NEWS FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

Full Week of Women's Basketball Scheduled

This week's Big Ten Women's Basketball schedule will be a full slate of action, beginning with Northwestern traveling to Illinois on Wednesday. Indiana will host non-conference opponent Texas A&M Corpus Christi on Thursday, while eight League teams will battle in intraconference play. Iowa travels to Michigan for a rare Saturday game, which precedes four Conference games scheduled for Sunday. No. 2 Ohio State will look to hang on to first place in the League standings with a home game against Minnesota on Thursday and then a road test at Michigan State on Sunday.

FSN to Broadcast Penn State/Ohio State as Wildcard

The Big Ten Conference and FSN Chicago announced Monday the selection of the Penn State at Ohio State matchup as its February 27th "Wildcard" game. The game, which could potentially decide a share of or the outright Big Ten Championship, will air tape-delay at 9 p.m. CT on FSN Chicago and at 10 p.m. ET on FSN Ohio. The final regular season game will also be replayed at noon on FSN Chicago, Detroit and North.

XM Radio to Broadcast Three Big Ten Games This Week

For the first time this season, XM Satellite Radio will carry coverage of Big Ten women's basketball games. Thursday's Michigan State at Iowa game will air on XM 187 with pre-game starting at 6:45 p.m. ET. Sunday's Northwestern at Penn State game will air at 1 p.m. ET on XM 188, while Wisconsin at Minnesota will air at 1:15 p.m. ET on XM 186. The coverage will be that of the host schools' broadcast.

BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Rene Haynes, Michigan State

5-10, SO, G, Columbus, Ohio/Wellington School

Haynes averaged 17 points while shooting over 70 percent from the field as Michigan State won a pair of road games this past week. The sophomore guard had a career-high 22 points during last Thursday's 79-48 win at No. 12 Minnesota, sinking 8-of-10 shots including all three of her three-point attempts. She also added six rebounds, four assists and three steals in the win against the Golden Gophers. This past Sunday at Wisconsin, Haynes came off the bench to score 12 points while adding a pair of steals and rebounds. For the week, she shot .706 from the field and .833 percent from three-point range.

Haynes is the second Spartan to earn Big Ten Player of the Week honors in as many weeks and is the fourth to be honored this season. Liz Shimek shared honors with Minnesota's Janel McCarville last week, while Kristin Haynie shared the weekly accolade with Illinois' Angelina Williams on December 27. Lindsay Bowen was the first MSU player to earn the award this season on December 6.

Since the inception of the Big Ten Player of the Week award during the 1983-84 season, Michigan State has only once had back-to-back League honorees prior to this week. Paula Sanders (December 23) and Nicole Cushing-Adkins (January 6) earned the award on consecutive weeks during the 1996-97 season.

NEWS FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

Big Ten Lands Four Teams in AP Top 25 Poll

In last week's national polls (AP / USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Coaches Poll), the **Big Ten** had four teams represented in the Associated Press poll, while three squads were ranked by the Coaches. **Ohio State** was No. 2/3 – its highest ranking in school history. **Michigan State** was No. 9/9 and **Minnesota** was No. 12/13. **Penn State** was ranked No. 25 by the AP and was receiving votes in the Coaches poll, while **Iowa** and **Purdue** were receiving votes in both polls.

Four League Squads Rank Among Nation's Top 20 RPI

In the latest WBCA/Summerville RPI Ratings, the **Big Ten** ranks third in Conference RPI average (.580) and fifth in overall RPI (.582), while four League teams rank among the nation's top 20. **Ohio State** holds an overall RPI rating of .649, which is fifth best in the nation, followed by No. 6 **Michigan State** (.645). **Minnesota** (.628) is 14th, while **Penn State** (.618) ranks 19th. In overall strength of schedule, **Purdue** is eighth at .635, while **Northwestern** (.622) is 13th and **Michigan** (.615) is 15th. The complete list of ratings is located on page five.

Seven League Teams Rank in Top 25 in Attendance

In the latest unofficial attendance rankings compiled by the University of Wisconsin, seven Big Ten teams average in the nation's top 25. **Purdue** is fifth with an average of 8,456, while **Minnesota** (8,413) is sixth and **Penn State** (8,042) is seventh. **Wisconsin** (6,100) ranks 14th, followed by No. 17 **Michigan State** (5,171), No. 22 **Ohio State** (4,245) and No. 23 **Iowa** (4,118).

