BIG TEN GYMNAST OF THE WEEK

Lindsey Bruck, Michigan
 Jr., Marietta, N.Y./Marcellus

Bruck claims Gymnast of the Week honors after tallying her 11th straight regular-season all-around score of 39.000 or better, while also helping Michigan rally to tie No. 6 Nebraska last weekend. She took third in the all-around with a score of 39.175. With Michigan struggling on beam in the final rotation, Bruck nailed the second-best score of the night (9.000) in the anchor spot to guarantee the Wolverines a strong finish. She also tied for seventh in the vault (9.725) and floor (9.750) events. The Marietta, N.Y. native earns her second career weekly accolade as she was also honored on Feb. 9, 2005.

2006 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2006 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championships will be held on the campus of Michigan State University on March 25.



Last year, Michigan extended its string of conference dominance to seven consecutive seasons, as the Wolverines won the 2005 Big Ten Championships. Michigan has now won 13 of the past 14 league titles, as the only other program to claim a league crown in that time span was Minnesota in 1998.

BIG TEN NOTES

Big Ten Success: The Big Ten has recorded nine top-10 team finishes in the last six years of the NCAA Championships. Last year, two league programs earned a spot in the 12-team field of the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships for the fourth straight season as Michigan won the South Central Regional and Penn State placed second in the West Regional. The Wolverines, collected their 13th straight berth in the NCAA Championships and 14th appearance overall to lead all league schools. Penn State advanced to its first NCAA Championships since the 2000 season.
