Michigan State Catpures 3-2 Win at Home Over Michigan

Big Ten play began this week with an intrastate rivalry matchup in the state of Michigan, with the Wolverines of Michigan (15-7, 5-6) falling at Michigan State (8-11, 3-8) on Wednesday, 3-2. Other matches this weekend include No. 2 Minnesota (20-2, 9-1) at Wisconsin (13-5, 7-3) on Saturday, televised nationally on ESPN2, and Purdue (11-9, 4-6) at No. 6 Penn State (17-2, 8-2) on Saturday as well. That match will be televised on FSN Chicago. Both televised matches will be aired on Sunday.

The Race For Conference Crown Reaches Halfway Point

This past weekend marked the halfway point in the race for the Big Ten Championship. All 11 League teams have played at least 10 of the 20 schedule Conference matches, with Ohio State and Minnesota sharing the top spot with a 9-1 record. Penn State is third in the League at 8-2, followed by Wisconsin in fourth at 7-3.

Illinois Sweeps Ohio State From Ranks of Unbeaten

For the second time this season, Illinois has knocked a team from the ranks of the unbeaten. The No. 24 Fighting Illini upset No. 7 Ohio State, 3-0, in Champaign on Saturday, snapping the Buckeyes' 19-match winning streak. Earlier this year, the Illini upset two-time defending national champion and then-No. 1 USC in Champaign, ending the Women of Troy's 52-match winning streak. The win Saturday marked the first time since 1995 that Illinois had defeated two Top Ten teams in the same season when the Illini knocked off No. 8 Penn State and No. 9 Ohio State in back-to-back nights.

Three Conference Teams Rank Among Top Ten

For the third time this season and only the fourth time in Big Ten history, three teams rank in the top 10 nationally. In the latest USA Today/CSTV Top 25 Coaches Poll, Minnesota is ranked No. 2, followed by No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Ohio State. Illinois is the fourth Big Ten school ranked in the top 25 as the Fighting Illini are currently 21st. Wisconsin has also fought back and gained the attention of the nation's coaches as the Badgers received votes outside the top 25 for the first time since October 4.

Michigan State's Erbe Earns 550th Career Win

Michigan State head coach Chuck Erbe earned his 550th career win Wednesday night (October 27) with a 3-2 victory over intrastate rival Michigan. Erbe, now in his 12th year in East Lansing, was head coach at Southern California from 1976-1988, before taking the helm of the Spartans in 1993.

BIG TEN CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Kelly Bowman, Minnesota
SO, Setter, Maple Grove, Minn./Osseo

Bowman earns her first Player of the Week honor of her career after she posted a .556 hitting percentage and averaged 9.00 assists per game in two wins at Indiana and Purdue last week-end. The sophomore setter also posted an average of 3.00 kills per game as well as 3.00 digs per game. Bowman narrowly missed two triple-doubles this past weekend as she recorded eight kills, 28 assists and 10 digs at Indiana and 10 kills, 26 assists and eight digs against Purdue. She also posted a .615 clip against the Boilermakers. Bowman has recorded five triple-doubles so far this season.

Jackie Simpson, Wisconsin
FR, Setter, Downers Grove, Ill./South

Simpson becomes the first Badger to claim Player of the Week honors since Morgan Shields on November 18, 2002. The freshman setter had a career-high 67 assists as the Badgers put up a season-high 80 kills in only four games (20 kills per game) in a 3-0 win at Michigan. She also had the second double-double of her career against Michigan State on Friday night with 38 assists and 10 digs. On the weekend, Simpson averaged an impressive 15.00 assists per game, as well as 0.57 kills, 0.86 blocks and 2.43 digs per game. The Badgers averaged 18.43 kills and hit .272 behind her setting. Simpson upped her season assist average to 12.48 per game, which is sixth best in the League.

Michigan's Rosen Joins Century Club With Wolverines

Michigan head coach Mark Rosen captured his 100th win with the Maize and Blue against Northwestern last Friday, marking the second milestone for the Wolverine mentor this season. Rosen, in his 13th year, recorded his 300th career victory on September 11 against Oakland.

