**2007-08 BIG TEN NOTES**

**BUCKEYES WIN 2008 NIT CROWN:** Ohio State won five straight games to earn the program's second National Invitation Tournament crown. The Buckeyes defeated Massachusetts, 92-85, in the title game. After defeating Dayton in the quarterfinals, the Buckeyes earned their fourth berth in the NIT round of four in school history and first since 1988. Ohio State opened with UNC-Asheville in the first-round and continued to post double-digit victories against California, Dayton and Mississippi. The Big Ten returned to the NIT semifinals for the first time since the 2006 season when Michigan finished as the runner-up. A Big Ten program has played in the NIT semifinals four times in the last eight seasons, as the last conference squad to be crowned NIT champion was Michigan in 2004. The Big Ten has produced seven NIT winners overall in Purdue (1974), Indiana (1979), Michigan (1984, 2004), Ohio State (1986, 2008) and Minnesota (1993). Michigan recorded the conference's 100th official all-time victory in the event in the second round on March 22, 2004, as the Big Ten now holds a record of 115-60 in 64 appearances.

**RYAN NAMED 2008 JIM PHELAN NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR:** Wisconsin's Bo Ryan was named the 2008 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year. Ryan led Wisconsin to both the Big Ten regular season and conference tournament championships. The award, which is voted on by a 20-member selection committee and is chaired by Jim Phelan, is presented annually at the Final Four to the top coach in college basketball. Under the guidance of Ryan, Wisconsin is one of only five schools in the country to win at least 30 games in each of the last two seasons and his 61-11 record over two years is fifth-best nationally. Ryan's team led the nation in scoring defense (54.4 ppg.).

**EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICANS:** Indiana's dynamic inside-outside duo of D.J. White and Eric Gordon not only finished as the Big Ten leading scorers, but have collected numerous All-America accolades for their sterling play. Gordon and White collected their latest honors after being named second-team State Farm All-Americans (NABC). White also earned second-team Associated Press All-America honors, while Gordon was named to the third team. In addition, the duo have garnered several more national honors. White picked up second-team All-America accolades from CBSSports.com, the *Sporting News* and *Sports Illustrated*. White also earned USBWA All-District V honors and was on the Wooden Award and the Naismith Award lists. Fresh off of a record-setting freshman campaign, Gordon was named first-team All-American and Freshman first-team All-American by CBSSportsline.com, a *Sporting News* All-Freshman team selection and a second-team All-American honoree by *Sports Illustrated*. He was also a USBWA All-District V selection and was on the Wooden Award and Naismith Award lists.

**TWO TEAMS MAKE SWEET SIXTEEN**

**APPEARANCES:** The Big Ten placed two teams in the NCAA Regional Semifinals. Michigan State advanced to the South Regional in Houston, Texas., while Wisconsin won two games to land in the Midwest Regional in Detroit, Mich.

**HOW "SWEET" IT IS:** By advancing to the NCAA Tournament regional semifinals, Michigan State became one of only four teams that has played in more than 50 percent of the Sweet 16's during the last 10 years. The Spartans have made it to the Sweet 16 in six of the last 10 years. MSU equals Kansas and UCLA with six appearances since 1999. Duke leads all teams, making eight trips to the Round of 16 in the last 10 years.

**NATION'S BEST FANS**

With an average of nearly 12,900 fans per Big Ten home game during the 2007-08 campaign, the conference is on pace to lead the nation in attendance for the 32nd consecutive year. Big Ten teams welcomed 2,437,673 fans for 189 home contests this season to average 12,898 per game. The Big Ten broke the two-million mark in total attendance for the 16th straight year and the one-million-fan mark in conference games for the 31st straight year.

2007-08 BIG TEN NOTES

**RARE AIR:** Michigan State and Wisconsin advanced to the third round of this year's NCAA Tournament, making them two of 12 programs that have advanced to the Sweet 16 in at least three of the last six years. Duke, Kansas and Texas lead the group with four appearances. The Spartans and Badgers join Connecticut, Memphis, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, UCLA, Villanova and West Virginia with three appearances.

