TONIGHT IN CHESTNUT HILL

• Just two weeks after meeting at Fenway Park in front of the second largest crowd in college hockey history, Boston University visits archrival Boston College to close out the teams' regular-season Hockey East series.
 • The Terriers defeated the Eagles, 3-2, at Fenway, while BC posted a 4-1 road victory over BU on Dec. 5.



SERIES HISTORY

• The Comm. Ave. rivals have met 248 times and the Terriers lead the series, 124-107-17 (.534).
 • The teams are 4-4-2 in their last 10 meetings, but BU has won four of the last five.
 • The Terriers are 13-17-4 (.441) in their 34 visits to Conte Forum.
 • No other opponent has appeared on BU's schedule more often. Northeastern is the next closest, having faced the Terriers 203 times since the 1930-31 season.
 • BU began playing hockey during the 1917-18 season and played its lone game that year against BC.

JACK AND JERRY

To add even more to this rivalry, the opposing bench bosses are the top two active coaches in career victories, as BU's Jack Parker has 823 victories, second only to BC's Jerry York at 833. Both coach at their respective alma mater and the two faced off on the ice from 1965-67.

SCOUTING THE EAGLES

• After opening the new year with three straight losses, Boston College rebounded with two home

victories last week - a 4-1 win over Providence on Tuesday before a 6-1 triumph against Maine on Friday.

• Junior Brian Gibbons has a team-best 24 points on nine goals and 15 assists, while sophomore Cam Atkinson - the reigning Hockey East Player of the Week - is right behind with 22 points on the strength of a team-high 13 goals. Junior Joe Whitney has tallied 17 points (7g, 10a) and seniors Ben Smith (10g, 6a) and Carl Snee (6g, 10a) have contributed 16 each.

• Junior John Muse has made 14 starts in goal for the Eagles this season and has a 7-5-2 record to go along with a 2.70 goals-against average. Freshman Parker Milner has won five of his six starts in goal.
 • BC's offense ranks fourth in the nation, averaging 3.60 goals per contest and its penalty kill is operating at 87.4 percent, good for seventh in the country.
 • Jerry York is in his 16th season at the helm of the BC program and has a record of 366-200-57 (.633) at the school.

TERRIERS EGDE BC AT FROZEN FENWAY (1/8)

• In the highest attended college hockey game in eastern United States history, Boston University defeated archrival Boston College, 3-2, at Fenway Park in front of 38,472 fans. The Terriers, who were playing in their first outdoor game in over 50 years, jumped out to a 3-0 lead before holding off the then-No. 7/8 Eagles.

• David Warsofsky opened the scoring in the first period before Joe Pereira and Wade Megan added second-period tallies to make it a 3-0 advantage. BC scored a late power-play goal in the second and got within one

on a shorthanded tally 7:43 into the third.

- Kieran Millan made 27 saves for the Terriers, who held a 31-29 shot advantage for the game.

BU TOPPED BY BC AT AGGANIS (12/5)

- Boston University took a 1-0 lead early in the second period, but crosstown rival Boston College answered with four unanswered tallies to earn a 4-1 victory at Agganis Arena.

- Nick Bonino opened the scoring for the game, converting on a wrap-around with assists from Alex Chiasson and Chris Connolly at the 2:10 mark of the second to give the hosts a 1-0 lead.

- BC tied it up with just over two minutes to play in the middle stanza before coming out gunning in the third period to produce a go-ahead goal just 38 seconds into the frame.

- Both teams were unable to take advantage of man-up advantages as BU was 0-for-5 on the night and BC was scoreless on six chances.

- Kieran Millan stopped 23 shots for the Terriers in the loss while BC netminder John Muse stopped 30 shots to record his fifth victory of the year.

LAST TIME OUT

- Boston University broke a 3-3 tie in the third period with back-to-back goals and went on to hold off Merrimack by a score of 6-4 on Saturday night at Agganis Arena. Colby Cohen potted a pair of goals and Nick Bonino posted a career-best four assists.

- Grant Rollheiser recorded a career-high 39 saves for the Terriers, while Andrew Braithwaite made 21 stops in goal for the Warriors.

- BU never trailed in the game, holding leads of 1-0, 2-1 and 3-2 only to have the visitors answer each time leading up to the decisive third period.