Ohio State Wins 3-2 Thriller in Battle of Top 10 Teams

Big Ten play began last weekend with a blockbuster in State College as No. 7 Ohio State remained undefeated with a 3-2 win at No. 5 Penn State. The match marked the 17th time in League history that two Big Ten teams ranked in the nation's top 10 battled in Conference action. Three weeks ago, then-No. 4 Penn State dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to top-ranked Minnesota, marking the highest-ranked match in Big Ten history. Of the 17 matches in which Big Ten teams have been ranked in the top 10, the Nittany Lions have been a participant on 15 occasions.

Ohio State's Gordon Sets All-Time Big Ten Kill Mark

Ohio State's Stacey Gordon, who set a Big Ten record last season with 6.62 kills per game, broke the all-time Big Ten kill record of 2,379, established by Minnesota's Nicole Branagh from 1997-2000, on October 15.

The Buckeye senior had 25 kills in three games against Michigan State and 31 in a four-game match versus Michigan. Her record-breaking kill came on her 27th kill against the Wolverines, which gave OSU a 13-12 lead in game four. Gordon currently stands at 2,444 kills for her career. Her total places her sixth on the NCAA Division I career kills list. She stands 231 kills behind No. 5 Priscilla Pacheco (1991-94) of Georgia who has 2,675.

Three Standouts Setting Own Marks in Kills History

Several other Big Ten student-athletes have their sights set on individual marks for kills this season as well. Indiana's Christina Archibald has 1,689 kills over her career, while Minnesota's Erin Martin is only the seventh Gopher to record 1,500 kills in a career, as she now has 1,528 kills. Michigan's Jennifer Gandolph (1,468) is also quickly approaching the 1,500-kill mark.

Nearly 11,000 Gopher Fans Help Minnesota Set Record

On October 16, Minnesota broke a school record for attendance with 10,927 fans for a match at Williams Arena. The 10,927 fans that came to see the Gophers defeat then-No. 23 Illinois, were the most fans to attend a Division I volleyball match this season. Minnesota's old record of 6,046 was set in Williams Arena on September 28, 1990 against Purdue.

The Minnesota-Illinois match was the second-highest attended match between two Big Ten teams in the history of the League. The highest attended match came when 10,935 fans watched Illinois and Wisconsin battle on November 30, 1990, in Madison.

BIG TEN VOLLEYBALL BITS



No. 21 **Illinois** (14-5, 6-4) has knocked off two previously unbeaten teams with long winning streaks, having downed #1 USC (52-game streak) and #7 Ohio State (19-game streak). This past weekend also marked the first time since 1995 that Illinois has defeated two Top Ten teams in the same season when the Illini knocked off #8 Penn State and #9 Ohio State in back-to-back nights. The Illini haven't won three matches against Top Ten teams in the same season since 1992 -- #3 Hawaii, #5 Nebraska, #9 Penn State and #7 Nebraska (NCAA Sweet 16). The Illini advanced to the Elite Eight that year. Head coach Don Hardin has 348 victories, just two shy of 350 for his career.



After struggling through a 10-match losing streak, **Indiana** (8-13, 2-8) has bounced back to win two out of its last three matches with triumphs over Northwestern and Iowa. The Hoosiers face a stiff road test this weekend as IU travels to Penn State on Friday and will then play in a Sunday matinee at Ohio State at 2 p.m. IU is in the midst of its toughest span yet as the Hoosiers were swept at home by No. 2 Minnesota and will now hit the road to battle the No. 6 Nittany Lions and No. 7 Buckeyes. Ohio State (18.19 kills per game) and Penn State (17.09) rank first and third in kills, respectively, while Indiana (2.43) is fifth-best in the League in blocks.



