Going Streaking

After starting their respective seasons 0-1, Minnesota and Wisconsin have posted huge rebounds and are both currently riding eight-game winning streaks. The Golden Gophers opened the 2008-09 campaign with a tough loss at then-No. 2/2 Stanford and are now winners of their last eight games. Most recently, Minnesota posted a monster 20-point victory over a Boston College on Thursday in the ACC/Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge. The Eagles were receiving votes in the AP poll. Currently, the Gophers are receiving votes in the media and coaches polls. Wisconsin opened its season with a loss at South Dakota State, but is now riding an eight-game win streak that includes an upset over then-No. 6/7 Baylor at the Paradise Jam. More recently, the Badgers won their ACC/Big Ten Challenge game by a nine-point margin against Virginia Tech. Wisconsin is receiving votes in the AP poll.

Big Ten Improves in Challenge

The Big Ten posted a 4-7 record in the second annual ACC/Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge last week, marking a one-game improvement from the previous year. The Big Ten recorded a strong finish as Michigan and Indiana won the event's final two games. The Wolverines posted a 63-52 win over N.C. State on Friday, becoming the only Big Ten team to remain undefeated in two years of Challenge play. Other Big Ten wins include Indiana's 69-54 defeat of Miami, Minnesota's 80-60 romp over Boston College and Wisconsin's 61-52 victory against Virginia Tech. Three of the Big Ten's four Challenge wins came in home games.

Double Your Fun

Illinois' Jenna Smith, Ohio State's Jantel Lavender, Penn State's Tyra Grant and Wisconsin's Alyssa Karel are the only four Big Ten players to post double-digit scoring marks in every game this season. The group accounts for four of the conference's top 11 scorers, including Lavender, who leads the Big Ten with 22.1 points per game. Smith is second at 18.7, Grant is tied for third at 17.8 and Karel is 11th at 14.0. Lavender has registered double-digit scoring in each game of her career.

Shades of Lavender

Not only has Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender** scored in double-digits in each game this year, but she has posted a double-double in each contest and has scored 20 or more points in every game but one. Lavender has 22 career double-doubles in just 40 career games and trails only Indiana's **Whitney Thomas** (25) and Illinois' **Jenna Smith** (23) for the career lead among active Big Ten players.

There's No Place Like Home

Big Ten teams have been dominant on their home courts this season, posting a combined 37-10 record. Iowa, Michigan State, Minnesota and Wisconsin are undefeated on their home floors as the Gophers and Badgers are each 5-0, while the Hawkeyes and Spartans boast 4-0 home marks.

Comeback Kids

After sitting out all of the 2007-08 season with injuries, three Big Ten women's basketball players are back on the court in a big way. Purdue's **Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton**, a 2006 honorable mention All-American, currently leads her team in scoring (15.3), rebounding (8.4) and field goal percentage (.556). Michigan State's **Aisha Jefferson** leads the Spartans in scoring at 14.4 ppg., including an output of 34 points, to tie for the single-game conference high this season. Northwestern's **Kristin Cartwright** has been a reliable scorer for the Wildcats, posting six double-figure outputs this season while averaging 11.8 points and 3.25 assists.

Upset Specials

Big Ten women's basketball has been playing at a high level, upsetting ranked non-conference opponents in four out of the five weeks of the season. Wisconsin staged the most prominent win over then-No. 6/7 Baylor, defeating the Bears, 59-58, at the Paradise Jam on Nov. 29. Michigan pulled off a 50-42 upset victory over then-No. 13/12 Vanderbilt on Nov. 23, and three days later Michigan State downed then-No. 23/20 Old Dominion, 74-48. Most recently, Iowa upended No. 22 Iowa State, 66-46, on Sunday, handing the Cyclones just their second loss of the season.

Big Ten in the Big Apple

Penn State will participate in the third annual Maggie Dixon Classic on Sunday in Madison Square Garden in New York City. The Lady Lions will face top-ranked UConn at approximately 2 p.m. ET, following Game 1 of the doubleheader between Army and No. 14/13 Rutgers at Noon. Both games will be televised by ESPNU. The event honors the memory of Maggie Dixon, the former Army head coach who passed away of a congenital heart ailment at the age of 28, just weeks after leading her team to its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. A portion of the event's proceeds will benefit C.A.R.E., an organization that works to fund research and raise awareness of sudden cardiac death due to acquired heart disease and inherited rhythm disorders.