- Joe Pereira gave the Terriers the lead for good when he backhanded the puck past Braithwaite from the top of the crease at the 11:53 mark of the third. Under five minutes later, Chris Connolly scored on a 2-on-1 rush to give BU its first two-goal lead of the night at 5-3.

- Merrimack made things interesting late with an extra-attacker goal at the 18:46 mark, but the Terrier defense held off the visitors and Vinny Saponari capped a three-point night (1g, 2a) with an empty-netter to cap BU's third win in four games since the new year.

- Ross Gaudet scored his second goal in as many nights when he opened the scoring just 2:25 into the game.

40-SOMETHING

- Boston University allowed 43 shots in its 6-4 win over Merrimack on Saturday, marking the first time since Feb. 17, 2007 (3-3 tie vs. UNH), that it had allowed an opponent to record 40 or more shots.

- The Terriers have not lost a game in which they gave up 40 or more shots since a 4-2 road loss against Massachusetts on Feb. 12, 2005, in which the Minutemen put up 41 shots on goal.

- BU is 2-0-1 in its last three games in which it has allowed 40 or more shots.

TERRIER TIDBITS

- Boston University has already posted more wins in January (3) than November and December combined (2).

- The Terriers are tied for third nationally in shorthanded goals with five, trailing only St. Cloud State (8) and Mercyhurst (6).

- BU has yet to win a game this year when it allows the first goal (0-7-3).

- Junior Nick Bonino recorded a career-best

four assists in Saturday's win over Merrimack and now has 95 career points, including 16 (3g, 13a) against Merrimack alone.

- Junior Colby Cohen is tied for second in the country among defensemen in goals scored with seven and has totaled seven points (4g, 3a) in the four games since the new year.
- Sophomore goaltender Grant Rollheiser is 4-0-4 in his last eight decisions and has not lost since Jan. 13, 2009, against Providence.
- Senior Eric Gryba received 12 penalty minutes in the loss against Rensselaer on Dec. 11 to pass Freddy Meyer '03 and become BU's all-time leader in penalty minutes with 295. Meyer recorded 288 in his career with the Terriers.
- Over the past 13 games, 19 different Terriers have scored at least one point and Bonino (5g, 11a) has a team-best 16 points during the stretch.
- Last season, the Terriers were 5-0-0 when allowing exactly three goals but are just 1-5-3 this season in that scenario.

BALANCED ATTACK

- Defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk leads the Terriers in scoring this year with 18 points on three goals and 15 assists and classmate Nick Bonino, who missed five games in the fall with a separated shoulder, is right behind with 16 points (5g, 11a).
- Seven other players have 10 or more points on the season and that group is paced by sophomore Vinny Saponari with 15 on four goals and 11 assists.

SCORING BY CLASS

The juniors hold a narrow 61-57 lead over the sophomores in the race for scoring by class, but the sophomores have the most goals with 23.

WARSOFSKY HELPS USA CLAIM GOLD

- Sophomore David Warsofsky helped the U.S. National Junior Team claim the gold medal at the World Junior Championship on Jan. 5 with a thrilling 6-5 overtime victory over five-time defending champion Canada.
- Warsofsky is the first BU hockey player to earn a gold medal at the World Junior Championship. Ten other Terriers have earned medals at World Juniors, but Warsofsky is the first since Dan LaCouture and Tom Poti were part of the 1997 silver-medal team. Eight other former BU players earned bronze medals at the tournament. The only other year U.S. won the gold at World Juniors was 2004.
- Sophomore Vinny Saponari and freshman Max Nicastro were among the 29 invitees to U.S. World Junior pre-tournament training camp, but did not make the final roster.

DRURY NAMED TO 2010 OLYMPIC TEAM

Former Boston University standout Chris Drury has been named to the 2010 U.S. Olympic Ice Hockey Team. Drury, who was a member of Team

USA at the 2002 and 2006 Olympics, is the fourth-oldest player on the 23-man roster. The XXI Olympic Winter Games will be held Feb. 16-28 in Vancouver.

AMONTE JOINS US HALL OF FAME

Former Terrier Tony Amonte was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame on Dec. 1 at a ceremony at the Westin Boston Waterfront hotel. He joins seven other former Terriers in the Hall (Jack Garrity, Jack Kelley, Dick Rodenhiser, Jim Craig, Mike Eruzione, Jack O'Callahan, David Silk).

