Radio/Video: All six matches will be streamed live on fightingillini.com. Illinois' Friday and Saturday matches will be live on WDWS (AM 1400). Both Saturday Illinois matches can be heard live on WDAN (AM 1490). Dave Loane and Mike Trame have the call.

Tournament history: Illinois is hosting the Illini Classic for the 27th straight year. Illinois has won 19 of the previous 26 tournaments, including the last four in a row. BYU won the 1987 tournament, defeating Illinois 3-1 in the title match.

Illinois vs. the field: Illinois is 1-0 all-time vs. South Carolina, having defeated the Gamecocks 15-3, 15-2, 15-2 at the Florida Invitational on Sept. 5, 1986. The Illini are 1-2 all-time vs. BYU, with the Cougars claiming the Illini Classic with a 15-6, 15-8, 7-15, 15-9 win over Illinois in 1987 and a 15-10, 15-13, 8-15, 13-15, 16-14 victory in Provo, Utah, in 1988. The Illini won the most recent meeting at BYU in 2002 (32-30, 30-27, 30-26). Illinois and MTSU are meeting for the first time.

DeBruler looks for another all-tourney spot:

Laura DeBruler has been named to the all-tournament team at the State Farm Illini Classic each of the past three seasons. She is one of seven players to earn that distinction three times, but no one has been named to that team four times. Other players with three Illini Classic all-tournament honors are Bridget Boyle (1987, '88, '89), Vicki Brown (2005, '06, '07), Mary Eggers (1985, '86, '87), Lorna Henderson (1989, '90, '91), Disa Johnson (1984, '85, '86) and Tracey Marsall (1996, '97, and '98). DeBruler was MVP of last year's tourney.

Illini has No. 6 Pre-Season ranking:

Illinois is ranked sixth in the AVCA Preseason rankings. The preseason ranking is the highest for Illinois since being ranked sixth to start the 1993 season. The Illini began and ended last season No. 10 in the poll and this year marks the first time since 1989 and 1990 that Illinois has started consecutive years ranked in the top 10.

The Illini will have a chance to test their ranking in September, which includes matches against No. 1 Penn State (Sept. 24 in Huff Hall) and at No. 2 Nebraska (Sept. 11) and No. 3 Texas (Sept. 3).

Illinois has two matches apiece against Big Ten rivals Minnesota, who is tied with Illinois at No. 6, and Michigan, who checks in at No. 12. Dayton, who is slotted 21st, faces the Illini in Lincoln, Neb., on Sept. 10. Other opponents who received votes include Ohio State, Cincinnati, Michigan State and Wisconsin.

Stuff Huff reaches fifth birthday: One of the fall traditions continues Friday night in the annual Stuff Huff match. Inspired by Illinois' five-set victory over USC in 2004, the Illini marketing department began a promotion call Stuff Huff in 2006. It is designed to provide a capacity or near capacity crowd for an electric atmosphere in the home opener. The first event drew 3,129 fans as Illinois defeated Illinois State.

The promotion especially targets students. In that match in 2006, over 1,600 students used their student ID to enter the gate. The first 1,000 students will be treated to food at a cookout in the grass field south of the building. Bruce Weber and members of the Illini men's basketball team will be involved with the cookout then help jam Huff Hall.

A LOOK BACK

The 2009 season saw continued success for Illinois volleyball. Kevin Hambly, who served as an assistant for five years at Illinois following a stint with the U.S. Olympic team, posted a 26-6 final record in his first season as head coach. In fact, only four teams in school history posted a better winning percentage. The Illini finished in sole possession of second place in the Big Ten, posting a 16-4 conference mark, and reached the Sweet 16 for the second year in a row and 11th time overall.

Not only that, Illinois, emerged as a top-five team in the country, earning that seed overall in the NCAA Tournament while spending eight straight weeks in the top 10 in the AVCA coaches' poll. Illinois finished the year at No. 10.

Illinois enjoyed that success in a conference ranked No. 2 in the RPI and which advanced three teams to the Elite Eight and two to the Final Four. In fact, of the Illini's six losses, four came to eventual Final Four teams and another to an Elite Eight team. The Illini posted five victories over ranked opponents and twice defeated the No. 6 ranked team in the country, a five-set thriller at Michigan and a three-set sweep of Minnesota, a Final Four team, at Assembly Hall.

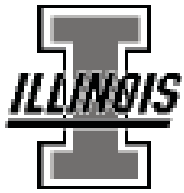

Illinois picked second in the Big Ten; four Illini named Preseason All-Big Ten:

Illinois, who returns four All-Americans including first team selection outside hitter Laura DeBruler from a team that finished second in the Big Ten in 2009, is picked to finish second again by the conference coaches.

Three-time defending national champion Penn State, who rides a 65-match Big Ten winning streak and an NCAA record 102-match overall win streak into the season, is the coaches' pick to win the league. The Nittany Lions open the Big Ten season at Illinois on Sept. 24. Final Four qualifier Minnesota is picked third followed by Ohio State, Michigan and Michigan State.

