Big Ten Title Chase Begins: The Big Ten tips off the 104th season of conference play this week as all 11 teams will be in action starting Tuesday, December 30. Regular-season runner up Purdue will host Illinois on Tuesday to start conference play. Eight more programs tip off Big Ten play on Wednesday, as Wisconsin begins defense of its 2008 Big Ten title. The Badgers travel to Ann Arbor to meet a red-hot Michigan team. In other Big Ten match-ups, Northwestern travels to Penn State, Ohio State welcomes Iowa and Minnesota hosts Michigan State. Indiana tips off its Big Ten slate on Saturday when the Hoosiers travel to Iowa.

Heading Into Conference Play: With the majority of non-conference play now complete, 10 conference squads have suffered three or fewer defeats. Minnesota (12-0) remains perfect in non-conference action joining only eight other teams in the nation with unblemished records. The Golden Gophers are one of six teams with 12 wins to lead the nation. Illinois (11-1) and Ohio State (9-1) enter the conference slate with only one loss each. Penn State's 11-2 record marks its most wins ever, entering Big Ten play, as the Nittany Lions are off to their best start since the 1995-96 team began 13-0. Purdue is also 11-2 entering Big Ten play. Michigan and Michigan State are both 9-2 entering the week. Iowa (10-3) and Wisconsin (9-3) have each suffered three losses during the non-conference.

RPI Success: The Big Ten remained second overall in the non-conference RPI ratings to the ACC (.5995) with an overall adjusted RPI of .5851. The Big Ten has three teams among the RPI top-25 in No. 10 Northwestern (.6415), No. 21 Michigan (.6245) and No. 22 Illinois (.6238). A complete listing of Big Ten squads' RPI rankings appears on page 5.

A Strong Non-Conference Season: The Big Ten wraps up the non-conference season with an 105-25 overall record in seven weeks of action. The .808 winning percentage ranks second in the nation, behind the ACC, which leads with a .824 winning percentage (112-24). Twenty-three of the 25 losses by Big Ten teams have come at the hands of squads that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Of the 25 deficits, nine were narrow contests, in which Big Ten teams fell short by 10 or fewer points.

More on the Non-Conference Slate: The Big Ten heads into conference action at a .800 win percentage. Standing at 105-25 (.808) overall, the conference solidified its best non-conference start since the 1988-89 season when it amassed an .824 winning percentage against non-conference foes. Since the 1905-06 sea-

son, there have only been eight times in which the Big Ten has finished .800 or above against non-conference teams during the regular season.

Big Ten Debut: Indiana's Tom Crean will get his first taste of Big Ten action as a head coach on Saturday when the Hoosiers travel to Iowa. Crean joined the Hoosiers after spending nine years as head coach at Marquette, where he led the Golden Eagles to an 190-96 record, a Conference USA title, five NCAA Tournament appearances and a Final Four berth.

Then There Were Nine: Nine teams now stand undefeated entering the seventh week of the college basketball season. The Big Ten has one representative yet to suffer a loss this season. The ACC (Clemson, North Carolina, Wake Forest) has three undefeated teams, while the Big East (Connecticut, Pittsburgh) has two. The Big Ten joins the Pac-10 (Stanford), MVC (Illinois State) and Big 12 (Oklahoma) with one perfect team each.

Still Perfect: Minnesota is one of only nine teams that remain undefeated on the 2008-09 season. The Gophers are enjoying a perfect record for the first time this late in the season since the 1948-49 campaign when the team started 12-0.

A Note from the Road: The Big Ten has compiled a 10-8 (.556) record away from the friendly confines of home to join the ACC (.720) and the Big East (.640) as the only three conferences with win percentages over .500 on the road.

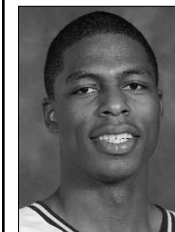
BIG TEN CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Trent Meacham, Illinois
G, Sr., Champaign, Ill./Centennial

Trent Meacham garners his first weekly accolade after leading Illinois to a pair of victories last week, including a 75-59 win over No. 25 Missouri. The senior guard averaged 19.5 points, 4.0 assists and 2.5 rebounds to lead the charge and help the Illini wrap up non-conference play with a six-game winning streak. Meacham scored a season-high and game-high 23 points in Illinois' ninth straight win over Missouri, a game where the Illini recorded their first win over a ranked opponent on the season. Meacham was in double figures again in the 62-53 win over Eastern Michigan, netting 16 points while shooting a season-best four-of-five from behind the arc. On the week, Meacham shot an impressive 63.6 percent from three-point range (7-of-11) and 92.3 percent from the free-throw line (12-of-13). Meacham leads the Illini in scoring on the season, averaging 12.2 points, while shooting 50 percent from the field and three-point range.

