MVP Moments

Five Big Ten players earned MVP honors at tournaments over the weekend. Indiana's **Amber Jackson** earned the distinction at the Hilton Concord Classic after leading her team to the title by averaging 25 points and five rebounds per game. Michigan's **Jessica Minnfield** was named MVP of the Southern Mississippi Lady Eagles Classic after leading the Wolverines to their first in-season tournament title since 1999-00. Minnesota's **Emily Fox** averaged 18.5 points, 2.5 steals and 4.0 assists to earn MVP distinction at the Colorado Coors Classic. Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender** was named MVP of the Buckeye Classic after recording three double-doubles and two games with 20 or more points. Wisconsin's **Alyssa Karel** earned MVP honors of the Island Division at the Paradise Jam after netting 14.7 points over three games, including the game-winning basket in the Badgers' thrilling win over No. 6/7 Baylor.

Big Ten Goes 6-of-11

Six Big Ten women's basketball teams are receiving national attention in either the Associated Press or ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. No. 17/20 Purdue and No. 18/18 Ohio State lead the charge, followed by No. 21/24 Michigan State. Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin are garnering votes. The last time over half the conference squads were ranked or receiving votes in either poll was on Nov. 27, 2007.

Badgers Have No Trouble in Paradise

In a thrilling upset win this past weekend at the Paradise Jam, Wisconsin upended No. 6/7 Baylor, 59-58, to claim the tournament title in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. The victory marks the first for an unranked Big Ten team over a team ranked sixth or higher since Dec. 5, 2004, when Penn State triumphed over No. 2/4 North Carolina. The last time the Badgers upstaged a top-10 team was on Dec. 28, 2001, when Wisconsin beat No. 7 Purdue, 71-59. In addition to the win over the Bears, the Badgers posted wins over Villanova and Central Florida at the Paradise Jam and are now receiving votes outside the AP top 25 poll.

Spartans Winning Big

Not only has Michigan State compiled an impressive 6-1 record, but the team has done so in convincing fashion. The Spartans currently rank fifth in the country in scoring margin at +27.9, just under seven points off NCAA-leading Texas. Recently, Michigan State downed No. 23/20 Old Dominion, 74-48, last Wednesday, marking the fifth-biggest margin of victory over a ranked opponent in program history. A major contributor to the large differential has been MSU's stellar defense, holding opponents to a 30 percent average from the field which ranks third-best among all NCAA Division I squads. The Spartans also boast the nation's 14th-best scoring offense, averaging 80.1 points per contest to lead the Big Ten.

Jefferson Feels Luck of the Irish

In the Big Ten's second 30-point performance this season, Michigan State forward **Aisha Jefferson** scorched the nets for 34 points against No. 14/10 Notre Dame this past Saturday. The junior's 34-count marks the highest individual point total in the Big Ten this season, a new career high for the Spartan and the third-highest single-game total in school history. Jefferson leads MSU with 15.3 points per contest, which ranks eighth in the conference.

Double Your Fun

Indiana senior **Whitney Thomas** recorded her 24th and 25th career double-doubles in wins over Missouri and Radford last week, reclaiming the career lead among all active Big Ten players. Illinois' **Jenna Smith** is second with 23 double-doubles, while Ohio State sophomore **Jantel Lavender** has 20 in just 38 career games.

A Challenging Week Ahead

The second annual ACC-Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge tips off on Wednesday, Dec. 3, with three games hitting the courts. No. 21/24 Michigan State opens the event at Georgia Tech at 4:15 p.m. ET, followed by 7 p.m. ET tips between Penn State at Florida State and No. 2/2 North Carolina at No. 18/18 Ohio State. The matchup between the Buckeyes and Tar Heels will air live on the Big Ten Network. Thursday features six Challenge games, including four on Big Ten campuses. No. 8/11 Maryland at No. 17/20 Purdue will be shown live at 6:30 p.m. ET on the Big Ten Network, followed by No. 20/19 Virginia at Illinois at 8:30 p.m. ET. Boston College at Minnesota and Virginia Tech at Wisconsin will be available on BigTenNetwork.com. The second annual Challenge wraps up on Friday with two games, including N.C. State at Michigan which will be televised live on the Big Ten Network.

More on the Challenge

In all, this year's ACC-Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge will feature 13 teams either ranked or receiving votes in the latest AP poll, with the Big Ten represented by six teams in or just outside the top 25. Nine of the 11 Challenge games will include at least one team either ranked or receiving votes, while four matchups will pit a pair of teams either ranked or receiving votes against each other. A pair of top-25 matchups on Big Ten campuses highlight the docket as No. 17/20 Purdue hosts No. 8/11 Maryland and No. 18/18 Ohio State plays host to No. 2/2 North Carolina.

Tourney Tickets on Sale Soon

All-session tickets for the 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will go on sale to the general public on Saturday, Dec. 6, at 10 a.m. ET at all 11 Big Ten university ticket offices, the Consecro Fieldhouse

box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www.ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (317) 239-5151. All-session tickets are on sale for \$45 for the first 45 days of the public sale, which is a \$20 discount from the regular price of \$65.