Illinois boasts a league best four players on the Preseason All-Big Ten team – DeBruler, who was a unanimous selection, senior middle blocker Johannah Bangert, senior setter Hillary Haen and junior outside hitter Michelle Bartsch. All four were All-Americans a year ago.

Game Time Change: The final home match of the season vs. Minnesota on Nov. 20 has been moved to 4:30 pm to accommodate live television from the Big Ten Network.

More Television Information: Illinois will appear on national television at least six times in 2010 beginning with the home Big Ten opener against Penn State. That match will be shown tape delayed on the Big Ten Network on Sept. 28 at 10 am Central Time. The Illini will also make live appearances on the network at Wisconsin (Sept. 29) and Penn State (Nov. 13) and at home vs. Wisconsin (Nov. 3) and Minnesota (Nov. 20). The Oct. 22 match at Minnesota will be show tape delayed on the ESPN2 on Sunday, Oct. 24.

Hambly faces former school:

Illinois head coach Kevin Hambly played for BYU from 1992-95, earning two All-America honors and two all-conference accolades.

Hambly had a career .323 attack percentage, including a .348 mark as a senior and tallied 1,222 kills, 458 digs and 533 blocks as a Cougar.

Hambly played professionally then joined the USA Volleyball coaching staff before finishing his degree at Illinois in 2006.

Ward gives Illinois five top-30 players:

Colleen Ward transfers to Illinois this season after playing two years at the University of Florida. Ward was the No. 7 ranked player nationally in the 2007 signing class. Michelle Bartsch was ranked No. 16. Combined with Anna Dorn, who was No. 6 in this year's class; Hillary Haen, who No. 23 in the 2006 class and Laura DeBruler, who ranked No. 30 in that class, give Illinois five top-30 players on the roster.

Bonilla gets start at libero:

Jennifer Bonilla becomes just the fourth Illinois opening night starter at libero, joining Lauren Harks, Beth Vrdsky and Ashley Edinger. Edinger also started as a freshman. Rachel Feldman started at libero for the final six weeks of the 2009 season.

• Fellow freshman Jazmine Orozco is expected to share time with Colleen Ward at the second outside hitter spot.

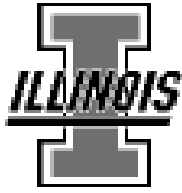

DeBruler, Bangert close in on career marks

Outside hitter Laura DeBruler and middle blocker Johannah Bangert are closing in on Illinois career records for kills and blocks, respectively. With 1,668 career kills, DeBruler is fourth on the all-time list, just 93 off the all-time mark held by Mary Eggers (1,761). DeBruler could pass both Mary Coleman (1,707) and Nancy Brookhart (1,669) on the list and move into second this weekend.

• Bangert enters the season fifth on the all-time blocks list with 492, 70 shy of Eggers' mark of 562. With just six blocks this weekend, Bangert could move into fourth on the list.

• Both records have been in the books for 22 years.

Bangert could set national standard for blocks

The NCAA began keeping season blocking stats in 1994. Since then only two players have led the country in blocks more than once -- Nebraska's Melissa Elmer (2004 and 2005) and Illinois' Johannah Bangert (2008 and 2009). In fact, Bangert is the only Big Ten player to lead the nation in blocks. Bangert averaged 1.60 and 1.58 blocks per set the last two seasons, respectively.

STATE FARM ILLINI CLASSIC

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE ILLINI CLASSIC

The four-team Illini Classic began in 1984, featuring Missouri, Northern Illinois, Notre Dame and the host Fighting Illini. Missouri won the inaugural round-robin tournament with a perfect 6-0 record.

In 1985, Illinois defeated New Mexico State, 3-0, to win its first Classic title. In 1986, No. 4 San Jose State ended a 15-match home winning streak for the Illini, winning 3-1.

In 1987, No. 4 Brigham Young defeated No. 6 Illinois, 3-1, in the title match featuring two of the nation's top returning teams.

The Fighting Illini captured the 1988 and 1989 Classic titles, defeating Nebraska and Pittsburgh. In 1990, No. 6 Stanford pulled off a stunning comeback to defeat the Illini in the title match. In 1991, Illinois scored the last six points in the decisive fifth game, stunning No. 19 Georgia to win the championship.

In 1992, the Classic featured the "Big Eight-Big Ten Challenge" pitting No. 12 Illinois and No. 14 Ohio State against No. 5 Nebraska and No. 16 Colorado. Illinois captured the 1995 title by defeating current Illinois coach Don Hardin's Louisville Cardinals in the championship match. That began a winning streak of consecutive tournament titles for the Illini, which stood at six until Florida ended the streak by claiming the 2001 title.

In one of the biggest regular season victories in school history, the Illini defeated #1 USC, ending the Women of Troy's then NCAA record 52-game winning streak in the 2004 finals. The Illini rallied from 2-1 down to claim the victory in front of more than 3,000 fans at Huff Hall. The "Stuff Huff" promotion produced 3,219 fans for the tournament and season opener between Illinois and Illinois State. The Illini claimed their 18th championship with a victory over No. 11 Oregon in dramatic fashion in 2008 and went 3-0 for the title in 2009.