**FAMILIAR SETTING:** Michigan State made its 11th-straight NCAA appearance, the fifth-longest streak in the nation. Only Arizona (24), Kansas (19), Kentucky (17) and Duke (13) have made more consecutive appearances. This was the fifth time in school history that the Spartans entered the NCAA Tournament as the No. 5 seed. This was MSU's seventh trip to the Sweet 16 in 11 NCAA Tournaments under Tom Izzo.

**MR. MARCH:** Michigan State's Tom Izzo is no stranger to coaching basketball in March and has a top resume to prove it. Izzo has coached the Spartans to 11 NCAA appearances and owns a 26-10 record. Of the 65 coaches in this year's NCAA Tournament, Izzo boasted the third-best winning percentage (.727) entering this year's event only behind Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.773) and Louisville's Rick Pitino (.744). He became only the second coach in NCAA history to reach four Final Fours in his first 10 years of coaching, joining Ohio State's Fred Taylor who took his Buckeyes to four Final Fours in his first 10 seasons. Izzo is also one of only 10 coaches in NCAA Tournament history to advance to three straight Final Fours, which he accomplished from 1999-2001.

**WINNING 30:** Wisconsin won a school record 31 games during the 2007-08 campaign. That breaks the former record of 30 set last year. The Badgers' 61-11 (.847) record over the last two seasons is the fifth-best in the country. UW is one of just five teams in the country that have won at least 30 games in each of the last two seasons, joining North Carolina, UCLA, Memphis and Kansas. In Big Ten history only two other schools have won at least 30 games in back-to-back seasons, Indiana in 1974-75 (31-1) and 1975-76 (32-0) and Michigan State in 1998-99 (33-5) and 1999-2000 (32-7). This year's Wisconsin team is the 14th squad in Big Ten history to record at least 30 victories.

**SIX TEAMS FINISH WITH 20 OR MORE WINS:** For the fourth season in a row, five or more Big Ten squads have earned 20 or more wins. Wisconsin led the way with a school-record-setting 31 wins. Michigan State recorded 27 triumphs on the season, while Purdue and Indiana each won 25 contests. Ohio State reached 24 victories on the season and Minnesota rounded out the group, collecting 20 wins in Tubby Smith's first year at the helm.

**A DEEP CONFERENCE:** The Big Ten is the only conference since 2000 to advance five different programs to the Final Four. The ACC, Big 12 and Big East have each had four different schools reach the national semifinals over that time, followed by the Pac-10 (2) and the SEC (2). Michigan State leads the Big Ten with three appearances (2000, 2001 and 2005) while Illinois (2005), Indiana (2002), Ohio State (2007) and Wisconsin (2000) have each earned a Final Four spot since 2000.

**CREAN NAMED INDIANA HEAD COACH:** On April 2, 2008, Tom Crean was announced as the 28th head coach in Indiana basketball history. Crean comes to Indiana after spending nine years at Marquette, where he averaged over 20 wins a season and made five NCAA Tournament appearances. In each of his final seven seasons, Crean's team posted at least 19 wins and earned a postseason berth. Over those seven years, he compiled an aggregate record of 160-68 (.702). He is a two-time recipient of the Ray Meyer Conference USA, NABC District XI and USBWA District V Coach of the Year awards, and in 2003 won the Coach Clair Bee Award as well as being named a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award. In 2007-08, Crean's squad put together a 25-10 season and earned the No. 6 seed in the NCAA South Regional. The Golden Eagles topped Kentucky in the first round and lost to No. 3 seed Stanford in overtime to come up just shy of a trip to the Sweet 16. MU finished tied for fifth in the Big East with an 11-7 conference record. Prior to his arrival in Milwaukee, Crean served under Tom Izzo on the Michigan State basketball staff for four seasons, holding the position of associate head coach the last two. In Crean's four years on Izzo's staff, the Spartans put together an 88-41 record and made four consecutive postseason appearances, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. Prior to his tenure at Michigan State, Crean spent the 1994-95 season as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh and served as the associate head coach at Western Kentucky from 1990 to 1994. Crean got his start in coaching on the Division I level in 1989-90, serving on Jud Heathcote's staff at Michigan State.

