## Claxton & Cornley Form One Of Big Ten's Top Tandems:

Named team Co-MVPS for the 2006-07 season Geary Claxton and Jamelle Cornley are two of four Big Ten returners who ranked in the top 15 in the conference in scoring and rebounding last season. Either Claxton or Cornley led Penn State in scoring in all but six games in 2006-07 and they led or tied for the team lead in rebounding in all but two games. They both posted double-digit scoring averages in conference play (Claxton -15.7 ppg; Cornley - 13.2 ppg) and accounted for 47 percent of Penn State's scoring (28.9 ppg) and rebounding (13.7 rpg) in Big Ten games. Claxton ranks as the second leading Big Ten returning scorer (16.3 ppg) and tops in rebounding (8.0 rpg), while Cornley is the sixth leading scorer (13.5 ppg) and third leading rebounder (6.7 rpg) among returners. They both ranked in the top 15 in six Big Ten categories in 2006-07.

## Claxton Looks To Become Second Player To Lead Lions In Scoring In Four Straight Seasons:

With a scoring average of 16.3 ppg in 2006-07, Geary Claxton raised his scoring average for the third-straight season and became just the sixth Penn State player in 111 years of basketball to lead the team in scoring in three straight seasons. Claxton, whose scoring average was the highest for a PSU player since Joe Crispin posted 19.5 ppg in 2000-01, was the first player since Pete Lisicky (1996-98) to accomplish the feat. In his final campaign, Claxton will look to join All-American Jesse Arnelles (1952-55) as just the second player to lead the Lions in scoring in four seasons.

**Claxton Continues Progression:** Senior Geary Claxton, the Nittany Lions leading scorer and rebounder the last two seasons, will look to continue his steady progression as he enters his final campaign. Claxton has raised his scoring and rebounding average in each of his three previous seasons in a Nittany Lion uniform while playing an average of 33.3 minutes per game and in all but four (broken hand) of Penn State's 90 games over that stretch.

## Lions Return Big Ten 3-point Percentage Leader In Morrissey:

Following a strong sophomore season in which he led the the Big Ten shooting 49.3 percent (35-71) from the three-point line in conference play, 6-3, junior guard Danny Morrissey returns as one of the top long range threats in the conference. Returning from a medical red-shirt in 2005-06 (patella tendon tear), Morrissey hit his stride as 2007 conference play began posting a string of 15 threes in three games to start the Big Ten season and completing a run of seven straight games scoring in double-digits. Morrissey earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors (1/8) after shooting 59 percent (32-54) from the floor and 56 percent (23-41) from three in a rout of Northwestern and close losses at Purdue and vs. Indiana, leading Penn State averaging 19.3 ppg in those games. Morrissey shot 44.1 percent (64-145) from three for the year, tied for the fourth-best season ever in Penn State annals and third overall in the Big Ten for the season.

## BIG TEN RETURNS TO 18-GAME SCHEDULE

At the request of the majority of conference coaches, the Big Ten's Administrators Council (athletic directors and senior woman administrators) approved an 18-game conference schedule in April to start in the 2007-08 season. The change affects both men's and women's teams. Big Ten schools had traditionally played 18 league games until adopting the conference tournament for the 1997-98 season. The Big Ten has played a 16-game schedule the last 10 seasons. League teams will now play eight of a possible 10 opponents home and away and will face the other two league teams once each, playing one at home and one on the road. In the old 16-game format, Big Ten teams played six teams home and away and four teams once each, with two games at home and two on the road. Penn State posted its two winningest seasons in the Big Ten playing an 18-game schedule going 12-6 in 1995-96 and 9-9 in 1994-95.



## SIX NEW PLAYERS TO JOIN LION LINE-UP

Penn State will welcome its last two recruiting classes to the floor for the first time in 2007-08 as six players who will add speed, size, depth, and athleticism join the line-up. Both 2006 signees David Jackson (6-6, Farrell, Pa.) and Andrew Jones (6-8, Philadelphia, Pa.) are coming off redshirt seasons during their true-freshmen campaigns and 2007 signees Talor Battle (5-11, Albany, N.Y.) and Jeff Brooks (6-8/Louisville, Ky.), both from the high school ranks, and Stanley Pringle (6-1, Pasco-Hernando CC) and Schyler King (6-6, Tyler JC), both junior college transfers, will look to make an impact in the line-up. Battle, a 2007 Class AA New York All-State selection, and Pringle, the Suncoast Conference Player of the Year, add two quick and athletic scorers at the guard positions. Both have played extensively at the point-guard position, shoot well from the three-point stripe and are adept at penetrating and scoring. Brooks, a 2007 Kentucky All-State selection, Jackson, a Pennsylvania All-State selection and King will add three long and rangy athletes on the perimeter. All possess good perimeter shooting skills and the quickness to defend and rebound. Jones, who has gained more than 30 pounds since coming to Penn State, brings an additional active and physical presence to the paint.

