Purdue Tops Indiana to Begin This Week's League Play

Big Ten began this week with Purdue (13-2, 6-9 Big Ten) defeating intrastate rival Indiana (8-18, 2-13) in a 3-2 nailbiter. The win marked a season sweep for the Boilermakers over Indiana. In other key matches scheduled for this week, No. 4 Penn State (21-2, 12-2) and No. 8 Ohio State (22-2, 12-2) will host Northwestern (8-16, 3-11) and Wisconsin (16-6, 10-4), while No. 5 Minnesota (22-4, 11-3) travels to Michigan (17-8, 7-7) and Michigan State (10-12, 5-9).

Three Conference Teams Rank Among Top 10

For the fifth time this season and only the sixth time in Big Ten history, three teams rank in the top 10 nationally. In the latest USA Today/CSTV Top 25 Coaches Poll, Penn State is ranked No. 4, followed by Minnesota at No. 5 and No. 8 Ohio State. Illinois is the fourth Big Ten school ranked in the top 25 as the Fighting Illini are currently 25th. Wisconsin was the leading vote recipient outside the top 25.

Illinois' Nickname: Fighting Illini or Streak Busters?

There is no question that Illinois has lived up to its nickname "Fighting Illini" this season, but some would argue that a more appropriate nickname for the Orange & Blue would be "Streak Busters." Illinois has ended three notable streaks by its opponents this season.

On October 23, Illinois knocked a team from the ranks of the unbeaten for the second time this season. The No. 24 Fighting Illini upset No. 7 Ohio State, 3-0, in Champaign, snapping the Buckeyes' 19-match winning streak. Earlier this year, the Illini upset two-time defending national champion and then-No. 1 USC in Champaign, ending the Women of Troy's 52-match winning streak. The win against OSU marked the first time since 1995 that Illinois had defeated two Top 10 teams in the same season when the Illini knocked off No. 8 Penn State and No. 9 Ohio State in back-to-back nights.

Most recently, Illinois swept Wisconsin -- a team that entered the November 5th match a winner of eight straight. A week prior to the Illinois match, Wisconsin upset second-ranked Minnesota, 3-2.

BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Syndie Nadeau, Penn State SR, Outside Hitter, St. Georges, Quebec/Cegep Beauce-Appalaches

Nadeau earns her first career Big Ten Player of the Week honor after being the driving force behind Penn State's two crucial road victories last weekend. Behind her efforts, the sixth-ranked Nittany Lions moved into a tie for first place in the League standings. At No. 5 Minnesota, the senior outside hitter lit up the Gophers with a season-high 19 kills on 46 swings to hit .348 against a team that had the Conference's second lowest opponent hitting percentage (.157). Her match-high 19 kills were just two shy of her career high of 21, which she set in a five-game match against Florida on September 20, 2002. Not only was Nadeau effective on the offensive end against Minnesota, she posted 13 digs and three blocks on defense as well. The following night at Iowa, she posted 11 kills on an errorless 22 swings to hit .500 for the contest. She also recorded a team-high two blocks and notched 11 digs for her second double-double of the weekend and her 11th of the season.

For the weekend, Nadeau averaged 4.29 kills per game while hitting .397. The all-around player also averaged 3.43 digs per game and 0.71 blocks per game through the two matches. For the year, Nadeau is averaging 2.91 kills per game, including 3.12 in Conference-only matches. Nadeau is the second Penn State student-athlete to earn weekly honors this season as Sam Tortorello was tabbed by the League on September 20.

PSU's Nadeau Named AVCA National Player of the Week

For the third time this season, a Big Ten student-athlete has been recognized as the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) National Division I Player of the Week. Current Big Ten Player of the Week, Syndie Nadeau of Penn State, earned the honor this week, marking the Nittany Lions' first-ever National Player of the Week award in the history of the program. Minnesota's Kelly Bowman, a sophomore setter who was named Big Ten co-Player of the Week on October 25, also earned the weekly AVCA national award as well as Ohio State's Stacey Gordon on September 13.

