All Hail The Gophers

Minnesota is the new top-ranked team in the USA Today/CSTV Top 25 poll it was announced Monday. This marks the first time in school history the Golden Gophers have been ranked No. 1. Not since Penn State won the NCAA Championship in 1999 and was ranked No. 1 in the final poll, has a Big Ten team been tabbed the best in the nation.

The Conquer of Troy

In front of nearly 3,000 fans in Huff Hall on Saturday, 16th-ranked Illinois defeated top-ranked and two-time defending national champion USC, 3-2, ending the longest winning streak in NCAA volleyball history at 52 straight. The Illini (5-0) topped the Women of Troy 30-24, 24-30, 12-30, 30-27, 15-8, which marked the first time in school history that the Orange and Blue defeated a number one team. Earlier this year, Minnesota dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to USC at the NACWAA Tournament.

BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stacey Gordon, Ohio State

SR, Outside Hitter, Oshawa, Ontario, Canada/Eastdale

Ohio State's Stacey Gordon earns Big Ten Player of the Week honors after leading the Buckeyes to a 2-0 performance at the Georgia Tech Invitational this past weekend. OSU notched 3-0 victories over Xavier and No. 21 Georgia Tech. Gordon recorded 26 kills (.561), one service ace, four assist blocks and four digs against Xavier and 33 kills (.421), one assist block and nine digs in the sweep of the host Yellow Jackets.

Gordon was named the MVP of the tournament after the Buckeyes stopped a 26-match home winning streak for Tech. In the two matches, Gordon recorded 11 or more kills in three games.

She scored the winning kill in each game against Georgia Tech and with OSU trailing 28-25 in game three, scored kills for OSU's 26th, 29th and 30th point to close out the match.

This is the 12th career Player of the Week honor for Gordon and the first this season.

Impressive Start For Conference Teams

In its first two weeks of competition, the Big Ten showed its dominance throughout the country, with League teams combining for a 56-11 (.836) record, including a 25-7 (.781) performance last week. The Conference recorded a 31-4 (.886) mark in the first week of play.

Eight Big Ten Teams Earn Recognition in Top 25 Poll

Eight Big Ten teams have received recognition in the USA Today/CSTV Top 25 poll released September 13. Minnesota leads the nation at No. 1, followed by No. 5 Penn State and No. 9 Illinois. Not since December 4, 2000 have three Big Ten teams (WIS-4, PSU-8, MINN-9) been ranked in the top 10. Ohio State is ranked No. 25, while Michigan, Michigan State, Purdue and Wisconsin received votes.

Wolverines Go 3-0 For Rosen's 3-0-0

Michigan head coach Mark Rosen recorded his 300th career victory in a 3-0 defeat of Oakland University on September 11. The Wolverines captured the Michigan/Pepsi Challenge title that evening with a 3-0 sweep of Florida State. Rosen is now 301-107 in his 13th season as a head coach and has 92 wins at the Michigan helm, third-best on the all-time list.

And While We're Talking Numbers...

With the weekend sweep of the Michigan/Pepsi Challenge (September 10-11), the Wolverines are off to a 7-0 start, their best start since 1983 when U-M began the season 8-0. No Michigan volleyball team has started a season better than 8-0.

Waite's Wait Down To One

Wisconsin head coach Pete Waite needs only one more victory for career win No. 400. The Badgers went 2-1 the weekend of September 10-11 to earn UW's sixth-year head coach wins 398 and 399. Badger fans will most likely be able to witness No. 400, as Wisconsin opens a five-match homestand, beginning with Virginia on September 17.

Big Ten Tops Against Top-Ranked Teams

Proving its dominance in collegiate volleyball, the Big Ten is 8-3 so far this year against teams ranked in the USA Today/CSTV poll. No. 16 Illinois upset top-ranked USC 3-2 on September 11, while No. 5 Minnesota has claimed wins over Florida (4), Colorado State (11) and Kansas State (15).

Making Those Yellow Jackets Blue

For the third time this season, a Big Ten squad has knocked off nationally-ranked Georgia Tech. Ohio State won the Georgia Tech Invitational September 11, with a 3-0 sweep of the host Yellow Jackets. The Buckeyes win marked the end of Tech's 26-match home winning streak. Earlier this year, Purdue defeated then-No. 12 Tech, 3-1, one day before Wisconsin topped the Yellow Jackets, 3-2.

