ON TAP

After improving its unbeaten streak to seven games (6-0-1) following its championship at the Denver Cup, Boston University kicks off a stretch of seven straight Hockey East contests with a home game against Maine. This is the 100th meeting between the two league rivals.

HALFWAY THERE

The Terriers are at the official midpoint of their season, having posted a 13-4-1 record through 18 games in their 36-game schedule. BU was 5-10-3 after 18 games during the 2007-08 season.

SERIES HISTORY

- The Terriers and Black Bears have played 99 times since first meeting in the 1923-24 season, and BU holds a 48-42-9 edge (.530), including a perfect 4-0-1 record in match-ups at Agganis Arena.
- Over the previous three seasons, the Terriers have posted an 8-0-1 record against the Black Bears. The nine-game unbeaten streak against Maine is BU's longest in the series in over 20 years.
- Since the formation of Hockey East in 1984-85, the Terriers have a 35-31-9 (.527) league advantage.
- Nineteen meetings have gone into overtime and BU holds a 7-2-10 (.632) advantage in those games. BU has recorded six of the 10 shutouts in the series.
- The Terriers' longest winning streak in the series was 13 games (Jan. 16, 1982 - Feb. 15, 1986). The Black Bears' longest streak was 11 games (Oct. 31, 1986 - Nov. 10, 1989) and came just after the BU win streak.

SCOUTING THE BLACK BEARS

- After winning 10 of its 16 games (10-5-1) in the first half of the season, Maine is 0-2-1 since returning to action on Dec. 27-28 at the Florida College Classic.
- The Black Bears are coming off a tough 5-4 home loss to New Hampshire on Sunday. Maine led 4-2 early in the third before the Wildcats reeled off three straight goals. Maine is sixth in the league standings with 11 points, two points behind third-place BU.
- Maine is 5-2-1 in non-conference play with wins over Alaska, Niagara (2) and Union (2).

- Maine's scoring defense ranks seventh in the nation at 2.05.
- Freshman Gustav Nyquist has made an immediate impact with team highs in both goals (9) and assists (9) for 18 points. Classmate Bryan Flynn (6-7—13), sophomore Tanner House (6-6—12) and senior Christopher Hahn (4-7—11) are the only others in double-figure scoring.
- Goaltender Scott Darling has emerged as a league Rookie of the Year candidate with a .928 save percentage and a 1.84 goals against average in 15 starts.
- Tim Whitehead is in his eighth season at the Maine helm and has a record of 177-94-31 at the school.

LAST YEAR'S SERIES

- BU swept Maine last season, posting a 3-1 victory at Alford Arena on Jan. 12 before recording back-to-back overtime wins (2-1, 1-0) at home on Feb. 15-16.
- Colin Wilson had four points (2g, 2a) in the series, including the lone goal of the finale. Classmate Kevin Shattenkirk tallied the game-winning goal and added an assist in the 3-1 road win. Luke Popko scored the overtime winner on Feb. 15.

TERRIERS TOP PIONEERS TO CLAIM DENVER CUP

- Behind a strong start and great special-teams play, BU claimed the title at the Wells Fargo Denver Cup with a 4-1 victory over then-No. 5 Denver on Saturday at Magness Arena. The Terriers advanced to the title game with a 6-2 win against Rensselaer on Friday.
- Senior Matt Gilroy, who scored the eventual game-winner against Denver, was named tournament MVP, and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by classmate Jason Lawrence (2 goals vs. RPI), freshman David Warsofsky (4 assists in the tournament) and freshman goaltender Kieran Millan, who recorded a career-best 33 saves against the Pioneers.
- It marked just the fourth time in the 17-year history of the tournament that Denver was not the champion, and it was just the second time the Pioneers had fallen in the championship game.
- Denver (13-6-2) came up empty on seven power-play chances, while Gilroy's goal came on a man advantage and gave BU a 2-0 lead at 11:05 of the first.
- Senior Brandon Yip scored arguably the biggest goal of the tournament and assisted on the game-winner.