Iowa (9-13, 1-9) continues Big Ten play this weekend on the road against Wisconsin and Northwestern. The Hawkeyes and Badgers will meet on Friday in Madison, with the match against the Wildcats in Evanston on Saturday night. Iowa was without its three offensive powers in a 3-0 loss to Indiana last Saturday, as hitters Carolyn Giese, Laura Simpson, and Stacy Vitali were all sidelined for the match. Iowa ranks second in the League in blocks by opponents at 2.08, while senior Pam Kavadas is third among League defenders with 5.05 digs per game.



Michigan (15-7, 5-6) looks to rebound at home against No. 21 Illinois on Saturday after a heartbreaking 3-2 loss at Michigan State on Wednesday. The Wolverines are 10-2 at home this season, one win shy of tying a program record for home wins. Head coach Mark Rosen captured his 100th win with the Maize and Blue against Northwestern last Friday. Among notable individual milestones for the Wolverines, Megan Bowman moved into 13th place on Michigan's all-time list for career block assists, while Lisa Gamalski played in her 100th match at U-M against the Wildcats.



Michigan State (8-11, 3-8) gave head coach Chuck Erbe his 550th career victory on Wednesday with a 3-2 win at home over intrastate rival Michigan. The Spartans out-dug Michigan, 68-60, on Wednesday, and bettered their opponents this past weekend, 116-109, good for one more dig per game than Wisconsin and Northwestern combined. MSU also recorded 16.7 kills per game and 16.0 assists per game, both slightly better numbers than the Badgers and Wildcats. Michigan State will look for its third straight win on Friday when the Spartans host No. 21 Illinois.



No. 2 **Minnesota** (20-2, 9-1) became the first League team to eclipse the 20-win mark this season. It is the Golden Gophers best 22-match start since 2000 and their third-best start in school history. Minnesota jumped out to a 9-1 start in Big Ten play for just the third time in school history as well. Last weekend, Erin Martin moved into fifth place on Minnesota's all-time kills list with 1,528. Lindsey Taatjes moved up to ninth on the Minnesota all-time digs list with 1,057, after posting 25 digs on the week in two matches against Purdue and Indiana. Paula Gentil now has 1,757 career digs, 174 shy from tying the Big Ten record.



Northwestern (7-13, 2-8) returns home after a weekend in Michigan where the Wildcats dropped a pair of 3-0 decisions to U-M and Michigan State. Northwestern welcomes in No. 2 Minnesota on Friday, followed by a matchup with Iowa on Saturday. The Wildcats claimed one of their two Conference victories against the Hawkeyes in a 3-2 thriller in Iowa City. Junior Christie Gardner ranks fifth in the League with 4.47 digs per game, while senior Drew Robertson is ninth in assists with an average of 11.11 per game.



No. 7 **Ohio State** (19-1, 9-1) dropped its first game of the season to No. 24 Illinois this past weekend. Setter Marisa Main now has 1,015 career kills at Ohio State and has moved to eighth on the OSU career list passing Danielle Berlein (1987) with 927. Main, who is the NCAA leader in assists per game, recorded a career-high six blocks at Penn State with her five assist blocks equaling her career-high. Libero Rebecca Kastein had a career-high 19 digs at Penn State, while Maya Mapp had a season-high eight total blocks at Penn State with a solo and a season-high seven assists. OSU hosts Purdue on Friday and Indiana on Sunday.



No. 6 **Penn State** (17-2, 8-2) takes on Indiana and Purdue this weekend -- two teams the Nittany Lions swept both teams on the road just three weeks ago (October 8-9). Last week, junior setter Sam Tortorello posted a career-high eight kills at No. 24 Illinois, while senior Syndie Nadeau recorded a career-high seven blocks versus No. 7 Ohio State. Penn State currently ranks second in the League in hitting percentage (.296), opponent hitting percentage (.151), blocks per game (3.02) and digs per game (18.62). Sophomore Kim Holm leads all Conference hitters with a percentage of .398.



Purdue (11-9, 4-6) ended its four-match skid with a decisive 3-0 win at home over Iowa last Friday. The Boilermakers fell to No. 2 Minnesota by the same score on Saturday, but are looking ahead to a tough road test at No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Ohio State this weekend. The Boilermakers will battle the Buckeyes on Friday with Penn State on Saturday. The match against the Nittany Lions will be televised on FSN Chicago. Currently, Purdue ranks fourth in the League in hitting percentage (.261), assists (15.78), and kills (16.91).



