**BIG TEN CHAMPION SPARTANS AND GOPHERS CONCLUDE NCAA PLAY**

Big Ten co-Champions Michigan State and Minnesota, along with NCAA Central Regional medalist Dan Woltman of Wisconsin, represented the Big Ten Conference at the 2007 NCAA Men's Golf Championships, May 30-June 2. Minnesota (278-276-294-285--1133) finished tied with Florida for ninth overall, which marked the team's and the conference's second-straight top 10 finish. The 72-hole event was held on the Gold Course at Golden Horseshoe Golf Club (Par 71, 6,817 Yards) in Williamsburg, Va.



The Golden Gophers were led by Victor Almstrom. The Minnesota sophomore fired a career-best 67 in the final round to move him into a tie for 15th at 1-under-par 279 (73-68-71-67). Almstrom's total of 279 tied the fifth-best 72-hole tournament score in Gopher golf history.

After an eighth-place finish at the NCAA Central Regional, Michigan State earned its first trip to the NCAA Championships under Big Ten Coach of the Year Mark Hankins. The Spartans missed the cut by six strokes after a 54-hole score of 857 (283-287-287). The top 15 teams and the top six individuals not on those 15 teams advanced to the fourth and final round. Freshman Jack Newman had the highest finish for the Spartans as he finished with a 210 (70-69-71).

Following his win at the NCAA Central Regional, Wisconsin's Woltman also missed the cut with a 214 (72-72-70), which placed him in a 10-way tie for 64th place after three rounds. However, Woltman earned an honorable-mention accolade on the PING Division I All-America Team, which was announced by the Golf Coaches Association of America. Also honored by the GCAA was third-team selection and Big Ten Golfer of the Year Matt Harmon of Michigan State, while Minnesota's Victor Almstrom, Bronson LaCassie and Niall Turner earned honorable-mention awards. Harmon and LaCassie were also tabbed third-team All-Americans by *Golfweek*, while Turner and Indiana's Jorge Campillo were honorable-mention selections.

Off the course, 38 men's golfers were named Academic All-Big Ten for their efforts in the classroom during 2006-07.

**SIX BIG TEN MEN'S GOLF TEAMS COMPETE AT NCAA REGIONALS**

Six Big Ten men's golf teams and one individual participated in NCAA Regional competition, May 17-19. Big Ten co-Champion Michigan State (319-290-306--915), the No. 10 seed, placed eighth in the Central Regional, followed by co-Champion and No. 11 seed Minnesota (314-290-314--918).



The Golden Gophers tied for the 10th and final spot, but advanced by virtue of a playoff win over Texas A&M. No. 15 Wisconsin (304-305-310--919) finished one stroke back in 12th, and one shot ahead of No. 13 Northwestern (316-293-311--920) in 13th. No. 16 Purdue (320-310-309--939) placed 19th in the 27-team field, while 17th-seeded Penn State (297-304-300--901) finished 16th in East Region. In addition, Indiana's Jorge Campillo (82-76-77--235) was invited as an individual to compete at the Central Regional and placed tied for 72nd overall.

The top 10 teams and two individuals from each of the three 27-team regions advanced to the NCAA Championships.

**MICHIGAN STATE AND MINNESOTA SHARE 2007 BIG TEN TITLE**

Michigan State and Minnesota shared the conference title at the Big Ten Men's Golf Championships this season, which was held at the Scarlet Golf Course on the Ohio State University campus. Entering the final round with a six-stroke lead, the Spartans shot 19-over-par on the final 18 holes to finish at 1192 for the weekend, while the Gophers shot 10-over on the day to storm back from a 10th-place standing after Round 1. The championship is the third in Michigan State's history as the Spartans also won in 1969 and 2005. The crown marks Minnesota's fifth as the Gophers were also winners in 1929, 1938, 1963, 1972, 2002 and 2003. The co-championship is the first time in Big Ten history that two teams have shared the conference title.



Purdue (299-292-304-301--1196) finished third, followed by host Ohio State (295-306-301-303--1205), Wisconsin (306-295-301-305--1207) and Indiana (299-303-300-311--1213) and Penn State (301-306-303-303--1213) tied for sixth. Rounding out the field was Northwestern (298-303-307-313--1221), Illinois (302-305-307-309--1223), Michigan (298-312-307-306--1223) and Iowa (315-312-312-317--1256).

Purdue's Pariya Junhasavasdikul claimed the individual title, finishing the Championships with a 1-over 285.
