Wisconsin Tops Wildcats on Wednesday to Open League Play

Big Ten play began this week with Wisconsin (16-5, 10-3, Big Ten) defeating Northwestern (8-15, 3-10) on Wednesday, 3-0. The Wildcats will now travel to Illinois on Saturday for a 7 p.m. match that will be televised on ESPN2 on Sunday at 4 p.m. ET.

Minnesota Hosts Pair of Top-Ten Big Ten Matchups

For the 18th and 19th time in Big Ten history and the third and fourth occasion this season, two Conference teams ranked in the top 10 nationally will battle against one another. No. 6 Penn State (19-2, 10-2) travels to No. 5 Minnesota (21-3, 10-2) on Friday, November 5, in a rematch of the Golden Gophers' 3-2 win over the Nittany Lions on October 2. The Gophers will then turn around and face No. 7 Ohio State (21-1, 11-1) on Saturday.

Earlier in the year, Minnesota met both teams in historic matches. Against Ohio State, then top-ranked Minnesota fell to the Buckeyes, 3-1, with the outcome bumping the Gophers from the top spot the following week. Minnesota rebounded the next night at Penn State when the Gophers brought their No. 1 ranking into State College and defeated then-No. 4 Penn State, 3-2 (34-36, 30-28, 30-27, 26-30, 15-11). The match marked the highest-ranking matchup in Big Ten history and only the second time ever that two League teams faced off while each were nationally ranked in the top five. The only other time this scenario occurred in Conference history was when No. 4 Ohio State battled No. 5 Penn State on November 29, 1994.

BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stacey Gordon, Ohio State SR, Outside Hitter, Oshawa, Ontario, Canada/Eastdale

Gordon averaged 8.17 kills per game and hit .391 for the weekend as No. 7 Ohio State earned its first back-to-back sweeps in Conference play this season with 3-0 wins over Purdue and Indiana. Gordon's 8.17 mark is her best two-match weekend set in the Big Ten with her previous best being 8.00 (56 kills, 7 games) against Michigan State and Michigan.

The senior outside hitter tallied an impressive 9.67 kills per game (29 kills, 3 games) against Purdue. She recorded 10 digs in each match this weekend as well. Gordon also moved up the ranks in the OSU history books as well this weekend. Her solo block against Indiana moved her into a tie for 16th in Buckeye career solos with 33 and her three total blocks gave her 209 for her career and moved her to 18th on the OSU career blocks list.

Gordon, who has registered double-figure kills in her last 98 matches, earns her fourth Player of the Week honor of the season and the 15th of her career.

Sheila Shaw, Wisconsin JR, Middle Blocker, Muskego, Wis./Muskego




Shaw becomes the second Badger in as many weeks to share Player of the Week honors as teammate Jackie Simpson earned recognition last week.

Shaw tied her career high with 24 kills while helping lead the Badgers to a 3-2 win over No. 2 Minnesota. She had five kills in the decisive game five and hit .500 for that period. The 6-1 middle blocker also led the Badgers with five assists and added one service ace and two digs to her totals while hitting .370 against the Gophers.

In a 3-0 win against Iowa, Shaw put down 10 kills, hit .316 and added three digs and two blocks. On the weekend, Shaw led Wisconsin with 4.25 kills per game, while hitting at a .354 clip.

This is the first career Player of the Week award for Shaw.

Three Conference Teams Rank Among Top Ten

For the fourth time this season and only the fifth time in Big Ten history, three teams rank in the top 10 nationally. In the latest USA Today/CSTV Top 25 Coaches Poll, Minnesota is ranked No. 5, followed by No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Ohio State. Illinois is the fourth Big Ten school ranked in the top 25 as the Fighting Illini are currently 25th. Wisconsin was the leading vote recipient outside the top 25.

Gophers Say Just Bring it

Minnesota has built a record of 21-3 this season, with seven of those 24 matches coming against top 25 competition. Currently, Minnesota holds a record of 5-2 versus top 20 teams and a 4-1 record against teams in the top 15.

