The Amazing Race

Ohio State dropped a tight 63-61 decision on the road against Purdue on Monday, but still holds a one-game lead in the Big Ten standings. Penn State tightened its hold on second place in the conference with two wins last week, right behind the Buckeyes at 7-2. The Boilermakers are tied with Wisconsin for third, just three games out at 5-4. Minnesota stands alone in fifth at an even 4-4, while Michigan State and Indiana are tied for sixth, followed by a four-way tie in eighth.

Everyone's a Winner

Iowa's win on Sunday and Purdue's win on Monday gave each team 10 or more on the season, marking the first time in Big Ten women's basketball history that all conference teams recorded 10 or more victories in a season. The wins also improved each team's overall record to 10-10, joining the Big Ten with the Big 12 as the only two conferences in the country with all their teams at or above .500 for the season.

Anybody's Ballgame

Iowa and Michigan picked up their third Big Ten wins of the season on Sunday, guaranteeing for the second straight year that every Big Ten team will finish with at least three wins. Prior to last season, the last time the feat had been accomplished was in 2002-03. Including this year, only eight times in the history of Big Ten women's basketball have all conference squads posted at least three Big Ten victories. Only once, in 1988-89, have all teams had at least four wins in Big Ten play.

Knocking 'Em Down

With Purdue's 63-61 win over No. 4 Ohio State on Monday, the Boilermakers became the eighth Big Ten team to post at least one victory against a top-25 opponent. Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin lead the conference with 2-1 records against ranked opposition, while Michigan State is 2-2. Indiana, Michigan and Northwestern each have one win against top-25 foes.

Big Ten Report Card

The Big Ten continues to boast highly ranked teams in the NCAA RPI report, led by No. 8 Ohio State. Followed by No. 17 Michigan State, No. 21 Wisconsin, No. 34 Penn State and No. 35 Illinois, 45 percent of Big Ten teams are within the RPI's top 35, which is the second-highest percentage among all conferences (Big 12). No. 43 Michigan makes the Big Ten one of three conferences (ACC and Big 12) with over half its teams ranking in the top 50. The Big Ten is also just one of three conferences (ACC and Big 12) with all its teams ranking among the RPI's top 105.

Welcome to the Club

Illinois' **Lacey Simpson** and Northwestern's **Amy Jaeschke** became the eighth and ninth active Big Ten players to reach the 1,000 career points milestone on Thursday. Purdue's **FahKara Malone** looks to be the next conference player to crack the plateau, needing just 15 points for 1,000.

Sounding Like a Broken Record

Several records fell last week, with many more looking to fall in the near future. On Thursday, Illinois' **Jenna Smith**, already her program's leading rebounder, became the top rebounder in Illinois men's or women's basketball history, pulling down 12 boards. With 10 more on Sunday, Smith moved into eighth on the Big Ten's career rebounding list, currently with 1,037. On Sunday, Northwestern's **Amy Jaeschke** blocked six shots to become her program's all-time leader, currently with 221. She now ranks 10th all-time in conference annals. Purdue's **FahKara Malone** needs just 11 steals to break her school's record, currently with 317, ranking 10th in Big Ten history. Michigan State's **Allyssa DeHaan** is just 17 blocks away from tying the NCAA's all-time record, currently with 463.

Double Trouble

Illinois senior **Jenna Smith** and Ohio State junior **Jantel Lavender** are two of just four players in NCAA Division I to rank in the nation's top 20 in points and rebounds per game. Smith is 13th in boards (10.9 rpg) and 19th in points (19.3 ppg), while Lavender is 11th in scoring (21.1 ppg) and 20th on the glass (10.3 rpg). Smith is also second in the country with 13 double-doubles, and Lavender is tied for third with 12. Lavender is the Big Ten's active career double-doubles leader, with 49, while Smith surpassed her school's career double-doubles record earlier this season and currently has 45.

Still Streaking

Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender** continues to claim the longest double-digit scoring streak in the nation. The junior tallied 17 points against Purdue on Monday, increasing her streak to 88 games, which spans the entire length of her career. Penn State's **Tyra Grant** boasts the second-longest active streak in the conference, having posted double-digits in her last 31 straight games, dating back to last season, most recently with a 15-point performance against Illinois on Sunday.

Neighborhood Watch Program

Six Big Ten players earned spots on the Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List. Illinois' **Jenna Smith**, Michigan State's **Allyssa DeHaan**, Northwestern's **Amy Jaeschke**, Ohio State's **Samantha Prahalis** and **Jantel Lavender** and Penn State's **Tyra Grant** are in contention for the trophy, which is presented annually to college basketball's Player of the Year.

Wooden is Watching

The Big Ten placed five players on the 2009-10 John R. Wooden Award Women's Preseason Top 30 List, leading all conferences. Preseason candidates from the Big Ten included Illinois senior **Jenna Smith**, Michigan State senior **Allyssa DeHaan**, Ohio State junior **Jantel Lavender** and sophomore **Samantha Prahalis** and Penn State senior **Tyra Grant**. OSU was one of just four schools with multiple players on the list, and Prahalis was the only sophomore to make the cut. DeHaan and Lavender both earned spots on the Midseason Top 20 List, released on Jan. 13.