DeShawn Sims, Michigan
F, Jr., Detroit, Mich./Pershing

Michigan's DeShawn Sims earns his second weekly laurel after leading the Wolverines over Florida Gulf Coast, 76-59, while posting a historic 20 rebounds and 20 points to garner his fourth double-double of the season. Sims became the first Wolverine to post a 20-point, 20-rebound performance in 31 years. The last Wolverine to accomplish the feat was Phil Hubbard, who had 22 points and 26 rebounds vs. Detroit (March, 1977). Sims' 20 points gives him 11 straight games scoring in double figures this season, and marks his 37th career double-digit game and seventh 20-plus point game. En route to the career-best board mark, by halftime Sims had surpassed his previous high of 12, grabbing 13 total rebounds, including 10 on the defensive end, in the first half. Sims' 20 rebounds marked the first 20-plus rebounding performance since Graham Brown (2003-06) had 21 at Indiana (January, 2006). Along the way, Sims posted a new career best with 15 defensive rebounds. With his 20 rebounds, Sims posted the most rebounds by a Big Ten Conference player this season. The previous best in the conference was by teammate Manny Harris, who had 15 against Norfolk State.

Five in the Polls: With five teams--Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Purdue--ranked in the AP poll this week, the Big Ten leads all conferences with 46 percent of its members among the top-25. The Big East is second with seven of its 16 teams ranked, representing 44 percent of the conference's contingency. The Boilermakers return to the top-10 after a two-week hiatus, checking in at No. 9. The Spartans round out the top 10, while the Golden Gophers are 21st. Michigan moves up a slot to No. 23 this week and Ohio State rounds out the Big Ten's contingency at No. 24.

Battle for Scoring Title Heats Up: This week the Big Ten saw a new sophomore climb his way to the top of the leaderboard in scoring. Penn State's **Talor Battle** edged out Michigan's **Manny Harris** after netting 36 points over two games last week. Battle and Harris are now averaging just over 19 points per game, amassing 249 points (19.2 ppg.) and 209 points (19.0 ppg.), respectively, in non-conference action. The battle for the top will continue as the two teams enter conference play this week.

Grand Company: Michigan State's **Raymar Morgan** became the second active Big Ten player to score 1,000 points when he tallied eight points against Oakland last week to boost his career total to 1,000 points. Three other conference standouts are on pace to join Morgan as Northwestern's duo of **Craig Moore** (988) and **Kevin Coble** (868) and Penn State's **Danny Morrissey** (834) are within 170 points of that scoring plateau. PSU's **Jamelle Cornley** (1,240) entered the 2008-09 campaign with more than 1,000 career points.

Sensational Sophomores: A group of sophomores leads the Big Ten in seven of the 13 major statistical categories in games played to date. Penn State's **Talor Battle** leads the young pack, pacing the conference in both scoring (19.2 ppg.) and minutes played (36.15 per game). Michigan State and Ohio State each feature two players at the forefront of the leaderboard. Spartan Sophomores **Kalin Lucas** leads the conference with a 6.45 assist-to-turnover ratio, while sharp-shooter **Durrell Summers** paces the Big Ten in three-point field goal percentage (.536). Ohio State's **Evan Turner** and **Dallas Lauderdale** also lead the conference in steals (2.70 spg.) and blocked shots (3.20 bpg.), respectively. Illinois' **Mike Davis** rounds out the list of sensational sophomores, leading the Big Ten with an average of 6.15 defensive boards per contest.