Wisconsin (13-5, 7-3) has won five straight matches, its longest winning streak of the season, and has moved into sole possession of fourth place in the Big Ten. The Badgers lead all Conference teams for the year in blocks with 3.38 per game, while junior Sheila Shaw (1.43 bpg) and freshman Taylor Reineke (1.31) continue to impress at the net as their averages rank first and third, respectively, among all Big Ten blockers. Wisconsin, who is receiving votes in this week's USA Today/CSTV Coaches Poll, plays host to Iowa on Friday followed by No. 2 Minnesota on Saturday.

Crashing The Net

In the past two weeks, three Big Ten season highs have been recorded at the net by League standouts. This past week, Penn State's Sam Tortorello set a season high for assists with 74 in a 3-2 loss to Ohio State, while in that same match, the Buckeyes' Stacey Gordon tied her top total for the year with a League's best mark of 36 kills this season. Wisconsin freshman Taylor Reineke turned in a 12-block performance against Indiana on October 15, marking the highest total number of blocks in a match by a League player this year.

Northwestern's Robertson Goes "Wild" Against Indiana

Despite falling 3-2 to Indiana on October 16, Northwestern received a top-notch performance by senior Drew Robertson. She became the third League player this year to record a triple-double when she turned in 11 kills, 27 digs and 57 assists. Robertson joins Minnesota's Kelly Bowman (5) and Michigan's Lisa Gamalski (1) as the only League players to record at least one triple-double this season.

Bowman on Top of Game Versus Top-Ranked Competition

Minnesota's Kelly Bowman has tallied five triple-doubles this year, with two coming against three of the top four teams in the nation. On August 28, Bowman recorded 17 kills, 18 digs and 40 assists versus No. 1 USC, while on September 11, she recorded 11 kills, 19 kills and 15 assists against No. 4 Florida. Most recently, Bowman delivered 16 kills, 21 digs and 34 assists at No. 4 Penn State on October 2.

No. 1 Minnesota Tops No. 4 Penn State in Historical Match

Despite falling to Ohio State the night before, Minnesota brought its No. 1 ranking into State College on October 2 and defeated No. 4 Penn State 3-2 (34-36, 30-28, 30-27, 26-30, 15-11). The match marked the highest-ranking matchup in the Big Ten history and only the second time ever that two League teams faced off while each were nationally ranked in the top five. The only other time this scenario occurred in Conference history was when No. 4 Ohio State battled No. 5 Penn State on November 29, 1994.

The match was the first time since October 19, 2002 had two Big Ten squads taken to the court ranked in the top 10. Ironically, that match was also between Minnesota (9) and Penn State (8).

Nothing Recreation About Rec Hall For Minnesota

In that historical match between Minnesota and Penn State, the Gophers won for the second straight year in Rec Hall at Penn State. The 3-2 win marked only the third time in 16 tries Minnesota has won at Rec Hall, giving Minnesota three of the last four meetings at Rec Hall. The Gophers also made history in Rec Hall in 2000 when they snapped Penn State's NCAA record 87-match home winning streak.

A Streak To Remember

Prior to falling 3-1 to Ohio State on October 1, Minnesota spent three weeks at the top spot in the national rankings -- the first time in school history the Golden Gophers had ever been rank No. 1. In that span, Minnesota went 6-1, marking the first time a Big Ten squad had ruled the collegiate volleyball scene in three-consecutive weeks since Penn State in 1999. The Nittany Lions held the No. 1 rank for 11-straight weeks from October 4, 1999 until the final poll of the 1999 season when PSU captured the NCAA title.

