop the long-term vision of the network and will sustain the ongoing commitment to becoming a premier, nationally distributed channel.

**Big Ten Network Set to Debut in August of 2007:** Last June, the Big Ten announced a 20-year deal with Fox Cable Networks to create the Big Ten Network, a national network devoted to Big Ten athletic and academic programs, to launch in August of 2007. The Big Ten Network will carry many of the games and events previously available only through syndication and will be available to all carriers and distributors nationwide. In addition to traditional distribution through cable and satellite, select Big Ten Network content will also be available through alternative media platforms. Sports programming on the Big Ten Network will annually include, but is not limited to, 35-plus football games, at least 105 regular-season men's basketball games, at least 55 regular-season women's basketball games, Big Ten Championships and Tournaments, 170 Olympic sporting events and coverage from the conference's vast library of historic sporting events, including bowl games. In addition, each school will have the right to provide 60 hours of its own content annually. Fox has entered into a charter affiliation agreement with DIRECTV, which will carry the Big Ten Network at launch nationwide on Total Choice, which is received by more than 15.4 million households. The Big Ten Network will be majority-owned by the Big Ten Conference, with Fox holding a minority interest. The network will establish its studios and headquarters in Chicago, with Fox handling the administration and daily operations and the Big Ten establishing general guidelines regarding the types of programs and advertising to ensure consistency with the conference's brand values.