EARLY-SEASON INJURIES

- As a team, the Terriers have missed a combined 23 games this season due to injury or illness.
- With the exception of defenseman Ryan Ruikka, who is expected to miss the entire season due to an offseason knee injury, the Nov. 28 contest against Cornell marked the first time all season that the Terriers had a fully healthy roster.

BONINO STREAK COMES TO AN END

- BU was undefeated in last 39 games (34-0-5) when Nick Bonino scored at least one point until he scored the Terriers' lone goal in a 4-1 loss against Boston College on Dec. 5.
- The last time Bonino had notched a point in a loss was also against BC on Feb. 4, 2008, when he scored a goal in the Beanpot semifinals.
- In last year's national title season, BU went 24-0-3 in the games he had at least one point.

SHOTS AREN'T EVERYTHING

The Terriers were undefeated (9-0-1) in their previous 10 games in which they had been outshot until UNH held a 27-23 shot advantage in its 4-2 win over BU on Nov. 20. The streak dated back to Jan. 26, 2008, as UNH was also the last team to top BU while recording more shots.

SHUTOUT STORY

- The Terriers went 99 consecutive games without being shut out before being blanked by Notre Dame on Oct. 20. It was the longest active streak in the country.
- BU had not been handed a shutout loss in 112 games (1-0, vs. BC, 12/2/06), as the last time it came up empty was a 0-0 draw with UMass Lowell on Feb. 2, 2007.
- With the 1-0 loss at Northeastern on Nov. 6, the Terriers were shut out in an opposing rink for the first time since March 12, 2004.

NON-CONFERENCE STREAK ENDS

- The Terriers' loss to Notre Dame on Oct. 20 was its first against a non-Hockey East team since Dartmouth on Jan. 15, 2008, which was a span of 10 straight wins.
- BU was the only team in the country to post a perfect non-conference record (9-0-0) during the 2008-09 regular season.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Sophomore goaltender Kieran Millan suffered his first-ever loss away from Agganis Arena in the season opener at UMass. As a freshman, his record away from home was an incredible 16-0-1.

HOCKEY EAST WEEKLY HONOREES

MEGAN NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- After scoring the eventual game-winning goal in BU's 3-2 victory over BC at Fenway Park, freshman forward Wade Megan was the first Terrier to be named Hockey East Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week this season on Feb. 11.
- With the Terriers leading 2-0 in the second period, Megan elevated a puck over BC netminder John Muse by the right post and into the net for the second goal of his collegiate career.

COHEN NAMED CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- After setting career highs in goals (2) and points (4) in BU's 7-3 win over No. 15 UMass on Jan. 2, junior defenseman Colby Cohen was named the Athletic Republic Hockey East Co-Player of the Week. He shared the honor with Vermont's Justin Milo.
- Cohen recorded his third game-winning goal of the season and tied his career high in assists with two. He also boasted a game-best plus-3 rating.

SOPHOMORES HONORED BY LEAGUE

- After tallying four points and posting a plus-3 rating in BU's split with Merrimack, sophomore forward Chris Connolly was named the Hockey East Co-Player of the Week along with UNH's Bobby Butler on Nov. 16.
- Connolly scored a career-high three points (2g, 1a) in a 6-4 home win over the Warriors. He also earned the primary assist on junior Kevin Shattenkirk's goal in the opening minute of play.
- Classmate David Warsofsky was named Hockey East Player of the Week on Nov. 2 after scoring two goals, including a shorthanded tally, in BU's 5-4 overtime victory at UMass Lowell. He added an assist in a loss to the UML the next night and turned in a plus-4 rating for the weekend.

PRESEASON HONORS

Three Terriers - one at each position - were named to Inside College Hockey's 2009-10 Pre-season All-America Second Team. Junior forward Nick Bonino, junior defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk and sophomore goaltender Kieran Millan were the only Hockey East players among the 18 selected to one of INCH's three preseason All-America squads.

SCORING LOAD

Although BU returns just one of its top six scorers from its national title season, all four of its players (Nick Bonino, Colby Cohen, Zach Cohen, Chris Connolly) who scored a goal in the national title game are back for the 2009-10 campaign.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

All three of BU's goaltenders from last season, including reigning national rookie of the year Kieran Millan. Millan had one of the best seasons by a freshman netminder in NCAA history,

breaking a single-season school record with 29 victories as part of a remarkable 29-2-3 record. He also posted a 1.94 goals-against average to go along with a .921 save percentage.

