## 2007 BIG TEN WOMEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIP

The University of Minnesota is set to play host to the 2007 Big Ten Women's Tennis Championship this weekend, with competition beginning on Thursday, April 26 and continuing through Sunday, April 29.

Four schools will begin championship play on Thursday at 9 a.m., with No. 8 Penn State taking on No. 9 Michigan State and No. 6 Purdue battling No. 11 Wisconsin. Thursday afternoon competition will see No. 7 Minnesota pitted against No. 10 Illinois, beginning at 3 p.m.

The five highest seeds have earned first-round byes, and will begin their respective campaigns on Friday. No. 1 Northwestern, No. 2 Indiana and No. 3 Michigan will take on the winners of Thursday's matchups. Additionally, No. 4 Iowa and No. 5 Ohio State will do battle in the other quarterfinal match.

Northwestern, currently ranked 5th by the ITA, will be vying for its ninth-consecutive Big Ten Championship and will be led by Georgia Rose and Samantha Murray. The two are ranked 13th and 39th, respectively, by ITA in singles action. In addition, Rose and partner Alexis Prousis sit 10th-nationally in No. 1 doubles.

Meanwhile, Michigan's No. 1, 2 and 3 singles players of Chisako Sugiyama, Jenny Kuehn and Kara Delicata have posted only three losses in the conference with a combined singles record of 27-3. In all, eight Big Ten athletes rank in the top-125 singles, four pairs rank in the top-60 doubles and five teams land in the top-50 nationally according to the FILA Rankings.

In last year's championship, third-seeded Michigan made yet another run into the final match by getting through Wisconsin in the quarterfinals and No. 2 Iowa in the semifinals. The Wolverines were stopped short once again by the Wildcats, who took home the hardware for the eighth-consecutive year.
