NEWS FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

Easy as 1,2,3???

In a span of a little more than two weeks, three Big Ten teams have the opportunity to knock off the top-three squads in the land. This past weekend, a pair of League teams knocked off the No. 2 and 3 teams in the Associated Press poll, as **Penn State** edged second-ranked North Carolina, 77-71, in State College on Sunday, and No. 15 **Michigan State** defeated No. 3 Notre Dame in overtime on Thursday, 82-73. No. 18 **Minnesota** can make it a clean sweep on December 14 when the Golden Gophers host top-ranked LSU, which will air live on ESPN2 at 7 p.m. ET.

Streaks Were Made to be Broken

In the past two weeks, three Big Ten teams have ended nationally-recognized winning streaks across the nation. This past week, **Michigan State's** victory over No. 3 Notre Dame was not only the highest-ranked team that MSU had ever beaten, but it snapped the Fighting Irish's 25-game home court winning streak. Last season, MSU stopped Ohio State's 24-game home winning streak and Minnesota's 19-game home winning streak as well. Also over the weekend, **Illinois** beat No. 21/20 Louisiana Tech to end the Techster's 161-game home winning streak over unranked opponents. It also ended their 30-game overall home winning streak -- the second longest in the nation. The win marked the 10th consecutive season in which the Illini have beaten a ranked team. On November 26, **Michigan** became just the second road team to win at the Thunderdome in UC Santa Barbara's last 41 home games and snapped a 12-game Gaucho home win streak.

BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Lindsay Bowen, Michigan State

5-7, JR G, Dansville, Mich./Dansville

Bowen averaged 25.5 points over the weekend while leading Michigan State to a pair of road victories, including an 82-73 overtime win at No. 3/3 Notre Dame. The 5-7 junior scored 23 points against the Fighting Irish on Thursday, including a game-tying three-pointer with 13.6 seconds left in regulation to force overtime. Bowen also had five rebounds and tied her career high with four steals while playing all 45 minutes against Notre Dame. The Dansville, Mich., native followed that performance with a 28-point outburst while leading a second-half rally in an MSU victory at Cincinnati Saturday. She scored 18 points in the second half and added three assists, three rebounds and a steal as Michigan State closed the game with a 22-2 run and claimed the 77-61 win. Bowen, a Preseason First Team All-Big Ten selection by the League coaches, has now scored 84 points in her last three games (28 ppg). Bowen, who earns her first Big Ten Player of the Week award of her career, is the first Spartan to win the weekly honor since Sylee Bromfield on December 9, 2002.

Something About 107?

It must be something about 107. So far this season, both Ohio State and Purdue have posted 107 points in dominating wins. Purdue beat IPFW in the season-opener on November 21, 107-39, while Ohio State topped intrastate rival Ohio on its home court, 107-37, on December 1. The 107-point total is the highest of any League team since Minnesota defeated IPFW on November 23, 2002, 116-73. Prior to the Buckeyes and Boilermakers this year, the last time a Big Ten squad eclipsed the century mark was Penn State on December 4, 2002, with a 101-74 victory over Maryland.

Big Ten Teams Outscoring Opponents Big Time

Three Conference teams - **Minnesota, Ohio State and Purdue** - have each outscored their opponents by more than 15 points per game this season. Ohio State tops the League with an impressive difference of 37.2 points per game. The Buckeyes, who have played eight games, including two against top-25 teams, are currently outscoring their opponents, 653-355. OSU beat Ohio on December 1, 107-37, matching the League's highest output of the year. Purdue, which is 15.5 points better than its opponents, dominated IPFW, 107-39, in the season-opener on November 21. Minnesota ranks second in the League at 18.7, after setting a new NCAA-era school record by allowing only 34 points in the win over Detroit. The 52-point margin of victory was also an NCAA-era school record. On the week, the Gophers allowed 79 points, an average of less than 40 points in the two games.

