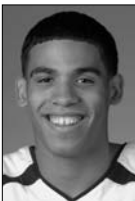

The work ethic that saw him earn Albany Times Large School Player of the Year on the court and National Honor Society recognition in the classroom has also gotten him elected a Penn State team co-captain as a sophomore. He looks to two of his brothers for motivation. His older brother Tracy, who Battle says was his hero growing up, is currently serving a prison sentence. Battle speaks to him by phone regularly and thinks about doing the things he can't do. His younger brother Taran Buie has taken over for the current Nittany Lion as the star at Bishop Maginn High School in Albany and should be a top-50 prospect in the class of 2011.

Winning Ways: The Big Ten will head into the final week of non-conference play after amassing a 93-21 overall record in six weeks of action. The .816 winning percentage ranks second in the nation, behind the ACC, which leads with an .831 winning percentage (103-21). Thus far, all 21 losses by Big Ten teams have come at the hands of squads that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Of those 21 deficits, nine were narrow contests, in which Big Ten teams fell short by 10 or fewer points.

Crazy Eights: Currently standing at 93-21 (.816) overall, the Big Ten is off to its best non-conference start since the 1988-89 season when it went 98-21 (.824) against non-conference foes during the regular season. Prior to that season, the closest the Big Ten came to earning a similar mark was in 1917-18 when it amassed a 47-11 slate for a .810 winning percentage in non-conference contests. Since the 1905-06 season, there have only been eight times in which the Big Ten has finished .800 or above against non-conference teams during the regular season. A complete breakdown follows.

Big Ten. Big Stage. Big Wins: After taking down two top-five teams earlier this season, the Big Ten knocked off another. No. 19/22 Michigan State handed No. 5/5 Texas its second loss of the season. The win increased the Big Ten's record versus top-five opponents to 3-2. With the win, the Big Ten owns fifty percent of the wins over top-five squads. A breakdown follows.

More on the Big Wins: Minnesota posted its first win over a top-10 foe since February of 2000, Saturday, when the Golden Gophers topped No. 9 Louisville 70-64. The game was a reunion for Minnesota's Tubby Smith and his former Kentucky predecessor, Rick Pitino. The victory marked Smith's fourth consecutive win over Pitino and earned the Gophers their first 10-0 start since the 1976-77 season.

Playing on Both Ends of the Court: The Big Ten is proving that defense wins games by holding its opposition to only 59.7 points per game to lead the nation. The Pac-10 and Big East each are allowing only 62.6 points per game, good enough to rank second and third, respectively. The Big Ten is also averaging an 11.1 margin of victory to rank fifth in the nation – a testament to its sensational play on both ends of the court. While defense is locking down the competition, offense is reaching new heights. Six teams have increased their offensive production since this point in the season a year ago by an average of five points per game.

A Note from the Road: The Big Ten has compiled a 10-8 (.556) record away from the friendly confines of home to join the ACC (.714) and the Big East (.667) as the only three conferences with win percentages over .500 on the road.

Five in the Polls: With five teams--Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Purdue--ranked in the AP poll this week, the Big Ten leads all conferences with 46 percent of its members among the top-25. The Big East is second with seven of its 16 teams ranked representing 45 percent of the conference's contingency. The Boilermakers return to the top 10 after a two-week hiatus at No. 10. The Spartans check in at No. 11, while the Buckeyes are 15th. Minnesota moves into the polls for the first time this season, sitting at No. 23 and Michigan debuts at No. 24.

RPI Merry-Go-Round: The Big Ten is ranked second in the third edition of the RPI Rankings after being ranked first last week. The conference has an adjusted RPI of .6008 to rank seven-thousandths of a percentage behind the ACC (.6015). Last week, the Big Ten was ranked first followed by the ACC. Three weeks ago, it was the ACC atop the leaderboard, with the Big Ten ranked second. The Big Ten has three teams in the top 15, with Northwestern (.6667) checking in at No. 9, Ohio State (.5076) at No. 11 and Michigan (.6223) at No. 15. A complete listing of Big Ten squads' RPI rankings appears on page 5.