HOCKEY ON CAMPUS

Bernie Corbett and Paul McNamara are once again teaming up on Wednesdays this winter to bring weekly college hockey talk to Boston's radio airwaves, co-hosting the popular "Hockey On Campus" program on ESPN Radio (890 AM) from 7 to 9 p.m.

After Denver got on the board at 17:41 of the second to get within one at 2-1, Yip scored just over a minute later off a faceoff win by sophomore Nick Bonino to help the Terriers reestablish a two-goal lead.

- Freshman Vinny Saponari opened the scoring and assisted on an empty-net tally by junior Zach Cohen with 1:08 left in regulation.
- On Friday, the Terriers broke a second-period tie with four unanswered goals to roll to a 6-2 victory over RPI in first-round action.
- Lawrence scored two power-play goals, including the game-winner. Zach Cohen notched a goal and an assist, while freshman Kevin Gilroy, junior Luke Popko and Yip also scored goals.
- Freshman Grant Rollheiser recorded 13 saves to earn the win in goal against the Engineers.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

BU is the only team in the country to have a perfect non-conference record (7-0-0). Last year, the Terriers went 2-6-1 in non-conference play. BU went undefeated in its 10 non-conference games (9-0-1) during the 1995-96 season, but had not won its first seven non-league contests since the 1991-92 campaign, when it was a perfect 12-0-0.

PENALTY KILL STEPS UP

The Terriers have successfully killed off 34 of their opponents' last 35 power plays, including a current stretch of 27 straight.

KEEPING IT CLOSE

Boston University, Miami and Nebraska-Omaha are the only three teams in the nation who have suffered just one multi-goal loss this season.

FAST PACE

BU, which is aiming for its 14th victory of the season, did not earn its 14th win of the 2007-08 campaign until Feb. 23. The Terriers entered

the semester break with 11 wins for the first time since the 1999-00 season.

ON BOTH ENDS

Among Hockey East teams, BU has scored the most goals (63) and given up the fewest (37).

A DIFFERENT DEFENSE

BU has allowed 37 goals through 18 games, giving up more than two goals only four times. Last year, the Terriers let in 63 goals in their first 18 contests and gave up three or more goals in 12 of their first 16 games.

FACE LIFT

After winning just 47 percent of their faceoffs (238-of-505) in their first eight games, the Terriers have won 54 percent of their faceoffs (336-of-285) in their last 10 contests.

POSITIVE IMPACT

Led by freshman David Warsofsky at plus-10, 20 of the 22 BU skaters that have played this season have a positive plus/minus rating.

QUICK HITS

- BU's combined special teams percentage of .576 is tops in the nation.
- Dating back to Feb. 8, the Terriers are 24-7-1 in their last 32 games.
- BU has scored a goal in 12 straight periods and has opened the scoring in nine of its last 10 contests.
- Five of junior Zach Cohen's nine career goals have come in the last seven games.
- The Terriers' offense ranks second in the country, averaging 3.72 goals per game. The defense is allowing just 2.06 goals per contest, good for eighth in the nation.
- BU's current seven-game unbeaten stretch (6-0-1) is the third-longest active streak in the nation (Notre Dame - 16; Ohio State - 8).

- The Terriers had outshot their opponent in their first 17 games this season before Denver held a 34-27 shot advantage on Saturday.
- BU leads all Hockey East teams and ranks third nationally in scoring margin (1.67).

TWO TERRIERS PLAY AT WORLD JUNIORS

- Sophomores Colin Wilson and Kevin Shattenkirk played for the U.S. National Junior Team at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship, in Ottawa, Ont., on Dec. 26 - Jan. 5. Team USA placed fifth in the tournament.
- Wilson, Shattenkirk and UNH's James van Riemsdyk were named Team USA's three best players of the tournament. Shattenkirk was the top scoring defenseman in the event and tied for eighth overall with nine points (1-8), while Wilson recorded eight points (3g, 5a).
- Wilson played at Juniors for the second straight year, as the centerman scored seven points, including a tournament-best six goals, for the 2008 U.S. squad that finished fourth. Shattenkirk made his World Junior debut.
- BU was one of five schools (Michigan, Minnesota, UNH, Notre Dame) to have multiple players named to the team and Hockey East led all conferences with five players selected.