8 Wins to 800

Minnesota head coach Mike Hebert stands just eight wins away from the 800-victory milestone only seven total and four active coaches have ever reached. Hebert, in his ninth year at Minnesota, has recorded a career record of 792-337 (.702), as head coach of the Gophers, Illinois (1983-95), New Mexico (1980-82) and Pittsburgh (1976-79).

Penn State head coach Russ Rose is also one of the four active coaches to have reached 800 wins as he eclipsed the mark in the Nittany Lions' season opener. On September 3, PSU swept Rutgers 3-0, to make Rose only the sixth coach in Division I history to reach the 800-win plateau. Currently, Rose ranks second all-time among active coaches in winning percentage (.845, Hawaii's Dave Shoji-.850) and third all-time in victories (818).

Badgers Upset Minnesota in Madison

Wisconsin upset No. 2 Minnesota Saturday night in a thrilling 3-2 match in Madison. Saturday's win, which was witnessed by a season-high crowd of 5,136 at the UW Field House, marked the first time since 2001 that the Badgers had beaten an opponent ranked as high as No. 2, when they last did it against USC. The win was Wisconsin's seventh straight.

Michigan State's Erbe Earns 550th Career Win

Michigan State head coach Chuck Erbe earned his 550th career win on October 27, with a 3-2 victory over intrastate rival Michigan. Erbe, now in his 12th year in East Lansing, was head coach at Southern California from 1976-1888, before taking the helm of the Spartans in 1993.

Michigan's Rosen Joins Century Club With Wolverines

Michigan head coach Mark Rosen captured his 100th win with the Maize and Blue against Northwestern on October 22, marking the second milestone for the Wolverine mentor this season. Rosen, in his 13th year, recorded his 300th career victory on September 11 against Oakland.

Gentil Digging Away in Big Ten Record Books

Minnesota junior libero Paula Gentil has closed in on second place on the Big Ten all-time digs list with 1,798 career digs. Gentil is now just 122 digs out of second place (1,920 - Susan Wohlford, Wisconsin, 1988-91) and 133 away from the all-time Big Ten record (1,931 - Janet Moylan, Iowa, 1987-90). Gentil broke her own school record with 39 digs (13.0 dpg) against Michigan on September 25, bettering her previous high of 37 against then-No. 1 USC on August 28 in five games. Gentil's school record marked just the first time a League player has recorded 39 or more digs in a match since October 20, 1990.

BIG TEN VOLLEYBALL BITS



No. 25 **Illinois** (15-6, 7-5) is one win away from giving head coach Don Hardin his 350th career victory. The Illini will look to accomplish the feat this week when they play host to Wisconsin on Friday and Northwestern on Saturday. Illinois is coming off a 1-1 weekend against Michigan and Michigan State, however Jessica Belter continued her impressive play against the two schools. In the past two seasons, Belter has recorded 116 kills and hit .385 in eight matches against the Wolverines and the Spartans. Currently, Illinois tops the Conference in service aces (1.67 per game), while freshman Stephanie Obermeier is third in the League with 13.55 assists per game. Junior Rachel VanMeter ranks fourth in the Conference with 4.32 kills per game.



After hitting a successful stretch of winning two of its last three matches, **Indiana** (8-15, 2-10) suffered a pair of Conference losses to No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Ohio State over the weekend. The Hoosiers will look to rebound this weekend when they welcome in Michigan and Michigan State. This weekend marks the first two matches of a four-match homestand for the Hoosiers, who will only make one more road trip this season. IU ranks fifth in the League with 2.42 blocks per game, led by junior Mandy Eberle's average of 1.25, which ranks fifth in the Big Ten. Freshman Christine Nilles is currently sixth overall with 0.32 service aces per game.



Iowa (9-15, 1-11) continues to be hampered by illness, as the Hawkeyes received word last week that Chelsey Garrett will be sidelined with an illness and out for at least two weeks. She is the fourth Hawkeye this season to be diagnosed with mononucleosis. Stacy Vitali remains out with the illness, while senior Laura Simpson saw her first action in over 10 days this past weekend against Wisconsin and Northwestern. Iowa was swept in both matches and will now host Ohio State and Penn State this weekend. The Hawkeyes rank fourth in the League with 16.07 digs per game, led by Pam Kavadas' third-best Conference mark of 5.04 dpg.