Illini Head Coach Don Hardin Earns 350th Career Victory

In sweeping Wisconsin on November 5, Illinois gave head coach Don Hardin his 350th career victory. Hardin is the eighth Big Ten mentor to reach a coaching milestone this season (See Page 5). Hardin, who is in his 17th year as a head coach, spent eight seasons at Louisville before spending the past nine at Illinois.

Gophers Say Just Bring it

Minnesota has built a record of 22-5 this season, with seven of those 24 matches coming against top 25 competition. Currently, Minnesota holds a record of 6-3 versus top 20 teams and a 5-2 record against teams in the top 15.

Minnesota Split Pair of Top-Ten Big Ten Matchups

For the 18th and 19th time in Big Ten history and the third and fourth occasion this season, two Conference teams ranked in the top 10 nationally battled against one another. No. 6 Penn State topped No. 5 Minnesota on November 5, 3-1, but rebounded to top Ohio State in four games on November 6.

Earlier in the year, Minnesota met both teams in historic matches. Against Ohio State, then top-ranked Minnesota fell to the Buckeyes, 3-1, with the outcome bumping the Gophers from the top spot the following week. Minnesota rebounded the next night at Penn State when the Gophers brought their No. 1 ranking into State College and defeated then-No. 4 Penn State, 3-2. The match marked the highest-ranking matchup in Big Ten history and only the second time ever that two League teams faced off while each were nationally ranked in the top five. The only other time this scenario occurred in Conference history was when No. 4 Ohio State battled No. 5 Penn State on November 29, 1994.

No. 25 **Illinois** (17-6, 9-5) takes a three-match winning streak into Bloomington on Friday as the Orange and Blue will face Indiana on November 12, followed by Purdue the night after. The Fighting Illini will be on the road for the next two weeks before returning to Champaign the last week of the year for their final homestand. Illinois ranks first in the League with 1.68 service aces per game and is third in hitting percentage at .261. Freshman Stephanie Obermeier ranks third in the Conference with 13.54 assists per game and junior Rachel VanMeter is fourth in kills per game with an average of 4.41.



Over the weekend, **Indiana** (8-18, 2-13) fell to Michigan, 3-0, before giving Michigan State a run for its money in the third game of a 3-1 loss. This past Wednesday, the Hoosiers dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker at home to rival Purdue. The Cream and Crimson will close out its four-match homestand on Friday with a tilt against Illinois at 7 p.m. Indiana is fifth in the League in service aces (1.24 per game) and sixth in blocks (2.35). Junior Mandy Eberle ranks fourth in the Conference with 1.22 blocks per game, while freshman Christine Nilles (0.29) and sophomore Tasha Arsenych (11.44) rank seventh in service aces and assists, respectively.



Iowa (9-17, 1-13) is coming off arguably its toughest homestand of the season as the Hawkeyes were swept by No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Ohio State. The Hawkeyes hit the road this weekend to face Michigan State on Friday and Michigan on Saturday. Iowa ranks fifth in the League with 16.09 digs per game, led by Pam Kavadas' third-best Conference mark of 5.15 dpg.



Michigan (17-8, 8-7) swept its third Big Ten road weekend since 1997 with wins at Indiana and Purdue. Freshman Stesha Selsky stepped up big against Purdue, recording a career-high 24 digs after donning the libero jersey in game three. Sophomore Erin Cobler ran her streak of double-digit kill outings to 12 in the last 14 matches. Senior Sarah Allen competed in her 100th match for the Maize and Blue against Indiana. Senior Jennifer Gandolph is just 10 kills away from recording 1,500 for her career. Michigan head coach Mark Rosen needs just two more victories to move into a tie for second place all-time at U-M for coaching victories.



