### NEWS FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

#### Big Ten Regular Season Championship Decided This Week

Michigan State, Ohio State and Penn State will all vie for the 2005 Big Ten regular season championship this week. The Spartans, coming off a win over Ohio State on Sunday, will host Michigan in the final game of the regular season on Wednesday. Should the Spartans win, Michigan State will clinch at least a share of the 2005 Conference title. It would be the second ever for the Spartans and the first for MSU since 1997. Should Ohio State defeat Purdue and Penn State this week, it would mark the ninth Big Ten title and the first since 1993 for OSU. Should Penn State defeat Ohio State Sunday, the Lady Lions would capture their third-consecutive League championship and their sixth overall.

The two scenarios for an outright League champion are as follows: Should Michigan State fall at home to Michigan on Wednesday, and Ohio State defeat Purdue on Thursday, the winner of the Penn State at Ohio State game on Sunday would be declared Big Ten champion. Should Michigan State win on Wednesday and Ohio State fall at Purdue, but rebound to defeat Penn State in Columbus on Sunday, Michigan State would be the lone League champion for 2005. All three teams could share the League crown pending certain results in the schedule.

#### FSN to Broadcast Penn State/Ohio State as Wildcard

The Big Ten Conference and FSN Chicago have announced the selection of the Penn State at Ohio State matchup as its February 27th "Wildcard" game. The game, which could potentially decide a share of or the outright Big Ten Championship, will air tape-delay at 9 p.m. CT on FSN Chicago and at 10 pm. ET on FSN Ohio. The final regular season game will also be replayed at noon on February 28 on FSN Chicago, Detroit and North.

### BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### Jessica Davenport, Ohio State

6-4, SO, C, Columbus, Ohio/Independence

Davenport recorded two impressive performances against top 15 teams this past week, with her first career triple-double against No. 9/9 Michigan State and a near career-high in scoring against No. 14/14 Minnesota. On the week, Davenport nearly averaged a triple-double with 27 points, 12 rebounds and 8.5 blocks. She was a combined 23-of-33 (.697) from the field in all 80 minutes of play.

Against the Golden Gophers, Davenport set a Value City Arena record with 35 points and added 11 boards, five blocked shots and three assists for her ninth double-double of the season. This past Sunday in East Lansing, the Buckeye sophomore registered 19 points, 13 rebounds and 12 blocked shots against the Spartans, marking the first triple-double recorded by a Big Ten student-athlete since Minnesota's Janel McCarville in last year's Big Ten Tournament, which ironically was recorded against Ohio State. Davenport's 12 blocks tied a Big Ten record, which was set on three different occasions during the 1988-89 season by Wisconsin's Janetta Johnson.

Since the beginning of Conference play this season, Davenport has recorded the first four Big Ten Player of the Week honors of her career. She is currently leading all scorers in Conference action with an average of 21.4 points per game and is just one-tenth behind Penn State's Tanisha Wright for the overall scoring lead at 19.2.

**Big Ten Lands Four Teams in AP Top 25 Poll**

In last week's national polls (AP / USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Coaches Poll), the **Big Ten** had four teams represented in the Associated Press poll, while three squads were ranked by the Coaches. **Ohio State** was No. 2/3 – its highest ranking in school history. **Michigan State** was No. 9/9 and **Minnesota** was No. 14/14. **Penn State** was ranked No. 24 by the AP and was joined by **Purdue** in receiving votes in the Coaches poll.

**Four League Squads Rank Among Nation's Top 25 RPI**

In the latest WBCA/Summerville RPI Ratings, the **Big Ten** ranks third in Conference RPI average (.575) and fifth in overall RPI (.582), while four League teams rank among the nation's top 25. **Michigan State** holds an overall RPI rating of .653, which is fifth best in the nation, followed by No. 6 **Ohio State** (.647). **Minnesota** (.625) is 15th, while **Penn State** (.611) ranks 21st. In overall strength of schedule, **Northwestern** is 10th at .618, **Michigan** (.610) is 13th, **Indiana** (.606) is 17th and **Purdue** (.601) is 19th. **Seven League Teams Rank in Top 25 in Attendance**

In the latest unofficial attendance rankings compiled by the University of Wisconsin, seven Big Ten teams average in the nation's top 25. **Minnesota** is fifth with an average of 8,799, while **Penn State** (8,655) is sixth and **Purdue** (8,456) is seventh. **Wisconsin** (6,100) ranks 14th, followed by No. 15 **Michigan State** (5,913), No. 23 **Ohio State** (4,369) and No. 25 **Iowa** (4,083).