Big Ten Tops Among Leagues With Two 22-Win Teams

With **Ohio State** at 24-2 and **Michigan State** at 22-3, the Big Ten is the only Conference in the nation to boast a pair of teams with 22 wins or more. The Big Ten is also one of three Leagues to boast two or more teams with 20+ wins.

Big Ten Women's Basketball Attracting More Fans in 04-05

Big Ten Women's Basketball is attracting more fans nationwide than last year. Currently, the League boasts an all-game total of 772,952 fans through 193 games, which is over 68,000 better than last season's 193-game total. The Conference is also ahead of its record-breaking marks for home attendance, which were set last year.

Big Ten Ranks Among NCAA Leaders

In the latest NCAA report (2/8/05), issued each week on Tuesdays, nine student-athletes and seven teams rank in the top 15 in their respective categories. **Ohio State's Caitly Matter** is sixth overall with a .468 three-point field goal percentage, while **Michigan State's Lindsay Bowen** ranks ninth at .459. The Spartans' **Kristin Haynie** is 15th with 3.3 steals per game, while **Ohio State's Jessica Davenport** ranks 14th with 2.8 blocks per game. **Penn State's Tanisha Wright** is 15th with a 19.9 scoring average. **Ohio State's Brandie Hoskins** is 10th in field goal percentage at .594, followed by **Davenport** in 13th at .590 and **Iowa's Jamie Cavey** in 14th at .589. **Ohio State** is first in field goal percentage (.515), while **Penn State** ranks second in free throw percentage at .788. **Michigan State** ranks fourth in rebounding margin at 10.0. A complete breakdown is on page eight.

League Scoring Title Narrowing to Two Player Race?

Two Big Ten student-athletes have begun to pull away in their chase for the League's scoring title. Currently, Illinois senior **Angelina Williams** leads the Conference with 20.3 points per game, while **Ohio State** sophomore **Jessica Davenport** follows closely behind with 20.2. The last Buckeye to lead the League in scoring was **Katie Smith** with 21.2 ppg during the 1994-95 season. The following year, **Ashley Berggren** netted 27.5 ppg for Illinois, marking the last time an Illini player has led the Conference in scoring.

Illinois (13-10, 5-8) had a +13 rebounding margin (45-32) over Penn State on Sunday -- a 29-board turnaround from when the two teams met the first time this year. PSU held a +16 margin (40-24) over the Illini on January 13. **Angelina Williams** is the League's current scoring leader at 20.3 points per game. She is trying to become the first IU player to do that since **Ashley Berggren** in 1995-96 (27.5 ppg). **Erin Wigley** notched her first career double-double Sunday vs. Penn State with 14 points and a career-high 10 boards.



Indiana (10-13, 3-10) won its first conference road game of the season as it defeated Northwestern, 54-53, Sunday afternoon in Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Hoosiers were led by sophomore **Carrie Smith** who came off the bench to score a career-high 15 points. In addition to **Smith's** efforts, junior **Cyndi Valentin** added 19 points on 7-of-16 shooting. IU also got a strong bench performance from junior **Kali Kullberg**, who played 25 minutes recording a career high five assists. Indiana hosts Texas A&M Corpus Christi on Thursday and Purdue on Sunday.



Iowa (16-7, 5-7) has made at least one 3-pointer in 200 consecutive games dating back to March 1, 1998, and has made 22 three-pointers its last three games (7.33 tpg). The Hawkeyes limited Ohio State to only two offensive rebounds and out-rebounded the Buckeyes by 11 (37-26) on Sunday. Iowa has scored exactly 60 points in the last two games. **Johanna Solverson** has posted five assists or more in her last seven games. The Hawkeyes host Michigan State on Thursday and then travel to Michigan for a rare Saturday matchup.



Michigan (5-18, 1-11) dropped a 72-39 decision at No. 2 Ohio State -- its highest ranked opponent since the end of the 2000-01 season -- last Thursday. **Tabitha Pool** was the lone Wolverine in double figures, scoring 10 points to go with a team-high six rebounds. Michigan returns to the floor against Purdue in Crisler Arena on Thursday and then hosts Iowa on a rare Saturday game at 2 p.m.