Michigan (15-8, 5-7) will look to rebound from an 0-2 weekend against Michigan State and Illinois with a road trip to the Hoosier state this week. The Wolverines will face Indiana on Friday, followed by Purdue the next night. Senior Sarah Allen recorded the 750th dig of her career this past weekend, while senior Jennifer Gandolph needs just 29 kills to record 1,500 for her career. With 108 blocks, freshman Lyndsay Miller is second in program history for single-season blocks by a freshman. Miller is also fifth all-time in single-season kills by a freshman with 215.



Michigan State (9-11, 4-8) captured its third-straight win on Friday with a 3-1 victory over No. 21 Illinois. Last Wednesday, the Spartans gave head coach Chuck Erbe his 550th career victory with a 3-2 win at home over intrastate rival Michigan. MSU's wins against Michigan and Illinois mark the Spartans' first Big Ten sweep of the year. Michigan State's three-match winning streak is its longest since the Spartans won five matches to begin the season. On the week, MSU out-dug its opponents, 14.00-12.00 per game, as well as out-blocked opponents, 3.11-2.00 per game.



No. 5 **Minnesota** (21-3, 10-2) will look this weekend to tie its school record home-winning streak of 13 set last season. The Golden Gophers have won 25 of their last 26 matches at home with their only loss coming to Penn State on November 28, 2003. Trisha Bradford moved into a three-way tie for 10th on the career kills list with 1,250, while Erin Martin enters the week just 36 kills away from becoming the fifth Golden Gopher in school history to reach 1,600 career kills. Lindsey Taatjes has moved to seventh on the school's all-time digs list with 1,088 digs. The Gophers host Penn State and Ohio State this weekend.



Despite falling 3-0 at Wisconsin on Wednesday, **Northwestern** (8-15, 3-10) is coming off a season sweep of Iowa, after a 3-0 win on Saturday. Senior setter and co-captain Drew Robertson broke the all-time assists record at Northwestern with 49 against Iowa. Her assist total against the Hawkeyes brought her career mark to 4,789, surpassing the previous record set by Liz Renius of 4,743. Robertson ranks ninth in the League this year with 11.24 assists per game, while teammate Christie Gardner is fifth in digs with an average of 4.37. Northwestern will finish this week on the road with a Saturday match in Champaign against Illinois.



This past week, No. 7 **Ohio State** (21-1, 11-1) recorded its first back-to-back sweeps in Conference play this season. Danielle Meyer and Ami Stevens combined for 26 kills against Purdue (13 each) to balance out Stacey Gordon's 29 kills against the Boilermakers. Meyer and Briana McCarthy combined for five blocks against Indiana with Meyer totaling seven for the match. Each averaged 1.33 blocks per game on the week-end with Meyer picking up eight assists and McCarthy, two solos and six assists. Marisa Main averaged 16.50 assists for the weekend, well over her Big Ten-leading mark of 14.85. OSU travels to Iowa and Minnesota this weekend.



No. 6 **Penn State** (19-2, 10-2) travels to Minnesota on Friday, followed by a matchup with Iowa on Saturday. With her 91 assists this past weekend, junior setter Sam Tortorello became only the fifth player in Nittany Lion volleyball history to record more than 4,000 career assists (4,061). She joined All-Americans Michelle Jaworski (6,596, 1987-90), Bonnie Bremner (5,911, 1996-99), Salima Davidson (5,455, 1991-94) and Ellen Hensler (4,774, 1983-86) as the only players in Penn State history to accomplish the feat. She is also just 46 assists shy of breaking the Tortorello family record of 4,107 career assists set by her sister Liz, who was a setter at Wisconsin from 1988-92 and ranks second in Badger history with her mark.



Purdue (11-11, 4-8) is coming off of two 3-0 sweeps by Ohio State and Penn State last weekend. Against Penn State, the Boilermakers faced their seventh top 25 team of the season. Purdue will look to pick up a season sweep of Michigan State for the first time since 1992, when they take on the Spartans on Friday night. They will then look to snap a three-match series losing streak to Michigan on Saturday night. Purdue ranks fourth in the League in assists (15.62 per game) and kills (16.80).



