### BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

#### Still Streaking

With a win over Iowa on Sunday, Indiana extended its winning streak to nine games, marking the program's longest since the 1998-99 season. The streak is also tied for ninth in the NCAA among active streaks this year. The win over the Hawkeyes also gave the Hoosiers their first 3-0 Big Ten start since 2000-01. Riding a streak of their own, the Ohio State Buckeyes are winners of their last six, which is tied for the 12th longest active streak in the NCAA. OSU is off to a 3-0 start in conference play for the first time since 2006-07, when the team opened the Big Ten slate 13-0.

#### Perfect 10s

With wins on Saturday and Sunday respectively, Minnesota and Indiana became the latest Big Ten teams to reach 10 wins on the season, joining Ohio State (12-2) and Wisconsin (12-3). The Golden Gophers' triumph came at Illinois in a 52-48 decision, marking Minnesota's first game of the season that was decided by margin of five points or fewer. The Hoosiers earned a victory at home against Iowa in a 76-54 contest, improving their record to 4-0 in games decided by 21 points or more. Four Big Ten teams boasted 10 or more wins at this same point last season, but none of those teams claimed 12 wins.

#### Join the Club

Indiana senior **Whitney Thomas** became the 20th player in Indiana women's basketball history to reach the 1,000 career points milestone when she dropped 16 against Iowa on Sunday. With 918 career rebounds to her name, she is just 82 boards away from becoming the second ever Hoosier with 1,000 career points and rebounds. Thomas is one of nine active Big Ten players with 1,000 or more career points and one of five to reach the milestone during the 2008-09 campaign.

#### 'Cats are Wild

With a win over Wisconsin, who was receiving votes in the AP and coaches polls, Northwestern recorded its fifth win of the year, tying its mark for the entire 2007-08 season. Behind the guidance of first-year head coach **Joe McKeown**, the Wildcats are averaging over seven points more per game, are shooting at a percentage of .071 higher and are allowing opponents three fewer points per game than the 2007-08 Wildcats did at the end of last season.

## BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

**Going Out with a Bang**

Purdue closed out the Big Ten's non-conference season with a convincing 66-55 win over No. 8/4 Texas on Monday in Mackey Arena. The Big Ten ends the early-season schedule with a 75-43 record (.636) over non-conference opponents, including a 6-17 mark against ranked teams. The Big Ten went 3-10 against top-10 teams, with each of those wins coming by an unranked Big Ten squad. Five different conference teams posted at least one win over a ranked non-conference opponent, including Michigan who recorded victories over then-No. 12/13 Vanderbilt and then-No. 8/8 Notre Dame.

**On the Edge**

A pair of Big Ten players are on the verge of reaching career milestones as Indiana's **Kim Roberson** is one swipe away from joining the Big Ten's 200 career steals club, and Penn State's **Brianne O'Rourke** is one helper away from becoming a member of the conference's 500 career assists club. Roberson looks to become the Big Ten's sixth active player with 200 or more steals, while O'Rourke would become the only active conference player with 500 career assists. O'Rourke would become just the 22nd all-time member of the club and the fourth Lady Lion on the list.

**Keeping the Pace**

Ohio State sophomore **Jantel Lavender** has the chance to become the quickest Ohio State women's basketball player to reach 1,000 career points. Lavender has tallied 856 points in 45 career games with a season average of 22.1 points per game. At that current pace, Lavender would tie former Buckeye great Katie Smith, who needed 52 games to reach the milestone. Other top Buckeyes on the list include Frani Washington (56 games) and Jessica Davenport (63). In her 45 career games, Lavender has never scored less than 10 points in a game, and has recorded 20 or more points in a game on 24 occasions, including 11 games this season.

**Avoiding the Sophomore Slump**

Sophomores rank among the Big Ten's best in several different statistical categories, including scoring, rebounding, field-goal percentage and blocked shots. Leading the way is Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender**, who is first in points (22.1 ppg) and boards (11.1 rpg). At this point in her freshman season, the Buckeye was averaging 16.3 points and 9.6 rebounds per contest. Northwestern's **Amy Jaeschke** ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 16.9 ppg and third with 9.6 rpg, compared to this point last season when she was averaging 9.7 points and 6.0 boards per game. Jaeschke has also bumped up her shooting percentage from .385 to .505 this year, while her blocked shots total has increased from 1.57 to 3.00. Other sophomores among the Big Ten's top 10 leaders are Wisconsin's **Alyssa Karel** (6th, 14.3 ppg), Iowa's **Kachine Alexander** (8th, 7.7 rpg), Northwestern's **Meshia Reed** (T-6th, .500 FG%), Indiana's **Brittney Thomas** (9th, 3.31 apg), Michigan State's **Kalisha Keane** (8th, 2.07 spg) and Penn State's **Janessa Wolff** (6th, 1.64 bpg).

**Four Named to Naismith Watch List**

Four Big Ten women's basketball players were named to the Naismith Trophy early season watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Dec. 19. Illinois' **Jenna Smith**, Michigan State's **Allyssa DeHaan**, Northwestern's **Amy Jaeschke** and Ohio State's **Jantel Lavender** are among the 50-member list currently in the running for one of college basketball's most prestigious awards. Jaeschke and Lavender are two of just eight sophomores to make the cut.