## 2007-08 BIG TEN NOTES

**SEEING RED:** Wisconsin followed up its regular season title by winning the second Big Ten Tournament title in school history, defeating Michigan, Michigan State and Illinois to take the crown in Indianapolis. Four other teams in Big Ten history have won both the Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles in the same season: Michigan State in 1999 and 2000, Illinois in 2005 and Ohio State in 2007).

**WISCONSIN CLAIMS BIG TEN TITLE:** The Badgers claimed sole possession of the title for the second time in **Bo Ryan's** tenure and the third title in that seven-year span, sharing the crown in 2002 and winning the title outright in 2003. Wisconsin earns its 17th title in program history, tying Illinois and Ohio State for third in number of conference crowns. Purdue leads all Big Ten teams with 21 conference championships, while Indiana ranks second with 20 titles.

**LANDRY NAMED MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER:** Wisconsin's **Marcus Landry** was voted Most Outstanding Player of the 2008 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament. In the Badgers' three games during the tournament, Landry led the team in scoring averaging 12 points per game and was second on the squad in grabbing 7.3 rebounds per game. In Wisconsin's quarterfinal win over Michigan, Landry had eight points and seven boards. In the semifinal win against Michigan State, the Milwaukee, Wis., native nearly had a double-double with his 18 points and nine rebounds. In the championship game, Landry helped stop a streaking Illinois squad by scoring 10 points with six caroms, adding four assists and two blocks. Landry was joined on the All-Tournament team by teammate **Michael Flowers**, Illinois' **Demetri McCamey** and **Shaun Pruitt** and Michigan State's **Drew Neitzel**.

**GORDON CAPTURES SCORING TITLE:** With 20.8 points per conference game this season (374 in 18 games), Indiana's **Eric Gordon** claimed the Big Ten's scoring title in conference only contests. Gordon led the conference for the duration of the season. The last Hoosier to lead the conference in scoring was **Bracey Wright** in 2005. Gordon becomes the first freshman since Minnesota's **Kris Humphries** to lead all players in scoring. Gordon was closely followed by teammate **D.J. White**, who closed out the conference season with 17.8 points per game.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** One of the nation's top inside-outside combinations, **Eric Gordon** and **D.J. White** finished the regular season ranked one and two in scoring. Gordon and White become the first teammates to accomplish that feat since Michigan's **Glen Rice** and **Gary Grant** finished first and second in scoring in 1987-88.

**MR. DOUBLE-DOUBLE:** Indiana's **D.J. White** finished the regular season as the Big Ten's rebounding champion, averaging 10.7 caroms per game. White is the first player to average a double-double in scoring and rebounding since Minnesota's **Kris Humphries** did so during the 2003-04 season.

**WHITE TABBED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE YEAR:** Indiana's **D.J. White** captured the conference's highest honor as he was named the Big Ten Player of the Year in voting by both the coaches (unanimous) and the media. He is the sixth Hoosier to earn the award and the first since **Jared Jeffries** did so in 2002. In Big Ten games only, White led the conference in rebounding (10.7 rpg) and finished second in scoring (17.8 ppg). The senior forward finished the regular season averaging a double-double, becoming the first player to do so since Minnesota's **Kris Humphries** in 2004.

**OTHER INDIVIDUAL HONORS:** In other individual accolades, Indiana's **Eric Gordon** was named Freshman of the Year by the coaches and media. Gordon led the conference in scoring all year, averaging 20.8 points in Big Ten games only. The 6-4 guard was joined by four other first-year standouts on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. The five-man squad included Michigan's **Manny Harris**, Ohio State's **Kosta Koufos** and Purdue's **Robbie Hummel** and **E'Twaun Moore**. Purdue's **Chris Kramer** picked up Defensive Player of the Year laurels. Kramer earns his second nod as a member of the All-Defensive Team. Michigan State's **Travis Walton** and Wisconsin's **Michael Flowers** were also honored for a second-straight year and are joined by Michigan's **Ekpe Udoh** and Wisconsin's **Joe Krabbenhoft** on this year's All-Defensive Team. Wisconsin's **Jason Bohannon**, who recorded only two starts in 30 games this season, was named the Sixth Man of the Year. The sophomore guard provided a spark off the bench for the Badgers this season, averaging 8.2 points and 2.4 rebounds in all games.

**ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM:** Eleven of the 18 players named to the 2008 All-Big Ten first-, second- or third-teams have a chance to return to their teams next season. Both All-Big Ten first-team squads included Indiana's **Eric Gordon** and **D.J. White**, Purdue's **Robbie Hummel** and Wisconsin's **Brian Butch**. Michigan State senior **Drew Neitzel** was honored by the coaches, while the media named Ohio State's **Jamar Butler** to the top squad. White was a unanimous selection by both the coaches and media. MSU's **Neitzel** earned first-team laurels for the second-consecutive year.

**PROLIFIC FRESHMEN:** The Big Ten saw an insurgence of talented freshmen log a considerable amount of minutes, earn starting roles and make significant contributions to their teams. The precocious group finished the regular season ranked among the conference's best in several statistical categories. Indiana's **Eric Gordon** led the Big Ten in scoring, averaging 21.5 points per game, while Michigan's **Manny Harris** was third overall with 16.4 points per contest. Purdue's **Robbie Hummel** led all players, shooting .458 from beyond the arc and shot at a .854 clip from the free-throw line, which ranked third in the Big Ten. Ohio State's **Kosta Koufos** ranked second overall with 1.84 blocks per game and sixth in rebounding with 6.8 boards per contest. Northwestern's **Michael Thompson** was third in the conference with 4.31 assists per game and fourth with a 2.05 assists-to-turnover ratio, and Minnesota's **Al Nolen** was second in the Big Ten with 2.03 steals per contest. Overall nine freshmen from seven different schools ranked in the top five in the Big Ten in points, assists, steals, blocks, three-point percentage, free-throw percentage and assists-to-turnover ratio.

**BIG TEN TOURNAMENT ATTENDANCE SURPASSES ONE-MILLION MARK:** After welcoming 969,038 patrons in its first decade, the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament broke the one-million barrier in total attendance with a sell-out crowd of 18,691 during Friday night's session at Consecro Fieldhouse. Through five sessions the Big Ten welcomed 80,012 fans to boost the all-time tournament attendance to 1,049,050.

**BIG TEN CONFERENCE REACHES ATTENDANCE MILESTONES:** The Big Ten has once again surpassed the two-million mark in total attendance and the one-million mark in conference games. The conference welcomed 2,405,348 fans in 187 home contests. This is the 16th season in which the Big Ten has seen more than two million spectators pass through the turnstiles. For the 31st season, attendance at Big Ten contests has eclipsed the one-million mark, as 1,347,040 fans have attended 99 games.

**THE BIG DANCE CONSTANTS:** Michigan State is one of only five schools in the nation that has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 11 years, joining Arizona, Duke, Kansas and Kentucky. Wisconsin is only one of eight schools to make 10 straight appearances. The Badgers are joined by Gonzaga and Texas and the five teams listed above.

**BIG TEN TOURNAMENT BENEFITS:** Since the inception of the Big Ten Tournament in 1998, the conference has sent eight different teams to the Final Four and has won over 60 percent of its NCAA Tournament games, compiling a record of 82-48 in the national event from 1998 through 2007. The conference teams that have won the Big Ten Tournament have combined to post a 23-7 (.767) record in the NCAA Championship prior to this year's event.

**FINAL FOUR REGULARS:** The Big Ten has accumulated a record 39 Final Four appearances, tying the ACC for the national lead. The Big Ten is also tied with the ACC and SEC with the second-most national titles (10) in college basketball history. The Pac-10 leads all conferences with 15 titles. Since the inception of the NCAA Tournament in 1939, the Big Ten has recorded the most appearances of any conference in the Big Dance with 184 (ACC, 171) and has the second-most NCAA Tournament victories with 295 (ACC, 329).