Wisconsin (16-5, 10-3) has won eight straight matches, its longest winning streak of the season, after sweeping Northwestern, 3-0, on Wednesday. The Badgers upset No. 2 Minnesota, 3-2, on Saturday night in front of a season-high attendance of 5,136 at the UW Field House. The last time Wisconsin defeated a team ranked as high as No. 2 was in 2001 when it defeated then-No. 2 USC, 3-2. The Badgers travel to Illinois on Friday. Wisconsin's Sheila Shaw, the current co-Big Ten Player of the Week, leads the League in blocks (1.37 per game).

Ohio State's Gordon Sets All-Time Big Ten Kill Mark

Ohio State's Stacey Gordon, who set a Big Ten record last season with 6.62 kills per game, broke the all-time Big Ten kill record of 2,379, established by Minnesota's Nicole Branagh from 1997-2000, on October 15. Her record-breaking kill came on her 27th of 31 kills against the Wolverines. Gordon currently stands at 2,493 kills for her career, which is sixth on the NCAA Division I career kills list. She stands 182 kills behind No. 5 Priscilla Pacheco (1991-94) of Georgia who has 2,675.

Three Standouts Setting Own Marks in Kills History

Several other Big Ten student-athletes have their sights set on individual marks for kills this season as well. Indiana's Christina Archibald has 1,702 kills over her career, while Minnesota's Erin Martin is only the seventh Gopher to record 1,500 kills in a career, as she now has 1,564 kills. Michigan's Jennifer Gandolph (1,471) is also quickly approaching the 1,500-kill mark.

Gopher Setter Tabbed AVCA National Player of the Week

Minnesota's Kelly Bowman, a sophomore setter that was last week's Big Ten co-Player of the Week, earned national recognition as the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) National Division I Player of the Week. The honor mark the second time this season a Big Ten student-athlete has received the honor from the AVCA. Ohio State's Stacey Gordon was recognized on September 13.

Illinois Sweeps Ohio State From Ranks of Unbeaten

On October 23, Illinois knocked a team from the ranks of the unbeaten for the second time this season. The No. 24 Fighting Illini upset No. 7 Ohio State, 3-0, in Champaign, snapping the Buckeyes' 19-match winning streak. Earlier this year, the Illini upset two-time defending national champion and then-No. 1 USC in Champaign, ending the Women of Troy's 52-match winning streak. The win against OSU marked the first time since 1995 that Illinois had defeated two Top 10 teams in the same season when the Illini knocked off No. 8 Penn State and No. 9 Ohio State in back-to-back nights.

Ohio State Wins 3-2 Thriller in Battle of Top 10 Teams

No. 7 Ohio State topped then-No. 5 Penn State, 3-2, in State College on October 20 in the 17th match in League history two Big Ten teams ranked in the nation's top 10 battled in Conference action. On October 2, then-No. 4 Penn State dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to top-ranked Minnesota, marking the highest-ranked match in Big Ten history. Of the 17 matches in which Big Ten teams have been ranked in the top 10, the Nittany Lions have been a participant on 15 occasions.

Northwestern's Robertson Goes "Wild" Against Indiana

Despite falling 3-2 to Indiana on October 16, Northwestern received a top-notch performance by senior Drew Robertson. She became the third League player this year to record a triple-double when she turned in 11 kills, 27 digs and 57 assists. Robertson joins Minnesota's Kelly Bowman (6) and Michigan's Lisa Gamalski (2) as the only League players to record at least one triple-double this season.

Nearly 11,000 Gopher Fans Help Minnesota Set Record

On October 16, Minnesota broke a school record for attendance with 10,927 fans for a match at Williams Arena. The 10,927 fans that came to see the Gophers defeat then-No. 23 Illinois, were the most fans to attend a Division I volleyball match this season. Minnesota's old record of 6,046 was set in Williams Arena on September 28, 1990 against Purdue.

The Minnesota-Illinois match was the second-highest attended match between two Big Ten teams in the history of the League. The highest attended match came when 10,935 fans watched Illinois and Wisconsin battle on November 30, 1990, in Madison.

