**2005 BIG TEN MEN'S PREVIEW**

Second-ranked **Wisconsin** is looking for its seventh consecutive Big Ten Championship this Sunday, Oct. 30, when all league schools converge on the Les Bolstad Golf Course at the University of Minnesota.

The 8,000-meter race will take place at 11:30 a.m., following the Women's Big Ten Championship at 10:45.

The Badgers, who were runner-up at the 2004 NCAA Championships, finished 1-2-3 at Big Tens last year and placed all seven runners in the top 21. Wisconsin's total of 23 points was the fourth-lowest winning score in Big Ten history and its 58-point margin of victory over Indiana was the largest ever in conference history, bettering the previous mark of 55, set by the Badgers in 1910.

**Iowa**, which finished third last year, enters the race ranked 11th in the MONDO National Top 30 Poll, followed by No. 17 **Michigan**, which placed fifth in Iowa City last season. The 2004 Big Ten runner-up **Indiana** Hoosiers enter the weekend ranked 22nd, followed by No. 23 **Minnesota** and No. 26 **Ohio State**. **Michigan State** is currently receiving votes.

Wisconsin senior **Simon Bairu** is the two-time defending Big Ten champion and the reigning NCAA title holder. Bairu's Big Ten winning time of 23:45 at Iowa last year was 13 seconds faster than his first-place mark from the previous year. Wisconsin has claimed six individual titles in the past seven years and 24 overall to go along with 38 total team titles. The Badgers' total exceeds the next three teams combined - Michigan State (14), Indiana (13) and Michigan (9).

Badger mentor **Jerry Schumacher** earned his fourth consecutive Big Ten Coach of the Year award in 2004, which marks his fifth honor in six seasons. A sixth title for Schumacher would tie the conference record with former Wisconsin coach Martin Smith (1989-91-92-94-95-96).

This year's event marks the seventh occasion Minnesota has hosted the Men's Big Ten Championship. The Golden Gophers first hosted in 1926, when Wisconsin bested Ohio State for the league title. In fact, of the six previous championships held at Minnesota, Wisconsin has claimed first-place four times (1926-81-90-95), while Northwestern won the 1965 event and Michigan State tasted victory in 1971.

**2005 BIG TEN WOMEN'S PREVIEW**

All 11 conference schools, including five ranked in the FinishLynx National Top 30 Poll, will compete at the 2005 Big Ten Championship this Sunday, Oct. 30, which is hosted by the University of Minnesota.

The 6,000-meter race, which precedes the men's 8K race, will take place at 10:45 a.m.

No. 3 **Michigan** looks to capture its fourth straight conference title and seventh overall, after posting three consecutive titles from 1992-94 and 2002-2004. Wolverine mentor **Mike McGuire**, now in his 14th season, has a host of runners that have made headlines this season as five of the eight Runner of the Week selections went to Michigan this season. U-M sophomore **Alyson Kohlmeier**, who earned three of those awards, helped pace the Maize and Blue last season with a seventh-place finish at Big Tens. **Rebecca Walter**, last year's runner-up and 2003 conference champion and Athlete of the Year, also returns for a Wolverine squad that posted the sixth-highest winning score (45 points) in Big Ten history in 2004.

The Wolverines, who placed three runners in the top 10 and scored all five runners in the top 16, have now finished in the top two at the championships 12 times under McGuire's tutelage.

This year's individual crown is there for the taking as 2004 Big Ten champion **Danette Doetzel** of Michigan State did not return to East Lansing for her sophomore campaign. In 2004, she became only the second freshman in league history to claim Big Ten Athlete and Freshman of the Year accolades in the same season and the first since 1994. The Spartan freshman won the 6,000-meter race in convincing fashion in a Big Ten-record time of 20:33, besting second-place finisher Walter of Michigan. The Spartans recorded 85 points and finished tied for second with Illinois, which is currently ranked sixth nationally.

**Minnesota**, which is ranked 11th, finished fourth in 2004. Rounding out the current top 30 poll is No. 23 **Michigan State** and No. 30 **Iowa**, which took seventh last season.

This year's event marks the third occasion Minnesota has hosted the Women's Big Ten Championship. The Golden Gophers first hosted in 1990, when **Indiana** topped runner-up **Wisconsin** for the championship. The Badgers returned to Minnesota to claim first place in 1995, defeating Michigan by 28 points.