**Big Ten Women's Basketball Attracting More Fans in 04-05**

Big Ten Women's Basketball is attracting more fans nationwide than last year. Currently, the League boasts an all-game total of 850,945 fans through 204 games, which is over 64,000 better than last season's 204-game total. The Conference is also chasing its record-breaking marks for home attendance, which were set last year.

**Last Weekend a Fan Frenzy for Big Ten Women's Hoops**

This past Sunday marked one of the most memorable week-ends for Big Ten Women's Basketball fans. Of the League games played Sunday, all four were contested in front of more than 10,000 fans for a combined average of 13,367 patrons per game. A total of 15,177 fans were on hand for Penn State's Senior Day, while 14,203 Minnesota patrons sent Janel McCarville off in style on the Gophers' Senior Day. Michigan State played host to Ohio State in front of a school-record 14,066, while Indiana shattered its home attendance record by 2,000 with 10,022 in attendance against Purdue.

**Big Ten Tops Among Leagues With Two 23-Win Teams**

With Ohio State at 25-3 and Michigan State at 24-3, the Big Ten is the only Conference in the nation to boast a pair of teams with 23 wins or more. The Big Ten is also one of two Leagues to boast three or more teams with 20+ wins. Ohio State is one of only two teams in the nation to have already reached the 25-win plateau.

**Big Ten Ranks Among NCAA Leaders**

In the latest NCAA report (2/15/05), issued each week on Tuesdays, seven student-athletes and six teams rank in the top 15 in their respective categories. Ohio State's **Caity Matter** is fourth overall with a .471 three-point field goal percentage, while Michigan State's **Lindsay Bowen** ranks seventh at .460. The Spartans' **Kristin Haynie** is 12th with 3.4 steals per game, while Ohio State's **Jessica Davenport** ranks 14th with 2.9 blocks per game. Teammate **Brandie Hoskins** is 10th in field goal percentage at .599, followed by Davenport in 11th at .595 and Iowa's **Jamie Cavey** in 14th at .577. **Ohio State** is first in field goal percentage (.517), while **Penn State** ranks second in free throw percentage at .788. **Michigan State** ranks fifth in rebounding margin at 9.6. **Illinois** (14-10, 6-8) allowed 12 points to Northwestern in the first half last week, which tied the Assembly Hall record for least points allowed in a half. The Fighting Illini also held Northwestern to .255 shooting from the field. It was the sixth time this season, and the third time in the last five games, that the Illini held the opposition under .300 from the field. Illinois hosts IPFW on Tuesday, travel to Iowa on Thursday and then returns to Champaign on Sunday to host Michigan.



**Indiana** (10-15, 3-11) fell in overtime Sunday to Purdue, 62-58. Despite falling to the Boilermakers, Indiana set a new home attendance record of 10,022 fans, shattering its previous record of 7,986 set on January 24, 2003. Because the Hoosiers were successful in drawing a crowd of over 10,000 fans, Vera Bradley Design donated \$10,000 to breast cancer research. Annika Boyd netted a career-high 19 points, including a perfect 6-for-6 effort from the free-throw line. The Hoosiers host No. 14/14 Minnesota on Thursday and Iowa on Sunday.



**Iowa** (17-8, 6-8) closed its game at Michigan on a 26-4 run to win 78-59. Jamie Cavey posted her fifth double-double of the season and sixth of her career when she scored a team-high 19 points and grabbed a game and career-high 14 rebounds in Iowa's 19-point win at Michigan. Johanna Solverson dished out a game and career-high 10 assists at Michigan, marking the first time an Iowa player collected 10 assists since Kristi Faulkner tallied 10 helpers vs. Missouri (Dec. 29, 2002). Iowa is home to Illinois on Thursday and at Indiana on Sunday.



**Michigan** (5-20, 1-13) dropped a tough 78-59 decision to the Iowa Hawkeyes on Saturday at Crisler Arena. Michigan came out inspired from the opening tip on Senior Night 2005, scoring the first seven points of the game and leading by as many as 13 in the first half with aggressive play both offensively and defensively. Tabitha Pool recorded 20 points, nine boards, six steals and five assists in her last game at Crisler Arena, while fellow senior BreAnne McPhilly saved the best for last, playing her finest game with 11 points.