SETTLING IN

- Freshman Kieran Millan is 9-1-1 so far in his rookie campaign and his winning percentage of .864 ranks third in the nation.
- His goals against average of 1.72 is good for seventh in the country while his .929 save percentage ranks 14th.
- Millan earned a win in each of his first five starts, becoming the first BU netminder to do so since Michel Larocque (1995-96 season).

HOME RUN

The Terriers are 8-2-1 at home this season and are 16-3-1 in their last 20 contests at Agganis Arena. They had a stretch of 11 straight regular-season home wins snapped in a 4-3 setback against Vermont on Nov. 21.

FIRST-HALF FLIP

The Terriers went 11-4-1 in the first half this season after posting a 4-10-2 record before the semester break during the 2007-08 campaign.

SIBLING RIVALRY

Freshman Chris Connolly is tied for 19th nationally among freshmen in points per game (0.78). His younger brother, Jack (a freshman at Minnesota Duluth), is tied for 33rd at 0.65.

SOPHOMORE SENSATIONS

Sophomore Colin Wilson has a team-best 21 points on the year with seven goals and 14 assists and classmate Nick Bonino has recorded 19 points (6g, 13a). Fellow sophomores Colby Cohen (1-12-13) and Kevin Shattenkirk (3-8-11) rank first and second among Hockey East defensemen in points per game at 0.76 and 0.69, respectively.

BALANCED ATTACK

- Eighteen different Terriers have scored at least one goal so far this season. Only St. Cloud State (20), Wisconsin (20) and North Dakota (19) have spread out their scoring more.
- Seniors Chris Higgins, Jason Lawrence and

Brandon Yip are tied for the team lead with eight goals each. Sophomore Colin Wilson has seven goals and junior Zach Cohen and sophomore Nick Bonino have each tallied six.

POWERFUL POWER PLAY

BU's power play is currently ranked second in the nation at 23.7 percent (22-of-93). Senior Jason Lawrence has seven power-play goals, tying him for the fourth-most in the nation.

GET SHORTY

The Terriers already have four shorthanded goals this season after tallying just two in 2007-08.

TOUGH TO BLANK

- The Terriers have gone 71 games without being shut out, second only to New Hampshire (72) for the longest active streak.
- BU has not been handed a shutout loss in 84 games (1-0, vs. BC, 12/2/06) - the longest such streak in the nation.
- It has been nearly five years since the Terriers have been shut out on the road (4-0, at BC, 3/12/04).

EVEN STRENGTH A STRENGTH

BU has nearly doubled up its opponents in even-strength play this season (38-20).

SCORING BY CLASS

Led by a combined 40 points from Colin Wilson and Nick Bonino, the sophomores lead a tight race for scoring by class with 70 points (18g, 52a). The seniors are right behind with 66 points, including an impressive 28 goals.

DEFENSE MAKES OPENING STATEMENT

For the first time in program history, BU allowed two or fewer goals in each of its first six games.

OFF AND RUNNING

The Terriers won six of their first seven games for the first time since winning 11 of their first 12 games during the 1997-98 campaign.

PENALTIES PILING UP

The Terriers are averaging 17.6 penalty minutes per contest — the 15th-most in the nation. Last season, BU ranked 41st with just 13.2 penalty minutes a game.

RANK AND FILE

On Nov. 12, BU was ranked first in both national polls for the first time since March 20, 2006. The Terriers had not been at the top of the polls during the regular season since Jan. 5, 1998. In just its fourth season at the varsity level, the Terriers' women's ice hockey team earned its highest ranking ever in November when it was fourth in the USCHO.com poll.

OCTOBER REVERSAL

Last season, BU went 0-4-1 in October, resulting in its worst start since 1976. This year, the Terriers posted a 4-1-0 record in October.

