Going Streaking

With a 67-48 win over Marquette last Saturday, Wisconsin picked up its 10th straight victory which is tied for the nation's longest active winning streak with Auburn, Florida and North Carolina. Ten consecutive wins also matches the second-highest mark in Badger history with the top mark of 15 games achieved by the 2001-2002 squad. Indiana touts the conference's second-longest active streak at six games, which is tied for 11th in the nation.

Taking State

Big Ten women's basketball teams have played against 19 in-state opponents so far this season, producing a record of 13-6 in those games. Wisconsin fronts the conference, going 3-0 against teams from America's Dairyland, while Indiana and Iowa boast 2-0 marks versus in-state squads. Michigan and Minnesota are the only Big Ten teams that have yet to play a team from within its own borders.

Ann Arbor is Upset City

This past Wednesday, Michigan defeated No. 8/8 Notre Dame, 63-59, in overtime to claim the program's second overall win against a top-10 squad and first since Nov. 17, 2000, when U-M defeated No. 8 Louisiana Tech, 69-66. Earlier this season, the Wolverines downed No. 13/12 Vanderbilt, 50-42, giving the squad two wins against top-15 teams this year. The last time Michigan reached this mark was the 2001-2002 season. Notre Dame falls to the Wolverines for the first time since Dec. 2, 2001, and to a Big Ten school since Dec. 3, 2006.

Road Warriors

Indiana closed out its non-conference schedule on a six-game winning streak, with five of those six contests coming away from Assembly Hall. The Hoosiers lead the Big Ten with five total wins either on the road or on a neutral court. Wisconsin is second in the conference with one road victory and three neutral-site triumphs. Overall, five Big Ten schools are at or above .500 away from home.

Let the Games Begin

The Big Ten intraconference season tips off on Saturday as Northwestern travels to Bloomington to take on a red-hot Indiana squad. This marks the second consecutive year that the Wildcats have participated in the Big Ten opener, as NU hosted Illinois on Dec. 27, 2007, to kick off last year's intraconference slate. Saturday's game will be broadcast live on BigTenNetwork.com.

Milestone Markers

Purdue's **Danielle Campbell** became the latest Big Ten player to record 500 career rebounds, as she grabbed 20 boards in two games last week. The Boilermaker center has 501 career rebounds and is sixth among active Big Ten players. Also over the weekend, Indiana's **Whitney Thomas** became the third active conference player with 200 career steals, swiping five last week to bump her collegiate total to 201. Purdue's **Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton** is the active leader in that category and is just three steals shy of becoming the 29th player and seventh Boilermaker in the Big Ten's 250 career steals club.

DeHaan Hosts Big Ten Block Party

Michigan State's **Allysa DeHaan** tied her own school record for blocks in a single game, swatting nine against Xavier on Sunday. The total is tied for the single-game high in all of NCAA Division I this season. The 6-9 center leads the Big Ten and ranks fourth in the nation with 3.7 blocks per game.

Avoiding the Sophomore Slump

Big Ten sophomores have avoided the "sophomore slump" throughout the non-conference season. Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender** currently leads the Big Ten in scoring (21.7 ppg) and rebounding (11.9 rpg), while Northwestern's **Amy Jaeschke** ranks fifth in scoring (16.2 ppg) and second on the glass (11.3 rpg). Rounding out the top 10 in those categories, Wisconsin's **Alyssa Karel** is 10th in points (13.9 ppg) and Iowa's **Kachine Alexander** is 10th in boards (7.1 rpg).