Michigan State (10-12, 5-9) has won four out of its last five matches and is coming off a weekend split on the road at Purdue (L, 1-3) and Indiana (W, 3-1). The Spartans will look to continue the momentum this weekend as the Spartans host Iowa and Minnesota. MSU opened its Big Ten campaign this season on the road at these two schools, losing both matches 3-0. Michigan State is currently third in the League in service aces per game (1.30), led by senior Kim Schram's average of 0.32 per game, which ranks fifth in the Conference.



No. 5 **Minnesota** (22-4, 11-3) drew 9,437 fans combined to the Ohio State and Penn State matches this past weekend, which was the most attended two-match weekend at the Sports Pavilion in school history. Erin Martin recorded 35 kills this past week to move to 1,599 for her career and is only one kill shy of becoming the fifth Golden Gopher in school history to record 1,600 career kills. The Gophers set a school record with their third win over a top 10 opponent. The past two seasons, Minnesota has registered two wins in each season over a top 10 opponent. The Gophers travel to Michigan and Michigan State this weekend.



Northwestern (8-16, 3-11) defeated No. 25 Illinois in the first game of last Saturday night's match and played the nationally-ranked squad tough in the following games, before falling 3-1. Freshman Lindsay Anderson led both teams with 21 kills on the night, including eight in the opening frame to power the 'Cata to a win. She finished the night with a .347 hitting percentage. Senior co-captain Drew Robertson posted her 13th double-double on the year with 58 assists and 10 digs, and was only two kills away from landing her second triple-double this season. The Wildcats travel to Ohio State and Penn State this weekend.



No. 7 **Ohio State** (22-2, 12-2) will play four of the final six league matches at home starting with Northwestern and Wisconsin this week. OSU is 10-0 overall at home and 6-0 at home in conference matches. OSU's 22 wins this season doubles their wins (11) from last season. Marisa Main came within one kill of a triple-double at Minnesota. She had nine kills, 60 assists and 12 digs against the Gophers. At Minnesota, Rebecca Kastein tied her career high of 19 digs, which she previously set at Penn State. Ami Stevens also recorded a career-high 17 digs at Minnesota, bettering her previous high of 14, which was set twice.



No. 6 **Penn State** (21-2, 12-2) secured its 28th consecutive 20+ win season in the program's 29-year history with a win at Minnesota on November 5. The only year in which the Lions failed to reach the 20-win plateau was in 1976, the first year of the program, in which they only played 20 matches and finished with a record of 6-11-3. The Nittany Lions, who host Wisconsin on Friday and Northwestern on Saturday, currently rank first in the Conference in opponent hitting percentage (.149), and second in hitting percentage (.293), blocks per game (3.04) and digs per game (19.27).



Purdue (13-12, 6-9) split a homestand last weekend with a 3-1 win over Michigan State and a heartbreaking 3-2 defeat against Michigan, but bounced back to beat Indiana 3-2 on Wednesday. The Boilermakers will now host No. 25 Illinois on Saturday. Purdue ranks fourth in the League in digs per game (16.18) and fourth in assists (15.55) and kills (16.86). Individually in kills, junior Leah Wischmeier (4.28) and senior Kim McConaha (4.05) rank fifth and seventh, respectively, in the Big Ten.



Wisconsin (16-6, 10-6) fell to Illinois last weekend, which ended the Badgers' eight-match winning streak. The Badgers are in one of their toughest stretches of the year as UW is playing three straight road matches against teams ranked in the top 25. Illinois was No. 25, and the Badgers now face No. 4 Penn State on Friday and No. 8 Ohio State on Saturday. Among team notables, senior Jill Odenthal moved into ninth on the UW career kills list with 1,137. Teammate Sheila Shaw currently ranks ninth in the Conference in kills with an average of 3.86 per game.

Minnesota's Hebert Seven Wins Shy of 800

Minnesota head coach Mike Hebert stands just seven wins away from the 800th-victory milestone only seven total and four active coaches have ever reached. Hebert, in his ninth year at Minnesota, has recorded a career record of 793-338 (.701), as head coach of the Gophers, Illinois (1983-95), New Mexico (1980-82) and Pittsburgh (1976-79).

