BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Liz Shimek, Michigan State
SR, 6-1, F, Empire, Mich./Maple City-Glen Lake

Shimek opened up senior campaign posting impressive performances in wins over 2005 NCAA Tournament teams UC Santa Barbara and Western Carolina. The All-America candidate poured in a career-high 26 points on 10-of-13 shooting with seven boards against the Gauchos, only to better that performance against the Catamounts on Sunday. She scored a new career-high of 28 points on 13-of-16 shooting with 10 rebounds in just 26 minutes, marking her 24th career double-double. Shimek also dished out four assists and had three steals against WCU. Through two games, Shimek is shooting an impressive 23-for-29 (.793) from the floor and averaging 27.0 points and 8.5 boards. She is also a perfect 7-for-7 from the line.

This is the second career Player of the Week honor as she shared the award with Minnesota's Janel McCarville on Feb. 7, 2005.

A Look at the Week Ahead...

All 11 conference schools will take to the court this week, including 2004-05 co-regular season champion Ohio State, which will open its season Monday against Eastern Kentucky.

In fact, Big Ten women's basketball will be in action each day this week. One game is on the slate for Monday, three will be played Tuesday and two are scheduled for Wednesday. One game will be played on Thanksgiving, followed by a full plate of games Friday through Sunday.

Take Me Down to the Paradise City...

When did Thanksgiving week begin looking like Spring Break? Four Big Ten teams will be "giving thanks" to their coaching staffs for their Thanksgiving tournaments in paradise this week. Michigan State and Minnesota will travel to St. Thomas in the U.S. Virgin Islands to compete in the Paradise Jam, while Purdue heads to the Bahamas and Wisconsin travels to Hawaii. The Spartans will have their break highlighted by a NCAA semifinal rematch on Thanksgiving as MSU will battle Tennessee at 8:30 p.m. ET.

Four Big Ten Teams Ranked in Nation's Top 25

Four conference squads were ranked in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls last week. Ohio State was ranked fourth in both polls, while Michigan State was rated 10th and 11th, respectively. No. 16/17 Minnesota and No. 19/24 Purdue rounded out the Big Ten contingent. Penn State also received votes in the coaches poll. This week's polls will be released on Tuesday.

Minnesota's Six Seeing Double

This past Sunday, Minnesota defeated No. 11/9 Stanford with six players finishing in double figures. Shannon Schonrock finished with a team-high 15 points, while Lauren Lacey and Liz Podomonick each had 14. Natasha Williams has 13 points, followed by Kelly Roysland's 12 and April Calhoun's 11. The last time six Gophers scored in double figures in a single game was in Dec. of 1997.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

Cat-Scratch Fever

Northwestern's 93-77 season-opening win over Creighton marked the first time since 1998 that the Wildcats scored 50 points in a half and eclipsed the 90-point plateau. The last time both instances occurred was on Dec. 4, 1998 against Ohio. Last week against Creighton, NU junior A.J. Glasauer scored a career-high 26 points, while also dishing out six assists and grabbing four rebounds.

The Day for Double-Doubles

Three Big Ten student-athletes posted their first double-doubles of the season on Sunday, Nov. 20. Michigan's Kelly Helvey notched 10 points and 10 rebounds in the Wolverines' win over Miami (Ohio). Liz Shimek of Michigan State, the current Big Ten Player of the Week, tallied a career-high 28 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Western Carolina, while Wisconsin's Danielle Ward posted 14 points and 14 rebounds in the Badgers' win over Cleveland State.

Look Who Hit 40...

This past week both Illinois and Iowa earned their first victories over the year with 40-point wins. Illinois traveled to Loyola (Chicago) on Nov. 18, and walked away a 79-39 winner. Iowa, playing on its home floor, topped UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20 with an 82-42 rout.

When Hitting 30 is Actually Great

In its 80-52 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) in the opening week, Michigan connected on 30-of-35 free throws, which matched the school record. The Wolverines hit 30 free throws at Detroit on Nov. 18, 2001 and at Minnesota on March 6, 1988.

Coaching Milestones

Several conference coaches either eclipsed milestone marks this past week or are on pace to this week. Penn State's Rene Portland (665-235) coached in her 900th career game on Sunday, while Wisconsin's Lisa

Stone (339-151) took the sidelines in her 550th game. With a win over Cleveland State, Stone is now just one win away from No. 400 for her career. Also one game shy of 400 is Michigan State's Joanne P. McCallie (270-129), however hers will come Thursday when she coaches in her 400th career game.

Indiana's Sharon Versyp (98-52) paced the sidelines in her 150th game on Saturday and is looking for her first victory as the Hoosiers' head coach this week. Minnesota's Pam Borton (78-23) coached in her 100th and 101st games as the Gophers' mentor last week. Other milestones on the horizon include Ohio State's Jim Foster (73-25), who is looking for wins No. 99 and 100 this weekend and Purdue's Kristy Curry (154-44), who is two contests shy of her 200th game both at Purdue and in her career.

A Quick Look at Who Returns...

Five league teams return four or more starters, while nine schools welcome back at least three. Of the league's 55 starters from last year, 35 (64 percent) return for the 2004-05 campaign. In addition, 85 letterwinners return as well. The following is a closer look at the breakdown of each conference school:

Spartans & Buckeyes Not Looking to Share

Michigan State and Ohio State enter the 2005-06 season looking to successfully defend their co-Big Ten Championship from a year ago. Last year marked the ninth time in league history and the first time since the 1996-97 season that the Big Ten regular season title was shared by two teams. The Buckeyes have not captured consecutive league titles since winning five straight from 1983-1987. Michigan State tallied its second-ever conference championship last year and its first since 1997.

Points Come in Pairs

Among tandems in which both players return this year, Indiana senior **Jenny DeMuth** and senior **Cyndi Valentin** make up the highest-scoring Big Ten duo returning in 2005-06.

The Immaculata Idols

Illinois head coach **Theresa Grentz** and Penn State mentor **Rene Portland** were former teammates at Immaculata back in the mid-70s. Today, they are together again as the most tenured head coaches in the Big Ten. The 2005-06 season marks the 26th season at PSU for Portland, while Grentz enters her 11th year with the Illini. In fact, those combined 37 years on a conference campus are two more than the total of the remaining nine league coaches' tenures. The landscape of Big Ten mentors has taken on a fairly fresh look since the 1999-00 season. Excluding Grentz and Portland, nine of the 11 conference coaches have spent seven years or less at their respective schools. Six coaches have spent less than four years on their respective Big Ten campuses.
