PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Brook Dieter, Minnesota

Fr., OH, Bloomington, Minn./Kennedy

Dieter takes home her second weekly honor of the season after earning MVP honors at the Gopher Invitational over the weekend. The freshman became the first Minnesota player since 2004 to record 20 kills in three straight matches as she averaged 6.1 per game on the strength of a .358 hitting percentage over the weekend. Dieter's 21 kills on .581 hitting against Charlotte on Friday marked the most by a Gopher in a three-game match since 2004. The Bloomington, Minn., native also recorded five service aces, including three against UW-Green Bay on Saturday, and averaged two digs and 0.4 blocks per game on the weekend.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kate Nobilio, Northwestern

So., LIB, Johnsburg, Ill./Johnsburg

Nobilio takes home her second career weekly accolade after becoming the first libero/defensive specialist to ever be named MVP of the Wildcat Classic. The sophomore recorded at least 20 digs in each match, averaging 6.7 per game on the weekend as Northwestern went 3-0. Behind Nobilio's passing, the Wildcats hit .319 or better in each of their three matches. Nobilio tied her career high with four aces against Drake on Friday, averaging 0.6 per game for the weekend, and broke her career high with five assists on Saturday against St. Louis, averaging one helper per game in the tournament. The Johnsburg, Ill., native returned 98 percent of service receptions successfully and led the Northwestern defense in holding opponents to sub-.100 hitting on the weekend.

BIG TEN NEWS & NOTES

Network Debut

Wisconsin and Illinois will play in the first volleyball match broadcast by the Big Ten Network on Wednesday at 7 p.m. CT at Huff Hall in Champaign. The Badgers will take part in the network's second volleyball broadcast when they head to Michigan to take on the Wolverines at 7 p.m. CT on Saturday. The Big Ten Network is scheduled to air over 20 volleyball matches throughout the course of the season. In addition, ESPN2 is slated to televise three regular-season matches in 2007.

Coaches' Corner

Don Hardin won his 200th match as Illinois' head coach on Saturday as the Illini defeated Toledo, 3-1. With 392 wins in his career, Hardin is eight victories shy of 400. Also on Saturday, Mark Rosen won his 150th match with Michigan as the Wolverines defeated Georgia Tech, 3-2. Penn State's Russ Rose is one win shy of the 900 benchmark. With his next victory he will become just the third Division I coach in history to reach the milestone.

Unbeaten

Michigan owns the second-longest unbeaten streak in the nation with a 12-0 record, sitting just behind 13-0 Dayton. The start is the second-best in school history, second only to last season's squad that started 13-0.

Stuffing the Competition

Heading into last weekend's competition, Big Ten teams and players were among the nation's best in blocks. Ohio State's Danielle Meyer averaged an NCAA-best 1.83 stuffs per game while the Buckeyes were tied for 26th in the country with a 3.06 bpg average. Minnesota sat second among all Division I schools with a 3.68 bpg mark while Penn State was seventh (3.48).

Getting Defensive

Each of the Big Ten's 11 teams is holding opponents to hitting percentages under .200, including Northwestern, who has held its opposition to a mere .105 mark. With a hitting clip of .343 and an opponents' average of .150, Penn State is out-hitting its opponents by nearly 200 points.

Big Ten Poll-ing Place

Three Big Ten teams sit in the nation's top 10 for the second-consecutive week in No. 3 Penn State, No. 9 Wisconsin and No. 10 Michigan. Minnesota follows at No. 12 while Ohio State comes in at No. 23. Purdue is receiving votes outside the top 25.