Penn State head coach Russ Rose is also one of the four active coaches to have reached 800 wins as he eclipsed the mark in the Nittany Lions' season opener. On September 3, PSU swept Rutgers 3-0, to make Rose only the sixth coach in Division I history to reach the 800-win plateau. Currently, Rose ranks second all-time among active coaches in winning percentage (.846, Hawaii's Dave Shoji-.850) and third all-time in victories (820).

Badgers Upset Minnesota in Madison

Wisconsin upset No. 2 Minnesota October 30 in a thrilling 3-2 match in Madison. The win, which was Wisconsin's seventh straight, was witnessed by a season-high crowd of 5,136 at the UW Field House and marked the first time since 2001 that the Badgers had beaten an opponent ranked as high as No. 2, when they last did it against USC.

Michigan State's Erbe Earns 550th Career Win

Michigan State head coach Chuck Erbe earned his 550th career win on October 27, with a 3-2 victory over intrastate rival Michigan. Erbe, now in his 12th year in East Lansing, was head coach at Southern California from 1976-1988, before taking the helm of the Spartans in 1993.

Michigan's Rosen Joins Century Club With Wolverines

Michigan head coach Mark Rosen captured his 100th win with the Maize and Blue against Northwestern on October 22, marking the second milestone for the Wolverine mentor this season. Rosen, in his 13th year, recorded his 300th career victory on September 11 against Oakland.

Gentil Digging Away in Big Ten Record Books

Minnesota junior libero Paula Gentil has closed in on second place on the Big Ten all-time (1,856) and season (626) digs list. Gentil is now just 64 digs out of second place (1,920 - Susan Wohlford, Wisconsin, 1988-91) and 75 away from the all-time Big Ten record (1,931 - Janet Moylan, Iowa, 1987-90). She is also just 30 digs shy of breaking her own Big Ten single-season record of 656 set last season. Gentil broke her own school record with 39 digs (13.0 dpg) against Michigan on September 25, bettering her previous high of 37 against then-No. 1 USC on August 28 in five games. Gentil's school record marked just the first time a League player has recorded 39 or more digs in a match since October 20, 1990.

Ohio State Wins 3-2 Thriller in Battle of Top 10 Teams

No. 7 Ohio State topped then-No. 5 Penn State, 3-2, in State College on October 20 in the 17th match in League history two Big Ten teams ranked in the nation's top 10 battled in Conference action. On October 2, then-No. 4 Penn State dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to top-ranked Minnesota, marking the highest-ranked match in Big Ten history. Of the 17 matches in which Big Ten teams have been ranked in the top 10, the Nittany Lions have been a participant on 15 occasions.

Ohio State's Gordon Sets All-Time Big Ten Kill Mark

Ohio State's Stacey Gordon, who set a Big Ten record last season with 6.62 kills per game, broke the all-time Big Ten kill record of 2,379, established by Minnesota's Nicole Branagh from 1997-2000, on October 15. Her record-breaking kill came on her 27th of 31 kills against the Wolverines. Gordon currently stands at 2,541 kills for her career, which is sixth on the NCAA Division I career kills list. She stands 134 kills behind No. 5 Priscilla Pacheco (1991-94) of Georgia who has 2,675.

Three Standouts Setting Own Marks in Kills History

Several other Big Ten student-athletes have their sights set on individual marks for kills this season as well. Indiana's Christina Archibald has 1,728 kills over her career, while Minnesota's Erin Martin is only the seventh Gopher to record 1,500 kills in a career, as she now has 1,599 kills. Michigan's Jennifer Gandolph (1,490) is also quickly approaching the 1,500-kill mark.

