THE CHAMPIONSHIPS: The 2006 NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championships get underway at noon (ET) on Thurs., March 23 at the Georgia Tech Aquatic Center on the campus of Georgia Tech University.

THE BIG TEN: The competition field is set and includes 45 student-athletes representing eight Big Ten squads. Seven league teams were ranked in the final College Swimming Coaches Association dual meet rankings for the 2005-06 season as Michigan led the way at No. 8 and Minnesota right behind at No. 9. Indiana was ranked 11th while Purdue and Northwestern were slotted as 14th and 15th, respectively. Ohio State (19th) and Penn State (24th) rounded the Big

Ten representation in the top 25. The Golden Gophers qualified 12 student-athletes for the championships, the most among all conference schools this season.

Michigan has made the most appearances at the NCAA Championships as the Wolverines will make their 69th-consecutive trip to the event. U-M has participated in the national competition every year since its inaugural season in 1937. Michigan leads the Big Ten with 40 top-five NCAA team finishes, 11 championships and 154 individual champions. Ohio State has finished in the top five of the event 26 times and is tied with Michigan with 11 team titles while boasting 65 individual crowns. Indiana has recorded 17 top-five finishes and is next in line with six team titles and 79 individual champions. The Michigan State Spartans have appeared in the NCAA Championships 37 times and have finished among the top five on 12 different occasions. Iowa, Minnesota and Northwestern are the only other league schools to boast top-five marks.

Three defending NCAA champions return to the championships this year in Michigan's Peter Vanderkaay and Davis Tarwater, and Northwestern's Matt Grevers. Vanderkaay won the 500-yard freestyle individual title in 4:09.82 while teammate Tarwater swam a 1:42.30 200-yard butterfly time en route to his national title. Grevers earned the 100-yard backstroke crown after finishing in a 45.62 fashion.

Student-athletes from Indiana, Minnesota and Northwestern all enter the 2006 NCAA Championships after setting new Big Ten Championships records a few weeks ago. IU's Kevin Swander shattered the previous 100-yard breaststroke mark after touching the wall in 52.64 seconds. He went on to help the Hoosier 200-yard medley relay squad set a new league record. The foursome, made up of Ben Hesen, Swander, Thomas Clavier and Todd Patrick clocked in at 1:25.73, beating the previous mark by .40 seconds. Four Wildcats enter the NCAA Championships with newly acquired Big Ten records under their belts. Kyle Bubolz and Mike Alexandrov set new conference marks in the 100-yard butterfly and the 200-yard individual medley as they finished in 46.40 and 1:55.19, respectively. The NU swimmers joined Grevers and Ben Dexter on the record-setting 400-yard medley relay team, clocking in at 3:07.91. Minnesota's Adam Mitchell will be swimming for a 200-yard individual medley national title after breaking the Big Ten Championships record in the event in 1:44.63.