**BIG TEN SKIPPERS IN THE POSTSEASON:** The four coaches representing the Big Ten's NCAA Tournament contingent had plenty of experience under their belts. Wisconsin's **Bo Ryan** has led the Badgers to an NCAA Tournament appearance in each of his seven seasons at the helm in Madison. With the two NCAA Tournament wins in 2008, Wisconsin is 10-7 in tournament games under Ryan. As a program, the UW men's basketball team has made 10 consecutive NCAA appearances overall and has been to the big dance in 11 of the last 12 seasons. Purdue made its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance under head coach **Matt Painter**. This is the first time that the Boilermakers have made back-to-back appearances since they made four consecutive tournaments from 1997-2000. In just four years of head coaching experience, Painter has been to the tournament three times. He led Southern Illinois to the dance in 2004 and Purdue in each of the last two seasons. Indiana's Dan Dakich made his first NCAA Tournament appearance as a head coach. Dakich is no stranger to postseason play, having coached under Bob Knight for 12 seasons from 1985-1997. During that time on staff, Indiana compiled a 283-101 (.737) record. Over that span, the Hoosiers won the national title in 1987 and earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament in each of his 12 seasons. Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** is the veteran among the group, making 11 NCAA Tournament appearances in his 13-year coaching tenure in East Lansing, while making four Final Four appearances.

**MORE ON THE COACHES:** Ohio State's **Thad Matta** and Minnesota's **Tubby Smith** led their respective teams to postseason action in the 2008 MasterCard NIT. In his first season at the helm of the Minnesota program, Smith led the Gophers to their first 20-win season since 2004-05. Minnesota made its first postseason appearance since the 2005-06 season when it played in that year's NIT. In 17 years of coaching, Smith has now led teams to postseason play in 15 consecutive seasons dating back to 1994 and is 29-14 in those appearances. Smith has guided teams to four NCAA Elite Eight appearances, nine NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearances and captured a national championship at Kentucky in 1998. In eight years as a head coach, Matta has made seven postseason appearances and won 20 games his first year in Columbus when OSU was ineligible for postseason play. Matta has been to the NCAA Tournament six times including last year's run to the NCAA National Championship game and owns a 12-6 record in those games. This is the third consecutive year that the Buckeyes have participated in postseason play under Matta.

**CREAM OF THE CROP:** With the addition of **Tom Crean** at Indiana, **Todd Lickliter** at Iowa, **John Beilein** at Michigan and **Tubby Smith** at Minnesota, the Big Ten coaching contingent boasts six national coach of the year honorees, more than any other conference. The Big Ten's five national coach of the year award winners include Illinois' **Bruce Weber** (2005-various selectors); Indiana's Crean (2003-Clair Bee); Iowa's Lickliter (2007-NABC); Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** (2001-NABC, 1999-*Basketball Times*, 1998-various selectors); Minnesota's Smith (2005-Phelan Award, 2003-various selectors) and Wisconsin's **Bo Ryan** (2007-Rupp Cup, Clair Bee, 2008-Phelan Award). The current crop of Big Ten coaches has won 10 national coach of the year awards, which ranks second only to the ACC with 12. The Big Ten tops all conferences with six national coach of the year honorees, followed by the Big East (4), Pac-10 (4), ACC (3), Big 12 (1) and SEC (1). A breakdown appears in the chart below.

## 2008 BIG TEN TOURNAMENT REVIEW

The 2008 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament was one of the most competitive in the history of the event. Seven of the 10 games were decided by a margin of seven points or less, with four of those being settled by four points or less. The first day began with No. 9 Michigan winning over No. 8 Iowa, 55-47. The final two games were also thrilling and competitive with No. 10 Illinois beating No. 7 Penn State, 64-63, and No. 6 Minnesota coming back from a 16-point deficit to knock off No. 11 Northwestern, 55-52.