BIG PLUSES

Nick Bonino and Kevin Shattenkirk finished first and second in the nation last season in plus/minus rating at +29 and +28, respectively.

OUR HOUSE

The Terriers went 16-4-2 at home last season and are now 28-9-4 in their last 41 contests at Agganis Arena. Since it opened in January 2005, BU has posted a 58-28-12 record in the building.

BU FAVORED TO REPEAT IN HOCKEY EAST

After winning both the Hockey East regular-season and tournament titles last season en route to its fifth national title and a school-record 35 wins, Boston University has been picked to repeat as league champions in 2009-10. The Terriers earned six first-place votes in the preseason coaches' poll to finish with 84 points. UMass Lowell (79) and Boston College (76) rounded out the top three and each received two first-place nods.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

For the first time ever, more players on the Terriers' roster are from New York than Massachusetts. Three freshmen (Sean Escobedo, Wade Megan, Ben Rosen) are from the Empire State, joining sophomore Kevin Gilroy and junior Kevin Shattenkirk for a total of five. Just three players on this year's squad (Ross Gaudet, Andrew Glass, David Warsofsky) are from Massachusetts.

WEARING THE "C"

Junior defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk (New Rochelle, N.Y.) will serve as captain of the Terriers this season. He becomes the first junior to wear the "C" since Jack O'Callahan in 1977-78 and the first lone junior captain since Bob Smith during the 1961-62 season. Senior defenseman Eric Gryba (Saskatoon, Sask.) and junior forward Nick Bonino (Unionville, Conn.) will be assistant captains for this year's team.

WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcomed seven freshmen to their roster this season, as four forwards and three defensemen join BU for its defense of the national title. The class was ranked sixth in the country by Inside College Hockey and four members of the group have been drafted by an NHL team.

NHL HOPEFULS

Fourteen of this year's Terriers have been selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft. The 14 players were taken by 12 different clubs between 2006-09. Three of the them were selected by the Colorado Avalanche (Colby Cohen, Kieran Millan, Kevin Shattenkirk). Only Minnesota (20) and North Dakota (15) have more NHL draftees on their current roster.

PRO PIPELINE

- 15 former Terriers have played in the NHL this season with John McCarthy being the most recent. He made debut with San Jose on Jan. 9 and is the 61st former Terrier to reach the NHL ranks. John Curry was also recently called up to the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- Four players from last year's national championship squad have reached the NHL ranks: Matt Gilroy (NY Rangers), Colin Wilson (Nashville), Brandon Yip (Colorado) and McCarthy.
- The other 10 are Adrian Aucoin (Phoenix), Chris Bourque (Pittsburgh), Rick DiPietro (New York Islanders), Chris Drury (New York Rangers), Mike Grier (Buffalo), Freddy Meyer (New York Islanders), Jay Pandolfo (New Jersey), Tom Poti (Washington), Keith Tkachuk (St. Louis) and Ryan Whitney (Anaheim).

89TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 89th season of intercollegiate play and currently hold a 1373-788-134 (.627) record. BU's 1,373 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,604 wins - 90 seasons) and Michigan (1,491 wins - 89 seasons). The three programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 19 national titles between them.

COACH PARKER NOTES

37th SEASON ON THE BU BENCH

Terrier head coach Jack Parker is now in his 37th season and holds an overall record of 823-424-104 (.647). His 822 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution, while he ranks second among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage.

VS. THE EAGLES

Parker has taken on the Eagles 141 times since the 1973-74 season and holds a 73-56-12 (.560) record. He has coached more games against the Eagles than any team, while his 73 wins mark the second-highest total he's had against any opponent. The only team he's had more wins against is Northeastern (88).

VS. YORK

The two veteran coaches have faced each other 80 times in the past 36 years, and Parker owns a 44-29-7 (.594) record against York. Their rivalry began while York coached at Clarkson, during which time Parker held a perfect 9-0-0 record. From 1980-84, York moved on to Bowling Green, where Parker held a 2-1-0 advantage. Since York arrived at BC in 1994-95, Parker is 33-28-7 (.537).

