PENN STATE ADVANCES TO NATIONAL SEMIFINALS



Penn State swept through regionals last weekend to earn the program's sixth berth into the NCAA Semifinals. The Nittany Lions took down No. 19 Michigan, 3-0, on Friday night before making short work of No. 17 BYU on Saturday in a three-game sweep. Freshman middle hitter **Arielle Wilson** was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Regional Championship, while teammates **Nicole Fawcett** and **Christa Harmotto** joined her on the All-Regional Championship Team. With sweeps over Siena and Albany in the first and second rounds of NCAA competition, Penn State is the only team in this year's national semifinals to have advanced through the bracket without dropping a single game.

WHAT'S UP NEXT

Penn State will play 10th-seeded California in the second semifinal game on Thursday at 8 p.m. PT at ARCO Arena in Sacramento, Calif. This will mark the first-ever meeting between the Nittany Lions and Golden Bears.

With a win, Penn State would advance to take on the first semifinal game winner, either top-seeded Stanford or fifth-seeded USC. The Lions are 4-5 all-time against the Cardinal, including a 3-2 loss at the Yale Classic earlier this season. PSU is 1-2 all-time versus the Trojans, most recently earning a four-game win early in the 2005 season.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE SEMIFINALS

The Lions are making their sixth appearance in the national semifinals and their first since 1999 when they went on to win the NCAA Championship. Penn State has advanced to the title game in four of its five previous semifinal appearances for a 4-1 record in semifinal contests.

BIG TEN IN THE SEMIFINALS

Including this year's Penn State squad, six different Big Ten teams have combined to make 14 appearances in the national semifinals with six total berths into the NCAA Championship game. **Minnesota** was the last conference team to reach the semifinal round when it defeated USC in four games in 2004. The Golden Gophers then fell to Stanford in the title match.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE FINALS

Penn State has advanced to the NCAA Championship match on four occasions, most recently in 1999 when it won the national title in three games over Stanford. The Nittany Lions also reached the final match in 1998, but fell to Long Beach State in five, in 1997, but dropped the five-game decision to the Cardinal, and in 1993, but lost to Long Beach State in four.

BIG TEN IN THE FINALS

The Big Ten has made six appearances in the national championship contest, most recently in 2004 when Minnesota fell to Stanford. Penn State leads the Big Ten with four appearances in the final match, while Minnesota and Wisconsin each have one. Penn State remains the only conference team to have won an NCAA Volleyball Championship, taking home the trophy in 1999.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

- The **Big Ten** sent six teams to the NCAA Championship, which tied the Big 12 and the Pac-10 for the nation's largest conference representation.
- This season marked the 14th time in conference history the **Big Ten** had six or more teams selected to the NCAA Championship. The conference sent a record eight teams to the NAAs in 1999 and 2002, boasted seven NCAA participants in 1995, 2003 and 2004 and 2006, and sent six squads in 1994, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2001 and 2005. In the 27-year history of the event, the Big Ten has had five or more teams selected to the bracket on 17 occasions.
- Including this year, the **Big Ten** has sent three or more teams to NCAA Regionals on 13 occasions, including each of the previous five seasons. This season, **Penn State** and **Michigan** met in the University Park Regional Semifinals, while **Michigan State** came up short in the Madison Regional with a 3-2 loss to No. 2 Nebraska in the semifinals.
- Over the last 10 years, Big Ten teams have combined to go 5-1 when playing in the national semifinals. **Penn State** leads the field with a 3-0 record in that span, while **Wisconsin** is 1-0 and **Minnesota** is 1-1.
- The **Big Ten** holds an overall NCAA Championship record of 200-122 (.621), dating back to 1983. The conference has boasted a combined winning percentage of .600 or higher in 12 of the last 14 years and a .500 or better record in each of the past 15 tournaments. The Big Ten was 12-7 (.632) in 2006 and is 10-5 (.667) so far in 2007.
- The **Big Ten** has recorded 10 or more wins in the last four NCAA Championships including this season, currently with a 10-5 record through regionals. Overall, Big Ten squads have combined for 10 or more NCAA wins on 10 occasions.
- **Penn State** is the only Big Ten school with an NCAA Championship to its name (1999).
- **Michigan**, **Penn State** and **Wisconsin** all served as hosts for first- and second-round competition. Penn State's Rec Hall and Wisconsin's UW Field House also played home to NCAA Regionals.
- **Penn State** is the only Big Ten team to have advanced to the NCAA Semifinals without having dropped a single game in the previous rounds. The Nittany Lions have accomplished the feat four times in program history (1997, 1998, 1999, 2007). The 1997 PSU squad is the only team in conference history to have advanced to the NCAA Championship game without having lost a game in the opening rounds.
- Including this season, six different Big Ten schools have combined to reach the national semifinals 14 times, including three schools making six total appearances in the championship game. Of the six squads selected to the 2007 bracket, four (**Michigan State**, **Minnesota**, **Penn State**, **Wisconsin**) reached the national semifinals on nine occasions with six championship game appearances.
- **Penn State** and Stanford are the only two teams to have earned bids to all 27 NCAA Championships.