Big Ten Ranks Among Nation's Best

As of November 7, the Big Ten boasted several of its teams and student-athletes at or near the top of the NCAA statistical rankings. Ohio State's Stacey Gordon leads the nation in kills per game (7.22), while teammate Marisa Main is third in the country in assists per game (14.73). Minnesota's Paula Gentil ranks third currently in digs with 6.52 per game. In team categories, Ohio State ranks second in the nation in assists per game (16.90) followed by Minnesota (16.17) at No. 5 and Penn State (16.09) at No. 8. OSU also holds the nation's best mark in kills per game (18.40) and is second in hitting percentage (.319).

Nearly 11,000 Gopher Fans Help Minnesota Set Record

On October 16, Minnesota broke a school record for attendance with 10,927 fans for a match at Williams Arena. The 10,927 fans that came to see the Gophers defeat then-No. 23 Illinois, were the most fans to attend a Division I volleyball match this season. Minnesota's old record of 6,046 was set in Williams Arena on September 28, 1990 against Purdue.

The Minnesota-Illinois match was the second-highest attend match between two Big Ten teams in the history of the League. The highest attended match came when 10,935 fans watched Illinois and Wisconsin battle on November 30, 1990, in Madison.

A Streak To Remember

Prior to falling 3-1 to Ohio State on October 1, Minnesota spent three weeks at the top spot in the national rankings -- the first time in school history the Golden Gophers had ever been rank No. 1. In that span, Minnesota went 6-1, marking the first time a Big Ten squad had ruled the collegiate volleyball scene in three-consecutive weeks since Penn State in 1999. The Nittany Lions held the No. 1 rank for 11-straight weeks from October 4, 1999 until the final poll of the 1999 season when PSU captured the NCAA title.

Bowman on Top of Game Versus Top-Ranked Competition

Minnesota's Kelly Bowman has tallied six triple-doubles this year, with two coming against three of the top four teams in the nation. On August 28, Bowman recorded 17 kills, 18 digs and 40 assists versus No. 1 USC, while on September 11, she recorded 11 kills, 19 kills and 15 assists against No. 4 Florida. Bowman also delivered 16 kills, 21 digs and 34 assists at No. 4 Penn State on October 2. Most recently, she recorded 17 kills, 10 digs and 26 assists at Wisconsin in the Gophers' 3-2 loss on October 30.

Big Ten Boasts Big Upsets of Top-Ranked Teams

On two occasions this season, a Big Ten team has upset the nation's top-ranked team. No. 16 Ohio State knocked off No. 1 Minnesota 3-1 (30-24, 30-23, 18-30, 30-24) on October 1, while on September 11, then-No. 16 Illinois defeated top-ranked and two-time defending national champion USC, 3-2, ending the longest winning streak in NCAA volleyball history at 52 straight. The Illini topped the Women of Troy 30-24, 24-30, 12-30, 30-27, 15-8, which marked the first time in school history that the Orange and Blue defeated a number one team. Earlier this year, Minnesota dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker to then-No. 1 USC at the NACWAA Tournament.

Crashing The Net

In the past four weeks, three Big Ten season highs have been recorded at the net by League standouts. Three weeks ago, Penn State's Sam Tortorello set a season high for assists with 74 in a 3-2 loss to Ohio State, while in that same match, the Buckeyes' Stacey Gordon tied her top total for the year with a League's best mark of 36 kills this season. Wisconsin freshman Taylor Reineke turned in a 12-block performance against Indiana on October 15, marking the highest total number of blocks in a match by a League player this year.

Big Ten Boasts Winning Record Over Top-25 Teams

In the four total weeks of non-conference action, Big Ten teams won a combined 10-5 against top-25 competition. League teams defeated two top-10 teams, including then top-ranked USC (Illinois, 3-2), and posted a record of 7-4 against teams in the top-15. On three occasions, three different Big Ten teams defeated the 12th-ranked team, as Purdue and Wisconsin topped then-No. 12 Georgia Tech the first week of September, while Penn State topped No. 12 Stanford the week after.