Michigan State (22-3, 11-2) has now recorded the second most wins in a season in school history. Last week, **Liz Shimek** became the fourth Spartan this season to reach the 1,000 point mark, joining **Kelli Roehrig**, **Lindsay Bowen** and **Kristin Haynie**. Only two other teams are known to have had four players reach the 1,000-point mark in the same season - Georgia during the 1995-96 season and Saint Joseph's last season. MSU needs just one more victory to tie the school record of 23 wins set during the 1976-77 season (23-6).



Minnesota (19-5, 9-3) held Purdue to just 49 points in the game, marking the seventh Big Ten contest this season in which Minnesota has held its opponent to 50 or fewer points (13 games all season). The Golden Gophers swept two games from Purdue in a single season for the first time since the 1984-85 season. The game attendance of 13,222 is the highest this season, and ranks fifth all-time in Minnesota women's basketball history. Minnesota travels to Ohio State on Thursday and then hosts Wisconsin on Sunday.



Northwestern (5-20, 2-10) came up short as it lost to Indiana, 54-53, on Sunday in action at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Senior **Suzanne Morrison** led the way for the Wildcats with 12 points and seven rebounds, while junior **Ifeoma Okonkwo** chipped in 10 points and seven boards. Senior **Melissa Culver** matched her season-high eight points set on December 5 against Virginia. NU travels to Illinois on Thursday and then to Penn State on Sunday, which will make a rematch of the Wildcats' upset win over PSU in Evanston on January 27.



Ohio State (24-2, 11-1) beat Iowa inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, marking the second-consecutive victory in Iowa City after the Buckeyes won for the first time since 1985 last season. This year, Ohio State is 15-0 in Columbus, which is a first since the 2002-03 season, when then-first year head coach **Jim Foster's** OSU team defended its home court (14-0). Eight Buckeye teams have gone undefeated in Columbus throughout program history. OSU hosts Minnesota on Thursday and travels to Michigan State on Sunday.



Penn State (16-8, 11-2) continues to dominate in the second half of games. Over the last 10 contests, the Lady Lions are outscoring their opponents, 401 to 273, in the second half. **Tanisha Wright** and **Jess Strom** outscored the entire Illinois lineup in the second half, 29-28. It was the fourth time in the last eight games that the duo outscored its opponent in the second half. **Wright** (1,884 pts) continues to climb closer to the 2,000 point mark. Only 10 players in Big Ten history have reached the milestone.



Purdue (13-10, 6-6) lost its sixth road game of the season at No. 12 Minnesota on Sunday. Freshman **Lindsay Wisdom-Hyllon** recorded a team-high 13 points (5-6 FG, 3-4 FT), a team-high six rebounds, and a game-high four blocked shots against Minnesota. **Wisdom-Hyllon** now has 51 blocks this season, shattering the previous Purdue freshman record of 39. **Kristy Curry** is still looking for career win No. 150 and will try to eclipse the mark at Michigan on February 17.



Wisconsin (10-12, 4-8) fell to Michigan State on Sunday, which marked the Badgers' fifth to a ranked team this season. **Jolene Anderson** led UW in scoring for the 14th time this season on Sunday. The Badgers were denied a chance to string together three straight Big Ten wins for the first time under head coach **Lisa Stone** and match their season-high three-game winning streak. Stone is now just five victories away from her 400th. Wisconsin travels to Penn State on Thursday and then to Minnesota on Sunday.

Top Three League Teams Protecting the Home Court
 League-leader **Ohio State** and **Penn State** and **Michigan State**, who are tied for second, have been protecting the home court this season. Currently, the three teams have combined for a 36-0 record at home, including an 18-0 combined mark in Big Ten play. Ohio State (15-0), Michigan State (11-0) and Penn State (10-0) are all undefeated at home.

