**2007 TRACK & FIELD
CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Eighty-two student athletes from all 10 Big Ten track and field schools will represent the conference, June 6-9, at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships at the Alex G. Spanos Sports Complex in Sacramento, Calif. The event will be hosted by Sacramento State University and the Sacramento Sports Commission for the fourth time in the last five years.

Michigan boasts the most competing athletes of any conference school with 13, sending five men and eight women to the national championships. The Wolverine women tied for first at the Big Ten Championships while the men took third. The Michigan women are led by their strong group of tracksters with five athletes seeded in the top four in their respective events, including senior **Katie Erdman** who owns the top spot in the 800 meters. Combined, Michigan has seven entries with top-10 seeds, which is the fourth-highest total in the competition. The Wolverine women are ranked No. 6 in the Trackwire Top 25 while the men are tied for 25th.

Men's Big Ten Champion Wisconsin will send seven athletes to the national stage, including defending 5,000 meter champion **Chris Solinsky**. Big Ten Athlete of the Year and of the Championships **Demi Omole** is seeded fifth in the 100 meters. UW finished eighth at last year's outdoor championship and won the 2007 indoor competition. The Badgers are 15th in the Trackwire Top 25. The Wisconsin women are looking for their first top-10 finish since 1997, and will send five athletes to Sacramento.

After tying with Michigan for the Big Ten women's title, Illinois boasts six athletes in five different events at the NCAAs. Senior **Yvonne Mensah** won three events at the conference meet, including the triple jump, where she is seeded 27th at nationals. Three Illini men will also make the trip, including **Lesiba Masheto**, the Big Ten Champion in the 400 meters.

Iowa boasts four men and seven women making the trip to California. Big Ten 10,000 meter champion **Micah VanDenend** leads the Hawkeye men with an eight seed in the 5,000 meters, while **Peaches Roach** has the highest seed on the women's team at eighth in the high jump.

Tied for 17th in the Trackwire Top 25, the Penn State women finished in a close third place at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships and will send eight athletes to NCAA competition. Big Ten Freshman of the Year **Bridget Franek** is seeded sixth in the 3,000-meter steeplechase while junior **Shana Cox** is second in the 400 meters. Cox is also part of the fifth-seeded 4x400 relay team. Three members of the men's team will also make the trip, including **Allen Pettner**, seeded third in the javelin. Pettner set a new Big Ten Championships record in the event on May 13.

Sending 10 athletes to NCAAs, six women and four men will represent Minnesota at nationals. **Liz Alabi** and **Liz Podominick** are both dual-entries for the Gophers as both will compete in the shot put while Alabi is seeded 17th in the hammer and Podominick is 27th in the discus. Big Ten men's Field Athlete of the Year and of the Championships **Derek Gearman** is entered in the high jump (14th), long jump (12th) and triple jump (20th) for the Minnesota men.

Seven student-athletes from Purdue will make the trek to Sacramento, including **Keith Hopkins** and **Rickey Pinkney**, seeded sixth and 16th, respectively, in the 110-meter hurdles. **Astin Steward** leads the Boilermaker women, seeded 10th in the discus and 13th in the hammer. The Purdue women have at least one entry in each of the four throwing events.

Rounding out the Big Ten contingent at the NCAAs, Indiana will send **Blayne Burkholder** in the men's pole vault and three members of its women's team, including conference champions **Jessica Gall** (10,000 meters) and **Vera Neuenswander** (pole vault). Michigan State will also send four total athletes, including two entries in the women's 3,000-meter steeplechase. **Veronica Jatssek** will represent Ohio State in the women's hammer throw, seeded ninth.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS COVERAGE

A total of five hours of the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships will be nationally televised, beginning with CSTV's coverage on Friday from 7:30-10:30 p.m. CT. For the second consecutive year, CBS will broadcast the meet's final competitions, airing live footage from Noon-2 p.m. CT on Saturday.

BIG TEN ANNOUNCES 2007 INDIVIDUAL POSTSEASON HONORS

PARK RIDGE, Ill. - Michigan's **Anna Willard** was named the Big Ten women's Track Athlete of the Year and of the Championships while teammate **Bettie Wade** was named the women's Field Athlete of the Year and of the Championships. On the men's side, Wisconsin's **Demi Omole** was named the Track Athlete of the Year and of the Championships, while Minnesota's **Derek Gearman** was named Field Athlete of the Year and of the Championships, the Big Ten office announced on Wednesday.