Keep Your Eye on the Hawks

Under first-year head coach Cindy Fredrick, the Iowa Hawkeyes have already equaled their win total from last season. Iowa went 4-0 the weekend of September 11 and captured the Lamar Cardinal Classic title. The Hawkeyes, who improved to 6-1 on the season, were just 6-24 last year.

Gophers Say Just Bring it

Minnesota has stormed out to a 7-1 record this season, with four of those games coming against top 15 competition. The Gophers fell to #1 USC in a five-game heart-breaker in August, but have captured top-15 wins over #4 Florida (3-2), #11 Colorado State (3-1), and #15 Kansas State (3-2). USC is the two-time defending national champion, while Florida was a national semifinalist along with the Gophers last season.

BIG TEN VOLLEYBALL BITS



No. 9 **Illinois** (5-0) defeated No. 1 USC this past weekend in the State Farm Illini Classic Championship match, breaking the Women of Troy's NCAA record 52-game winning streak. The win marked the first time an Illini team has defeated the No. 1 team in the nation. The Illini are 14-1 in non-conference play the past two seasons with the only loss coming to Nebraska in the second game of the year last season. The Orange and Blue have now won 13 straight non-conference matches.



Indiana (5-2) finished 2-1 at the Texas-Arlington Invitational last weekend and two Hoosiers were awarded for their play, as Katie Pollom and Christina Archibald were named to the all-tournament team. Pollom recorded 39 kills (3.55 kpg.) to go with nine blocks (.82) and six service aces. Archibald posted 37 kills (3.36), 29 digs (2.64) and four blocks (.36). The Cream and Crimson return to action on Tuesday, Sept 14., as the Hoosiers host in-state rival IPFW.



Iowa (6-1) has now claimed as many victories as the team had all of last season. The Hawkeyes went a perfect 4-0 last weekend and claimed the Lamar Cardinal Classic title in Beaumont, Texas. Iowa has played all seven matches on the road, but now returns home to Iowa City for a six-match home stand. The Hawkeyes will meet Creighton on Tuesday, followed by matches with Eastern Washington, Furman and Chicago State this Friday and Saturday in the Hawkeye Holiday Inn Classic.



After giving head coach Mark Rosen his 300th career win last Friday, **Michigan** (7-0) returned on Saturday to defeat Florida State for the Michigan/Pepsi Challenge tournament championship. The win improves Michigan to a perfect 7-0 on the season, while Florida State drops to 5-1 with its first loss of the 2004 campaign. U-M's 7-0 start is the best in 21 years, next to the 8-0 start that the 1983 Wolverines put up to begin their campaign. No team has started better than 8-0 in school history. Michigan will host a tournament for the second straight week with matches against Virginia Tech, Western Michigan and Tennessee.



Michigan State (5-1) claimed wins over Arkansas and Wichita State before falling to No. 6 Washington last weekend at the Wichita State Tournament. State's Maggie Griffin and Brooke Langston earned all-tournament honors for their efforts in Wichita. Michigan State next faces Notre Dame at the South Carolina Invitational on Friday, September 17. Head coach Chuck Erbe needs just three wins for his 550th career win. The Spartans will also get a chance to battle defending national champion USC on Sunday.



No. 1 **Minnesota** (7-1) is coming off impressive home wins over No. 4 Florida (3-2) and No. 15 Kansas State (3-2). For the second time in as many weeks, Erin Martin received tournament MVP honors, while Paula Gentil was also named to the All-Tournament team. Minnesota will be back in action on Friday, September 17 when it plays Rice at the North Carolina Tournament. The Golden Gophers will also play No. 22 Loyola Marymount and host North Carolina on Saturday, September 18.



Northwestern (4-2) rebounded from a 0-3 loss to Loyola (Ill.) in their opening match of the weekend Chicago Challenge to win its next two matches en route to posting a 2-1 record on the weekend. True freshman Courtnie Paulus had a career weekend, recording 32 total kills. In her first career start against DePaul on Saturday, Paulus had a career-high 13 kills, while adding six digs. Junior outside hitter Julie Purcell added a solid 35 kills on the weekend. Northwestern plays at Long Beach State on Tuesday.



