SEVEN BIG TEN MEN'S GOLF TEAMS INVITED TO NCAA REGIONALS

Seven Big Ten men's golf teams and two individuals were selected on May 5 to compete in NCAA Regional competition. Big Ten Champion **Michigan State**, the No. 8 seed, was the only conference squad invited to the East Regional. Competing in the Central Regional will be No. 8 seed **Indiana**, No. 13 seed **Penn State**, No. 15 seed **Michigan**, No. 18 seed **Illinois**, No. 19 seed **Ohio State**, and Gopher student-athletes **Victor Almstrom** and **Clayton Rask**. **Wisconsin** is the No. 20 seed, playing in the West Regional.

The three regionals, which consist of 27 teams each, are scheduled for May 15-17, and the top 10 teams and two individuals in each region will advance to the NCAA Championships, May 28-May 31, held on the Kampen Course at Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex in West Lafayette, Ind. The 72-hole event is being hosted by Purdue University.

The East Regional will be played at the Council Fire Golf Club in Chattanooga, Tenn. Michigan State received the Big Ten's automatic bid to NCAA Regional competition after winning its third conference title in four years. The Spartans, led by Big Ten Coach of the Year **Sam Puryear**, will be looking to earn their 11th NCAA Championship bid.

The Central Regional will commence at the Scarlet Golf Course in Columbus, Ohio. Five of the seven Big Ten teams will be playing in this event. Piloting the Hoosiers will be Big Ten Player of the Year **Jorge Campillo**. The junior guided his team to a fourth-place finish at the Conference Championships, while earning top individual honors, shooting a 278 (-10) which ranks as the seventh-lowest score in championships history.

Despite a last-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, Penn State earns the conference's third-highest seed at No. 13. The Nittany Lions are led by All-Big Ten second-team honoree **Robert Rohanna**. Combined with sophomores **Kevin Foley** and **T.J. Howe**, Penn State has a great chance for its 1st NCAA Championships bid since 2004.

Much like PSU, Michigan has a wealth of talent to be showcased. Senior captain **Tim Schaezel** earned All-Big Ten first team honors this season, making him the first Wolverine to do so since Andrew Matthews in 2002. Look for **Bill Rankin** to be an important factor in the NCAA's as the junior had a phenomenal Big Ten Championships outing, finishing third with a 285 (-3). Freshman **Lion Kim** has had a promising first year, earning Michigan's lone Golfer of the Week accolade on March 5th.

Illinois is coming off a third-place finish at the conference championships and will be led into regional competition by Big Ten Freshman of the Year **Scott Langley**. Langley along with underclassmen **Chris Deforest** and **Matt Hoffman**, all placed in the top 10 in this year's Championships. Hoffman and Langley each racked up Golfer of the Week awards this season, making them two of the three freshmen who have done so.

Just behind Illinois at the No. 19 seed is Ohio State. The Buckeyes garnered two All-Big Ten second-team honorees in senior **Kyle Coconis** and freshman **Bo Hoag**. These two along with Vaughn Snyder placed in the top 13 at the Big Ten Championships.

Although Minnesota will not be competing as a team, the Gophers will send junior Almstrom and senior Rask as individuals. The duo earned All-Big Ten first team honors and rallied their squad to a second-place team finish at the Big Ten Championships.

The lone squad headed out west will be No. 20 seed Wisconsin. The Badger's **Dan Woltman** took home All-Big Ten second team laurels this season. UW is looking for its 14th overall NCAA bid and first since 1992.

Currently, four Big Ten squads are ranked in the nation's top 50 by Golfweek/Sagarin. No. 20 Michigan State is followed by No. 23 Indiana, No. 43 Penn State, and No. 46 Michigan.

MICHIGAN STATE REPEATS AS BIG TEN CHAMPS

Michigan State won its second-consecutive conference title, taking top honors at this year's Big Ten Men's Golf Championships in East Lansing. The Spartans claimed the event by four strokes over last year's co-champions Minnesota, despite a strong surge from the Gophers in the final round. The championship is the fourth in Michigan State's history as the Spartans also won in 2007, 2005 and 1969.

Illinois (293-288-302-299--1182) finished third, followed by Indiana (297-295-293-298--1183), Michigan (296-302-298-298--1194) and Northwestern (293-291-309-303--1196) and Ohio State (293-298-313-292--1196) tied for sixth. Rounding out the field was Wisconsin (296-305-302-296--1199), Purdue (303-295-311-300--1209), Iowa (304-305-301-302--1212) and Penn State (299-313-317-302--1231).

Indiana's Jorge Campillo claimed the individual title, finishing the Championships with a 10-under par 278.