OSU's Davenport Named WBCA Player of the Month
 Ohio State sophomore **Jessica Davenport** has been named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Player of the Month for January. Davenport is the first Big Ten student-athlete to earn the award, which was started during the 2003-04 season. In the month of January, Davenport averaged 19.8 points, 8.7 rebounds and shot .579 (77-133) from the field in 10 games. The 6-4 center earned the honor over 26 other nominees, including Wade Trophy National Player of the Year candidates Monique Curry (Duke), Sandora Irvin (TCU) and Kendra Wecker (Kansas State).

A Grand Old Milestone
 Michigan State's **Liz Shimek** became the 14th active Big Ten student-athlete to eclipse the 1,000-career-point mark this past weekend. Shimek's accomplishment mark the fourth time this season a Spartan has reached the 1,000 point mark. Shimek joins **Kelli Roehrig**, **Lindsay Bowen** and **Kristin Haynie**. Only two other teams are known to have had four players reach the 1,000-point mark in the same season - Georgia during the 1995-96 season and Saint Joseph's last season. UW's Anderson Posting "Mazzante/Whalen" Numbers
 Wisconsin's **Jolene Anderson** currently ranks among Big Ten greats Kelly Mazzante of Penn State and Lindsay Whalen of Minnesota. In the past five years, the Big Ten has not had a freshman average over 17.0 points in all games since the 2000-01 season when Mazzante and Whalen began their collegiate careers. But this year, the Badger freshman is fourth in the League at 18.0 points per game. Currently there are four freshmen ranked in the top 30 in scoring this season, which is a first since the 2000-01 campaign. The League had three in 2001-02 and just two in each of the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons.  With seven assists Sunday at Wisconsin, **Kristin Haynie** became the fourth player in Big Ten history to amass career totals of 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 500 assists and 300 steals. Haynie now has career totals of 1,056 points, 525 rebounds, 505 assists and 307 steals. She joins Ohio State's Yvette Angel (1981-85), Purdue's Katie Douglas (1997-2001) and Wisconsin's Tamara Moore (1999-2002).

Four Big Ten Seniors Candidates for Senior CLASS Award
 Four Big Ten student-athletes -- Michigan State's **Kristin Haynie**, Minnesota's **Janel McCarville**, Ohio State's **Caity Matter** and Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** -- are candidates for the 2004-05 Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award.

The top 30 male and female college basketball players in their senior season were nominated for the fourth annual Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year for NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball.

The Senior Class Award - an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School - was launched in the 2001-02 college basketball season. The 2005 State Farm Wade Trophy winner will be announced during the WBCA National Convention held in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Final Four in Indianapolis, Ind., April 2-5, 2005.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN INDIANAPOLIS

Celebrating its 10th year of the Big Ten Tournament in Indianapolis, the League office began highlighting 10 great Tournament moments on the first day of the 2004 Conference season, Thursday, December 30. Over a 10-week period, the Big Ten will feature a new moment on bigten.org and in its weekly women's basketball releases every Thursday leading up to Thursday, March 3 -- the opening day of the 2005 Big Ten Tournament at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

The following is the seventh of 10 memorable moments of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament in Indianapolis:

On **March 5, 2000**, No. 3 seed and defending National Champion Purdue captured its third-straight Big Ten Tournament title with a 71-63 win over top-seeded Penn State. Of the seven Purdue players that took the court in the championship game, three scored 17 points or more, including a game-high 24 from Katie Douglas. Camille Cooper tallied 17 points, while Kelly Komara also posted 17 points, along with nine rebounds, seven assists and five steals. Douglas had five of Purdue's 10 three-pointers, which helped the No. 18 Boilermakers (22-7) past the fifth-ranked Lady Lions (26-4) for the first time that season. Penn State defeated Purdue in both regular season games, which helped the Lady Lions to their first overall Big Ten championship. The Lady Lions, which had their 10-game winning streak snapped, had three players in doubled figures, led by Helen Darling with 16 points. Andrea Garner finished the game with 14 points, followed by Lisa Shepherd with 10.



Purdue captured its third-straight Big Ten Tournament title on March 5, 2000, with a 71-63 win over top-seeded Penn State. The 2000 event was the first ever Big Ten Tournament to be held at the current site of Conseco Fieldhouse.

The 2000 Tournament, held for the first time at the current site of Conseco Fieldhouse, was witnessed by a total of 27,398 fans - then the second highest attendance in the event's history.
