2007 SEASON IN REVIEW

Penn State captured the Big Ten Conference's second NCAA title with a thrilling five-game victory over top-seeded Stanford on Dec. 15 at ARCO Arena in Sacramento, Calif. The Nittany Lions swept every match until the final when they went up 2-0 on the Cardinal before dropping the next two sets. In the decisive Game 5, Penn State went on a 7-0 run to pull away at 10-4 before sealing the victory at 15-8. The title marked the second in Penn State and Big Ten history as the Nittany Lions also took home the trophy in 1999.

PSU sophomore outside hitter **Megan Hodge** was named the Most Outstanding Player of the National Championship after recording a season-high 26 kills against Stanford. As a team, the Nittany Lions shattered the NCAA Tournament record for team hitting percentage with a .424 clip, besting the previous mark of .369 set in 1995 by Long Beach State.

Penn State was one of six Big Ten teams to earn a bid into the 2007 championship bracket, joining **Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Purdue and Wisconsin**. With six squads in, the Big Ten tied with the Big 12 and Pac-10 for the largest conference representation in the championship.

Three Big Ten teams advanced to the regional rounds as Michigan defeated Miami (Ohio) and then-No. 21 Colorado State in Ann Arbor; Michigan State downed Kentucky and then-No. 15 Dayton on the Flyers' home court; and Penn State made quick work of Siena and Albany (N.Y.) at Rec Hall. In regional action, the Nittany Lions swept past the 19th-ranked Wolverines before blowing by No. 17 BYU in University Park. In the Madison, Wis., Regional, Michigan State met up with then-No. 2 Nebraska and forced the Huskers to five games before slipping in the final stanza, 15-9.

Penn State became one of just two teams (Stanford) to earn a berth into all 27 NCAA Volleyball

Championships after winning its Big Ten record fifth-consecutive conference title. With a 20-0 Big Ten record, the 2007 Nittany Lions became just the seventh team since double round-robin play began in 1985 to finish the conference schedule undefeated.

Wisconsin finished second in the conference standings with a 17-3 mark and earned the right to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Championship. The Badgers finished with a 26-5 overall record and earned a No. 14 final ranking in the coaches' poll.

Minnesota and Purdue tied for third in the conference with identical 11-9 Big Ten records. The Gophers finished with an overall mark of 18-13, while the Boilermakers ended at 19-14 and received votes in the final coaches' poll.

Michigan and Michigan State finished tied for fifth in the conference with 10-10 marks in Big Ten play. The Wolverines went undefeated in early season non-conference action to finish with a 24-11 overall record with a No. 19 final ranking, earning the right to host NCAA first- and second-round action. The Spartans ended the year with a 21-14 mark and the No. 20 spot in the final poll.

The Big Ten placed 11 student-athletes on the AVCA's All-America teams, including first-team selections **Nicole Fawcett**, Big Ten Player of the Year **Christa Harmotto** and **Megan Hodge** of Penn State. Nittany Lion setter **Alisha Glass** and Wisconsin sophomore **Brittney Dolgner** were named to the second team, while Badger senior **Taylor Reineke** and Michigan State's **Ashley Schatzle** earned spots on the third team. Michigan's **Katie Bruzdinski** and **Lexi Zimmerman**, Purdue's **Stephanie Lynch** and Wisconsin's **Jackie Simpson** earned honorable mention recognition. Additionally, Penn State's **Russ Rose** was named the AVCA National Coach of the Year.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

• The **Big Ten** boasts two NCAA Championships, both of which have been won by **Penn State**. The Nittany Lions earned the conference's first national title in 1999 before taking home their second trophy in 2007.

• **Penn State** and 2007 national runner-up Stanford are the only two teams to have earned berths into all 27 NCAA Volleyball Championships.

• **Penn State** was the only team to advance to the 2007 national semifinals without dropping a single game. The Nittany Lions finished the national bracket with a 15-2 record in games played.

