*** CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES *** Kansas State vs. Kansas March 10, 2007

CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

- Kansas advances to the Big 12 Championship game for the sixth time in school history. They are 4-1 all-time in the finals (defeated Texas 80-68 to capture the 2006 Big 12 title in Dallas). Their four championships are the most for any Big 12 school.
- Kansas will play the winner of the Texas/Oklahoma State game for the title. The Jayhawks are 1-1 against Texas and 3-2 against Oklahoma State in Big 12 Championship play.
- Kansas beat both Oklahoma State (87-57, 1/10 in Lawrence) and Texas (90-86, 3/3 in Lawrence) during the regular season.
- Kansas junior guard Russell Robinson had one steal (has 17 total) to move up to fourth place all-time on the Big 12 Championship steals list.
- Kansas coach Bill Self is 7-2 overall in Big 12 Championship play, tying him with former Kansas coach Roy Williams with the highest winning percentage (.778) of any coach in Big 12 Championship history.
- Since 1999, every BCS Conference School with 20+ overall wins and 10+ conference wins has been invited to the NCAA Tournament (169 wins).

TEAM NOTES

- Kansas State had their biggest lead of the game at 16-9 with 13:57 to play in the first half before Kansas went on a 26-12 run to end the half.

Kansas State

- Senior guard Lance Harris was 4-8 from 3-point range and stands in fifth place on the Big 12 Championship for 3-point field goal percentage (.512).
- Kansas State is now 0-2 in the Big 12 Championship semi-finals, with both losses coming to Kansas.

Kansas

- The Jayhawks improve to 4-1 when playing at the Ford Center and 5-2 in games played in Oklahoma City.
- KU held K-State to just 40 percent from the field (21-52 FG). It has held each opponent this season to under 50 percent shooting (29 straight opponents).
- Kansas has held 15 different opponents under 60 points in 2006-07, including eight in Big 12 play.