Quarterfinal action began with top-seeded Wisconsin taking down the Wolverines, 51-34. In the second game on Friday, No. 4 Michigan State was triumphant over No. 5 Ohio State, 67-60. Illinois held No. 2 Purdue without a field goal in its overtime stanza for a 74-67 win to move the semifinals. Friday's action was capped off with one of the most exciting finishes in the Big Ten this year, as Minnesota's Blake Hoffarber knocked down a game-winning shot at the buzzer after receiving a full court pass with 1.5 seconds remaining to beat No. 3 Indiana, 59-58.

The semifinals were also very competitive as Wisconsin rallied from a 12-point deficit in the second half to upend the Spartans, 65-63. The Fighting Illini made tournament history with their 54-50 win over the Golden Gophers to become the first No. 10 seed ever to play in the championship game. However, the Badgers proved to be too much for Illinois in the end, as Wisconsin won the tournament finale, 61-48, marking the first time that the program has won both Big Ten regular season and tournament championships in the same year.

## 2007-08 BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**Nov. 12: DeShawn Sims, Michigan:** Averaged 20.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks while shooting 56.7 percent from the field with wins over Radford and Brown. In only his fourth career start, finished with a career-best 23 points and career-bests in field goals (10) and field-goal attempts (19) against Radford. Sims scored 17 points on 7-for-11 shooting, including 3-for-5 from long range versus Brown.

**Nov. 19: Eric Gordon, Indiana:** Made an impressive debut, scoring 33 points in his first career start and the Hoosiers' season opener. Set a first game IU scoring record, shooting 64 percent from behind the arc and connecting on 8-of-10 free throws, leading the Hoosiers to a 99-77 win over Chattanooga. His scoring output broke the IU first-game scoring record of 26 points established by George McGinnis in 1970. Gordon followed the performance with 21 points, three assists and two steals against Longwood. Shot 59 percent from the field (17-of-29) and 63 percent from behind the arc (12-of-19) for the week.

**Raymar Morgan, Michigan State:** Scored a career-high 25 points and pulled down a career-best 15 rebounds in MSU's 86-53 win over Chicago State to open the 2007-08 season. Produced his first career double-double and bested his previous career highs of 19 points and nine rebounds. Followed that performance with 13 points and 14 caroms in 83-65 win over Louisiana-Monroe, marking back-to-back double-double performances. Earned CBE East Lansing Regional MVP honors after averaging 19.0 points and 14.5 rebounds.

**Nov. 26: Kosta Koufos, Ohio State:** Led Ohio State to a 2-1 record in the Preseason NIT, including a win over No. 21 Syracuse at Madison Square Garden. Averaged 18.7 points, 9.3 rebounds and recorded six blocks. Scored a career-high 24 points against the Orange. Versus VMI at home, recorded his first career double-double with 22 points and 14 rebounds. Connected on 50 percent of his shots from the field for the week and hit 69 percent (9-of-13) against the Keydets.

**Dec. 3: D.J. White, Indiana:** Led the Hoosiers to wins over Georgia Tech and No. 22 Southern Illinois on a 57.8 shooting percentage and back-to-back double-doubles. Against the Yellow Jackets, scored 18 points and pulled down a career-high 14 rebounds while adding three blocks and two steals. Had 10 points, 12 boards and three blocks in the road win over the Salukis. For the week, averaged 14 points, 13 caroms and 1.5 blocks.

**Dec. 10: D.J. White, Indiana:** Averaged 22.5 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks to lead Indiana to victories over Tennessee State and Kentucky. Against Tennessee State, had a career-high 29 points and added 13 rebounds. Against Kentucky, racked up 16 points, 13 rebounds and two blocked shots and became the 41st player in Hoosier history to eclipse the 1,000-point barrier.

**Dec. 17: Geary Claxton, Penn State:** Posted fifth double-double and seventh 20-point game on the season leading Penn State with 21 points, 10 rebounds on 10-of-16 shooting in a 61-38 victory over Princeton. Followed that performance with a 13-point and nine-rebound outing on 5-of-7 shooting in a 60-39 victory over Denver. Shot 15-of-23 (65%) from the floor for the week.