IN HOCKEY EAST

Parker holds an all-time 366-205-79 (.624) record in Hockey East regular-season play, which is the most wins of any league coach.

GAME RECAPS

BU FALLS AT PROVIDENCE (1/15)

- Boston University suffered its first loss of the new year against Providence, as the Terriers fell victim to a three-goal second period by the Friars and dropped a 3-1 decision at Schneider Arena.
- PC broke a scoreless tie with a trio of second-period tallies, including two on the power play.
- The Terriers got on the board at 7:47 of the third when Ross Gaudet capped a give-and-go with Joe Pereira by scoring his fourth goal of the season. Wade Megan also assisted on the play.
- BU was buzzing around the Providence net for the last several minutes of regulation and had two late power-play chances, but could not get any closer and the Friars picked up the 3-1 win.
- Alex Beaudry made 28 saves in goal for Providence while sophomore Kieran Millan made 21 stops in a losing effort for the Terriers.
- PC finished the game 2-of-3 on the power play, while BU came up empty on its eight chances with the man advantage. It marked only the second time in the last nine games that the Terriers were unable to record a power-play goal.

TERRIERS OPEN 2010 ON HIGH NOTE (1/2)

- Highlighted by two-goal efforts from both Zach Cohen and Colby Cohen, Boston University opened the 2010 portion of its schedule with an impressive 7-3 home victory against No. 15 Massachusetts on at Agganis Arena.
- Colby Cohen set career highs in goals (2) and points (4), while Zach Cohen added an assist to post a career-best three points. Kevin Shattenkirk matched his personal best in assists with three and Eric Gryba, Nick Bonino and Alex Chiasson each potted a goal in the victory.
- The Terriers converted three of their six power-play chances on the day, while the Minutemen scored all three of their goals on the power play but had 12 chances to do so, as BU was whistled for a season-high 13 penalties.
- BU held a 29-23 shot advantage for the game and received a 20-save performance in goal from sophomore Kieran Millan. Paul Dainton made 22 stops for the Minutemen.

RPI TOPS BU IN FIRST-HALF FINALE (12/11)

- Boston University took a 3-2 lead into the third period, but visiting Rensselaer scored three times in the final stanza to pull out a 5-3 win at Agganis Arena in the Terriers' first-half finale.
- BU had been 34-0-1 in its previous 35 games in which it led after two periods.
- The Terriers' special teams were responsible for all three of their goals on the night, including a pair of shorthanded tallies. With BU down a man midway through the second period, junior Kevin Shattenkirk scored his third goal of the season to give the home team a 3-2 lead.

- Kieran Millan finished the game with 20 saves for the Terriers, while Rensselaer's Bryce Merriam stopped 32 shots in the win.

TERRIERS TIE UP VERMONT (12/4)

- For the second time in as many games, Boston University rallied from a 3-1 deficit to earn a draw, as the Terriers skated to a 3-3 tie with No. 19 Vermont at Agganis Arena. BU played in a fourth straight overtime game for the first time in program history.
- Corey Trivino scored the game-tying tally on a power play with 5:18 left in regulation. In all, BU hit four pipes on the night, including two more after Trivino's goal while in search of a game-winner.
- Vermont jumped out to a 2-0 lead with goals 34 seconds apart towards the end of the first period. BU got one back when Eric Gryba potted his first goal of the season just over four minutes into the second.
- The Catamounts regained a two-goal edge on a goal at the 8:11 mark of the middle period, but Ross Gaudet made it a one-goal affair after two when he buried a rebound at 14:22 of the second.
- Madore made 37 saves, including 13 in both the first and third periods, while Grant Rollheiser turned in a 21-save performance for the Terriers.

TERRIERS RALLY FOR DRAW AT MSG (11/28)