Big Ten Boasts Big Upsets of Top-Ranked Teams

For the second time this season, a Big Ten team has upset the nation's top-ranked team. No. 16 Ohio State knocked off No. 1 Minnesota 3-1 (30-24, 30-23, 18-30, 30-24) on October 1, while on September 11, then-No. 16 Illinois defeated top-ranked and two-time defending national champion USC, 3-2, ending the longest winning streak in NCAA volleyball history at 52 straight. The Illini topped the Women of Troy 30-24, 24-30, 12-30, 30-27, 15-8, which marked the first time in school history that the Orange and Blue defeated a number one team. Earlier this year, Minnesota dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to then-No. 1 USC at the NACWAA Tournament.

Gentil Digging Away in Big Ten Record Books

Minnesota junior libero Paula Gentil has closed in on second place on the Big Ten all-time digs list with 1,757 career digs. Gentil is now just 163 digs out of second place and 174 away from the all-time Big Ten record. Gentil broke her own school record with 39 digs (13.0 dpg) against Michigan on September 25, bettering her previous high of 37 against then-No. 1 USC on August 28 in five games. Gentil's school record marked just the first time a League player has recorded 39 or more digs in a match since October 20, 1990.

Big Ten Ranks Among Nation's Best

As of October 24, the Big Ten boasted several of its teams and student-athletes at or near the top of the NCAA statistical rankings. Ohio State's Stacey Gordon leads the nation in kills per game (7.18), while teammate Marisa Main is second in the country in assists per game (14.71). In team categories, Ohio State ranks second in the nation in assists per game (16.83) followed by Minnesota (16.16) at No. 3. OSU also holds the nation's second-best mark in kills per game (18.19) and is third in hitting percentage (.323).

Gophers' Gentil and Lions' Walters Dig Down Deep

Two Big Ten student-athletes from two different teams were looking for one League record on October 2. Minnesota's Paula Gentil set the Big Ten record for digs in a match with 47, bettering the previous record of 44 set by Wisconsin's Susan Wohlford against Iowa on October 20, 1990. On the other side of the net, Penn State junior libero Kaleena Walters matched Wohlford's mark with a career-high and Penn State record 44 digs against the Gophers.

Gophers Say Just Bring it

Minnesota has built a record of 20-2 this season, with seven of those 22 matches coming against top 25 competition. Currently, Minnesota holds a record of 5-2 versus top 20 teams and a 4-1 record against teams in the top 15.

Big Ten Boasts Winning Record Over Top-25 Teams

In the four total weeks of non-conference action, Big Ten teams were a combined 10-5 against top-25 competition. League teams defeated two top-10 teams, including then top-ranked USC (Illinois, 3-2), and posted a record of 7-4 against teams in the top-15. On three occasions, three different Big Ten teams defeated the 12th-ranked team, as Purdue and Wisconsin topped then-No. 12 Georgia Tech the first week of September, while Penn State topped No. 12 Stanford the week after.

Illini's Virtue to Miss Remainder of Season

Illinois senior setter Erin Virtue suffered a tear of her anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her right knee late in the Illini's win over Ball State on September 17. The injury requires surgery, which will force the Honorable Mention All-American and Preseason All-Big Ten selection to miss the rest of the season. Virtue, who topped the 2,000 assist mark in just one-plus year as Illinois' starter, amassed 424 assists during the 2004 season before suffering the injury.

Underclassmen Blocking Out the Competition

Six underclassmen, including two freshmen in the top three, currently lead the Conference in blocks. Only two juniors and two seniors can be found among the top 10 blockers in the League. Wisconsin junior Sheila Shaw (1.43 bpg) leads the League followed by Michigan freshman Lyndsay Miller (1.33) and Shaw's teammate, freshman Taylor Reineke (1.31). Indiana junior Mandy Eberle is fourth at 1.26. Penn State's Kim Holm (So., 1.24) and Illinois' Jen Hynds (Fr., 1.18) are fifth and sixth, while Michigan's Megan Bowman (So., 1.14) is seventh. Sophomore Cassy Salyer of Penn State rounds out the top eight at 1.09.

