2005 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the 11th straight season, the Big Ten will boast at least one team in NCAA Men's Golf Championships. This year, **Purdue** will be representing the Conference as it has now reached the NCAA Championships in four of the last five years. The 2005 NCAA Men's Golf Championships will be held June 1-4 at Caves Valley Golf Club in Owings Mills, Md. Purdue won the national title in 1961 and finished tied for 16th last season.

In fact, Purdue is one of only 14 programs nationwide that has participated at the NCAA Championships in four of the last five years. The other schools are Arizona, Arizona State, Augusta State, Clemson, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Southern, Georgia Tech, Oklahoma State, SMU, Texas, UCLA, and Washington.

The Boilermakers earned a bid to the NCAA Championships by defeating Wichita State in a playoff, after both teams tied for 10th at the NCAA Central Regional Championships on May 21 in South Bend, Ind. The top 10 teams from each of the three regional sites advance to the NCAA Championships.

The Boilermakers are ranked No. 32 in the latest *Golfweek*/Sagarin Poll.

2005 NCAA REGIONAL RECAP

By defeating Wichita State in a playoff, **Purdue** captured the 10th and last spot in the NCAA Central Regional to advance to the 2005 NCAA Championships. The Boilermakers (291-288-296) carded a 54-hole total of 875, and then advanced past Wichita State in a one-hole playoff. Purdue's Bobby Bennett (71-69-75) tied for 20th overall at 215, while teammates Pariya Junhasavasdikul (T-43rd, 71-74-74--219) and Santiago Russi (T-50th, 74-71-75--220) also garnered spots in the top 50. Peter Richardson (76-76-72) and Dustin Cone (75-74-75) each tied for 77th overall at 224.

Also competing in the Central Regional was Big Ten champion **Michigan State** (289-296-292--877), which finished 13th, followed by **Minnesota** (293-293-292--878) in 16th. Individually, Ohio State's **Scott Anderson** (70-69-72) finished tied for ninth at 211, while Illinois' **Garrett Chaussard** (72-70-72--214) finished tied for 17th and Northwestern's **Chris Wilson** (74-78-70--222) placed tied for 66th.

In the East Regional, both **Indiana** and **Penn State** failed to qualify as the Hoosiers finished tied for 18th at 875 (294-292-289) with the identical score that lifted Purdue into the finals. The Nittany Lions finished in 20th at 885 (293-299-293).

2005 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Michigan State claimed its first Big Ten Men's Golf Championship since 1969, after firing a 17-under-par 847 (282-276-289) to best runner-up Indiana by five shots at the University Ridge Golf Course, May 6-8, in Verona, Wis.



Indiana recorded a 12-under 852 (283-275-294), while Northwestern was third at 853 (294-280-279) and Minnesota was fourth at 854 (285-283-286). Purdue placed fifth with a score of 861 (292-282-287), followed Ohio State (290-294-283--867) to best runner-up Indiana by five shots at the University Ridge Golf Course, May 6-8, in Verona, Wis.

Indiana senior All-American Jeff Overton claimed his first Big Ten Championship with a score of 17-under 199 (65-65-69). Overton's 54-hole total tied the Championships record, which was set by Ohio State's Kevin Hall in 2004. Additionally, his first and second round scores of 7-under 65 not only tied the course record and set a new collegiate course record, but also tied Wisconsin's Ben Walter's mark of 130 in 1994 as the Big Ten's lowest 36-hole total in Championships history. Overton, who successfully defended his Big Ten Player of the Year honor and Les Bolstad Award, became the seventh Hoosier to win medalist honors at the Championships and the first since Shaun Micheel in 1991.

Michigan State's Ryan Brehm, the Big Ten Freshman of the Year, and Matt Harmon placed second and third, respectively. Brehm carded a 13-under 203 (68-65-70), which included a second-round 65 that tied Overton's mark for the collegiate course record. Harmon (68-67-74) finished tied for third with Northwestern's Kyle Moore (72-71-66) at 209, while Penn State's Mark Leon (69-70-71) rounded out the top five at 210.

Following the Championships, MSU's Mark Hankins was named Big Ten Coach of the Year.