### GEARY CLAXTON

- With 1,262 career points and 621 career rebounds, is on pace to finish in the top three all-time in scoring and rebounding at Penn State joining All-American Jesse Arnelles as the only PSU player to finish their career ranked in the top five in both categories.

- Can become just second player to lead PSU in scoring in four seasons.

- Can become just third player in PSU history to post 1,000 points and 800 rebounds for a career.

- Needs 48 points, 32 steals and 21 rebounds to join Jarrett Stephens (1996-2000) as just the second PSU player to finish their career ranked in the top 10 all-time in points, rebounds, blocks and steals.

### JAMELLE CORNLEY

- Needs 254 points to become the 28th Nittany Lion to score 1,000 career points

- Needs 254 points and 128 rebounds to become the 16th Nittany Lion to post 1,000 points and 500 rebounds on their career.

## 2006-07 Three-point Leaders Walker & Morrissey Return; Rank Among Top 3-Point Shooters in PSU Annals:

Senior Mike Walker and junior Danny Morrissey have combined to make 248 career three-pointers and both rank among the top 10 in career threes made at Penn State entering the 2007-08 season. Walker stands eighth all-time with 131 career threes and Morrissey stands ninth with 117. Morrissey led PSU with 64 threes and shooting 44.1 percent from the arc last year, while Walker was second with 46 threes and shooting 37.4 percent.

## Walker Brings Momentum Of Big Ten Tournament Three-point Record Into Final Campaign:

Senior Mike Walker provided a big spark for Penn State playing big minutes at point-guard in the last eight games of the 2006-07 season. None was bigger than his career-high 22-point outing and Big Ten Tournament record seven threes on 11 attempts in Penn State's first round loss to Illinois (66-60). Walker logged big minutes at the point as senior Ben Lubber was sidelined with a wrist injury. Over the final eight games of the season, Walker led the team in assists (3.5 apg), threes (23), three-point percentage (48.9), assist-to-turnover ratio (2.3) and ranked third in scoring (10.3 ppg) just .3 points behind Jamelle Cornley in second.

## Claxton & Cornley Among Big Ten Double-Double Leaders:

Geary Claxton tied for third in the Big Ten with a career-best eight double-doubles in 2006-07 while Jamelle Cornley ranked tied for sixth with a career-high five. Claxton twice posted career-best strings of three straight double-doubles on the season. He accomplished the feat vs. Minnesota, Purdue and Wisconsin in succession in the Big Ten and earlier on the year vs. Hartford, Seton Hall and Long Island. Claxton enters the 2007-08 season leading the Big Ten with 17 career double-doubles while Cornley has six on his career.

## Suotamo Joins Finnish Team At World University Games:

Junior forward Joonas Suotamo played six games with the Finnish Team at the World University Games in Bangkok, Thailand Aug. 7-18. It was his second stint with the Finnish team at the World University Games, which are held every two years. He has played with the Finnish team the past several summers having success last year at the European Junior Championships and in 2005 at the World University Games and the U20 Championships. The Finnish Team posted a 3-3 mark at the 2007 Games, while Suotamo scored 22 points and grabbed 10 rebounds playing in all six games.

Danny Morrissey and David Jackson both spent time at the IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. during the early part of the summer where they competed against some of the top current and former collegians in the nation.

Geary Claxton's aunt, Tracy, played college basketball at both Kansas and Old Dominion. She was a two-time All-American at ODU (1984-85) and MVP of the 1985 Final Four as she led the Monarchs to their third National Crown.

Brandon Hassell is the cousin of NBA Timberwolves starting guard Trenton Hassell.

Assistant Coach Kurt Kanaskie's son, Kevin, will be a junior guard on Middle Tennessee State's basketball team. He led the team averaging 12.2 ppg and 5.8 apg while starting all 32 games in 2006-07.

More than 2,600 students enthusiastically braved the weather to energize the Jordan Center and nearly spur the upset as Penn State outscored the eventual NCAA runner-ups 43-24 in the second half before falling 64-62 when Mike Walker's last second three pointer from the top of the key came up just long.

### Largest BJC Crowd In Six Years:

Penn State had 13,347 fans greet them when they took the floor on Jan. 20 of last season to take on Michigan State in the Bryce Jordan Center. The crowd, fueled by more than 2,000 students fresh off the semester break, was the Nittany Lions largest at home since 15,377 fans filled the arena to watch No. 24 Michigan State take on Penn State on Feb. 24, 2001.