TERRIER TRIO

- Three Terriers have earned Hockey East Rookie Player of the Week honors this season.
- Sophomore Colin Wilson earned the accolade on Nov. 10 after scoring a career-high four points (2g, 2a) in a 6-4 come-from-behind road victory over UMass Lowell.
- After scoring two power-play goals in a 7-2 victory over perennial power Michigan, senior Jason Lawrence earned the honor on Oct. 27.
- Sophomore Kevin Shattenkirk was the first honoree on Oct. 13 after scoring two goals in the Ice Breaker, including the game-winner against Michigan State, and bolstering a defense that held each opponent to one goal.

NTDP REPRESENTATION

Nine current BU players played for the Ann Arbor-based USA Hockey National Team Development Program, marking the highest total of any school in the country. Minnesota has eight former NTDP players on its roster, while Michigan has six. Each of the last three captains of the U.S. National Under-18 Team (Brian Strait, Kevin Shattenkirk, David Warsofsky) is part of the Terriers' defensive corps this season.

FUTURE PROS

Boston University has 13 NHL draftees on its roster this year, tying it with Michigan and North Dakota for the second most in the country. Minnesota has a nation-high 17 NHL picks. The 13 Terriers were taken by 10 different clubs between 2004-08. Three of the them were taken by the Colorado Avalanche (Kevin Shattenkirk, Colby Cohen, Brandon Yip).

BU PICKED SECOND IN HOCKEY EAST

Boston University was picked second in the Hockey East Preseason Coaches' Poll, as announced at the league's annual media day on Sept. 29. The Terriers, who finished second in last year's regular-season standings, received

80 points, including three first-place votes, and trailed only Boston College, who received six first-place votes and 86 total points. BU has claimed seven Hockey East regular-season crowns and six conference tournament titles.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Senior defenseman Matt Gilroy, who earned first-team All-America honors last season, was named to the Inside College Hockey Preseason All-America Third Team and the All-College Hockey News Preseason Second Team. Sophomore forward Colin Wilson earned a spot on the INCH Preseason Second Team, while freshman defenseman David Warsofsky was selected to the INCH Preseason All-Rookie Team.

WEARING THE "C"

Senior forward John McCarthy (Andover, Mass.) and classmate Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, N.Y.) are serving as co-captains of the Terriers this season. Junior defenseman Brian Strait (Waltham, Mass.) is an assistant captain.

HONORING HIS BROTHER

Senior Matt Gilroy is just the second Terrier to wear a number higher than 40 (Jason Tapp wore 83 for his sister from 1998-02). The North Bellmore, N.Y., native made a promise to his mother, Peggy Ann, that he would always wear 97 to honor his brother, Timmy, who died after a bike accident. Timmy wore 97 while playing hockey at the Mite level. His brother, Kevin, is his freshman teammate this season.

WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcome 10 freshmen to their roster this season, including six forwards, two defensemen and two goaltenders. The class was ranked third in the country by Inside College Hockey and half of the class has been drafted by an NHL team. The 10-man group represents eight different states and Canadian provinces.

88TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 88th season of intercollegiate play and currently hold a 1344-776-128 (.626). BU's 1,344 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,587 wins - 88 seasons) and Michigan (1,461 wins - 87 seasons). The three geographically separated programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 18 national titles between them.

COACH PARKER NOTES

36th SEASON

Jack Parker is now in his 36th season and holds an overall record of 794-410-98 (.647). His 794

wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution. He ranks second among active coaches in wins and fifth in winning percentage.

VS. THE BLACK BEARS

Parker has coached 98 games against Maine and has posted a record of 48-41-9 (.536). In league play, Parker is 42-34-9 (.547) versus the Black Bears, including a 35-31-9 (.527) mark in Hockey East.

