BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Carl Landry, Purdue

Sr., F, Milwaukee, Wis./Vincent

Landry earns Player of the Week accolades for the second consecutive week after averaging 19.0 points and 8.5 rebounds in wins over No. 25 Virginia and Delaware State last week. Against the Hokies, the senior forward went 7-of-12 from the field while tallying 19 points and eight rebounds. In only 25 minutes of action, Landry then tallied 19 points and nine rebounds in a 62-40 win over Delaware State. For the week, he shot over 60 percent from the floor (14-of-23) and connected on 71.4 percent from the free throw line (10-of-14). He also recorded four assists, two blocks and three steals. Purdue's win over Virginia was its first non-conference home win over a ranked opponent since 1995. Landry, who currently leads the Big Ten in scoring with 19.3 points per game, picks up his third career weekly accolade after also being honored on Nov. 27, 2006 and Jan. 3, 2005.

BIG TEN NOTES

Preseason All-Big Ten Honorees Return from Injuries: Last Sunday, Ohio State freshman **Greg Oden** made his debut in a Buckeye uniform against Valparaiso after spending the last several months recovering from surgery to his right wrist. Oden entered at the 16:00 mark of the first half and finished with 14 points and 10 rebounds in 23 minutes to claim the first double-double of his career. Penn State's **Geary Claxton** also returned to PSU's line-up after missing the Nittany Lions' first four games of the year due to a broken hand. On Saturday against Morgan State, he posted 15 points and eight rebounds.

Molinari Takes Over Gopher Helm: With a 66-63 victory over Arizona State, Minnesota captured its first win under interim head coach **Jim Molinari** on Saturday. Molinari took over the Golden Gopher helm after Dan Monson resigned as head coach on Nov. 30. Monson compiled a 118-106 (.527) record in seven-plus seasons at Minnesota, including a 2-5 mark this season. Molinari came to Minnesota in 2004 after spending two seasons as an NBA scout for the Toronto Raptors and Miami Heat. Prior to his stint with the Heat, Molinari enjoyed a 24-year career as a collegiate head and assistant coach at the Division I level. For 11 seasons, he was the head coach at Bradley University where he amassed a 176-150 (.540) record and guided the Braves to the postseason six times. From 1989-1991, he was the head coach at Northern Illinois where he posted a record of 42-17 and won the 1991 Mid-Continent Conference title. His 14-year head coaching record stands at 219-167 (.567).

Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale: The Big Ten announced that all-session tickets for the 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament, along with single-session tickets, went on sale to the general public on Friday, Dec. 1. All-session and single-session tickets for the men's tournament, which includes 10 games over four days, will be available at the United Center box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www.ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (312) 559-1212. The cost for men's tournament all-session tickets will be either \$150 or \$275 depending on seat location. Single-session tickets range from \$30 to \$85 based on seat location and session. Orders will be limited to 12 all-session tickets or 12 single-session tickets for each session.

Big Ten Tourney in Chi-town: After a one-year hiatus, the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament returns to Chicago to crown the 2007 Tournament Champion. The first Big Ten Tournament was held at the United Center in 1998 and Chicago hosted the event in each of its first four years of existence before rotating with Indianapolis since 2002. In its first nine years of existence, the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament has welcomed more than 860,000 fans and issued over 5,300 media credentials. Four different conference representatives have become Big Ten Tournament champions, with Michigan State (1999, 2000), Illinois (2003, 2005) and Iowa (2001, 2006) claiming the honor twice along with Wisconsin capturing the 2004 crown. In addition, every tournament game in the past nine years has been televised live on CBS, ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPN Plus.

Big Ten Tournament Preview: On Saturday, Illinois will get an early look at the site of the 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament, as the Fighting Illini will take on Illinois-Chicago at the United Center in Chicago. Saturday's contest against the Flames marks the 35th game the Illini have played at the UC, dating back to the 1994-95 season. Illinois owns an all-time record of 28-6 (.824) at the United Center, which includes a current winning streak of 15 straight games spanning the last five seasons.

International Flavor: A total of 13 international players are listed on Big Ten rosters this season. Northwestern leads the Big Ten with four international players in **Nikola Baran** (Zagreb, Croatia), **Jean-Marc Melchior** (Contern, Luxembourg), **Ivan Peljusic** (Zadar, Croatia) and **Ivan Tolic** (Split, Croatia). The Big Ten's list of international players also include Indiana's **Ben Allen** (Melbourne, Australia), Iowa's **Kurt Looby** (St. John's, Antigua), Michigan's **Jevohn Shepherd** (Toronto, Ontario, Canada), Michigan State's **Idong Ibok** (Lagos, Nigeria) and **Maurice Joseph** (Montreal, Quebec, Canada), Minnesota's **Engen Nurumbi** (Kinsasha, Congo) and Penn State's **Milos Bogetic** (Podgorica, Serbia & Montenegro), **Nikola Obradovic** (Belgrade, Serbia & Montenegro) and **Joonas Suotamo** (Espoo, Finland).