Coming to a TV Near You

Big Ten women's basketball teams will experience a record amount of exposure with 119 games set to be broadcast nationally during the regular season. The Big Ten Network will air 55 games on its linear channel and an additional 56 contests on BigTenNetwork.com. All internet games will be streamed live and free of charge. During the 2008-09 season, Big Ten women's basketball can also be found on CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU. In addition, for the second time in history, all 10 games of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will reach a live national audience. The Big Ten Network is set to broadcast the first nine games of the event, while ESPN2 will cover the championship game.

Big Ten Tournament Returns to Indy

The conference will once again return to Indianapolis for the 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament. 2009 marks the second of a five-year agreement that places both the men's and women's tournaments in the Circle City. This year's tournament will be the eighth straight and 14th overall in Indianapolis and will be held on four consecutive days, March 5-8.

More than Just a Game

The 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will feature more than just exciting on-court action. Events surrounding the tournament include the annual girls' basketball youth clinic, fan pep rallies and the Big Ten's annual event to promote and support cancer awareness, held during the semifinal games. Following last year's event, the Big Ten donated over \$10,000 to the Indianapolis affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure.

Three Big Ten Teams to Host NCAA Action

Iowa's Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Michigan State's Breslin Center and Ohio State's Nationwide Arena will serve as three of the 16 host sites for the first and second rounds of the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, held March 21-24, 2009. Columbus, Ohio, will welcome four teams on March 21 and 23, while Iowa City, Iowa, and East Lansing, Mich., will host four teams each on March 22 and 24.

Big Ten Begins March to the Arch in 2009

Big Ten women's basketball will march toward the Arch during the 2008-09 season as the 2009 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held April 5 and 7 at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis. The conference has sent five teams to the past 10 Final Fours, including two in the last five seasons. The 2009 championship event is hosted by the Missouri Valley Conference.

Get to Know Her

The Big Ten announced its latest public service effort for women's basketball at Basketball Media Day on Oct. 26. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is a fully integrated effort that allows fans to see the non-basketball sides of their favorite student-athletes via multimedia tools and on-campus functions. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is funded in-part by the NCAA as part of a grant program that is designed to foster the growth of women's basketball on NCAA member campuses and within NCAA member conferences.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Katie Ohm, Minnesota Jr., G, 5-11, Elgin, Minn./Elgin-Millville
Ohm tallied a career-high 23 points in Minnesota's 80-60 win over Boston College in the ACC/Big Ten Women's Basketball Challenge on Thursday. The junior tied a Williams Arena record with

seven three-pointers, marking the highest single-game output in the Big Ten so far this season. In the game, Ohm shot 57.1 percent from the field, including 63.6 percent from beyond the arc. The Elgin, Minn., native also added eight rebounds, two steals and two assists as the Golden Gophers built up a 20-point margin on the Eagles who were receiving votes in the AP poll. Ohm owns two of the conference's three highest single-game three-point totals this year and has 33 long-range field goals in nine contests, putting her on pace to break the Minnesota single-season record of 73 set in 2001-02 and tied in 2004-05. The weekly award is the first of Ohm's career.

Veteran McKeown Joins Crop of Young Coaches

When Joe McKeown signed on to become the sixth head coach in Northwestern women's basketball history, he joined a group of conference coaches that has spent an average of three years at their respective institutions. Among the group of 11 mentors, seven have been at their schools less than three years, and five have been at their institution for one year or less. Iowa's Lisa Bluder is the dean of the Big Ten coaches with eight years at the helm of the Hawkeye program. Big Ten Mentors Reaching Major Milestones

Several Big Ten head coaches achieved major milestones in 2007-08, including Ohio State's Jim Foster who became just the 13th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 650 career wins on Jan. 28. On Feb. 10, Iowa's Lisa Bluder became the third active Big Ten coach to reach 500 career wins, joining Foster and Michigan's Kevin Borseth. Minnesota's Pam Borton became the sixth active conference mentor to reach 200 career victories on Feb. 28, joining Bluder, Borseth, Foster, Michigan State's Suzy Merchant and Wisconsin's Lisa Stone. Already during the 2008-09 campaign, Bluder won her 150th game at Iowa with a 83-58 win over Boston and Stone won her 450th career game with a 47-45 victory against Villanova.
