BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Adam Haluska, Iowa
Sr., G, Carroll, Iowa/Carroll

Haluska claims Player of the Week accolades after averaging 25.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game, while leading the Hawkeyes to wins over Michigan and No. 25 Indiana last week. The senior guard notched a double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds as the Hawkeyes rallied from an 11-point halftime deficit to claim a 69-62 victory at Michigan. Haluska then registered his third 30-plus point performance of the season, scoring 33 against No. 25 Indiana which included five three-pointers and 10-of-11 shooting from the charity stripe. He also added five rebounds and two steals in the 81-75 win over the Hoosiers. Haluska, who currently leads the Big Ten in scoring with 20.5 points per game, earns his third Big Ten weekly accolade as he was also honored on Jan. 30 and Dec. 26, 2006. With the win over No. 25 Indiana, Iowa has now won nine of its last 10 home contests against ranked opponents.

All-Tournament Selections: Ohio State's Jamar Butler and Wisconsin's Alando Tucker return after earning All-Tournament honors in past Big Ten Tournaments.



Last year, Ohio State's Butler led the Buckeyes to a runner-up finish at the 2006 Big Ten Tournament, while earning All-Tournament accolades. Wisconsin's Tucker claimed All-Tourney laurels in 2005. Illinois leads the conference with eight All-Tournament selections, while Ohio State follows with seven honorees. Every Big Ten squad has placed at least one student-athlete on the All-Tournament team.

BIG TEN NOTES

Tied for the Conference Lead: Wisconsin and Ohio State are tied for the Big Ten lead with matching 8-1 records. This is the first time under head coach **Bo Ryan** that the Badgers have been in first place in the conference standings after nine games. It is also UW's first 8-1 start to conference play since 1946-47, when the Badgers opened the Big Ten with a 9-1 record. The Buckeyes are off to their best start* in conference action since beginning the 1990-91 campaign with a 15-1 mark. (*OSU's 8-1 conference start during the 2001-02 season was vacated by the NCAA).

Tucker Nearing 2,000-Point Plateau: Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** needs just 25 points to become the second Badger and 23rd player in Big Ten history to score at least 2,000 points in his career. Currently the senior forward has tallied 1,975 points and is nearing UW's all-time scoring record held by Michael Finley, whose 2,147 points ranks 12th in conference annals. The last 2,000-point producer in the Big Ten was Indiana's A.J. Guyton, who tallied 2,100 points from 1997-00.

Big Ten's Grand Company: Tucker is joined by eight other Big Ten standouts that have reached the 1,000-point milestone in their career, including Iowa's **Adam Haluska** (1,696), Michigan's **Lester Abram** (1,175), **Dion Harris** (1,420) and **Courtney Sims** (1,223), Ohio State's **Ron Lewis** (1,503), Purdue's **David Teague** (1,189), Penn State's **Geary Claxton** (1,119) and Wisconsin's **Kammron Taylor** (1,059). The Boilermakers' **Carl Landry** (975) is vying to become the next member of the conference's 1,000-point club.

Three Big Ten Standouts Named to Wooden Award Midseason List:

Three Big Ten standouts - Michigan State's **Drew Neitzel**, Ohio State's **Greg Oden** and Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker** - were among the 30 players selected as midseason candidates for the 2006-07 John Wooden Award Player of the Year and All-America Team. The 10-player Wooden Award All-America Team will be announced on Tuesday, March 27, 2007, while the recipient of the Wooden Award Trophy as the nation's top collegiate men's basketball player will be named on Saturday, April 7, 2007. Last year, Illinois' Dee Brown was named to the 2006 Wooden All-America team, while Purdue's Glenn Robinson was the last conference standout to win the Wooden Award in 1994.

NCAA RPI Rankings: The Big Ten has four teams in the top 30 of the RPI rankings which were released by the NCAA last Monday. Wisconsin leads the Big Ten contingent with a No. 3 ranking, while Ohio State (8th), Indiana (20th) and Michigan State (28th) round out the top 30.

Matta's 20-Win Streak: While leading the Buckeyes to a 20-3 record this year, Ohio State's **Thad Matta** becomes the fifth coach in Big Ten history to record three-consecutive 20-plus victory campaigns in his first three seasons in the conference. The third-year coach led OSU to 20 wins in his first year in Columbus and 26 triumphs a season ago. He joins Illinois' **Bruce Weber** (2003-present), former Illini mentor Bill Self (2000-03), former Indiana coach Mike Davis (2000-06) and former Iowa mentor Tom Davis (1986-99), who all began their Big Ten careers with three consecutive 20-plus win seasons. In addition, Matta is also one of only two coaches nationally to record 20 or more wins in the first six seasons of his coaching career. Mark Few of Gonzaga is the other head coach with 20-plus victories in all seven years with the Bulldogs.