**Dec. 24: Shaun Pruitt, Illinois:** Averaged a double-double over three games with 16.3 points and 10.3 rebounds per game. Was the top scorer and rebounder in all three contests, recording 11 points and eight rebounds vs. Western Carolina, 24 points and 15 rebounds vs. Miami (OH), and 14 points and eight rebounds vs. Missouri. Scored the winning basket against Missouri off an offensive rebound with 35 seconds left.

**Dan Coleman, Minnesota:** Led the Gophers with 20 points, while helping hold Santa Clara to its second-lowest point total of the year. Snagged a career-high six steals for the game and recorded three blocks in the home win. Has put together three straight games of at least 20 points and leads the Gophers in scoring, averaging 14.3 ppg.

**Dec. 31: Brian Butch, Wisconsin:** Recorded third double-double of the season and 10th of his career with 21 points and 11 rebounds in the Badgers' 67-66 win over No. 9 Texas. It was UW's first road win over a top-10 team since defeating No. 4 Ohio State on Jan. 26, 1980. Scored 10 of Wisconsin's final 17 points, over the last eight minutes of the game. Made 9-of-17 shots and added three assists.

**Jan. 7: Geary Claxton, Penn State:** Started the week with an impressive 29 points, 10 rebounds, three steals and three blocks on 9-of-12 shooting in an 81-68 route of Lehigh. Against Northwestern, logged 18 points, 11 rebounds, four assists and two blocks on 7-of-12 shooting. Wrapped up the week with an 11-point, 11-rebound performance in a defensive battle at Illinois. Averaged 19 points, 10 boards and shot 54.3 percent from the floor for the week.

**Raymar Morgan, Michigan State:** Scored a career-high 31 points, and added 10 rebounds for third double-double of the season, as MSU defeated Minnesota 65-59 in both team's Big Ten opener. Shot 11-of-17 from the field and 9-of-12 from the foul line. Also added two assists, one block and one steal against Minnesota.

**Jan. 14: D.J. White, Indiana:** Averaged 18 points, 16 rebounds, and two blocks in leading the Hoosiers to their first 3-0 conference start since the 2002 season. Had 21 points and 22 rebounds at Michigan, the first IU player since Alan Henderson in 1995 to surpass 20 points and 20 boards in a single game. Followed that up with 15 points and 10 boards against Illinois. Made 12-of-22 shots from the field (54.5) and 12-of-15 from the free-throw line (75.0).

**Jan. 21: Keaton Grant, Purdue:** Had back-to-back 22-point outings, helping lead Purdue to two conference wins. Set a career high with 22 points at Iowa and followed it up with 22 against Illinois. Shot a combined 8-of-12 from behind the three-point line. Also a combined 14-of-14 from the free-throw line.

**Jan. 28: Drew Neitzel, Michigan State:** Averaged 19.0 points, 6.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds in a pair of Spartan victories, shooting .583 from the field and .500 from three-point range. Scored 20 points, connecting on 6-of-10 three-point attempts and adding five assists in a 78-62 road win at Northwestern. Against Michigan, scored a team-best 18 points and added seven assists and a season-high seven rebounds.

**Feb. 4: D.J. White, Indiana:** Averaged 24 points and 15 rebounds in two games. Had 22 points and 17 rebounds at Wisconsin and 26 points-a Big Ten career-high-and 13 rebounds against Northwestern. Was 7-of-13 from the field and 8-of-10 from the line against UW and 9-of-11 from the floor and 8-of-11 from the charity stripe versus NU.

**E'Twaun Moore, Purdue:** Averaged 18.0 points in Purdue's two wins. Scored a team-high 12 points in a win over Iowa and scored a game-high 24 points at Illinois. Against the Illini, connected on 10-of-12 shots from the floor and scored 20 points in the second half. Went 8-of-9 from the floor during an eight-minute span, which enabled Purdue to maintain the lead down the stretch. Shot 4-of-4 from three-point range over the two games.