Rare Air: Ten teams now stand undefeated entering the sixth week of the college basketball season. The Big Ten (Minnesota, Ohio State) remains one of three conferences to have at least two teams yet to suffer a loss. The ACC (Clemson, North Carolina, Wake Forest) has three undefeated teams, while the

Robbie Hummel, Purdue F, So., Valparaiso, Ind./Valparaiso

Boilermaker forward Robbie Hummel is named Big Ten Player of the Week for the second consecutive time this year after netting 18 points and pulling down a career-high 14 rebounds to lead Purdue over No. 20 Davidson, 76-58, in the John R. Wooden Tradition at Consecro Fieldhouse on Saturday. En route to his second double-double of the season, Hummel's performance came on 6-of-11 shooting from the field, including 2-of-4 from three-point range, and a perfect 4-of-4 from the charity stripe. The sophomore added four assists against one turnover, helping Purdue hand Davidson its worst defeat since November of 2006.

Last Purdue POW: Robbie Hummel (December 15, 2008)

Big East (Connecticut, Pittsburgh) has two, ranking second in the nation. The Pac-10 (Stanford), MVC (Illinois State) and Big 12 (Oklahoma) each have one perfect team. Minnesota has reeled off 10 straight wins to open the 2008-09 campaign, marking its first 10-0 start since the 1976-77 season. Ohio State has rolled to an 8-0 start this season. The Buckeyes began the 2005-06 campaign 11-0 before suffering their first loss.

Lucky 13: Ohio State has the nation's longest win streak at 13 games after five-consecutive victories to end the 2007-08 season and victories in the first eight games this year. Ohio State won the 2008 National Invitation Tournament at Madison Square Garden in New York.

Silencing the Sharp-Shooters: Last week two of the Big Ten's teams shut down a couple of the nation's leading scorers en route to wins over ranked opponents. Purdue held national leader Stephen Curry of Davidson to just 13 points. Curry, who entered the game averaging 31.9 points, made just five-of-26 field goal attempts as a relentless Boilermaker defense limited his productivity. Purdue also silenced the prolific shooter from three-point range, as he was only two-of-12. Michigan State shut down a sharp-shooting A.J. Abrams of Texas. Abrams, who averaged 28.5 points over his previous four games, went three-for-10 from the field and scored eight points. He went 0-for-four from three-point range, failing to hit one for the first time this season.

It's a First: With his 15 second-half points and career-best 13 assists, Michigan's **Manny Harris** posted his third career double-double--first for points and assists. He is the first Wolverine to post a point-assist double-double since Dion Harris had 14 points and 10 assists against Wofford on Dec. 2, 2006. Overall, he is the 17th Wolverine to accomplish the feat, and his effort marked the 54th all-time point-assist double-dip in U-M history.

Spreading the Holiday Cheer: Michigan State's **Kalin Lucas** picked up eight assists for the second-consecutive game in the Spartans' victory over Texas. Over the last three games, he is averaging 8.3 assists per game. For the season, Lucas is averaging 6.5 helpers per contest to rank 15th in the nation. Lucas is the nation's leading ball handler, with a turnover-to-assist ratio of 6.50.

Home Dominance: Big Ten squads have jumped out to a 66-3 mark (.957) in home games this season, as eight teams are undefeated and three squads have one loss on their home courts. Minnesota leads the way with an 8-0 mark, while Iowa (7-0), Michigan (6-0), Northwestern (6-0), Ohio State (6-0), Wisconsin (6-0), Indiana (4-0), and Michigan State (4-0) are also unbeaten on their own floors.

MEDIA ALERT

The tip-time for Minnesota's basketball game versus Michigan State on Wednesday, Dec. 31 has been changed from 5 p.m. CT to 11 a.m. CT.

More on the Home Courts: With a 66-3 record on home floors, the Big Ten ranks second in the nation behind the Big 12 in win percentage. The Big Ten owns a .957 win percentage, five points behind the Big 12 (75-3) with a .962 win percentage. The Southland Conference (45-4) rounds out the top three with a .918 win percentage. The Big East (96-10, .906) is in fourth.