2007 BIG TEN VOLLEYBALL POSTSEASON HONORS

After becoming the first team in Big Ten history to win five consecutive conference titles, Penn State was honored again on Monday as junior middle hitter **Christa Harmotto** became the third different Nittany Lion in as many years to be named Big Ten Player of the Year. In addition, middle hitter **Arielle Wilson** became the sixth consecutive Penn State player to receive Freshman of the Year honors, and PSU head coach **Russ Rose** was named Coach of the Year by the conference coaches and the media, marking the ninth time he has been recognized. Rounding out the 2007 Big Ten volleyball individual honors, Michigan senior libero Stesha Selsky was named Defensive Player of the Year.

A native of Aliquippa, Pa., Harmotto is the ninth Nittany Lion in program history to be named Big Ten Player of the Year. The junior is on pace to shatter the conference record with a .483 hitting percentage in all matches and has been among the national leaders all year in that category. Harmotto also finished second in the conference in blocks per game, averaging 1.75 per Big Ten contest, and is among the NCAA's best with an average of 1.63 stuffs in all games played. Harmotto was a three-time Big Ten Player of the Week selection this year.

Wilson became the first freshman since 2003 and the second ever to lead the Big Ten in blocks, averaging 1.78 per conference game. The Broadview, Ill., native finished second in the Big Ten with a .382 conference hitting percentage and tallied a .406 clip in all contests. Wilson is the seventh Nittany Lion to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the sixth in a row, following Sam Tortorello (2002), Cassy Salyer (2003), Kate Price (2004), Nicole Fawcett (2005) and Megan Hodge (2006). Wilson was a two-time Big Ten Player of the Week selection this year, earning the award once on offense and once on defense.

Selsky is the first Wolverine to take home Defensive Player of the Year honors. The senior broke Michigan's school record for digs with 2,140 for her career, becoming just the third player in Big Ten history to reach the 2,000 saves milestone. The Manhattan Beach, Calif., native led the Big Ten with 5.71 digs per conference game and averaged 6.08 saves in all games played, putting her among the NCAA's elite in that category. Selsky was a two-time Defensive Player of the Week selection this year.

This year, Rose's Nittany Lions became the first program in history to win five consecutive conference titles and the seventh squad since double round-robin play began in 1985 to finish the Big Ten schedule with an undefeated record. The 29th-year mentor put Penn State in the No. 1 spot in the AVCA national rankings for the first time since 1999, and led his squad to its 27th NCAA appearance. The Lions join Stanford as the only two programs in the nation to have appeared in every NCAA Volleyball Championship. This marks the seventh time that Rose has been honored as Big Ten Coach of the Year by his peers, the ninth time he has been recognized by the media and the seventh time he has received the nod from both groups.

Harmotto is also a member of the 2007 All-Big Ten team, joining teammates **Nicole Fawcett**, **Alisha Glass** and **Megan Hodge**. Fawcett and Hodge were unanimous selections to the squad, marking the third honor of Fawcett's career, Hodge's second and Glass' first. Also unanimously chosen to the 2007 All-Big Ten Team, Ohio State's **Danielle Meyer** earned her third career honor and Michigan's **Katie Bruzdinski** received her second. Wisconsin senior **Taylor Reineke** is the fourth three-time honoree on the squad, and is joined by teammates **Jackie Simpson** and **Brittney Dolgner**, who each received their second career accolades. Rounding out the team, Michigan State's **Ashley Schatzle** and Purdue's **Stephanie Lynch** each took home their second career laurels, while Minnesota's **Jessy Jones** earned her first.

Nine of the 11 Big Ten schools were represented on the All-Conference ballot as Illinois' **Vicki Brown** and **Laura DeBruler**, Indiana's **Lauren Ditteon**, Michigan State's **Katie Johnson** and Wisconsin's **Jocelyn Wack** were named Honorable Mention All-Conference.

DeBruler also earned a selection to the All-Freshman Team and was joined by Michigan's **Lexi Zimmerman**, Minnesota's **Brook Dieter** and **Lauren Gibbemeyer**, and Penn State's **Wilson** and **Blair Brown**.

The conference office also announced honorees from each of the 11 volleyball squads for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. In addition, the student-athletes must be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting. Honorees for women's volleyball are Illinois' **Ashley Edinger**, Indiana's **Juli Pierce**, Iowa's **Emily Hiza**, Michigan's **Selsky**, Michigan State's **Miken Trogdon**, Minnesota's **Kelly Roysland**, Northwestern's **Brittney Aldridge**, Ohio State's **Briana McCarthy**, Penn State's **Melissa Walbridge**, Purdue's **Samantha Mader** and Wisconsin's **Audra Jeffers**. These 11 student-athletes are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, as the conference office will honor one male and one female student-athlete from each institution at the end of the school year.

NEWS & NOTES

Penn State Captures Fifth Straight Big Ten Title

Penn State became the first program in conference history to take home five straight Big Ten titles when it clinched the outright crown on Saturday, Nov. 17, with a sweep of Illinois. The Nittany Lions finished the conference schedule with perfect 20-0 record, becoming just the seventh squad since double round-robin play began in 1985 to finish the Big Ten slate undefeated.

