ON TAP

• Boston University, currently on a season-high six-game win streak and 13-1-1 in its last 15 games, returns to Agganis for the first time in two weeks to take on UMass Lowell.

• The Terriers will attempt to sweep their league series with the River Hawks for the first time since the 2002-03 season.

• BU reached the 20-win mark earlier than ever before in the program's 88-season history with its triumph over Harvard on Monday (Feb. 2) in the Beanpot. The previous record was beaten by one day, as the 1983-84 team earned its 20th victory on Feb. 3.

SERIES HISTORY

• The Terriers and River Hawks head into Friday's contest having met 85 times since the 1983-84 season. Over that period, BU holds an impressive 60-17-8 (.753) advantage

• The Terriers have a 5-2-2 (.667) edge in the contests played at Agganis Arena.

• The teams have met 75 times in Hockey East play, with the Terriers holding a 52-16-7 (.740) lead.

• In the 10 overtime competitions in the series, BU is 2-0-8 against the River Hawks.

SCOUTING THE RIVER HAWKS

• UMass Lowell enters Friday on a three-game win streak, having won each contest by a score of 3-2. Most recently, the River Hawks posted a road victory at Maine last Friday. UML is 4-1 since suffering a six-game losing streak from Dec. 5 - Jan. 10.

• The River Hawks are in the middle of a nine-game stretch that includes eight road contests.

• Two of the River Hawks' top three scorers are defensemen, including sophomore Maury Edwards, who has a team-best 19 points on eight goals and 11 assists. Junior Kory Falite has emerged as one of the league's top goal-scorers and has 18 points on the strength of 12 tallies. Junior blue-liner Jeremy Dehner also has 18 points thanks to a team-best 12 helpers. Sophomore Scott Campbell (8g, 9a) and freshman David Vallorani (4g, 13a) each have recorded 17 points.

• UMass Lowell ranks 11th in the country in both scoring defense (2.33) and power play (19.8%).

• Juniors Nevin Hamilton (.920 sv%, 2.35 GAA) and

32. Shawn McEachern '91, one of the newest members of the BU Athletic Hall of Fame, is in his first season as an assistant coach for the River Hawks.

EARLIER THIS SEASON VS. LOWELL

BU 3, UML 2 - Dec. 12 - Agganis Arena

• A power-play offering from Colby Cohen went off the skate of Chris Higgins and into the net to break a third-period tie and boost BU to the home victory.

• The Terriers rallied from deficits of 1-0 and 2-1 to stretch their unbeaten streak to five games (4-0-1). Joe Pereira became the 18th different Terrier to score a goal this season and also added an assist. Zach Cohen scored the game-tying goal late in the second and Kieran Millan turned in a 22-save performance.

• BU's penalty kill was key to the victory, as UMass Lowell came up empty on all six of its power-play opportunities.

• Lowell opened the scoring just 64 seconds into the game before Pereira tied the contest with just under a minute left in the first period.

BU 6, UML 4 - Nov. 7 - Tsongas Arena

• Colin Wilson netted his second goal of the game with 14.5 seconds left to play to break a 4-4 tie and lead BU to a thrilling road victory. The Terriers scored half of their six goals in the final 2:14.

• Wilson added a pair of assists to tie his career high of four points, while Chris Higgins tallied the game-tying goal with 2:14 left in the third before adding another with just six-tenths of a second left.

• Kieran Millan won his fourth straight start and made 23 saves. The rookie made a handful of standout saves in the final period.

• The Terriers rallied from a 3-1 deficit late in the second with a power-play tally from Wilson and an equalizer by Vinny Saponari at 9:13 of the third. The River Hawks regained the lead with 5:31 left in regulation, only to watch BU come through with the late three-goal flurry.

HOCKEY ON CAMPUS

Bernie Corbett and Paul McNamara are once again teaming up on Wednesdays this winter to bring weekly college hockey talk to Boston's radio airwaves, co-hosting the popular "Hockey On Campus" program on ESPN Radio (890 AM) from 7 to 9 p.m.

TERRIERS EDGE HARVARD IN BEANPOT SEMI

• Jason Lawrence scored the game-winning goal at 18:14 of the third period to lead the Terriers to a wild 4-3 victory over Harvard in the opening round of the 57th Beanpot on Monday evening at TD Banknorth Garden.

• The Terriers responded to an early 2-0 deficit with three unanswered tallies - including two from Nick Bonino.

• Harvard opened the scoring at 8:19 of the first and added a 5-on-3 tally just 1:04 into the second period. Bonino scored consecutive goals just 1:43 apart in the second period to tie the game.

• Zach Cohen gave BU its first lead at 11:25 of the third when he snuck the puck past Harvard netminder Matt Hoyle off an offensive-zone faceoff.

• The Crimson, however, fought back and made it a 4-4 contest with 5:27 left in regulation with its second power-play tally of the evening.

• Kieran Millan made 22 saves between the pipes for the Terriers, who held a 34-25 shot advantage.

TERRIER NOTES

ROOKIE STANDOUT BETWEEN THE PIPES

• Freshman Kieran Millan is 16-1-1 so far in his rookie campaign and his winning percentage of .917 is the best in the nation. He has earned the win in goal in each of his last 10 starts.