VS. WHITEHEAD

This marks the 41st time that Parker and Tim Whitehead have been on opposing benches. In the previous 40 meetings, Parker holds a 21-15-4 (.575) record. Since Whitehead took over the Maine helm in 2001, Parker holds a 12-9-3 (.563) advantage. When Whitehead was the head coach at UMass Lowell, the two met on 16 occasions and Parker was 9-6-1 (.594).

GOOD COMPANY

Head coach Jack Parker ranks second among active coaches with 794 career victories. Of the seven other active bench bosses with 400 or more career wins, BU has faced six of them (Jerry York, Boston College; Rick Comley, Michigan State; Red Berenson, Michigan; George Gwozdecky, Denver; Dick Umile, New Hampshire; Joe Marsh, St. Lawrence) this season.

GAME RECAPS

BU TOPS LOWELL IN FIRST-HALF FINALE

- A power-play offering from Colby Cohen went off the skate of Chris Higgins and into the net to break a third-period tie and boost BU to a 3-2 home win over UMass Lowell on Dec. 12.
- The Terriers rallied from deficits of 1-0 and 2-1 to stretch their unbeaten streak to five games (4-0-1). Joe Pereira became the 18th different Terrier to score a goal this season and also added an assist. Zach Cohen scored the game-tying goal late in the second and Kieran Millan turned in a 22-save performance.
- BU's penalty kill was key to the victory, as UMass Lowell came up empty on all six of its power-play opportunities.
- Lowell opened the scoring just 64 seconds into the game before Pereira tied the contest with just under a minute left in the first period.

TERRIERS EARN THREE POINTS VS. BC

- BU posted a three-point weekend against then-No. 2/3 Boston College in a home-and-home series on Dec. 5-6. After the teams battled to a 1-1 draw at Agganis, the Terriers posted a 3-1 road victory over their archrival the following night.
- Chris Connolly tallied BU's first penalty-shot goal in over six years for the eventual game-winner on Dec. 6 and also assisted on Corey Trivino's first career goal, which opened the scoring. Connolly was named Hockey East Rookie of the Week for his efforts.
- On Dec. 5, BU's John McCarthy and BC's Brock Bradford scored 19 seconds apart in the first period to account for the scoring.
- Kieran Millan allowed one goal in each game, stopping 39 of the 41 shots he faced on the weekend. He kept the Eagles scoreless for a stretch of just under 100 minutes spanning the

two games and was named Hockey East Co-Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

- BU snapped a six-game winless streak (0-4-2) in its series with BC.

TERRIERS TOP ST. LAWRENCE

- BU kept its perfect non-conference record intact with a 4-1 home win over St. Lawrence on Nov. 29, as 11 different Terriers earned at least one point.
- Brandon Yip, Zach Cohen and Colin Wilson all scored a goal for the second time in as many games and Kevin Shattenkirk also found the back of the net. John McCarthy had the first two-assist game of his career. Kieran Millan turned in a 24-save performance.
- After Yip opened the scoring at 8:13 of the first, the Saints tied it up just over seven minutes later on a power-play tally off a faceoff.
- Cohen recorded his first career game-winner on a redirect with 19.7 seconds left in the first before BU tacked on a pair of insurance goals in the second.

TERRIERS HOLD OFF CRUSADERS

- Colin Wilson scored the eventual game-winner and added an assist to help the Terriers earn a 3-2 decision over visiting Holy Cross on Nov. 25.
- BU never trailed in the game, breaking a scoreless tie early in the second with back-to-back goals from Brandon Yip and Zach Cohen.
- Wilson gave BU a 3-1 lead with a power-play tally at 9:25 of the third only to see the Crusaders muster a shorthanded goal 23 seconds later.
- BU held off the visitors down the stretch, including a last-minute penalty kill.
- Grant Rollheiser made 19 saves in goal for BU.