• Nittany Lion sophomore **Megan Hodge** was named the NCAA Championship's Most Outstanding Player after putting down a match-high 26 kills in the title game against Stanford. Hodge's honor marks the fourth for the Big Ten and for PSU as Terri Zemaitis was named MOP in 1997 and Lauren Cacciamani received the honors in 1998 and 1999.



NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

• Penn State's **Megan Hodge, Alisha Glass, Christa Harmotto** and **Nicole Fawcett** were named to the NCAA Championship All-Tournament team, marking the first time in Big Ten and PSU history that four players earned the honor.

• Michigan State seniors **Katie Johnson** and **Ashley Schatzle** were named to the Madison, Wis., Regional All-Tournament team, becoming the first Spartans to ever take home the accolades.

• Penn State's **Arielle Wilson** was named the Most Outstanding Player of the University Park, Pa., Regional and was joined by **Nicole Fawcett** and **Christa Harmotto** on the region's All-Tournament team.

• The **Big Ten** sent six teams to the NCAA Championship, which tied the Big 12 and the Pac-10 for the nation's largest conference representation.

• This season marked the 13th time in conference history the **Big Ten** had six or more teams selected to the NCAA Championship. The conference sent a record eight teams to the NAAs in 1999 and 2002, boasted seven NCAA participants in 1995, 2003 and 2004 and 2006, and sent six squads in 1994, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2007. In the 27-year history of the event, the Big Ten has had five or more teams selected to the bracket on 17 occasions.

• Including 2007, the **Big Ten** has sent three or more teams to NCAA Regionals on 13 occasions, including each of the last six championships.

• The **Big Ten** holds an overall NCAA Championship record of 202-122 (.623), dating back to 1983. The conference has boasted a combined winning percentage of .600 or higher in 13 of the last 16 years and a .500 or better record in each of the last 17 tournaments. The Big Ten posted a 12-5 (.706) NCAA Championship record in 2007.

• The Big Ten's .706 winning percentage in the 2007 NCAA Championship bested the conference's previous record of .700, set in 2000.

• The **Big Ten** has recorded 10 or more wins in the last five NCAA Championships, including 2007, finishing with a 12-5 record. Overall, Big Ten squads have combined for 10 or more NCAA wins on 10 occasions, including each of the last five seasons.

• **Michigan, Penn State** and **Wisconsin** all served as hosts for first- and second-round competition. Penn State's Rec Hall and Wisconsin's UW Field House also played home to NCAA Regionals.

• Including 2007, six different Big Ten schools have combined to reach the national semifinals 14 times, including three schools making six total appearances in the championship game. Of the six squads selected to the 2007 bracket, four (**Michigan State, Minnesota, Penn State, Wisconsin**) have combined to reach the national semifinals on nine occasions with six championship game appearances.

NEWS & NOTES

Penn State Captures Fifth Straight Big Ten Title

Penn State became the first program in conference history to take home five straight Big Ten titles when it clinched the outright crown on Saturday, Nov. 17, with a sweep of Illinois. The Nittany Lions finished the conference schedule with perfect 20-0 record, becoming just the seventh squad since double round-robin play began in 1985 to finish the Big Ten slate undefeated.

Badgers Break Big Ten Attendance Record

Wisconsin shattered its own Big Ten Conference record for attendance, averaging 5,050 spectators per match. The Badgers set the previous Big Ten mark of 4,328 per match in 2006. Wisconsin also shattered the conference record for Big Ten matches, averaging 5,970 fans over 10

contests. The Badgers enjoyed their first ever sellout on Oct. 20 as they did their part to "Spike Cancer," raising \$5,000 for the Susan G. Komen for the Cure Madison affiliate.

Big Ten Coaches Reach Big Milestones

Illinois' **Don Hardin** became the newest member of the Big Ten coaches' 400 wins club with a victory over Iowa in the team's final match of the season. Hardin joined Iowa's **Cindy Fredrick**, Michigan State's **Cathy George**, Minnesota's **Mike Hebert**, Ohio State's **Jim Stone**, Penn State's **Russ Rose** and Wisconsin's **Pete Waite** as Big Ten coaches active in 2007 with 400 or more career wins. Also this season, Hebert became the first coach in history with 300 wins at two Big Ten schools, earning the mile-

stone at Minnesota on Nov. 17. Hebert also compiled over 300 wins with Illinois from 1983-95. Early this year, Rose became just the third Division I coach in history to reach 900 career wins as his Nittany Lions defeated Michigan State on Sept. 21. Iowa's Fredrick has retired her post on campus on Dec. 18.