Big Ten Ranks Among Nation's Best

As of October 31, the Big Ten boasted several of its teams and student-athletes at or near the top of the NCAA statistical rankings. Ohio State's Stacey Gordon leads the nation in kills per game (7.26), while teammate Marisa Main is third in the country in assists per game (14.85). Minnesota's Paula Gentil ranks third currently in digs with 6.45 per game. In team categories, Ohio State ranks first in the nation in assists per game (16.96) followed by Minnesota (16.09) at No. 6 and Penn State (16.00) at No. 8. OSU also holds the nation's best mark in kills per game (18.36) and is second in hitting percentage (.324).

Bowman on Top of Game Versus Top-Ranked Competition

Minnesota's Kelly Bowman has tallied six triple-doubles this year, with two coming against three of the top four teams in the nation. On August 28, Bowman recorded 17 kills, 18 digs and 40 assists versus No. 1 USC, while on September 11, she recorded 11 kills, 19 kills and 15 assists against No. 4 Florida. Bowman also delivered 16 kills, 21 digs and 34 assists at No. 4 Penn State on October 2. Most recently, she recorded 17 kills, 10 digs and 26 assists at Wisconsin in the Gophers' 3-2 loss on October 30.

A Streak To Remember

Prior to falling 3-1 to Ohio State on October 1, Minnesota spent three weeks at the top spot in the national rankings -- the first time in school history the Golden Gophers had ever been rank No. 1. In that span, Minnesota went 6-1, marking the first time a Big Ten squad had ruled the collegiate volleyball scene in three-consecutive weeks since Penn State in 1999. The Nittany Lions held the No. 1 rank for 11-straight weeks from October 4, 1999 until the final poll of the 1999 season when PSU captured the NCAA title.

Big Ten Boasts Big Upsets of Top-Ranked Teams

On two occasions this season, a Big Ten team has upset the nation's top-ranked team. No. 16 Ohio State knocked off No. 1 Minnesota 3-1 (30-24, 30-23, 18-30, 30-24) on October 1, while on September 11, then-No. 16 Illinois defeated top-ranked and two-time defending national champion USC, 3-2, ending the longest winning streak in NCAA volleyball history at 52 straight. The Illini topped the Women of Troy 30-24, 24-30, 12-30, 30-27, 15-8, which marked the first time in school history that the Orange and Blue defeated a number one team. Earlier this year, Minnesota dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to then-No. 1 USC at the NACWAA Tournament.

Crashing The Net

In the past three weeks, three Big Ten season highs have been recorded at the net by League standouts. Two weeks ago, Penn State's Sam Tortorello set a season high for assists with 74 in a 3-2 loss to Ohio State, while in that same match, the Buckeyes' Stacey Gordon tied her top total for the year with a League's best mark of 36 kills this season. Wisconsin freshman Taylor Reineke turned in a 12-block performance against Indiana on October 15, marking the highest total number of blocks in a match by a League player this year.

Big Ten Boasts Winning Record Over Top-25 Teams

In the four total weeks of non-conference action, Big Ten teams were a combined 10-5 against top-25 competition. League teams defeated two top-10 teams, including then top-ranked USC (Illinois, 3-2), and posted a record of 7-4 against teams in the top-15. On three occasions, three different Big Ten teams defeated the 12th-ranked team, as Purdue and Wisconsin topped then-No. 12 Georgia Tech the first week of September, while Penn State topped No. 12 Stanford the week after.

Gophers' Gentil and Lions' Walters Dig Down Deep

Two Big Ten student-athletes from two different teams were looking for one League record on October 2. Minnesota's Paula Gentil set the Big Ten record for digs in a match with 47, bettering the previous record of 44 set by Wisconsin's Susan Wohlford against Iowa on October 20, 1990. On the other side of the net, Penn State junior libero Kaleena Walters matched Wohlford's mark with a career-high and Penn State record 44 digs against the Gophers.

Illini's Virtue to Miss Remainder of Season

Illinois senior setter Erin Virtue suffered a tear of her anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her right knee late in the Illini's win over Ball State on September 17. The injury requires surgery, which will force the Honorable Mention All-American and Preseason All-Big Ten selection to miss the rest of the season. Virtue, who topped the 2,000 assist mark in just one-plus year as Illinois' starter, amassed 424 assists during the 2004 season before suffering the injury.