Climbing the RPI Ladder

According to RPIRatings.com, the Big Ten currently ranks third among all conferences with an RPI score of .5963. This rating is just .0132 back of the ACC in first and .0028 behind the Big 12 in second. Two Big Ten schools rank among the top 10 in RPI with Ohio State in fifth and Wisconsin in ninth. Coming to a TV Near You

Big Ten women's basketball teams will experience a record amount of exposure with 119 games set to be broadcast nationally during the regular season. The Big Ten Network will air 55 games on its linear channel and an additional 56 contests on BigTenNetwork.com. All internet games will be streamed live and free of charge. During the 2008-09 season, Big Ten women's basketball can also be found on CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU. In addition, for the second time in history, all 10 games of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will reach a live national audience. The Big Ten Network is set to broadcast the first nine games of the event, while ESPN2 will cover the championship game.

Big Ten Tournament Returns to Indy

The conference will once again return to Indianapolis for the 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament. 2009 marks the second of a five-year agreement that places both the men's and women's tournaments in the Circle City. This year's tournament will be the eighth straight and 14th overall in Indianapolis and will be held on four consecutive days, March 5-8.

More than Just a Game

The 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will feature more than just exciting on-court action. Events surrounding the tournament include the annual girls' basketball youth clinic, fan pep rallies and the Big Ten's annual event to promote and support cancer awareness, held during the semifinal games. Following last year's event, the Big Ten donated over \$10,000 to the Indianapolis affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure.

Three Big Ten Teams to Host NCAA Action

Iowa's Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Michigan State's Breslin Center and Ohio State's Nationwide Arena will serve as three of the 16 host sites for the first and second rounds of the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, held March 21-24, 2009. Columbus, Ohio, will welcome four teams on March 21 and 23, while Iowa City, Iowa, and East Lansing, Mich., will host four teams each on March 22 and 24.

Big Ten Begins March to the Arch in 2009

Big Ten women's basketball will march toward the Arch during the 2008-09 season as the 2009 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held April 5 and 7 at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis. The conference has sent five teams to the past 10 Final Fours, including two in the last five seasons. The 2009 championship event is hosted by the Missouri Valley Conference.

Get to Know Her

The Big Ten announced its latest public service effort for women's basketball at Basketball Media Day on Oct. 26. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is a fully integrated effort that allows fans to see the non-basketball sides of their favorite student-athletes via multimedia tools and on-campus functions. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is funded in-part by the NCAA as part of a grant program that is designed to foster the growth of women's basketball on NCAA member campuses and within NCAA member conferences.

against No. 8 Notre Dame on Wednesday. The senior forward recorded her second 20-point game of the season, shooting at a blistering .909 clip (10-11) from the floor. The Toronto native also added three rebounds, an assist, two blocks and three steals as the Wolverines defeated their highest-ranked opponent since the 2000-01 campaign. Skrba tallied 12 points in the first half and netted Michigan's only two overtime field goals as the Wolverines went on to stun the Fighting Irish, 63-59. Ten field goals on 11 attempts both marked career highs for the senior who takes home Michigan's first weekly accolade since 2005.

Veteran McKeown Joins Crop of Young Coaches

When Joe McKeown signed on to become the sixth head coach in Northwestern women's basketball history, he joined a group of conference coaches that has spent an average of three years at their respective institutions. Among the group of 11 mentors, seven have been at their schools less than three years, and five have been at their institution for one year or less. Iowa's Lisa Bluder is the dean of the Big Ten coaches with eight years at the helm of the Hawkeye program. Big Ten Mentors Reaching Major Milestones

Several Big Ten head coaches achieved major milestones in 2007-08, including Ohio State's Jim Foster who became just the 13th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 650 career wins on Jan. 28. On Feb. 10, Iowa's Lisa Bluder became the third active Big Ten coach to reach 500 career wins, joining Foster and Michigan's Kevin Borseth. Minnesota's Pam Borton became the sixth active conference mentor to reach 200 career victories on Feb. 28, joining Bluder, Borseth, Foster, Michigan State's Suzy Merchant and Wisconsin's Lisa Stone. Already during the 2008-09 campaign, Bluder won her 150th game at Iowa with a 83-58 win over Boston and Stone won her 450th career game with a 47-45 victory against Villanova.