**Michigan State** (24-3, 13-2) set a new school record with its 24th victory of the season on Sunday, after a 66-64 win over No. 2/3 Ohio State. The previous record was when the 1976-77 team went 23-6. Michigan State has now won eight straight Big Ten games, which is the most in team history. The Spartans are now 12-0 at home this season, tying the third-longest home winning streak in school history. With the win over Ohio State, MSU set a new mark for the highest-ranked team the Spartans have ever beaten.



**Minnesota** (20-6, 10-4) topped Wisconsin on Sunday, 84-53, in front of a crowd of 14,203, which ranks No. 2 all-time in Minnesota history. Janel McCarville scored a career-high 33 points in leading the Gophers to their 20th victory of the season. McCarville is the only player in Gopher history to play on four consecutive 20-plus wins teams. The Golden Gophers hit 20 wins for the fourth consecutive season and seventh overall. Minnesota closes the regular season on the road at Indiana Thursday and Northwestern on Sunday.



**Northwestern** (5-22, 2-12) dropped an 83-56 decision to No. 24 Penn State at the Bryce Jordan Center on Sunday. Senior Suzanne Morrison was 8-of-17 shooting, good for a team-high 16 points, and pulled down five rebounds. Ifeoma Okonkwo chipped in 11 points, and tied her career-high assist mark, dishing out five. She also contributed five boards and one steal. Northwestern, playing without senior Sarah Kwasinski, shot better from the field (41.5 percent) than the Lady Lions, but were outrebounded 32-43. NU is at Wisconsin on Wednesday.



**Ohio State** (25-3, 12-2) hits the road to Purdue on Thursday and then closes out the regular season schedule at home against Penn State. This season, Ohio State is 16-0 in Columbus. Ohio State's 25 wins is the most for Jim Foster in his three seasons as head coach of the Buckeyes. The last time an Ohio State squad recorded 25 wins was the 1992-93 season. That year the Buckeyes finished 28-4. Ohio State is 8-2 this season against ranked opponents, including a 6-0 mark in Value City Arena.



**Penn State** (18-8, 13-2) closed out its second perfect home season in three years, as the Lady Lions finished at 12-0 this year. This senior class lost just five games at the Bryce Jordan Center over the course of their career, including just one in the last three years. The class tallied 50 home wins over the four years. Tanisha Wright went over 1,900 points for her career Sunday vs. Northwestern, and now has 1,918 points. The Lady Lions travel to Ohio State on Sunday for its final game of the regular season.



**Purdue** (15-10, 8-6) is now 18-14 all-time in overtime games after winning 62-58 in an extra five minutes at Indiana last Sunday. The Boilermakers are 2-0 this season in overtime games and are now 6-1 in games decided by five points or fewer. Purdue grabbed 59 rebounds against Indiana, 30 more than the Hoosiers. The Boilermakers are 8-1 when outrebounding their opponents (3-0 Big Ten). Purdue hosts Ohio State on Thursday and Wisconsin on Sunday.



**Wisconsin** (10-14, 4-10) fell 84-53 to Minnesota last Sunday. The Badgers were led by Janese Banks' 16 points. Banks has now led in scoring two times this season. Sinking two on Sunday, freshman Jolene Anderson now needs three three-point baskets to tie the UW freshman record of 47. She will get that chance when the Badgers host Northwestern on Wednesday, followed by a road trip to Purdue on Sunday to close out the regular season.

**League Scoring Title Narrowing to Two Player Race?**

Two Big Ten student-athletes have begun to pull away in their chase for the League's scoring title. Currently, Ohio State sophomore **Jessica Davenport** leads the Conference with 21.2 points per game, while Illinois senior **Angelina Williams** follows closely behind with 19.6. The last Buckeye to lead the League in scoring was Katie Smith with 21.2 ppg during the 1994-95 season. The following year, Ashley Berggren netted 27.5 ppg for Illinois, marking the last time an Illini player has led the Conference in scoring.

**Top Three League Teams Protecting the Home Court**

League-leaders **Penn State** and **Michigan State**, as well as **Ohio State** which is currently second, have been protecting the home court this season. Currently, the three teams have combined for a 40-0 record at home, including an 22-0 combined mark in Big Ten play. Ohio State (16-0), Michigan State (12-0) and Penn State (12-0) are all undefeated at home.