Underclassmen Blocking Out the Competition

Seven underclassmen, including three freshmen in the top four, currently lead the Conference in blocks. Only two juniors and one senior can be found among the top 10 blockers in the League. Wisconsin junior Sheila Shaw (1.37 bpg) leads the League followed by freshmen Melissa Walbridge (PSU, 1.36), Lyndsay Miller (MICH, 1.29) and Shaw's teammate, Taylor Reineke (WIS, 1.25). Indiana junior Mandy Eberle is fifth at 1.25. Penn State's Kim Holm (So., 1.20) and Illinois' Jen Hynds (Fr., 1.13) are sixth and seventh, while Michigan's Megan Bowman (So., 1.12) is eighth.

OSU's Stone Reaches No. 500

Ohio State head coach Jim Stone captured his 500th career win on September 17 when his Buckeyes defeated Northeastern, 3-1. The win ranks him fourth among active coaches in the League. With his Buckeyes owning a 21-1 record this season, Stone has a career mark of 512-300 (.631).

Worth the Wait for Waite

Wisconsin head coach Pete Waite captured career win No. 400 on September 17 in a 3-0 sweep of Virginia. Waite, who is in his 17th year at the helm of the Badgers, has 411 career wins and ranks near the top 10 in winning percentage at .741 (411-144) overall.

OTHER TOP LEAGUE PERFORMERS

ILLINOIS - Rachel VanMeter, JR, Outside Hitter

VanMeter played a major role in helping the Illini to a big road victory at Michigan with 22 kills and 10 digs. VanMeter continues to rank in the top 10 in the Big Ten in kills per game.

INDIANA - Katie Pollom, SR, Middle Blocker

Pollom paced Indiana with 23 total kills over the weekend. She also added five blocks assists for the Hoosiers against No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Ohio State.

IOWA - Carolyn Giese, SR, Middle Blocker

Giese led the Hawkeyes with 11 kills and had a .240 hitting percentage against Northwestern, after being sidelined the past two weeks with illness.

MICHIGAN - Katie Bruzdinski, FR, Outside Hitter

Bruzdinski tied career highs for kills in back-to-back matches with 20 against Michigan State and Illinois, while recording a double-double against the Spartans. She had six kills in the fifth game alone against the Spartans in a close road loss. Bruzdinski has led the Wolverines in kills in 12 matches this season, recording five double-doubles. Bruzdinski also added four aces in two matches, giving her 32 for the season.

MICHIGAN STATE - Brooke Langston, JR, Middle Hitter

Langston hit .600 with 26 kills as Michigan State picked up its first Big Ten weekend sweep of the year with wins against Michigan and No. 21 Illinois. Langston averaged 2.89 kills per game as well as 1.22 blocks per game.

NORTHWESTERN - Drew Robertson, SR, Setter

Robertson recorded a season-high assists tally for a three-game match with 49 against Iowa, powering the 'Cats past the Hawkeyes. That brought her total to 4,789 on her career, surpassing the previous NU record by Liz Renius of 4,743. After her streak of six-straight double-doubles was put to a stop by Minnesota the previous night, Robertson got back on track by posting 12 digs along with her 49 assists.

PENN STATE - Kate Price, FR, Outside Hitter

Price carried the offensive load for the sixth-ranked Nittany Lions in both matches of the weekend, posting match-highs in both contests. Versus Indiana, the freshman outside hitter posted 18 kills on 37 attempts to hit .324 while adding eight digs and two solo blocks. The following night against Purdue, Price posted 16 kills on 34 swings to hit .353 with one ace and six digs. For the weekend, she averaged an astounding 5.67 kills per game while hitting .338 and averaging 2.33 digs per game.

PURDUE - Kim McConaha, SR, Middle Hitter

Dargan hit .333 on the weekend, including a .478 night against Iowa on Friday night. She narrowly missed a triple double against the Hawkeyes with 12 kills, 40 assists and nine digs to go with a team-high four blocks. Dargan tallied seven digs, two kills and two blocks to go with 34 assists against the Golden Gophers. For the week, she averaged 2.67 digs, 2.33 kills, and 1.00 blocks to go with 12.33 assists per game.