Freshmen Make Immediate Impact

The Big Ten boasted several of the nation's best newcomers throughout the course of the season with multiple freshmen among NCAA's statistical leaders. Illinois' **Laura DeBruler** consistently ranked as the nation's top freshman in kills per game, ending the regular season with 4.89 per game in all matches played. DeBruler became just the fourth freshman in history to lead the Big Ten in that category, registering 4.98 per game in conference competition. Freshman of the Year **Arielle Wilson** from Penn State became just the second first-year player to lead the conference in blocks, averaging 1.78 stuffs per game in Big Ten action. Michigan State's **Lauren O'Reilly** and Michigan's **Lexi Zimmerman** consistently placed among the NCAA leaders in assists per game, finishing the conference season ranked second and third, respectively in the Big Ten. O'Reilly averaged 13.63 helpers per conference game, while Zimmerman averaged 13.16.

Conference Comes Up Big in Final RPI

The Big Ten placed five teams in the top 30 of the NCAA's final RPI report, led by top-10 teams No. 2 **Penn State** and No. 6 **Wisconsin**. The Nittany Lions and Badgers were followed by No. 20 **Purdue**, No. 21 **Michigan** and No. 29 **Michigan State**. With five teams in the top 30, the Big Ten is tied with the Pac-10 for the largest representation by any conference.

Harmotto Smashes Big Ten Record

Penn State's **Christa Harmotto**, the Big Ten Player of the Year, smashed the conference's record for hitting percentage with a .492 average in all games played. The mark bests the previous high of .455 set by Illinois' **Mary Eggers** in 1986.

Lions Lead Nation in Hitting

As a team, **Penn State** led all of NCAA Division I with a .350 hitting percentage. The Nittany Lions were the nation's hitting percentage champions in 2006, and also took home the stat crown in 1997, 1998 and 1999. The Lions are the only Big Ten team to ever finish first in the nation in the category.

Wack and Selsky Join Elite Digs Club

Wisconsin's **Jocelyn Wack** and Michigan's **Stesha Selsky** became the second and third players in Big Ten history to eclipse the 2,000 career digs milestone. Wack reached the mark on Oct. 27 while Selsky followed on Nov. 5. Wack and Selsky finished their careers ranked second and third respectively in all-time digs in the Big Ten, and each is the career record holder at her own school. Wack and Selsky follow only Minnesota's **Paula Gentil**, who recorded 2,791 career saves, in the conference records book. Wack ended her career with 2,182 total digs, while Selsky finished with 2,178.

Big Ten in the Polls

After winning the program's second NCAA Championship, **Penn State** ended the 2007 season at No. 1 in the AVCA Coaches Poll, marking the team's seventh straight week with the top billing. The Big Ten placed three other teams in the top 20 with **Wisconsin** at No. 14, **Michigan** at No. 19 and **Michigan State** at No. 20. The Wolverines' spot marks the first time the program has been ranked in the final poll of any season, while the Spartans' ranking is the team's highest final placement since 2001. **Purdue** received votes outside the top 25.

BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Two Big Ten Standouts Named National POW

Two Big Ten volleyball players were named the Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week this season. Penn State's **Megan Hodge** earned the first honor of her career on Sept. 10, while her teammate **Alisha Glass** earned her second career national award on Nov. 19.

Dieter Ties Freshman POW Record

Minnesota's **Brook Dieter** earned three Big Ten Player of the Week selections this season, tying her with Penn State's **Megan Hodge** (2006) and **Nicole Fawcett** (2005) and Ohio State's **Stacey Gordon** (2001) for the most POW selections in a freshman season.