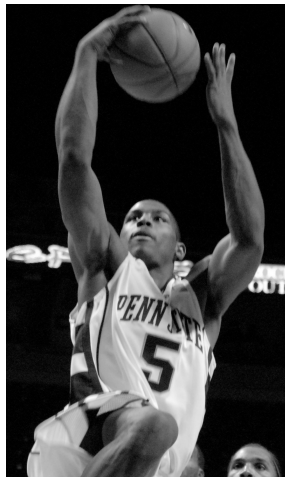

Ed DeChellis is entering his fifth season at the helm of the Penn State Nittany Lion basketball team. During his rebuilding process, DeChellis has already helped Penn State claim its first ever Big Ten Freshman of the Year in Jamelle Cornley and three straight members of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team: Marlon Smith (2004), Geary Claxton (2005) and Cornley (2006). Penn State had none before his arrival.

He continued to build Penn State's talent pool in 2006-07 bringing in a pair of top 100 rated recruits in New York All-State guard Talor Battle and Kentucky All-State forward Jeff Brooks.

Penn State made big strides in 2005-06 despite playing the youngest (12 underclassmen) and smallest (no starter over 6-6) line-up in the Big Ten. DeChellis led Penn State to its most overall wins (15-15), most non-conference wins (8-3), most Big Ten wins (6-10), first Big Ten Tournament win and first post-season appearance in five seasons. The Lions three Big Ten road wins tied for third-best in the conference and included a huge upset victory at No. 6 Illinois, ending the Illini's 33-game home win streak and marking the biggest road win in program history. Penn State swept two conference opponents (Purdue and Northwestern) for the first time since 1997-98, beat Indiana for just the third time in program history, and posted its best marks in scoring, assists, steals, shooting percentage and turnovers in five or more seasons.

DeChellis wrapped up the year by being named the 2006 National Coaches Vs. Cancer Man of the Year for contributions in the fight against cancer.

Penn State was coming off two consecutive seven-win seasons when DeChellis was named head coach in April of 2003. Energizing the fans and players, DeChellis helped guide Penn State to nine wins with fewer players on scholarship. The win total was more than the prior two seasons. DeChellis also helped guide Penn State to more Big Ten wins than the previous season as well.

DeChellis returned to Penn State after a very successful run as the head coach at East Tennessee State University. At ETSU, the 1982 Penn State graduate turned a last place Buccaneer team into a three-time conference divisional winner, a conference tournament champion and an NCAA Tournament squad.

Taking over a program that went 7-20 the year before his arrival, DeChellis amassed an excellent 105-93 record in seven years as head coach.

Showcasing the ability to build a program from the foundation up, DeChellis had his most successful seasons in his last three there. During that span, his ETSU teams went 56-31 and won three straight Southern Conference North Division titles.

In 2002-03, DeChellis guided a very young team to the Southern Conference Tournament championship and the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in a decade. A No. 15 seed in the NCAA Tournament, DeChellis nearly coached his squad to an upset of No. 2 seed Wake Forest, falling 76-73 in the game's final minute.

Adding evidence to the stability he brought to the ETSU program is the fact that his roster in 2002-03 sported only three seniors, and only one of them started.

DeChellis had success in conference play, in non-conference games and in the classroom. His team posted a 60-49 conference record during his tenure, going 58-37 over the last six seasons. His 105 career coaching victories is third in ETSU history.

At East Tennessee State, every senior that joined the program from his hiring in 1996 earned his degree. four Buccaneer players earned Southern Conference Academic Honor Roll status in each of his first two years.

A native of Monaca, Pa., DeChellis began his coaching career in Happy Valley, serving as a graduate assistant coach under Dick Harter and then Bruce Parkhill. After earning his bachelor of arts in secondary education in 1982, he moved on to Salem College in Salem, W. Va., in 1984 where he had a two-year stint as an assistant coach. DeChellis also served as Salem's Director of Intramurals.

In 1986, DeChellis returned to Penn State and began a very successful 10 year run as an assistant coach, surving under Bruce Parkhill for nine years and Jerry Dunn for one.

DeChellis helped guide the Nittany Lions to four straight post-season appearances from 1989 through 1992. During that four year span of 20+ win seasons, Penn State posted an impressive 87-40 record.

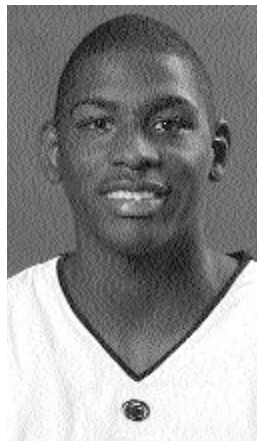
The 1989-90 team posted a 25-9 overall record and advanced to the 1990 NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden, earning third place.

Penn State went 21-11 overall in 1990-91 and won the Atlantic 10 Tournament title as DeChellis helped Penn State earn its first NCAA Tournament bid since 1965, where PSU upset No. 16 UCLA in the first round.

The 1994-95 team went 21-11 overall and earned another trip to Madison Square Garden. Penn State, once again an NIT semifinalist, again won the consolation game for third place in the tourney.

The next year Penn State had its most successful Big Ten season to date going 21-7, finishing second in Big Ten play, earning the school's first ever top 10 national ranking, and earning a second trip to the NCAA Tournament for DeChellis.