Gary Winckler of Illinois was named the women's coach of the year for the sixth time in his career, while Wisconsin mentor **Ed Nuttycombe** received the men's honor for the fourth consecutive year and the 10th time in his career.

Rounding out the postseason awards, Penn State's **Bridget Franek** was named the women's Freshman of the Year, and Purdue's **Jon Pullum** received men's first-year honors.

Willard and Wade are the first Wolverines to ever receive awards for excellence throughout the year, while Tania Longe (1998) and Richelle Webb (1994) are the only other Michigan athletes to receive championships honors.

Willard won three individual events at the 2007 Big Ten Outdoor Track and Field Championships last weekend, setting a meet record in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with a time of 9:57.90. The senior also took home the gold in the 1,500- (4:15.93) and the 5,000-meter (16:23.57) runs. During the regular season, Willard owned the conference's top times in the 1,500 (4:15.99) and 5,000 (15:53.36) as well as the second-fastest mark in the 800 meters (2:03.94). Willard's regular-season time in the 800 meters is currently fourth-best in the country while her championships time in the 1,500 meters is also the nation's fourth-fastest.

Wade became the first Wolverine since Longe in 1998 to win the heptathlon at the Big Ten championships, totaling 5,722 points in the event, which is the largest amount since Longe put up 5,861 in 1997. Wade placed first in three events en route to the heptathlon title, winning the high jump, shot put and long jump. The sophomore's score is currently the fourth-best in NCAA Division I this season. Wade also took home the silver medal in the championships high jump, clearing a height of 6'00.00".

Omole won the 100- (10.19) and 200-meter (20.92) dashes at the 2007 conference championships, becoming the first Big Ten athlete to ever win the 100-meter race in four consecutive years. The senior was also part of the winning 4x100-meter relay team for the fourth straight year, making him the first athlete in history to win two events in four consecutive championships. Omole also set the standard in the 100-

and 200-meter races during the regular season while the Wisconsin 4x100 squad also notched the Big Ten's best regular-season time. The senior's time in the 100-meters is currently the fifth-fastest in the country.

Gearman recorded team points for the Gophers in four events at the Big Ten championships, placing second in the high jump and the long jump and fourth in the triple jump. The senior was also part of the Gophers' 4x100-meter relay team which clocked in fourth. During the regular season, Gearman posted top-five marks in the conference in all three jumping events, including the best distance in the long jump (24'09.00"). The senior also qualified for NCAA Regionals in the high jump (7'2.50") and the triple jump (51'00.00").

Franek is the second Nittany Lion to receive Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors. Franek finished third in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the championships last weekend, clocking in at 10:05.96. During the regular season, the freshman posted the best time in the Big Ten in that event with an NCAA Regional qualifying mark of 9:59.21, which is currently the fourth-best time in the nation. The freshman also qualified for NCAA Regionals in the 1,500-meter run at 4:21.16.

Pullum is the fourth Boilermaker to earn Freshman of the Year honors and the first to take home the award since Michael Turner in 1996. Pullum won the discus throw at this year's championships, throwing for a distance of 177'08". The distance set a career high for the freshman and qualified him for NCAA Regionals.

The conference office also announced honorees from each team for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. In addition, the student-athletes must be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting.

Honorees for men's and women's outdoor track and field are Illinois' **Lesiba Masheto** and **Camile Robinson**; Indiana's **Doug Dayhoff** and **Vera Neuenswander**; Iowa's **Micah VanDenend** and **Sarah Burgett**; Michigan's **Jeff Porter** and **Katie Erdman**; Michigan State's **Ryan McMillian** and **Anna Coster**; Minnesota's **Walter Langkau** and **Liz Alabi**; Ohio State's **Leonard Jatsek** and **Veronica Jatsek**; Penn State's **Tyler McCandless** and **Amber Strouse**; Purdue's **John Porter** and **Laura Farley**; and Wisconsin's **Nathan Brown** and **Alex McCannel**. These 20 student-athletes are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, as the conference office will honor one male and one female student-athlete from each institution at the end of the school year.