Ohio State (6-0) claimed two victories over the weekend and won the Georgia Tech Invitational. The Buckeyes swept both Xavier and the host Jackets, ending Tech's 26-match home winning streak. Stacey Gordon, the Big Ten Player of the Week, was named the MVP of the tournament with Danielle Meyer and Marisa Main being named to the All-Tournament Team. OSU is 6-0 with its best start since 2001 when the Buckeyes started the season 13-0. Ohio State hosts Youngstown State on Tuesday and Florida International, Northeastern and Montana State this weekend.



No. 5 **Penn State** (6-0) continued its win streak at the Stanford Invitational, winning all three matches including Friday's nightcap against the 12th-ranked Cardinal. Senior Ashley Pederson became just the 16th player in Penn State history to reach the 1,000 career kill mark. She reached the milestone in the Nittany Lions' 3-2 victory over Stanford. The Lions host Maryland-Baltimore County, Yale and West Virginia in this weekend's Penn State Classic in State College.



Purdue (4-2) swept Tennessee-Martin on Friday, before falling to Wake Forest and Tennessee at the Lady Vols Classic in Knoxville. Senior middle hitter Kim McConaha, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, surpassed the 1,000-kill mark for her career against UT-Martin. With 16 in the game, McConaha moved to 1,003. She posted 41 total kills on the weekend, boosting her career tally to 1,028. Purdue's win over UT-Martin was its first as a ranked team since 1988. Purdue hosts Valparaiso on Tuesday, followed by Central Michigan, East Tennessee State and Kentucky this weekend.



Wisconsin (3-2) will attempt to win career victory No. 400 for head coach Pete Waite Friday, when the Badgers host Virginia. The match will be the first of three in the InnTowner Invitational in Madison. Wisconsin will also host Marshall and Cincinnati this weekend, before opening up Big Ten play at home against Ohio State and Penn State.

Bowman Brings It During Top-Ranked Competition

Minnesota's Kelly Bowman is the only Big Ten player so far this season to record at least one triple-double. The sophomore setter has tallied two triple-doubles this year, with both coming against two of the top four teams in the nation. On August 28, Bowman recorded 17 kills, 18 digs and 40 assists versus #1 USC, while on September 11, she recorded 11 kills, 19 kills and 15 assists against #4 Florida.

The Sweet Smell of a Rose

Penn State opened its season September 3 with a 3-0 sweep of Rutgers, giving head coach Russ Rose his 800th career victory. The Nittany Lion mentor became only the sixth coach in Division I history to reach the 800-win plateau. Currently, Rose ranks second all-time among active coaches in winning percentage (.845, Hawaii's Dave Shoji-.850) and third all-time in victories (805).

Fredrick Successfully Begins Tenure at Iowa

Cindy Fredrick began her stint as Iowa head coach in winning fashion September 3, as the Hawkeyes topped Wright State, 3-2. Iowa captured its second game of the season as well, sweeping Denver 3-0, before falling at Illinois State.

Wolverines Set School Record in Hitting Percentage

Michigan set a new school record for hitting percentage against Manhattan on September 4, hitting .525 in a 3-0 win. The previous record was .524 set against Iowa in 1991.

How Low Can Penn State Go?

When Penn State defeated Quinnipiac 30-5 in the second game of its match on September 4, it marked the lowest point total allowed to an opponent in Penn State rally-scoring-era history. Ironically, the previous low was 30-6 versus Quinnipiac on August 31, 2002.

Forget 2,000...2,100 is Much Sweeter

Ohio State's Stacey Gordon, who set a Big Ten record last season with 6.62 kills per game, ended the past weekend with an even 2,100 kills for her career. The Buckeye senior is now just eight kills away from fifth all-time in Big Ten history (Debbie McDonald, PUR, 2,108) and 40 shy of Minnesota's Andrea Gonzalez's mark of 2,140, which is fourth-best. Gordon recorded 85 kills in the first week of play this season to surpass the 2,000 plateau. Gordon is one of only seven players in League history to have surpassed 2,000 kills.