An International Flavor

Penn State's Portland Takes Medical Leave of Absence

Last week, Penn State head coach Rene Portland took a leave of absence from the Lady Lions, citing medical concerns related to her fainting episode on the team plane. After the season-opening loss at Texas, the PSU mentor was admitted to Mount Nittany Medical Center on November 14 where she stayed two nights. Portland will not be involved in the Lady Lions' practices or games for an indefinite period of time. Associate Head Coach Annie Troyan is serving as acting head coach in Portland's absence and has guided the Lady Lions to their first three wins of the season, including an upset over No. 2 North Carolina on December 5.

Portland, in her 25th season as head coach at Penn State, has a career coaching record of 649-225, including 562-196 with the Lady Lions.

Sharp-Shooting Buckeyes

In the 107-37 win over Ohio on December 1, Ohio State shot 40-59 from the field. The .678 shooting percentage was the fifth best in League history. Ironically, the Buckeyes stake claim to the top-two all-time shooting percentages as OSU shot .720 against Wright State on December 18, 2003, and .689 against Minnesota on February 26, 2004. The Buckeyes also made 13 three-pointers this season against Bowling Green (November 12), which is the Big Ten's second-best mark all-time, behind OSU's 14 against IUPUI (12/1/03) and Purdue's 14 against Florida A&M (12/3/94).

Illinois (4-1, 0-0) ended Louisiana Tech's 161-game home winning streak over unranked opponents Saturday as the Fighting Illini prevailed in overtime, 71-65. The victory also ended the Techsters' 30-game overall home winning streak - the second longest in the nation. The win at Louisiana Tech marks the 10th consecutive season in which the Illini have beaten a ranked team.



Indiana (3-2, 0-0) is an undefeated 3-0 at home this season. The Hoosiers will look to win their first game on the road on Monday, December 6, at Indiana State. This will be the 29th meeting between the two teams with the Hoosiers holding a 22-6 edge over the Sycamores. IU failed to block one shot in its 53-50 loss to Arkansas. Before that game, the Hoosiers had blocked at least five shots in the first three games.



Iowa (6-0, 0-0) begins the season 6-0 for the first time since the 1995-96 season. The Hawkeyes are one win away (at Drake) from claiming the "mythical state championship" outright (wins over Iowa State and Northern Iowa). Freshman Stacy Schlapkohl posted career highs in points (18) and free throws made (6) against Northern Iowa. The Hawkeyes (1-2 3-pt FG vs. UNI) extended its streak of at least one triple in a game to 183.



Michigan (2-3, 0-0) has suffered two of its three losses on the opponent's last possession after the Wolverines led for the majority of the game at Alabama and at home vs. Drake. Freshmen Janelle Cooper totaled a career-high 14 points against Drake, while freshman Becky Flippin scored a career-high eight points against Charlotte.



Michigan State (6-1, 0-0) topped No. 3 Notre Dame, 82-73, in overtime Thursday, which marked the highest-ranked team the Spartans have ever beaten. MSU's previous high was a victory over No. 4 Penn State, 71-63, January 23, 2000. Michigan State snapped Notre Dame's 25-game home winning streak, which was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. MSU has now beaten two ranked Big East teams in overtime this year.



Minnesota (6-1, 0-0) set a new NCAA-era school record by allowing only 34 points in the win over Detroit. The 52-point margin of victory was also an NCAA-era school record. On the week, the Gophers allowed 79 points, an average of less than 40 points in the two games. The Gophers celebrate their 50th consecutive week in the AP poll this week.



Northwestern (1-4, 0-0) dropped its fourth-straight over the weekend, but first-year head coach Beth Combs has seen productive efforts from seniors Suzanne Morrison and Sarah Kwasinski. Morrison has led the Wildcats in their past two outings, scoring 11 points against No. 24 Houston and 21 against Virginia. Kwasinski has netted 10 points in each of her last two games, after scoring 14 at home against Kentucky.