30-Plus Point Performances: With a conference-high 31-point performance against Coppin State on Dec. 1, Iowa's **Adam Haluska** became the third different player to record 30 or more points this season. This season, Haluska joins Ohio State's **Ron Lewis** who tallied 30 points against North Carolina on Nov. 29; and Purdue's **Carl Landry**, who scored 30 in a win over Oklahoma on Nov. 21.

Protecting Your Home: Iowa will be vying for its 22nd consecutive home victory when the Hawkeyes host Northern Iowa on Tuesday. Iowa's 21-game home winning streak is the third-longest in the nation (Gonzaga - 44, Connecticut - 26, Air Force - 20, Akron - 19). The Hawkeyes were the only conference team to go undefeated at home last year and Iowa's last defeat occurred on Feb. 19, 2005 against Illinois. The Hawkeyes' 21-game streak still trails the Big Ten record of 53 straight home triumphs set by Michigan State from 1998 to 2002.

Big Ten Coaching Milestones: Two Big Ten mentors are in reach of claiming several coaching milestones during the 2006-07 season. Illinois' **Bruce Weber** needs just one triumph to tally his 200th career victory with a 199-72 mark that includes a five-year stint at Southern Illinois before joining the Fighting Illini staff in 2003. In his 16th year of coaching, Iowa's **Steve Alford** stands five wins away from claiming his 300th career victory with a 295-173 record.

2006 ACC/Big Ten Challenge Review: Last week, the ACC captured the Challenge with an 8-3 record, while the Big Ten earned victories from Northwestern, Purdue and Wisconsin ... Seven out of the 11 games were decided by eight points or less ... Purdue downed No. 25/- Virginia, 61-59, while Northwestern defeated Miami (Fla.), 61-59, to give both squads their second win in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge ... No. 12/13 Wisconsin captured an 81-66 victory over Miami (Fla.) to improve to 3-2 in the event ... With Ohio State earning the No. 1 ranking in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls, it marked the third consecutive year that the top-ranked team competed in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Last year No. 1/1 Duke posted a 75-67 victory over Indiana, while Illinois upset No. 1 Wake Forest, 91-73, in 2004.

Big Ten's Grand Company: Currently, six Big Ten standouts are members of the conference's 1,000 career point club, including three student-athletes from Michigan. The Wolverines' **Lester Abram** (1,024), **Dion Harris** (1,254) and **Courtney Sims** (1,073) head up the 1,000-plus point scorers list and are joined by Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** (1,654), Ohio State's **Ron Lewis** (1,378) and Iowa's **Adam Haluska** (1,373). After scoring 588 points during the 2005-06 season, Tucker is now aiming to become the first 2,000-point producer for the Big Ten since Indiana's A.J. Guyton tallied 2,100 points from 1997-00. With 960 career points, Purdue's **David Teague** is vying to become the next Big Ten standout to join the conference's 1,000 point club.

Big Ten Hosts 2007 NCAA First/Second Round: In 2007, the Big Ten will host the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds on Friday and Sunday, March 16 and 18, at the United Center in Chicago. It marks the third time in league history that the conference has played host to the NCAA Tournament as the Big Ten welcomed eight teams to the United Center in both 1998 and 2002. Ohio State will also host first and second rounds (March 16 and 18) next year at the Nationwide Arena in downtown Columbus.

TOP PERFORMANCES FOR THE WEEK OF NOV. 27-DEC. 3

Warren Carter, ILL: Averaged a double-double last week with 18.5 points and 10.5 rebounds per game; Established two career bests last week - 11 rebounds against Maryland and 24 points versus No. 16/16 Arizona.

D.J. White, IND: Recorded his fourth career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 12 rebounds against Charlotte; Led IU's defense, which has out-rebounded its first six opponents this season and held Duke (31.8 percent) and Charlotte (34.4 percent) under 35 percent from the floor.

Adam Haluska, IOWA: Tallied a career high in scoring with 31 points and nine assists against Coppin State, while earning MVP accolades at the Hawkeye Challenge.

Dion Harris, MICH: Averaged 19.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 7.5 assists per game last week; Posted a season-best 24 points against N.C. State and then notched his first career double-double with 14 points and a career-best 10 assists against Wofford.

Dan Coleman, MINN: Coleman led the Gophers with 18 points on 7-of-11 shooting (.636) against Clemson; Chipped in 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting versus Arizona State on Saturday with a career-high four assists.

Craig Moore, NU: Scored a career-high 24 points and tied a school record with seven three-pointers in win over Miami (Fla.); Shot 7-of-10 from long range (.700) and 8-of-11 from the field (.727).

Ron Lewis, OSU: Scored a game-high 30 points in Ohio State's road loss at No. 6 North Carolina; Tallied his seventh effort in double figures with 10 against Valparaiso to average 20 points on 14-of-21 (.667) shooting last week.

Jamelle Cornley, PSU: Led Penn State in both games last week, tallying 20 points and five rebounds; Shot 56.6 percent from the field (17-of-30) for the week, averaging 19 points, six rebounds, and 39 minutes per game for the week.

Kammron Taylor, WIS: Went 7-of-8 from three-point range (.875) during the week and leads the Big Ten in three-point shooting percentage (.591) this season; Led UW with 16 points against Florida International.