Big Ten's Homecourt Records: Ohio State has the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country with 22 consecutive triumphs at Value City Arena while Wisconsin follows in ninth place with a 19-game home winning streak at the Kohl Center. Gonzaga leads the nation with a 49-game homecourt winning streak. The Buckeyes' last home loss was on Jan. 15, 2006, in double-overtime, 62-59, against the Spartans. Ohio State's current 22-game winning streak now stands alone as the third-longest in program history. Wisconsin last loss at home occurred on Jan. 31, 2006, when the Badgers fell to No. 6/6 Illinois, 66-51. OSU and UW still trail the Big Ten record of 53 straight home triumphs set by Michigan State from 1998 to 2002 -- a winning streak that was ended by the Badgers.

The Importance of Defending the Homecourt: Winning home games is crucial to a conference title run. In fact, no Big Ten team in the past 15 seasons has lost more than one conference home game and gone on to claim a share of the title. The last conference squad to accomplish that feat was Indiana, as the Hoosiers went 7-2 at home in 1991 but earned a tie with Ohio State. From 1990-2006, teams that won or shared the Big Ten title have compiled a cumulative home record of 177-15 (.922) in conference games only. This season, the top three teams in the Big Ten standings are currently undefeated at home. Wisconsin and Ohio State, which are tied for first place in the conference standings, are 5-0 and 4-0, respectively at home this season. Indiana is also undefeated with a 5-0 record in Big Ten home games, while four programs have dropped only one home contest in Iowa (4-1), Michigan (3-1), Michigan State (3-1) and Purdue (3-1).

Haluska's Scoring Explosion: On Saturday, Iowa's **Adam Haluska** led the Hawkeyes to an 81-75 victory over Indiana, while tallying 33 points. It marked the third 30-plus point performance for the senior guard this season. Haluska recorded 31 points against Coppin State on Dec. 2 and then followed with a conference season-best 36-point performance in a 101-59 win over Georgia State on Dec. 30. This year, a total of six different players (Iowa's **Adam Haluska**, Michigan State's **Drew Neitzel**, Ohio State's **Ron Lewis**, Penn State's **Geary Claxton**, Purdue's **Carl Landry** and Wisconsin's **Alando Tucker**) have tallied 30 or more points in a game.

Attendance Nears Two-Million Mark: The Big Ten will break the two million mark in total attendance this week, as 1,938,885 fans have flocked to conference arenas for 155 games. Last season, the Big Ten led the country in total attendance for the 30th-straight season and broke the two-million mark for the 14th consecutive year as the conference welcomed 2,255,332 fans through the turnstiles in 176 games.

BIG TEN NOTES, CONT.

Big Ten Turnaround: With a 69-59 victory at Penn State on Saturday, Purdue improved to 15-8 overall and 4-5 in the Big Ten this season. With another victory this week, the Boilermakers will tie their win total from the last two years. The Boilermakers combined for 16 wins during the 2004-05 (7-21 record) and 2005-06 (9-19 record) seasons. Purdue is also vying for the most wins in Big Ten play since tallying a 7-9 mark during the 2003-04 season.

Big Ten Coaching Milestones: Earlier this year, Iowa head coach **Steve Alford** captured his 300th career victory and is now closing in on another coaching milestone. In his eighth season at Iowa, Alford only needs two victories to claim his 150th career win in Iowa City. Penn State's **Ed DeChellis** is also in reach of hitting the 150th career victory plateau. Currently, DeChellis boasts a career mark of 146-161 in his 11th season.

Big Ten Hosts 2007 NCAA First/Second Round: The Big Ten will host the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds on Friday and Sunday, March 16 and 18, at the United Center in Chicago. It marks the third time in league history that the conference has played host to the NCAA Tournament as the Big Ten welcomed eight teams to the United Center in both 1998 and 2002. Ohio State will also host first and second rounds (March 16 and 18) at the Nationwide Arena in downtown Columbus.

Black History Month: The Big Ten announced the launch of its Black History Month website to commemorate the achievements of African-Americans on Big Ten campuses. During the month of February, the website, which can be accessed at www.bigten.org, will feature a story on a male and female student-athlete from each institution throughout the 28-day celebration. Former men's basketball standouts that will be featured are Illinois' Kendall Gill, Michigan State's Magic Johnson and Purdue's Eugene Parker.