Wade For Me

Illinois' **Jenna Smith**, Michigan State's **Allyssa DeHaan** and Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender** and **Samantha Prahalis** were also on the 25-player 2009-10 preseason "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year. With four selections, the Big Ten is tied with the ACC, Big East and Pac-10 for tops among all conferences. The Buckeyes are one of three schools with multiple players on the list, and Prahalis is one of just two sophomores to be named.

Stay Classy

Illinois' **Jenna Smith**, Michigan State's **Allyssa DeHaan** and Penn State's **Tyra Grant** are candidates for the 2009-10 Lowes Senior CLASS Award. Student-athletes eligible for the award must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition.

Big Ten women's basketball will once again experience vast national television coverage, with nearly 90 percent of home games set to be broadcast on the Big Ten Network, www.BigTenNetwork.com, ESPN2 or CBS Sports this season. In addition to its linear network package, www.BigTenNetwork.com will stream additional games that will be produced in HD-quality.

Back Home Again...

Big Ten women's basketball will once again return to the city of Indianapolis and Consco Fieldhouse for the 2010 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament. The 2010 event marks the third of a five-year agreement that places both the men's and women's tournaments in the Circle City. This year's tournament will be the ninth consecutive and 15th overall in Indianapolis and will be held on four consecutive days beginning Thursday, March 4. The championship game will be played Sunday, March 7.

Deep in the Heart of Texas

Big Ten women's basketball has its sights set on San Antonio, Texas, during the 2009-10 season as the 2010 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held April 4 and 6 at the Alamodome. The conference has sent five teams to the past 11 Final Fours, including two in the last six seasons. The 2010 championship event will be hosted by the University of Texas at San Antonio.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Amy Jaeschke, Northwestern Jr., C, 6-5, Wilmette, Ill./New Trier

Jaeschke takes home her second Player of the Week honor this season after having one of the biggest weeks of her career. The junior recorded her 1,000th career point against Indiana on Thursday before becoming her school's all-time leading blocker on Sunday at Iowa. Jaeschke scored 17 points against the Hoosiers, becoming the ninth active Big Ten player to eclipse the 1,000 career points plateau. She also pulled down nine boards, blocked four shots, dished out three assists and had one steal. On Sunday, Jaeschke set a season-high with 30 points while shooting 73.3 percent from the floor, also recording eight rebounds, three assists and six blocks. With her second swat of the contest, she became Northwestern's all-time blocked shots leader. For the week, the Wilmette, Ill., native averaged 23.5 points on 63.3 percent shooting, 8.5 rebounds, 5.0 blocks and 3.0 assists.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Jaime Printy, Iowa**G, 5-11, Marion, Iowa/Linn-Mar**

Printy earns her third Freshman of the Week award after leading the Hawkeyes to a pair of wins last week, on the road against Illinois and at home versus Northwestern. The freshman averaged 22.5 points, 2.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 steals per game as the Hawkeyes climbed back to .500 overall. Against the Illini on Thursday, Printy tallied a team-high 22 points, including a perfect 8-for-8 mark from the free-throw line, also with four boards, four assists and a pair of steals. On Sunday against the Wildcats, she again led her team with 23 points, shooting 60 percent from the field. Printy paces all Big Ten freshmen in scoring, currently averaging 14.9 points per game.

BIG TEN COACHES CORNER

Young at Heart

For the first time in over a decade, the Big Ten welcomes back each of its 11 coaches from the previous season. Prior to this year's campaign, the Big Ten has not seen its entire coaching class return in subsequent seasons since 1998-99. Since that time, the Big Ten has witnessed 19 coaching changes, including five in the past two years. Last year, Northwestern welcomed the conference's newest coach, **Joe McKeown**, while in 2007-08, Illinois, Michigan, Michigan State and Penn State all brought in new mentors. Overall, seven of the conference's coaches have three years or less of experience at their institution, while no Big Ten mentor has coached at his or her school for more than nine full seasons. Iowa's **Lisa Bluder** is the dean of the Big Ten coaches, entering her 10th season with the Hawkeyes. Minnesota's **Pam Borton** (7), Ohio State's **Jim Foster** (7) and Wisconsin's **Lisa Stone** (6) are the only other Big Ten coaches with more than five years experience at their current institution.

Join the Club

The Big Ten boasts several of the nation's top coaches with four mentors claiming over 500 career wins. Ohio State's **Jim Foster** has 705 victories and a .720 career winning percentage in his tenure, including 201 wins and an .804 winning average with the Buckeyes. Iowa's **Lisa Bluder** owns 535 career triumphs, including 179 at the helm of the Hawkeyes. Michigan's **Kevin Borseth** has tallied 546 victories in his career, while Northwestern's **Joe McKeown** has an overall total of 528 wins. Wisconsin's **Lisa Stone** looks to be the next Big Ten coach to crack the 500-wins mark, currently with 481 to her name. In addition, three mentors have 200 or more career victories as Michigan State's **Suzy Merchant** has 259 Minnesota's **Pam Borton** has 232 and Purdue's **Sharon Versyp** has 202 in her tenure.