- Playing in front of a sold-out crowd at Madison Square Garden, Boston University erased a two-goal third-period deficit en route to a 3-3 draw with then-No. 7/8 Cornell in the second Red Hot Hockey contest.
- Sophomore Chris Connolly provided the game-tying tally on a power play with 51 seconds left in regulation for the Terriers, who earned a 6-3 win over the Big Red in the inaugural Red Hot Hockey event in 2007.
- Junior Nick Bonino tallied the first of BU's two goals in the third period and assisted on the game-tying tally, while sophomore David Warsofsky provided the Terriers' first goal of the contest and finished the night with a game-best plus-2 rating.
- Cornell never trailed, jumping out to an early 2-0 lead before taking a 3-1 advantage into the third.
- Back-to-back infractions on the Big Red at 16:40 and 18:02 of the third gave the Terriers 38 seconds with a two-man advantage. In addition, BU pulled sophomore goaltender Grant Rollheiser to make it a 6-on-3 situation.
- Cornell got through the 6-on-3, but the Terriers capitalized on the ensuing 6-on-4 to send the game into overtime.
- Ben Scrivens made 32 saves, including 11 in the third period alone, for the Big Red while Grant Rollheiser recorded 14 saves for the Ter-

riers, who more than doubled up the Big Red in shots (35-17).

BU ERASES FOUR DEFICITS IN WILD WIN (11/24)

- Sophomore Chris Connolly capped a wild contest between cross-town rivals with an overtime winner to lead Boston University to a 6-5 victory over Harvard at Bright Hockey Center.
- The Crimson took a 5-4 lead with 1:18 left in regulation on Conor Morrison's fourth goal of the contest, but senior Zach Cohen scored an extra-attacker goal with 19.5 ticks left to send the game into overtime.
- Junior Joe Pereira tallied a career-high four points on two goals and two assists and classmate Nick Bonino recorded three points, including his first goal of the year. Cohen registered the second two-goal game of his career.
- The Terriers scored the first goal of the game, but never held a lead again, as they erased four one-goal advantages by the Crimson before coming through with their second overtime win of the season.
- The Terriers outshot the Crimson by a significant 49-26 margin, as Harvard goaltender Kyle Richter finished the night with a career-high 43 saves. Kieran Millan made 21 saves in goal for BU.
- BU went 3-of-5 on the power play, as its first three goals came with the man advantage. The Terriers committed just three penalties on the night and killed off both of the Crimson's power-play chances.

BU SALVAGES POINT IN UNH WEEKEND (11/20-21)

- BU teams battled to a 3-3 draw at Agganis Arena on Saturday after the Wildcats posted a 4-2 home victory on Friday.
- Friday's meeting at the Whittemore Center was the teams' first since last year's NCAA Northeast Regional final.
- Vinny Saponari, Corey Trivino and David Warsofsky all scored a goal on Saturday, as Trivino provided the game-tying tally with 8:08 left in regulation. Grant Rollheiser made a then-career-high 27 saves in goal.
- Zach Cohen and Ross Gaudet each potted a goal for the Terriers in Friday's loss. UNH never trailed in the game and got goals from four different players.
- Special teams were the difference, as the Terriers came up empty on all five of their chances with the man advantage, while the home team converted on two of its six power plays.
- Kieran Millan made 23 saves in a losing effort for the Terriers, while Brian Foster picked up the win in goal for UNH with a 21-save performance.

BU SPLITS SERIES WITH MERRIMACK (11/13-14)

- BU split a home-and-home series with Merrimack as each team won on its home ice. The Terriers saw their losing skid reach four games on Friday night in a 6-3 loss to the Warriors before posting a 6-4 victory at Agganis Arena on Saturday.
- On Friday in North Andover, Wade Megan opened the scoring at 12:30 of the opening period with his first collegiate goal, but the Warriors scored five unanswered goals.

- Vinny Saponari recorded a goal and an assist and Corey Trivino potted his first goal of the season for BU, which scored all three of its goals on the power play.
- Merrimack, which remained a perfect 6-0 at home this season, was led by a two-goal effort from Brandon Brodhag.
- On Saturday, Chris Connolly tallied two goals and an assist for the Terriers, who jumped out to a 4-0 lead after the opening period.
- Grant Rollheiser made his first start of the year after missing the first month with a high-ankle sprain and recorded a career-high 25 saves, including 12 in the third.
- Merrimack rallied to make it a 5-4 contest midway through the third but the Terriers held on to prevent the Warriors from winning consecutive games for the first time in the all-time series.