Trio of Players on Naismith Trophy Watch List: The Purdue duo of **Robbie Hummel** and **E'Twaun Moore** join Michigan State's **Raymar Morgan** as the three Big Ten players represented on the Naismith Trophy Watch List. The 50-member list was announced on Thursday, Dec. 18. The Naismith Award is presented annually to the nation's best player. The academy of voters will narrow its early season list to the top 30 players in the nation in February. Those players, and others who distinguish themselves throughout the season, will be eligible for the final ballot in March.

Two Big Ten Players Candidates for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Thirty senior men's basketball players have been announced as candidates for the 2008-09 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to a NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Penn State's **Danny Morrissey** and Wisconsin's **Marcus Landry** represent the Big Ten. Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans. Former Wisconsin standout Alando Tucker was the 2007 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award winner.

Big Ten Network to Air 16 New Basketball Classics on 'Greatest Games': Watch Big Ten legends Magic Johnson, Isiah Thomas, Glenn Robinson, Deron Williams and Keith Smart square off against basketball greats like Larry Bird, James Worthy, Tayshaun Prince, Jacque Vaughn and Chris Paul on the Big Ten Network this winter on the popular series, *The Big Ten's Greatest Games*. In all, 16 new classics will debut during the course of the basketball season. The 'Greatest Games' schedule features five Big Ten national championships, including Indiana's title games in 1981 and 1987, Michigan's championship game in 1989 and Michigan State's titles in 1979 and 2000.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS -- WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 21

Trent Meacham, Sr., G, ILL: Scored 15 points in just 14 minutes of action, leading the Illini to a victory over Detroit. Was perfect from the floor on the night, shooting five-of-five from the field, including three-of-three from behind the arc, along with two-of-two at the foul line.

Manny Harris, So., G, MICH: After not scoring in the first half against Oakland, Harris scored 15 points in the second half to earn his 10th straight game scoring in double figures. Had a career-best eight assists in the first half and closed the game with a career-best 13 with zero turnovers. The output is the second best in the history of U-M and the most since Dion Harris had 10 helpers against Wofford on Dec. 2, 2006, two seasons ago. With his 15 second-half points and career-best 13 assists, Harris posted his third career double-double but first for points and assists.

Durrell Summers, So., G, MSU: Scored the game-winning three-pointer against No. 5 Texas in Houston on Dec. 20 with 18.5 seconds left. For the week, averaged 13.0 points in a pair of Spartan victories. Against Texas, scored 10 of his 14 points in the second half, including eight in the final 3:37. Also grabbed four rebounds, including hauling in Texas' last attempt at tying the game. In the first game of the week against The Citadel, Summers hit three-of-four shots and five-of-six free throws for 12 points.

Al Nolen, So., G, MINN: Led the Gophers in a win over No. 9/9 Louisville, scoring 18 points. Dished out five assists while only committing one turnover in 36 minutes of play.

Evan Turner, So., G, OSU: Led Ohio State to a pair of home wins last week with an average of 19.0 points and 7.0 rebounds a game. Shot 61 percent from the field (11-of-18) while knocking down two of three three-pointers. Only missed five minutes of court time in the two wins, which kept Ohio State undefeated.

Jon Leur, So., F, WIS: Came off the bench to score a team-high 16 points in 21 minutes of action as the Badgers beat Coppin State, 57-46. Connected on eight-of-12 shots in Wisconsin's win. Also posted six rebounds, one assist, one steal and one block. Leads the Big Ten in scoring among players without a start this season.

A lifelong Michigan fan, David Merritt turned down Division II basketball scholarship offers to attend Michigan on an academic scholarship. Merritt attempted to walk on to the basketball program at U-M and was cut during tryouts each of his first two years on campus in Ann Arbor. Merritt finally made the team in his third attempt at walk-on tryouts in 2006-07. He appeared in four games, playing 29 minutes. Under new head coach John

Beilein, Merritt saw action in 20 games a year ago despite being slowed by a knee injury that forced him to miss five games. He earned his degree in sports management in the spring and was then awarded a basketball scholarship for his fifth-year of eligibility. Merritt was also named a team captain this season and is currently enrolled in the Rackham Graduate School, pursuing a master's degree in urban planning. Merritt has started all nine games thus far for the Wolverines.