Gophers' Gentil and Lions' Walters Dig Down Deep

Two Big Ten student-athletes from two different teams were looking for one League record on October 2. Minnesota's Paula Gentil set the Big Ten record for digs in a match with 47, bettering the previous record of 44 set by Wisconsin's Susan Wohlford against Iowa on October 20, 1990. On the other side of the net, Penn State junior libero Kaleena Walters matched Wohlford's mark with a career-high and Penn State record 44 digs against the Gophers.

OSU's Stone Reaches No. 500

Ohio State head coach Jim Stone captured his 500th career win on September 17 when his Buckeyes defeated Northeastern, 3-1. The win ranks him fourth among active coaches in the League. With his Buckeyes owning a 22-2 record this season, Stone has a career mark of 513-301 (.630).

Worth the Wait for Waite

Wisconsin head coach Pete Waite captured career win No. 400 on September 17 in a 3-0 sweep of Virginia. Waite, who is in his 17th year at the helm of the Badgers, has 412 career wins and ranks near the top 10 in winning percentage at .740 (412-145) overall.

OTHER TOP LEAGUE PERFORMERS

ILLINOIS - Rachel VanMeter, JR, Outside Hitter

VanMeter has a streak of five straight matches with at least 18 kills with 103 kills in that span. She led Illinois to two victories last weekend.

INDIANA - Christina Archibald, SR, Outside Hitter

Archibald led Indiana with 26 kills during last week's action. The Belleville, Ill., product also added 18 digs for the Hoosiers.

IOWA - Laura Simpson, SR, Outside Hitter

Simpson returned from illness to lead the Hawkeyes this past weekend. Against Penn State, she recorded 10 kills, one solo block, and three block assists. Simpson played in limited action against Ohio State.

MICHIGAN - Katie Bruzdinski, FR, Outside Hitter

Bruzdinski was solid in a 3-0 win over Indiana, but truly shone against Purdue, helping Michigan capture its third road series sweep since 1997 and the second in two seasons against the Big Ten's Indiana schools. Bruzdinski had six kills in a critical game four to tie the match against Purdue, two games apiece, and then recorded four kills and the match-winning ace in game five for the win. Bruzdinski just missed out on back-to-back double-doubles.

MICHIGAN STATE - Kim Schram, SR, Outside Hitter

Schram had 24 kills in a 3-1 loss at Purdue, but helped the Spartans bounce back with a 3-1 win at Indiana. In that match, Schram had six digs and four blocks to go along 25 kills.

NORTHWESTERN - Drew Robertson, SR, Setter

Robertson posted her 13th double-double on the year with 58 assists and 10 digs, and was only two kills away from landing her second triple-double this season against No. 25 Illinois. She led the 'Cats to a victory in the first game -- marking the first time this year NU has taken a game from a top 25 opponent. In the 'Cats mid-week action against Wisconsin, Robertson recorded 28 assists and 10 digs. She also added three kills and hit .333.

OHIO STATE - Stacey Gordon, SR, Outside Hitter

Gordon's 21 kills at Iowa and 27 against Minnesota extended her streak of double-figure kill matches to 100. She has had double-figure kills in 113 of 115 career matches. Gordon has had 20 or more kills in her last 10 matches and 15 of the last 16. Against Minnesota, OSU trailed 2-1 in games when Gordon went on a terror recording 10 kills in 20 attempts with one error for a .450 hitting percentage. She added seven digs, one assist and one assist block as well.

PURDUE - Leah Wischmeier, JR, Outside Hitter

Wischmeier registered 22 kills for Purdue in a 3-1 win against Michigan State last weekend. She would go on to register her 1,000th-career kill the following night in a 3-1 loss to Michigan. The Brownstown, Ind., native posted 22 kills on the night, moving her career total to 1,001.

WISCONSIN - Marian Weidner, SR, Outside Hitter

Weidner smashed 14 kills against Northwestern, while hitting .417 in the mid-week match. She responded by registering six kills and eight digs in a 3-0 loss to Illinois last Friday.