**Feb. 11: Robbie Hummel, Purdue:** Averaged 19.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in Purdue's two victories. Connected on 14-of-21 shots from the field and 5-of-9 attempts from three-point range. With 21 points against Wisconsin helped Purdue to a 72-67 win. Against Penn State, scored 17 points and grabbed six rebounds, while adding two assists and a block.

**Feb. 18: Manny Harris, Michigan:** Was a key contributor to U-M's first three-game win streak of the season. Averaged 21.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game while shooting 94.7 percent from the free-throw line and 57.1 percent from long range. Posted his 21st and 22nd double-digit scoring performances of the season with 15 points at Iowa and a career-best 27 points against Ohio State. Was 8-of-8 from the free-throw line down the stretch, helping seal the come-from-behind victory over Iowa. Versus OSU, was seven-of-19 from the field with three long-range baskets, adding a 10-of-11 free throw performance, including seven-of-eight in the final 2:41.

**Feb. 25: Cyrus Tate, Iowa:** Averaged 22 points and 10 rebounds on the week. Scored a career-high 26 points at Michigan State, hitting 10-of-13 field goals and was 6-of-7 from the free-throw line. Led the Hawkeyes with 18 points and 11 rebounds, recording third career double-double in the win over Northwestern. For the week, shot 77 percent from the field while also averaging a block and two steals.

**March 3: Goran Suton, Michigan State:** Averaged a double-double with 15.5 points and 12.0 rebounds as the Spartans split a pair of games against ranked opponents. Against Wisconsin, led MSU with 14 points and 15 rebounds. In a win over Indiana, hit 6-of-7 shots, including first collegiate three-pointer, scoring 17 points and adding nine rebounds and four steals. For the week, shot .706 from the field.

**March 10: Jamar Butler, Ohio State:** Averaged 22.5 points per game in wins over Purdue and Michigan State. Scored 25 points against the Boilermakers, shooting at a .750 clip. Was five-of-six from behind the arc. Scored 20 points in the win over the Spartans.

MORE TV COVERAGE THAN EVER

For the first time in Big Ten history, every men's basketball home game was televised by CBS Sports, an ESPN platform or the Big Ten Network. The unprecedented television exposure for the 2007-08 Big Ten men's basketball season featured increased coverage from long-time partners CBS Sports and ESPN. The Big Ten's latest media agreements resulted in 17 games appearing on CBS Sports, including the semifinal and championship games of the 2008 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament to be played from March 13-16 in Indianapolis, Ind.



The conference's new 10-year national rights contract with ESPN meant that between 53 and 56 home games appeared on an ESPN platform, with the majority of contests broadcast by ESPN or ESPN2. The total number of games on an ESPN network increased to as many as 83 contests when including non-conference away or neutral-site matchups. The new agreement also doubled the amount of mid-week games featured during intraconference play, as ESPN or ESPN2 aired a weekly contest on both Tuesday and Thursday. An ESPN platform also showed games on Saturday and Sunday, along with first-round and quarterfinal matchups of the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament.



The Big Ten Network distributed at least 135 Big Ten men's basketball games during the 2007-08 season. The Big Ten Network schedule began with every exhibition contest and all home non-conference games not appearing on CBS Sports or an ESPN network. Once Big Ten play rolled around, the network schedule featured a double-header every Wednesday night along with games on Tuesday or Thursday nights and a robust package of games on the weekends, including double-, triple- and quadruple-headers. All intraconference games were distributed on a national basis, which meant the end of the split-regional or local broadcasts seen in the past. The Big Ten Network also televised first-round and quarterfinal contests during the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament.

**The Big Ten's "Greatest Games" to Air on Big Ten Network:** Throughout the winter, basketball fans had the opportunity to re-live 36 epic match-ups on the Big Ten Network series, "THE BIG TEN'S GREATEST GAMES." The series highlighted some of the best moments in the rich histories of all 11 Big Ten basketball programs. Series producers interviewed many legendary players and coaches from those games along with those who were on hand to cover the event. Their insight and memories were integrated into each episode.