TERRIERS EDGED IN ORONO (11/8)

- Boston University suffered its third consecutive one-goal defeat, dropping a 3-2 road decision against Maine. It was the Terriers' first regular-season loss against the Black Bears since Jan. 22, 2005.
- Alex Chiasson and Chris Connolly each scored a goal for the Terriers, who held a 28-18 shot advantage for the game.
- Maine scored two early goals with the first one coming on a 5-on-3 advantage before Chiasson tallied his team-leading fourth goal of the season to cut the deficit to one before the end of the opening period.
- BU controlled the run of play for the vast majority of the second period but the Black Bears ended up scoring the lone goal of the stanza with what ended up being the game-winning tally.
- Connolly got the Terriers back within one on another power-play marker with just under seven minutes left in regulation, but Maine held on.

BU SUFFERS 1-0 LOSS AT NU (11/6)

- Despite a strong team effort throughout the game, Boston University dropped a 1-0 decision to Northeastern at a sold-out Matthews Arena.
- The Huskies, who got a 43-save performance from freshman goaltender Chris Rawlings, scored the game's lone goal with 7:29 left in regulation.
- The teams came up empty on the first 11 power plays of the contest until the Huskies cashed in on their sixth and final chance with the man advantage following a BU penalty at the 11:37 mark of the third. Wade MacLeod knocked in a rebound for the game winner on assists from Mike Hewkin and Alex Tuckerman.
- The Terriers were given a prime opportunity to knot the game late when Hewkin was whistled for a five-minute major and a game misconduct on a hitting from behind call with 4:09 left in the third. Rawlings, however, continued to thwart everything that came his way and he and the Husky defense held off 95 seconds of 6-on-4 play in the final minutes to hold on for the victory.
- BU, which was shut out in an opposing rink for the first time since March 12, 2004, held a

43-20 shot advantage for the contest, including a 19-6 margin in the second period.

TERRIERS SPLIT LOWELL WEEKEND (10/30-31)

- BU split a home-and-home series with then-No. 8/9 UMass Lowell, earning a 5-4 overtime road victory before dropping a 3-2 contest at Agganis the following night.
- On Friday, Colby Cohen netted the game-winner with 1:06 remaining in overtime and David Warsofsky had his first career two-goal game.
- Alex Chiasson opened the scoring in the second period with his third goal of the season, but Lowell tied it up soon after. Warsofsky potted a shorthanded goal to help the Terriers regain the lead only to watch the home team score twice before the stanza ended to take a 3-2 lead into the third.
- Zach Cohen squared the game at 3-3 and Warsofsky put the Terriers up 4-3 with 5:38 remaining on his second score of the night. Nick Schaus brought the score to 4-4 at the 4:13 mark to bring the game to overtime.
- At Agganis on Saturday, UMass Lowell never trailed en route to the win. Sophomore Vinny Saponari and junior captain Kevin Shattenkirk each netted their first goal of the season in the second period for BU.

BU TOPS MICHIGAN WITH LATE GOAL (11/24)

- After two third-period goals by the visitors evened the score at 2-2 with five minutes left in regulation, junior Joe Pereira took advantage of a miscue behind the Michigan net and tallied an unassisted goal at 17:29 of the third period to give BU an exciting 3-2 victory over No. 4/5 Michigan at Agganis Arena.
- Kieran Millan matched his career high of 33 saves and made 19 saves in the third period alone to help the Terriers record their first win of the year.
- BU got power-play goals from Zach Cohen and Colby Cohen to take a 2-0 lead, but Michigan scored at the 10:04 and 14:30 marks of the third to knot the game.

BU BLANKED BY NOTRE DAME (11/2)

- BU was blanked, 3-0, by No. 9/10 Notre Dame in its home opener.
- Notre Dame was led by Brad Phillips' 34-save performance in goal, as he and the Irish withstood every scoring opportunity by the Terriers, including a 17-shot barrage in the final stanza.
- Billy Maday, Ben Ryan and Calle Ridderwall each tallied a goal and an assist for Notre Dame. Maday and Ryan opened the scoring in the 16th minute of the second period with goals just 12 seconds apart. Ridderwall capped the scoring with a power-play tally at 2:53 of the third.
- The Terriers went 0-for-8 on the power play, while the Fighting Irish went 1-of-6 with the man advantage.

TERRIERS EDGED IN SEASON OPENER (10/16)

- Despite a pair of goals by freshman Alex Chiasson in his collegiate debut, BU fell to Massachusetts, 3-2, in its season opener at Mullins Center.
- Junior Paul Dainton turned in a 39-save per-

formance for the Minutemen, stopping the final 27 shots he faced on the night.