**Coming to a TV Near You**

Big Ten women's basketball teams will experience a record amount of exposure with 119 games set to be broadcast nationally during the regular season. The Big Ten Network will air 55 games on its linear channel and an additional 56 contests on BigTenNetwork.com. All internet games will be streamed live and free of charge. During the 2008-09 season, Big Ten women's basketball can also be found on CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU. In addition, for the second time in history, all 10 games of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will reach a live national audience. The Big Ten Network is set to broadcast the first nine games of the event, while ESPN2 will cover the championship game.

**Big Ten Tournament Returns to Indy**

The conference will once again return to Indianapolis for the 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament. 2009 marks the second of a five-year agreement that places both the men's and women's tournaments in the Circle City. This year's tournament will be the eighth straight and 14th overall in Indianapolis and will be held on four consecutive days, March 5-8.

**More than Just a Game**

The 2009 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament will feature more than just exciting on-court action. Events surrounding the tournament include the annual girls' basketball youth clinic, fan pep rallies and the Big Ten's annual event to promote and support cancer awareness, held during the semifinal games. Following last year's event, the Big Ten donated over \$10,000 to the Indianapolis affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure.

**Three Big Ten Teams to Host NCAA Action**

Iowa's Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Michigan State's Breslin Center and Ohio State's Nationwide Arena will serve as three of the 16 host sites for the first and second rounds of the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, held March 21-24, 2009. Columbus, Ohio, will welcome four teams on March 21 and 23, while Iowa City, Iowa, and East Lansing, Mich., will host four teams each on March 22 and 24.

**Big Ten Begins March to the Arch in 2009**

Big Ten women's basketball will march toward the Arch during the 2008-09 season as the 2009 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held April 5 and 7 at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis. The conference has sent five teams to the past 10 Final Fours, including two in the last five seasons. The 2009 championship event is hosted by the Missouri Valley Conference.

**Get to Know Her**

The Big Ten announced its latest public service effort for women's basketball at Basketball Media Day on Oct. 26. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is a fully integrated effort that allows fans to see the non-basketball sides of their favorite student-athletes via multimedia tools and on-campus functions. The *Get to Know Her* campaign is funded in-part by the NCAA as part of a grant program that is designed to foster the growth of women's basketball on NCAA member campuses and within NCAA member conferences.

**Amy Jaeschke, Northwestern So., C, 6-5, Wilmette, Ill. / New Trier**  
Sophomore Amy Jaeschke brings Player of the Week honors to Northwestern for the first time in 12 seasons after spearheading two impressive Wildcat performances last week against No. 17 Ohio State and Wisconsin. Northwestern played the

Buckeyes to within nine points, primarily because of Jaeschke's defensive effort against last year's Big Ten Player of the Year Jantel Lavender. Jaeschke limited Lavender to 15 points and just nine rebounds; the second time this year the sophomore has not recorded a double-double. In addition to her defensive efforts, Jaeschke also turned in a game-high 24 points and five boards in 40 minutes of action. The Wilmette, Ill., native was 6-of-7 (.857) from the charity stripe and 9-of-18 (.500) from the field. In the win against Wisconsin on Sunday, Jaeschke netted 12 points while adding four rebounds and four blocks. Defensively, she held UW's leading rebounder, Lin Zastrow, to just three boards and helped limit the Badger offense to only 17 second-half points. Jaeschke is now averaging 16.9 points and 9.6 rebounds per game, both of which are Wildcat bests.

**Danielle Campbell, Purdue Sr., C, 6-4, Chicago, Ill. / Whitney Young**  
Purdue senior Danielle Campbell earns her second consecutive weekly laurel after posting a season-high 16 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Boilermakers in an upset over No. 8/4 Texas, 66-55, in

Mackey Arena on Monday. The performance marks Campbell's third double-double of the season and the ninth of her career. The Chicago native was 4-of-10 (.400) from the field and an unblemished 8-of-8 from the foul line. She also contributed four assists, three blocks and two steals in the victory. In the narrow overtime loss to Michigan State on New Year's Day, Campbell recorded team-highs of 15 points and eight rebounds, five of which were on the offensive end. She was 7-of-14 (.500) from the field and posted two blocks and two steals in 39 minutes of play. In the two-game stretch Campbell netted 9-of-9 free throws and moved into a tie for 14th for career free throws made at Purdue. The weekly award is the second of Campbell's career and the fourth for Purdue this season.

**Veteran McKeown Joins Crop of Young Coaches**

When Joe McKeown signed on to become the sixth head coach in Northwestern women's basketball history, he joined a group of conference coaches that has spent an average of three years at their respective institutions. Among the group of 11 mentors, seven have been at their schools less than three years, and five have been at their institution for one year or less. Iowa's Lisa Bluder is the dean of the Big Ten coaches with eight years at the helm of the Hawkeye program. **Big Ten Mentors Reaching Major Milestones**

Several Big Ten head coaches achieved major milestones in 2007-08, including Ohio State's Jim Foster who became just the 13th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 650 career wins on Jan. 28. On Feb. 10, Iowa's Lisa Bluder became the third active Big Ten coach to reach 500 career wins, joining Foster and Michigan's Kevin Borseth. Minnesota's Pam Borton became the sixth active conference mentor to reach 200 career victories on Feb. 28, joining Bluder, Borseth, Foster, Michigan State's Suzy Merchant and Wisconsin's Lisa Stone. Already during the 2008-09 campaign, Bluder won her 150th game at Iowa with a 83-58 win over Boston, Stone won her 450th career game with a 47-45 victory against Villanova, and Indiana's Felisha Legette-Jack won her 100th career game at Michigan State in a 62-48 decision.