Badgers Break Big Ten Attendance Record

Wisconsin shattered its own Big Ten attendance record, welcoming a total of 59,704 fans to the UW Field House over 10 matches for an average of 5,970 per contest, breaking the previous mark of 4,711 set last year. The Badgers enjoyed their first ever sellout on Oct. 20 as

they did their part to "Spike Cancer," raising \$5,000 for the Susan G. Komen for the Cure Madison affiliate.

Big Ten Coaches Reach Big Milestones

Illinois' **Don Hardin** became the newest member of the Big Ten coaches' 400 wins club with a victory over Iowa in the team's final match of the season. Hardin joins Iowa's **Cindy Fredrick**, Michigan State's **Cathy George**, Minnesota's **Mike Hebert**, Ohio State's **Jim Stone**, Penn State's **Russ Rose** and Wisconsin's **Pete Waite** as active Big Ten coaches with 400 or more career wins. Also this season, Hebert became the first coach in history with 300 wins at two Big Ten schools, earning the milestone at Minnesota on Nov. 17. Hebert also compiled over 300 wins with Illinois from 1983-95. Early this year,

Rose became just the third Division I coach in history to reach 900 career wins as his Nittany Lions defeated Michigan State on Sept. 21.

Freshmen Make Immediate Impact

The Big Ten boasted several of the nation's best newcomers throughout the course of the season with multiple freshmen among NCAA leaders. Illinois' **Laura DeBruler** consistently ranked as the nation's top freshman in kills per game, ending the regular season with 4.89 per game in all matches played. DeBruler became just the fourth freshman in history to lead the Big Ten in that category, registering 4.98 per game in conference competition. Freshman of the Year **Arielle Wilson** from Penn State became just the second first-year player to lead the conference in blocks, averaging 1.78 stuffs per game in Big Ten action. Michigan State's **Lauren O'Reilly** and Michigan's **Lexi Zimmerman** consistently placed among the NCAA leaders in assists per game, finishing the conference season ranked second and third, respectively in the Big Ten. O'Reilly averaged 13.63 helpers per conference game, while Zimmerman averaged 13.16.

Big Ten Owns Nation's Toughest Block

The Big Ten is the only conference in the nation boasting three teams (No. 2 **Penn State**, No. 4 **Minnesota**, No. 18 **Wisconsin**) among the nation's top 18 in blocks. The conference is also the only one in the country with three individuals among the top 15 in blocks per game as Penn State's **Christa Harmotto** ranks fourth, Minnesota's **Jessy Jones** ranks seventh and Wisconsin's **Taylor Reineke** comes in at No. 15.

Harmotto On Pace to Smash Big Ten Record

Penn State's **Christa Harmotto**, the Big Ten Player of the Year, is on pace to smash the conference's record for hitting percentage with a .494 average in all games played. The mark would best the previous high of .455 set by Illinois' **Mary Eggers** in 1986.

Lions Lead Nation in Hitting

As a team, **Penn State** leads all of NCAA Division I with a .352 hitting percentage. The Nittany Lions were the nation's hitting percentage champions last year, and also took home the stat crown in 1997, 1998 and 1999. The Lions are the only Big Ten team to ever finish first in the nation in the category.

Wack and Selsky Join Elite Digs Club

Wisconsin's **Jocelyn Wack** and Michigan's **Stesha Selsky** became the second and third players in Big Ten history to eclipse the 2,000 digs milestone. Wack reached the mark on Oct. 27 while Selsky followed on Nov. 5. Wack and Selsky rank second and third in the conference, respectively, in all-time digs, and each is the career record holder at her respective school. Wack and Selsky trail only Minnesota's **Paula Gentil**, who compiled 2,791 career digs, in the Big Ten records book.

Big Ten in the Polls

The Big Ten boasts four of the nation's top 25 in the most recent AVCA Coaches Poll. **Penn State** remained at No. 1 for the sixth consecutive week after capturing the top spot on Oct. 29 for the first time since the 1999 season. With a loss to Iowa State in the second round of the NCAA Championship, **Wisconsin** fell out of the top 10 for the first time since Nov. 5, down to No. 12. Following wins over Miami (Ohio) and then-No. 21 Colorado State, **Michigan** made its way back in the top 20 for the first time since Oct. 22. **Michigan State** earned a spot in the top 25 for the first time all season after wins over Kentucky and then-No. 15 Dayton in the NCAA's opening rounds. The ranking marked the first time since 2003 that the Spartans have received a spot in the AVCA Top 25.

BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Two Big Ten Standouts Named National POW

Two Big Ten volleyball players were named the Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week this season. Penn State's **Megan Hodge** earned the first honor of her career on Sept. 10, while her teammate **Alisha Glass** earned her second career national award on Nov. 19.

Dieter Ties Freshman POW Record

Minnesota's **Brook Dieter** earned three Big Ten Player of the Week selections this season, tying her with Penn State's **Megan Hodge** (2006) and **Nicole Fawcett** (2005) and Ohio State's **Stacey Gordon** (2001) for the most POW selections in a freshman season.