CATAMOUNTS SET BACK TERRIERS

- BU suffered its first two home losses of the season on Nov. 21-22 as then-No. 15 Vermont posted back-to-back 4-3 wins to become the first opponent to sweep a weekend series at BU since Maine on Nov. 20-21, 1992.
- In each game, the Terriers got on the board first only to fall behind then rally with a third-period goal to create a 3-3 deadlock. However, the Catamounts broke the late tie both nights.
- In the first game, Luke Popko, Chris Higgins and Jason Lawrence scored for the Terriers.
- BU held a commanding 41-24 shot advantage, but Rob Madore turned in a standout 38-save performance for the visitors.
- Faced with a 3-1 deficit on Saturday, Chris Connolly and Brandon Yip scored for BU to tie the game, but UVM's Corey Carlson netted the game-winner at 8:07 of the third.
- Carlson, Viktor Stalberg and Dan Lawson each had a goal and an assist for Vermont, which got a 32-save performance from Mike Spillane.
- Higgins opened the scoring with his team-leading seventh goal of the season and Colin Wilson and Colby Cohen each earned two assists on the night for the Terriers.
- Kieran Millan made a then-career-best 28 saves in goal for BU.

TERRIERS BLANK NORTHEASTERN

- Kieran Millan made 18 saves to record his first collegiate shutout in a 3-0 win over then-No. 7 Northeastern on Nov. 16 at Agganis Arena.

- UMass scored the only goal of the second before BU made it a 3-1 contest in the early stages of the third. The Minutemen, however, responded just over a minute later to regain the three-goal edge.

WILSON IGNITES LATE COMEBACK VS. LOWELL

- Colin Wilson netted his second goal of the game with 14.5 seconds left to play to break a 4-4 tie and lead BU to a thrilling 6-4 road victory over UMass Lowell on Nov. 7. The Terriers scored half of their six goals in the final 2:14.
- Wilson added a pair of assists to tie his career high of four points, while Chris Higgins tallied the game-tying goal with 2:14 left in the third before adding another with just six-tenths of a second left on the clock.

- Kieran Millan made 15 saves as the Terriers held a 32-17 advantage in shots on goal and scored on five of their nine power-play chances.

- The Terriers jumped out to a 3-0 lead early on in the second period on a shorthanded tally by Yip. Merrimack, however, responded with consecutive goals less than three minutes apart.
- BU regained control in the third with goals at the 6:21 and 7:30 marks to reestablish a three-goal lead and go on to win its 13th straight meeting with the Warriors.

TERRIERS ICE SEASON-OPENING TITLE

- BU earned its second Ice Breaker Invitational title with a 2-1 win over then-No. 11 Michigan State on Oct. 11 after posting a convincing 5-1 triumph over then-No. 5 North Dakota.
- Kevin Shattenkirk, Nick Bonino and Colin Wilson were named to the All-Ice Breaker Team with Wilson earning MVP honors.
- The title was the Terriers' first in an in-season tournament other than the Beanpot since the 2002 Great Lakes Invitational.
- BU, which claimed the 2002 Ice Breaker title, became the third team to win the tournament twice, joining Hockey East mates BC and UNH.
- Paced by second-period goals from Chris Higgins and Shattenkirk, the Terriers held off the Spartans on Saturday to claim the title.
- The Spartans got one back on a power play at 13:25 of the third and soon after had a 5-on-3 opportunity, but the Terriers held on.
- Grant Rollheiser made 12 saves in his collegiate debut for the Terriers, while MSU got an impressive 27-save performance from Jeff Lerg.
- Bonino tallied two goals and an assist to pace BU in its win over the Sioux, while Kieran Millan made 22 saves in his collegiate debut.
- The Terriers opened the scoring in the closing minutes of the first before the teams combined for three goals in the opening minute of the middle period. The Sioux tied the contest just 21 seconds into the second before BU regained the lead for good with a tally just 17 seconds after the equalizer and another 21 ticks later.
- BU made it a run of four unanswered goals by scoring near the middle of both the second and third stanzas to close out their first season-opening win since starting the 2005-06 slate with a 3-1 win over UMass Lowell.
- Wilson and Jason Lawrence each had a goal and an assist for the Terriers and Higgins earned a pair of helpers. Bonino, Colby Cohen and Chris Connolly each had a plus-3 rating.