Coming to a TV Near You

Big Ten women's basketball teams will experience a record amount of exposure with 119 games set to be broadcast nationally during the regular season. The Big Ten Network will air 55 games on its linear channel and an additional 56 contests on BigTenNetwork.com. All internet games will be streamed live and free of charge. During the 2008-09 season, Big Ten women's basketball can also be found on CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU. In addition, for the second time in history, all 10 games of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will reach a live national audience. The Big Ten Network is set to broadcast the first nine games of the event, while ESPN2 will cover the championship game.

Big Ten Tournament Returns to Indy

The conference will once again return to Indianapolis for the 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament. 2009 marks the second of a five-year agreement that places both the men's and women's tournaments in the Circle City. This year's tournament will be the eighth straight and 14th overall in Indianapolis and will be held on four consecutive days, March 5-8.

More than Just a Game

The 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will feature more than just exciting on-court action. Events surrounding the tournament include the annual girls' basketball youth clinic, fan pep rallies and the Big Ten's annual event to promote and support cancer awareness, held during the semifinal games. Following last year's event, the Big Ten donated over \$10,000 to the Indianapolis affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure.

Three Big Ten Teams to Host NCAA Action

Iowa's Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Michigan State's Breslin Center and Ohio State's Nationwide Arena will serve as three of the 16 host sites for the first and second rounds of the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, held March 21-24, 2009. Columbus, Ohio, will welcome four teams on March 21 and 23, while Iowa City, Iowa, and East Lansing, Mich., will host four teams each on March 22 and 24.

Big Ten Begins March to the Arch in 2009

Big Ten women's basketball will march toward the Arch during the 2008-09 season as the 2009 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held April 5 and 7 at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis. The conference has sent five teams to the past 10 Final Fours, including two in the last five seasons. The 2009 championship event is hosted by the Missouri Valley Conference.

Get to Know Her

The Big Ten announced its latest public service effort for women's basketball at Basketball Media Day on Oct. 26. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is a fully integrated effort that allows fans to see the non-basketball sides of their favorite student-athletes via multimedia tools and on-campus functions. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is funded in-part by the NCAA as part of a grant program that is designed to foster the growth of women's basketball on NCAA member campuses and within NCAA member conferences.

CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Amber Jackson, Indiana Sr., F, 6-2, Yokosuka, Japan/Oxnard (Calif.) Jackson was named MVP of the Hilton Concord Classic after dropping 25 points in back-to-back games against Radford and Saint Mary's over the weekend. The

senior's 50 total points came on 83 percent shooting (20-24) from the field and 77 percent (10-13) from the free-throw line. In IU's opening game of the tournament, Jackson netted a career-high 25 points on 8-of-9 shooting from the field and 9-of-11 from the line. She also added four rebounds and blocked a shot in 25 minutes of play. Against host St. Mary's in the championship game, the Yokosuka, Japan, native matched her career high with another 25 points, shooting 12-of-15 from the floor and 1-of-2 at the stripe. She also grabbed six rebounds and swatted four shots in the 17-point victory. Jackson also contributed in Indiana's 63-54 win over Missouri on Tuesday, recording four points, three boards and two blocks in 25 minutes on the court. For the week, Jackson averaged 18.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 2.3 blocks while shooting 72.4 percent from the field and 80.0 percent from the free-throw line. The award is the first of Jackson's career.

Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton, Purdue Sr., F, 6-2, Naperville, Ill./Neuqua Valley Wisdom-Hylton averaged 15.3 points and 9.0 rebounds as Purdue went 2-1 at the Waikiki Marriott Classic in Honolulu, including an overtime loss to No. 5/6

Stanford. Against the Cardinal, the senior netted 15 points, grabbed nine rebounds, dished out four assists, swatted a season-high four shots and added one steal. The following night against host Hawaii, Wisdom-Hylton went 10-of-11 from the field for 20 points with eight boards and a team-high and career-high six assists, also grabbing three steals and registering a pair of blocks. In her third game in as many days, the Naperville, Ill., native recorded her second double-double of the season, pouring in 11 points with 10 rebounds, also adding a pair of assists, a block and a steal in a win over Prairie View A&M. The weekly honor is the second of Wisdom-Hylton's career and the second for the nationally ranked Boilermakers this season.

Veteran McKeown Joins Crop of Young Coaches

When Joe McKeown signed on to become the sixth head coach in Northwestern women's basketball history, he joined a group of conference coaches that has spent an average of three years at their respective institutions. Among the group of 11 mentors, seven have been at their schools less than three years, and five have been at their institution for one year or less. Iowa's Lisa Bluder is the dean of the Big Ten coaches with eight years at the helm of the Hawkeye program. Big Ten Mentors Reaching Major Milestones

Several Big Ten head coaches achieved major milestones in 2007-08, including Ohio State's Jim Foster who became just the 13th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 650 career wins on Jan. 28. On Feb. 10, Iowa's Lisa Bluder became the third active Big Ten coach to reach 500 career wins, joining Foster and Michigan's Kevin Borseth. Minnesota's Pam Borton became the sixth active conference mentor to reach 200 career victories on Feb. 28, joining Bluder, Borseth, Foster, Michigan State's Suzy Merchant and Wisconsin's Lisa Stone. Already during the 2008-09 campaign, Bluder won her 150th game at Iowa with a 83-58 win over Boston and Stone won her 450th career game with a 47-45 victory against Villanova.