CELEBRATING THE 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Winningest Coaches: Only five coaches boast winning percentages of .600 or better in Big Ten Tournament play, and three will be returning to the United Center in 2007. After claiming the 2006 Big Ten Tournament title, Iowa's **Steve Alford** leads all coaches in winning percentage with a record of 13-5 (.722). Illinois' **Bruce Weber** and former Illini coach Bill Self are tied for second place with a .714 winning percentage. Another former Illinois coach Lon Kruger ranks fourth (6-3; .667), while Ohio State's **Thad Matta** follows in fifth place with a 3-2 mark (.600). Alford leads all coaches with 13 triumphs, while Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** has tallied 10 victories and two titles in nine events.

Top Tourney Teams: Illinois leads the conference in winning percentage and total wins in Big Ten Tournament play with a record of 16-7 (.696) over nine years. That mark includes two tournament crowns and three second-place finishes. The Fighting Illini won the 2005 crown, the last time the tournament was held in Chicago. Iowa boasts the league's second-best winning percentage with a record of 13-7 (.650), including two tournament titles (2001 and 2006) while Michigan State follows in third place with a 10-7 mark (.588). The Spartans join the Illini and the Hawkeyes as the only two-time winners in the event after MSU claimed the 1999 and 2000 titles.

Throw Out The Records: History has shown that every team at the Big Ten Tournament will have a shot at leaving town with the title. Last year, Michigan State advanced to the semifinals as the No. 6 seed, defeating No. 3 Illinois before falling to second-seeded Iowa. In 2003, Ohio State advanced to the title game despite holding the No. 8 seed. In 2002, Iowa reached the finals as the ninth seed, just one season after becoming the lowest-seeded team to win the Big Ten Tournament, as the sixth-seeded Hawkeyes won four games in four days to earn the league's NCAA automatic berth in 2001. In addition to the magical runs of OSU and Iowa the last five years, the No. 4 seed has advanced to the finals three times. In only the last three years has the No. 1 and the No. 2 seed faced off in the championship final. Last season, No. 2 Iowa downed Ohio State, while No. 1 Illinois defeated second-seeded Wisconsin for the 2005 Tournament title. In 2004, the No. 2 Badgers defeated the No. 1 seeded Fighting Illini.

Native Sons Return to Chicago: The Big Ten Conference includes at least 22 men's basketball players from the state of Illinois, as six of the 11 schools carry at least one Illinois native on the roster. Illinois leads the conference with nine native sons while Northwestern can put as many as six in-state products on the floor. Indiana, Iowa, Purdue and Wisconsin each feature one player from Illinois. The five schools without an Illinois product on the team include Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Penn State.

Credential Information: The 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament credential website is now online and available for media use. Please contact the Big Ten Communications office for access information to the website. After you have read and accepted the credential criteria and policies, the following web page will ask you to "Please select the Big Ten university you usually cover. If you do not cover a specific Big Ten school on a regular basis, select 'Other Media.'" **If your media agency normally covers a Big Ten team**, you must select that university when applying for credentials on the website. Upon filling out and submitting your credential application, you will receive an automated confirmation that your form has been received by that school's men's basketball SID. After the SID reviews your application, you will receive an acceptance or denial email. If you receive an acceptance email, your name will be added to that school's media list and **pending final approval of the Big Ten Conference**, will be approved for credentials. You do not need to contact the Big Ten Communications office to verify your credential approval. By February 23, you will receive additional tournament media information via email from the Big Ten Communications Department. The SIDs will also have a limited number of parking credentials to distribute in advance to their media outlets. **If your media agency does not normally cover a conference team**, just click on the "Media Type" drop-down box and select "Other Media" at the bottom of the list and follow the instructions noted above. If you discover that you need to make changes to your application after you submit it, please contact the men's basketball SID at the school you cover. Also if you cannot apply online, please contact our office to apply for credentials.

Hotel Information: Media representatives who plan on covering the 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament are advised that reservations are now being accepted at the Fairmont Chicago, the official media hotel of the Big Ten Tournament. Room rates are \$189 for a single or \$239 for a deluxe room. Reservations can be made by calling the hotel at 312-565-6698 or by accessing the following website: <http://www.fairmont.com/chi/bigten/>. The deadline to secure this rate was Sunday, February 4. After this date, there is no guarantee that the space or rate will be available.



Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale: All-session tickets for the 2007 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament, along with single-session tickets, went on sale to the general public on Friday, Dec. 1. All-session and single-session tickets for the men's tournament, which includes 10 games over four days, will be available at the United Center box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www.ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (312) 559-1212. The cost for men's tournament all-session tickets will be either \$150 or \$275 depending on seat location. Single-session tickets range from \$30 to \$85 based on seat location and session. Orders will be limited to 12 all-session tickets or 12 single-session tickets for each session.

Big Ten Network Unveils New Headquarters in Chicago:

The Big Ten Network announced on Dec. 20 the official location for its studios and business offices in Chicago. The network will be headquartered in the historic Montgomery Ward building located in Chicago's Near North neighborhood. The Big Ten Network studios will be located in a 44,000 square-foot office space at 600 West Chicago, formerly the Montgomery Ward & Co. Catalog House. The original section of the building was designated as a national historic landmark in 2000 for its significant role in American retail history. The space will include two studios and three control rooms as well as a 20,000 square-foot office space.

Silverman Named Big Ten Network President: The Big Ten Network announced on Dec. 5 that Mark Silverman will serve as the organization's first president. Silverman will manage the day-to-day operations of the network and will report to its Board of Directors. He comes to the Big Ten Network after serving as the general manager and senior vice president of ABC Cable Networks Group since April of 2004, managing the company's equity in such channels as Lifetime Television, A&E Network and the History Channel, each of which recorded their best financial performance in 2005. Silverman was also responsible for developing and launching new cable channels, shows and other key initiatives. He also served as the general manager of ABC Family Channel from 2003-04. Prior to joining ABC Family, Silverman was co-founder and president of Silverkings Media, a media/entertainment consulting company, from 2001-03, and senior vice president of Broadband Sports, an online sports content company, from 1999-2001. His previous experience also consists of various leadership roles with the Walt Disney Company from 1991-1999, including serving as vice president of business development for ABC, Inc., General Manager of ESPN Zone and vice president of Walt Disney Studios.

Big Ten Network Announces Branding Committee: On Oct. 25, the Big Ten Network announced the four individuals who will comprise its inaugural Branding Committee, a group which will provide oversight to preserve the integrity of the Big Ten Conference brand in all content provided through the network. The members of the Big Ten Network Branding Committee include Michigan State University President **Lou Anna K. Simon**, Northwestern University President **Henry S. Bienen**, Fox Networks Group President and Chief Executive Officer **Tony Vinciguerra**, and Fox College Sports Executive Vice President and General Manager **David Rone**. The Branding Committee



will serve as consultants to the Big Ten Network in developing and strengthening the network's brand and ensuring that the core values of the Big Ten Conference are reflected through all programming and advertising.

Big Ten Network Announces Board of Directors: On Oct. 19, the Big Ten Network announced the five individuals who will compose

its first Board of Directors. This group will provide leadership and oversight for the network. The members of the five-person Board of Directors include Big Ten Commissioner **James E. Delany**, Fox Regional Cable Sports Networks President **Randy Freer**, former Vice Chairman of PNC Bank and former chairman of the Board of Trustees of Penn State **Edward "Ted" Junker III**, Fox National Cable Sports Networks President **Bob Thompson** and New York Mets Chairman of the Board and CEO **Fred Wilpon**. The Board of Directors is responsible for providing strategic oversight and corporate governance for the network. The Board will develop the long-term vision of the network and will sustain the ongoing commitment to becoming a premier, nationally distributed channel.

Big Ten Network Set to Debut in August of 2007: Last June, the Big Ten announced a 20-year deal with Fox Cable Networks to create the Big Ten Network, a national network devoted to Big Ten athletic and academic programs, to launch in August of 2007. The Big Ten Network will carry many of the games and events previously available only through syndication and will be available to all carriers and distributors nationwide. In addition to traditional distribution through cable and satellite, select Big Ten Network content will also be available through alternative media platforms. Sports programming on the Big Ten Network will annually include, but is not limited to, 35-plus football games, at least 105 regular-season men's basketball games, at least 55 regular-season women's basketball games, Big Ten Championships and Tournaments, 170 Olympic sporting events and coverage from the conference's vast library of historic sporting events, including bowl games. In addition, each school will have the right to provide 60 hours of its own content annually. Fox has entered into a charter affiliation agreement with DIRECTV, which will carry the Big Ten Network at launch nationwide on Total Choice, which is received by more than 15.4 million households. The Big Ten Network will be majority-owned by the Big Ten Conference, with Fox holding a minority interest. The network will establish its studios and headquarters in Chicago, with Fox handling the administration and daily operations and the Big Ten establishing general guidelines regarding the types of pro-