OSU's Stone Reaches No. 500

Ohio State head coach Jim Stone captured his 500th career win on September 17 when his Buckeyes defeated Northeastern, 3-1. The win ranks him fourth among active coaches in the League. With his Buckeyes owning a 19-1 record this season, Stone has a career mark of 510-300 (.630).

Worth the Wait for Waite

Wisconsin head coach Pete Waite captured career win No. 400 on September 17 in a 3-0 sweep of Virginia. Waite, who is in his 17th year at the helm of the Badgers, has 408 career wins and ranks near the top 10 in winning percentage at .739 (408-144) overall.

Wolverines Go 3-0 For Rosen's 3-0-0

Michigan head coach Mark Rosen recorded his 300th career victory in a 3-0 defeat of Oakland University on September 11. The Wolverines captured the Michigan/Pepsi Challenge title that evening with a 3-0 sweep of Florida State. Rosen is now 309-113 (.732) in his 13th season as a head coach.

The Sweet Smell of a Rose

Penn State opened its season September 3 with a 3-0 sweep of Rutgers, giving head coach Russ Rose his 800th career victory. The Nittany Lion mentor became only the sixth coach in Division I history to reach the 800-win plateau. Currently, Rose ranks second all-time among active coaches in winning percentage (.845, Hawaii's Dave Shoji-.850) and third all-time in victories (816).

OTHER TOP LEAGUE PERFORMERS

ILLINOIS - Rasa Virsilaitė, JR, Outside Hitter

Virsilaitė posted her sixth double-double of the year with 19 kills and 11 digs against Penn State and then followed that performance with 16 kills and a .333 hitting percentage versus Ohio State.

INDIANA - Christina Archibald, SR, Outside Hitter

Archibald posted her 35th-career double-double and second of the weekend with 13 kills and 11 digs against Iowa after notching 13 kills and 14 digs to pace IU against Minnesota.

IOWA - Tiana Costanzo, SO, Outside Hitter

Costanzo led the Hawkeyes over the weekend in the absence of their three dominant hitters. The sophomore recorded seven kills against Purdue on Friday, followed by eight kills at Indiana the following night.

MICHIGAN - Jennifer Gandolph, SR, Outside Hitter

Gandolph had two straight double-doubles last week, giving her eight on the season, while setting a season-high with 19 digs against Wisconsin. Gandolph recorded eight kills in the second game against Northwestern as well as five blocks in a 34-32 win against the Wildcats.

MICHIGAN STATE - Kim Schram, SR, Outside Hitter

Schram led MSU in each of its Big Ten matches last week with 10 kills against Wisconsin on Friday and 29 against Northwestern on Saturday. Schram averaged 5.57 kills per game on the weekend and 2.43 digs per game. Additionally, she had six blocks in the two matches, which was second-best on the Spartan squad.

NORTHWESTERN - Drew Robertson, SR, Setter

Robertson has now recorded six-straight double-doubles -- her most recent coming against Michigan State with 55 assists and 12 digs. Her two double-doubles came on the heels of recording only the third triple-double in Big Ten competition this season against Indiana.

PENN STATE - Melissa Walbridge, FR, Middle Hitter

Walbridge averaged 2.00 kills per game and 1.67 blocks per game in two matches while attacking at a .390 clip. The true freshman stepped up against No. 7 Ohio State, recording a career-high 11 kills on an error-free 23 attempts to hit .478 while also posting six blocks. At Illinois, Walbridge recorded seven kills and nine blocks in her first career start away from Rec Hall. Her blocking helped hold the Illini to hitting .165 in the match as she recorded the most stuffs by any player on the court, falling just one block shy of her career-high 10.

PURDUE - Renata Dargan, JR, Setter

Dargan hit .333 on the weekend, including a .478 night against Iowa on Friday night. She narrowly missed a triple double against the Hawkeyes with 12 kills, 40 assists and nine digs to go with a team-high four blocks. Dargan tallied seven digs, two kills and two blocks to go with 34 assists against the Golden Gophers. For the week, she averaged 2.67 digs, 2.33 kills, and 1.00 blocks to go with 12.33 assists.