Ohio State (7-1, 0-0) gave head coach Jim Foster his 50th win at the helm of the Buckeye program with a 75-42 win at Dayton on December 4. He is 50-21 at OSU now in three seasons. The Buckeyes went 19-of-27 (70.4) from the charity stripe in the game, marking a season-high for free throws made and free throws attempted. Against Ohio, the 70-point win (107-37) tied the school record for the largest margin of victory.



Penn State (3-3, 0-0) defeated No. 2 North Carolina, 77-71, on Sunday. The last time the Lady Lions defeated a No. 2-ranked team was December 7, 2003, when they beat No. 2 Texas, 79-59, at home. The last time Penn State defeated a top-10 team was February 29, 2004 when it beat No. 4 Purdue to win the 2004 Big Ten championship. Five PSU players reached double-digit scoring figures against North Carolina.



Purdue (4-2, 0-0) returns from a West Coast split between UC Santa Barbara (W, 66-65 OT) and No. 25/24 UCLA (L, 64-70). The competition doesn't get any easier for the Boilermakers as they host No. 17/16 DePaul on Thursday, December 9. Purdue will then play host to Western Michigan before battling No. 10/9 Duke in Indianapolis on December 18.



Wisconsin (2-4, 0-0) returns to Madison to open a four-game homestand, after dropping its fourth-straight road contest on Sunday at Iowa State, 88-65. Making just the second start of her career, junior Annie Nelson recorded 13 points and eight rebounds, after posting 10 points against Marquette. Freshman Jolene Anderson paced the Badgers against Marquette with a career-high 26 points and 10 rebounds.

Big Ten Ranks Fourth in WBCA/Summerville RPI Ratings

In the latest WBCA/Summerville RPI Ratings, which measure strength of schedule, the **Big Ten** ranks fourth among all Conferences with a rating of .585. In the preseason rankings, the Big Ten was rated first, while **Penn State** (.707) and **Purdue** (.673) ranked second and third behind Tennessee (.781) in non-conference action. Five League teams trailed the Lady Volunteers (.684) in the overall schedule. **Indiana** (.618) is sixth, followed by No. 8 **Michigan** (.613), No. 11 **Penn State** (.609), No. 13 **Purdue** (.607) and No. 23 **Wisconsin** (.588). The complete list of ratings are located on page five.

Big Ten Proves Dominant in Overtime and Blowouts

The Big Ten has accumulated a combined record of 44-24 (.647) this season, but carries a 29-8 (.784) record in games that League teams either win by 16 points or more, or are extended into overtime. Currently, Big Ten teams are 4-2 in overtime, 4-0 in games decided by 16-20 points and 21-6 in games decided by 21 or more points. Michigan State is 2-0 in overtime games this year -- both of which came to ranked Big East opponents away from MSU's Breslin Center.

Playing For 20

A total of 17 student-athletes have gone for 20 or more points this season on 28 different occasions. Michigan State's **Lindsay Bowen** and Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** have each scored over 20 points in three contests this season. Bowen went for the League's season-best 33 points against Texas Christian on November 28, while Wright netted 30 in the Lady Lions' season-opener at then-No. 2/3 Texas on November 14.

Penn State's Strom Eyes Big Ten Assists Record

Penn State senior **Jess Strom** needs no assistance as she climbs her way toward the top of the all-time Big Ten career assists mark. Strom currently sits fourth with 679 assists for her career. Northwestern's Nancy Kennelly holds the League record with 892 assists from 1988-93.