**Davenport Ties Big Ten Single Game Blocks Record**

This past Sunday in East Lansing, Ohio State's Jessica Davenport posted her first career triple-double after registering 19 points, 13 rebounds and 12 blocked shots against the Spartans. Her 12 blocks tie the Big Ten record for single-game swats, as the mark was set on three different occasions during the 1988-89 season by Wisconsin's Janetta Johnson.

**OSU's Davenport Named WBCA Player of the Month**

Ohio State sophomore **Jessica Davenport** has been named the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) National Player of the Month for January. Davenport is the first Big Ten student-athlete to earn the award, which was started during the 2003-04 season. In the month of January, Davenport averaged 19.8 points, 8.7 rebounds and shot .579 (77-133) from the field in 10 games. The 6-4 center earned the honor over 26 other nominees, including Wade Trophy National Player of the Year candidates Monique Curry (Duke), Sandora Irvin (TCU) and Kendra Wecker (Kansas State).

**UW's Anderson Posting "Mazzante/Whalen" Numbers**

Wisconsin's **Jolene Anderson** currently ranks among Big Ten greats Kelly Mazzante of Penn State and Lindsay Whalen of Minnesota. In the past five years, the Big Ten has not had a freshman average over 17.0 points in all games since the 2000-01 season when Mazzante and Whalen began their collegiate careers. But this year, the Badger freshman is fourth in the League at 17.6 points per game. Currently there are four freshmen ranked in the top 30 in scoring this season, which is a first since the 2000-01 campaign. The League had three in 2001-02 and just two in each of the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. **MSU's Haynie Joins Rare Big Ten Club**

With seven assists at Wisconsin on February 13, Michigan State's **Kristin Haynie** became the fourth player in Big Ten history to amass career totals of 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 500 assists and 300 steals. Haynie now has career totals of 1,064 points, 531 rebounds, 511 assists and 309 steals. She joins Ohio State's Yvette Angel (1981-85), Purdue's Katie Douglas (1997-2001) and Wisconsin's Tamara Moore (1999-2002).

BIG TEN ANNOUNCES 41 RECRUITS DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

 Four Big Ten student-athletes -- Michigan State's **Kristin Haynie**, Minnesota's **Janel McCarville**, Ohio State's **Caity Matter** and Penn State's **Tanisha Wright** -- are candidates for the 2004-05 Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN INDIANAPOLIS

Celebrating its 10th year of the Big Ten Tournament in Indianapolis, the League office began highlighting 10 great Tournament moments on the first day of the 2004 Conference season, Thursday, December 30. Over a 10-week period, the Big Ten will feature a new moment on bigten.org and in its weekly women's basketball releases every Thursday leading up to Thursday, March 3 -- the opening day of the 2005 Big Ten Tournament at Consecro Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

The following is the eighth of 10 memorable moments of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament in Indianapolis:

On **March 1, 1997**, No. 8 seed Indiana recorded the Tournament's biggest upset by defeating top-seeded Purdue, 61-54, in the opening game of quarterfinal action. Bridget Porter led the way for Indiana with 18 points and 12 rebounds, while current Hoosier assistant coach Quacy Barnes posted 15 points, grabbed 11 boards, and swatted four shots. Purdue was led by Jannon Roland with 17 points and seven rebounds, while Stephanie White and Corissa Yasen scored 15 and 12 points, respectively.



No. 8 seed Indiana recorded the Tournament's biggest upset by defeating top-seeded Purdue, 61-54, in the opening game of quarterfinal action. The 1997 event was the first to be held at the RCA Dome.

In the 10-year history of the Tournament, the 1997 Hoosiers were the highest-seeded team ever to knock off a No. 1 seed. On three occasions (1995, 1998, 2003), a No. 7 seed as upset a No. 2 seed.

Indiana, which advanced to the quarterfinals after a 72-54 win over ninth-seeded Michigan, fell 87-53 in the semifinals to Iowa. The Hawkeyes would go on to win the 1997 Tournament Championship over Illinois, 63-56.

The 1997 Tournament was also the first to be held at the RCA Dome. The postseason event moved to the RCA Dome from 1997-99, after a two-year stint at nearby Hinkle Fieldhouse.