Other Conference Leaders: Mid-way through the regular season, Michigan State leads the conference with three Spartans at the top of the leaderboard in their respective categories. In addition to the two sophomores, Spartan junior **Raymar Morgan** leads the Big Ten in field goal percentage, shooting 62-of-95 (.653) in games to date. Iowa joins Ohio State with two athletes on top of the charts, including leaders **Matt Gatens** in free-throw percentage (.964) and **Anthony Tucker** in three-point field goals made (35). Illinois saw one player at No. 1 in senior **Chester Frazier**, who paces the conference in assists with 6.46 apg. Junior **DeShawn Sims** represented Michigan in the conference standings, leading the conference in rebounding with 9.2 rpg. Indiana's **Tom Pritchard** is the only freshman to top the charts, pacing the conference in offensive rebounds, averaging 3.75 per outing. A complete list of individual conference leaders follows:

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS -- WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 28

Matt Gatens, Fr., G, IOWA: Recorded first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds in win over Western Illinois. Also had one assist and one blocked shot.

Kalin Lucas, So., G, MSU: Scored 15 points, dished out six assists and tallied two steals as Michigan State defeated Oakland, 82-66, on Saturday at the Palace of Auburn Hills. Scored 12 of his points in the first half, as MSU used an 18-2 run, sparked by one of Lucas' three three-pointers, to take a 14-point lead into the half. With his six assists and one turnover, Lucas continues to lead the nation with a 6.45-to-1 assist to turnover ratio.

Blake Hofferber, So., G, MINN: Tied for the team-high with 15 points against Southeastern Louisiana. Went five-of-eight from beyond the arc this week to bring his career totals to 96-of-220 (.436) which is the second-best three-point percentage in school history. Shot 69 percent from the field and 62 percent from three-point range.

Evan Turner, So., G, OSU: Led Ohio State with 13.5 points and 7.0 rebounds a game. Also recorded third double-double of the season in loss to West Virginia.

Talor Battle, So., G, PSU: Nearly posted a triple-double in PSU's win over Lafayette and then posted his sixth 20-point game of the season to lead the Lions over Sacred Heart as Penn State improved to 11-2 on the year, its most wins ever entering Big Ten play. Logged his second career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds and added eight assists and four steals in an 83-55 victory vs. Lafayette. Scored 20 first-half points, hitting his first three treys and shooting six-of-seven in the half, on his way to a game-high 25 points in a 73-65 victory over Sacred Heart. Penn State led by just three with 51 seconds to play before Battle drove to the goal, scored and was fouled. Completed the three-point play to seal the win. For the week, was 12-of-24 from the floor, averaging 18 points, 7.5 rebounds, 5.5 assists and 3.5 steals a game and took over the conference lead in scoring.

JaJuan Johnson, So., F/C, PUR: Scored a career-high 21 points and pulled down a career-best nine rebounds in Purdue's 70-55 win over Fort Wayne. In two games, averaged 15.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.5 blocked shots per contest. Was good on 59.1 percent of shot attempts, including over 71 percent against Fort Wayne.

Trévon Hughes, Jr., G, WIS: Led the Badgers with 18 points in their loss to No. 9 Texas. Helped keep Wisconsin in the game with 13 first-half points and knocked down three three-pointers on the night. Finished the game with four rebounds, one steal and three assists to just one turnover.

**DANNY PETERS, ohio state junior guard**

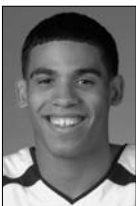

**MARCUS LANDRY, wisconsin senior forward**

Senior Marcus Landry is assuming a lot of responsibility this season for the Badgers. As a preseason All-Big Ten selection, he will no doubt be relied on heavily to guide Wisconsin's on-court fortunes. But for Landry, responsibility is nothing new. A husband and father of three, Landry knows what it's like to have people counting on him. In addition to dedicating himself to his family and teammates, Landry is also committed to his academics, raising his grade point average nearly 1.5 points in the last two years on his way to earning the Academic Momentum Award this fall.

**DAVID MERRITT, michigan senior guard**

A lifelong Michigan fan, David Merritt turned down Division II basketball scholarship offers to attend Michigan on an academic scholarship. Merritt attempted to walk on to the basketball program at U-M and was cut during tryouts each of his first two years on campus in Ann Arbor. Merritt finally made the team in his third attempt at walk-on tryouts in 2006-07. He appeared in four games, playing 29 minutes. Under new head coach John Beilein, Merritt saw action in 20 games a year ago despite being slowed by a knee injury that forced him to miss five games. He earned his degree in sports management in the spring and was then awarded a basketball scholarship for his fifth-year of eligibility. Merritt was also named a team captain this season and is currently enrolled in the Rackham Graduate School, pursuing a master's degree in urban planning. Merritt has started all nine games thus far for the Wolverines.