Four League Coaches Record Milestone Wins

Four Big Ten coaches have already claimed milestone victories in their respective careers this season. On December 5, Minnesota's **Pam Borton** won her 125th game at the helm of the Golden Gophers, in a 62-45 win over Kansas. **Beth Combs** earned her first win at Northwestern on November 24 at home against Western Michigan. The Wildcats won 64-60 to give the first-year head coach her first win at NU. Ohio State's **Jim Foster** gained career win 550 in Columbus on November 17 as his Buckeyes topped No. 24/21 Arizona in the semifinals of the Preseason WNIT. Foster then captured his 50th win at Ohio State on December 4, as the Buckeyes beat Dayton. Iowa's **Lisa Bluder** gained her 75th win at Iowa on November 20 as the Hawkeyes captured the KCRG TV-9 Hawkeye Challenge in Iowa City, with victories over Southern Illinois and Missouri.

Big Ten Continues to Boast FAN-tastic Figures

The Big Ten is looking to continue its dominance in national attendance this season, as last year's total of 778,125 was a Conference record and ranked second nationally (Big 12). Over the 2003-04 season, an average of 5,085 fans -- also a Conference record -- attended Big Ten games. The Big Ten has led the nation in attendance seven of the last 12 years, most recently in 1999.

BIG TEN ANNOUNCES 41 RECRUITS DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Big Ten Conference schools will welcome at least 41 new women's basketball players next season as each program announced its additions from the early signing period, which ran from November 10-17. Duke head coach Gail Goestenkors, who is a former Purdue assistant, will have to have her Blue Devils ready as Purdue is 27-8 all-time in Indianapolis and has won its last seven straight in Consecro.

Badgers Host Conference Champs on CBS

The Wisconsin Badgers will also gain national exposure this season, as on Saturday, January 8, CBS will be in Madison to televise the noon EST tip-off featuring UW and Penn State. Last year in Madison, Wisconsin nearly upset the then-No. 9 Lady Lions, but fell in the final seconds of the game, 60-59.

Boilers and Bucks to Battle in Big Ten/Big East Challenge

The second annual Big Ten/Big East Challenge will be played on Saturday, January 16 on ESPN2 and will feature Conference teams Purdue and Ohio State.

Purdue, the defending Big Ten Tournament Champion, plays at Notre Dame at 5 p.m. ET in a rematch of last year's Challenge contest, which the Boilermakers won at home, 76-63. The two programs are no strangers to each other, as both teams battled in the 2001 NCAA Championship Final, which Notre Dame won 68-66. Since that matchup, Purdue has won the last four games. Preceding the Purdue vs. Notre Dame contest, Ohio State hosts Rutgers at 3 p.m. ET. In last year's inaugural Challenge, Rutgers upended the Buckeyes, 56-53, in Piscataway, N.J.

A Tough Act To Follow...

This year marks the 23rd season of Big Ten Women's Basketball. Women's athletics were officially incorporated into the Big Ten in 1981-82, with basketball beginning in 1982-83. Since its official inception, Big Ten Women's Basketball has become one of the elite conferences in the nation. Last season, the Big Ten produced its fourth Final Four representative (Minnesota) in six years and captured 11 wins in the 2004 NCAA Championship, marking the League's all-time best win total in the Tournament.

2004-05 PRESEASON HONORS

Ohio State and Purdue Tabbed Preseason Favorites

The Big Ten women's basketball coaches selected Ohio State as the preseason League favorite for the 2004-05 season, while two-time defending Conference Tournament champion **Purdue** was tabbed the preseason front-runner by media members attending Big Ten Media Day. **Ohio State**, which finished 21-10 and third in the Conference last season with an 11-5 record, is the lone team to be ranked in the top three in both the coaches and media polls.

Minnesota's **Janel McCarville** was tabbed in both polls as the Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year. The Gophers' lone senior was named to the 2004 NCAA All-Final Four team and returns as the League's third-leading scorer (16.1 ppg) and the top rebounder (10.8 rpg). McCarville, who is a Wade Trophy National Player of the Year Candidate, Naismith Trophy Preseason Candidate and Preseason Wooden Award All-American, is also second among returning players in the Conference in blocked shots (1.9 bpg) and field goal percentage (.616).

SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Four Big Ten Seniors Candidates for Senior CLASS Award

Four Big Ten student-athletes -- Michigan State's **Kristin Haynie**, Minnesota's **Janel McCarville**, Ohio State's **Caity Matter** and Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** -- are candidates for the 2004-05 Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award.

The top 30 male and female college basketball players in their senior season were nominated for the fourth annual Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year for NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball.

The Senior Class Award - an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School - was launched in the 2001-02 college basketball season. It is designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elect to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring.

From the watch list, a national media committee will select 10 Finalists for the award next February. When the season reaches the NCAA Tournament in March, nationwide fan balloting will be coupled with results from voting by coaches and media to determine the male and female winner.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Indianapolis Named Host for 2006 Big Ten Tournament

The Big Ten Conference has named the city of Indianapolis as host of the 2006 Conference Women's Basketball Tournament. The 2006 event, which will be held March 2-6, will be the 12th postseason Tournament in League history and the 11th to be played in Indianapolis.

The inaugural Big Ten Tournament was played in the RCA Dome in 1995 and remained at that location until 1999. The Tournament moved to Conesco Fieldhouse in 2000 and then left Indianapolis for a one-year stint in Grand Rapids, Mich., in 2001. The Conference Tournament returned to Indianapolis and Conesco Fieldhouse in 2002 and will remain at that venue through 2006.

In the past decade of Big Ten Tournament play, the Conference has welcomed more than 283,000 fans, including over 256,000 spectators to the Indianapolis area. Last year's Tournament broke both single-session and total attendance records with 9,417 and 37,365 fans, respectively.

Two Big Ten Student-Athletes Named to "Wade Watch"

Minnesota's **Janel McCarville** and Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** were named by a national awards committee consisting of leading basketball coaches, journalists, and basketball administrators August 18, as preseason candidates for the 2005 State Farm Wade Trophy. The list is comprised of 31 student-athletes who are members of an NCAA Division I institution and are selected based on the following criteria: game and season statistics, leadership, character, effect on their team and overall playing ability.

The 2005 State Farm Wade Trophy winner will be announced during the WBCA National Convention held in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Final Four in Indianapolis, Indiana, April 2-5, 2005.

JOHN R. WOODEN AWARD

Three League Standouts Named to Wooden Watch List

Three Big Ten student-athletes have been selected among the top 30 women's basketball players to the Wooden Award Preseason All-America Team selected by the John R. Wooden Award National Advisory Board. Minnesota's **Janel McCarville**, Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** and Purdue's **Katie Gearlds** were named to the second annual Preseason Team on August 13.

Each of the three League schools on this year's team had a representative on last year's preseason squad as well. Minnesota's Lindsay Whalen, Penn State's Kelly Mazzante and Tanisha Wright, and Purdue's Shereka Wright were all 2003-04 Wooden Preseason All-Americans. Mazzante and Shereka Wright were selected to the inaugural five-player All-America team at the conclusion of last season.

In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 20 List, followed in March by the official voting ballot, consisting of the top 10-15 players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The 2005 Award ceremony, which will include the presentation of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award, the Wooden Award All-American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will be held at the Los Angeles Athletic Club on April 9, 2005 and will be broadcast live on CBS.

NAISMITH TROPHY

Big Ten Trio Tabbed Naismith Trophy Candidates

A trio of Big Ten women's basketball players have been selected among the top 50 collegiate standouts as preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy presented by Cingular Wireless, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced Tuesday, November 9. Minnesota's **Janel McCarville**, Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** and Purdue's **Katie Gearlds** were named to the watch list for what is considered the most prestigious national award presented annually to the men's and women's players of the year.

The Top 50 list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country. The board based its preseason criteria on player performances from last season.

In January, the Board of Selectors will narrow its preseason list to the Top 30 players in the nation. Those players, and others who distinguish themselves throughout the season, will be eligible for the final ballot in March.