Others in League Stalking Gordon's Mark

Several other Big Ten student-athletes have their sights set on individual marks for kills this season as well. Those who are seeking the 1,500-kill plateau this season are Indiana's Christina Archibald (1,479), Michigan's Jennifer Gandolph (1,292), and Minnesota's Erin Martin (1,279).

Boilermakers Bust into Poll for First Time Since 1990

After its 3-1 victory over No. 12 Georgia Tech on September 3, Purdue moved into the No. 24 position in the *USA Today/CSTV* poll. The selection marks the team's first Top 25 ranking since the final poll of the 1990 season, which also was the last time the Boilermakers went to the NCAA Tournament.

Other "Firsts" For The Boilers...

The win over then-No. 12 Georgia Tech marked the first win over a Top 15 team for Purdue since the 1993 season, while Annie Mastandrea pulled up 31 digs in the Missouri match, which marked the first time a Purdue player had recorded more than 30 digs since 1990.

Two Big Ten Squads Affected by Hurricane Frances

As the approach of Hurricane Frances threatened the eastern coast of Florida, both Illinois and Northwestern were forced to cancel their previously scheduled volleyball tournaments September 3-4, on the campuses of Miami and Florida, respectively. Both Florida schools cancelled their tournaments on September 1 in anticipation of severe weather. The cancellations forced Illinois to travel to the Hurricane Frances Classic in Oxford, Ohio, while Northwestern quickly organized the NU Labor Day Classic in Evanston.

Gordon Extends Double-Figure Streak for Kills

Ohio State's Stacey Gordon, who recorded eight service aces against Temple to set the OSU match record, has also served as an ace when it comes to double-figure kills. This past weekend, Gordon had a two-match total of 59 kills to extend her current streak to 82 matches.

Minnesota's Gentil Digs Her Way to the Top

Paula Gentil, who currently has 1,431 career digs and is just a junior at Minnesota, is only 500 digs away from the Big Ten career record of 1,931, set by Iowa's Janet Moylan from 1987-90. Gentil broke the Minnesota school record in digs on September 3, passing Sharon Oesterling (1986-89) who had previously held the record at 1,291. She broke the school record against UT-San Antonio. The two-time defending Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Gentil set the Conference record in digs last year with 656. Gentil's mark bettered the previous record of 606 set by Purdue's Becky Kanitz in 1987. With 656 digs in 2003 and 574 in 2002, the junior libero has the two highest single-season totals in school history.

Preseason Rankings "Golden" For Gophers

Minnesota, which finished its season 26-11 after falling to USC in the national semifinals, was the Big Ten preseason favorite and led all League teams in the *USA Today/CSTV* Top 25 Coaches Poll at No. 5. In addition to being the top-rated team among Big Ten squads, the Golden Gophers' ranking was the highest preseason selection in school history.

MINNESOTA TABBED AS BIG TEN PRESEASON VOLLEYBALL FAVORITE FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR

After earning its first ever trip to the NCAA National Semifinals last season, Minnesota was selected as the top choice in the 2004 Big Ten Volleyball Preseason Coaches Poll, it was announced August 16 by League officials. Penn State, the defending Conference champion, was tabbed second, while Wisconsin was voted to the No. 3 spot. ILLINOIS - Rachel VanMeter, Junior, Outside Hitter

VanMeter continued to be the Illini's driving force as she took the State Farm Illini Classic MVP honor this weekend. On the weekend, she totaled 26 kills in the two matches to lead all Illini. She hit .321 with 15 kills in the opening match vs. Miami (Ohio) and then hit the game-winner in the fifth and deciding game vs. No. 1 USC.

INDIANA - Katie Pollom, Senior, Middle Blocker

Pollom hit over .300 in the Hoosiers' victories over Arkansas-Little Rock and Houston this past weekend. The senior middle blocker also helped the offense post a .300 attack percentage in its first two matches of the tournament held at the University of Texas-Arlington.

IOWA - Carolyn Giese, Senior, Middle Blocker

Giese was part of the All-Tournament team in the Lamar Cardinal Classic this past weekend. She tallied 57 kills over four games and hit .278.