• Millan will be looking to tie the program record for fewest losses in the first 19 decisions of a career, as Brian Durocher started out 17-1-1 as a freshman in 1974-75.

• Millan's goals against average of 1.55 is good for third in the country while his .933 save percentage ranks eighth.

• The rookie has not allowed more than one goal in any of his last 38 periods in net and has allowed two or fewer goals in 11 of his last 12 starts.

• Millan was named Hockey East Goaltender of the Month on Monday for the second consecutive time, posting a 7-0-0 record and 1.00 goals against average in January after putting together a December that included a 2-0-1 record with a 1.30 goals against average.

• Millan earned a win in each of his first five starts, becoming the first BU netminder to do so since Michel Larocque (1995-96 season).

PARKER REACHES 800

• Jack Parker became just the third Division I hockey coach to earn 800 career victories following the Terriers' 3-1 road win over Merrimack on Jan. 30.

• Parker, who is the first hockey coach in NCAA history to win 800 games at one school, joins Ron Mason (924) and Jerry York (814) in the 800-win club.

• Matt Gilroy scored the game's first goal and added an assist. Colin Wilson earned two assists, while Brandon Yip and Colby Cohen each tallied a power-play goal.

• BU opened the scoring with consecutive goals just 72 seconds apart late in the first period and never lost the lead.

EVERYBODY CONTRIBUTES

BU has 11 players with 14 points or more this season. No other team in the country can lay claim to that accomplishment, but Denver is right behind with 10.

MR. WILSON

• Sophomore Colin Wilson leads all Hockey East players in points with 32 on nine goals and 23 assists. He ranks third in the nation in points per game (1.33) and second only to Quinnipiac's Brian Leitch (1.35) in assists per game (0.96).

• Wilson tallied two goals and nine assists during a six-game point streak that came to an end on Monday.

• Wilson, the 2008 Hockey East Rookie of the Year, was selected seventh overall in last year's NHL Entry Draft by the Nashville Predators.

FASTER PACE

BU has already surpassed its win total of 19 from last season. The Terriers entered the semester break this season with 11 wins for the first time since the 1999-00 campaign.

BLUE LINE SCORING BOOST

• BU boasts four of the top nine scoring defencemen in Hockey East: Colby Cohen (21 points, 1st), Matt Gilroy (18, T-3rd), Kevin Shattenkirk (15, T-7th and David Warsofsky (14, 9th).
• Cohen has scored at least one point in each of his last six games, posting two goals and six assists during the stretch.

PENALTY KILL STEPS UP

The Terriers have still successfully killed off 83 of their opponents' last 90 power plays, including streaks of 27 straight (Jan. 17-30) and 28 straight (Nov. 29 - Jan. 10). BU's penalty kill was ranked 35th in the nation after being swept by Vermont on Nov. 21-22, but now ranks ninth.

A DIFFERENT DEFENSE

BU has allowed 50 goals through 26 games, giving up more than two goals only six times. Last year, the Terriers let in 85 goals in their first 26 contests and gave up three or more goals in 12 of their first 16 games.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

BU is the only team in the country to have a perfect non-conference record (8-0-0). Last year, the Terriers went 2-6-1 in non-conference play. BU went undefeated in its 10 non-conference games (9-0-1) during the 1995-96 season, but had not won its first eight non-league contests since the 1991-92 campaign, when it was a perfect 12-0-0.

TOUGH TO BLANK

• The Terriers have gone 79 games without being shut out - the longest active streak in the country. BU was tied with UNH at 75 games before ending the Wildcats' streak on Jan. 23 (5-0 win).
• BU has not been handed a shutout loss in 84 games (1-0, vs. BC, 12/2/06) - the longest such streak in the nation.
• It has been nearly five years since the Terriers have been shut out on the road (4-0, at BC, 3/12/04).

THE BEST OFFENSE IS A GOOD DEFENSE

• Freshman Kieran Millan was named Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week for the third time this season on Jan. 26. Senior defenseman Matt Gilroy earned the honor the previous week.
• Millan allowed just one goal on 52 shots in BU's weekend sweep of New Hampshire. He recorded his second career shutout with a 22-save performance in a 5-0 home victory over the Wildcats before turning in a standout 29-save effort 3-1 win in Durham the following night. It marked the Terriers' first home-and-home sweep of New Hampshire since 2001.
• When UNH scored its lone goal of the weekend on Saturday (which went off the skate of a BU defender), it ended a streak of over 315 minutes during which Millan did not allow an even-strength goal.

• Millan who also named the national Player of the Week by Inside Hockey for his efforts.

• For the year, Gilroy has 18 points on five goals and 13 assists. The two-time All-American has played in 127 consecutive games and boasts a career rating of plus-65, including a plus-9 mark so far this season.

• Gilroy was one of Sports Illustrated's "Faces in the Crowd" on Jan. 26 and was the subject of a *New York Times* feature by George Vecsey.

POWERFUL POWER PLAY

• BU's power play is currently ranked first in the nation at 23.8 percent (34-of-143).
• The Terriers have tallied 14 power-play goals in the last seven games.
• Senior Jason Lawrence has 10 power-play goals, good for second in the nation. Jacques Lamoureux of Air Force is first with 11.

QUICK HITS

• BU's combined special teams percentage of .571 is the best in the nation.
• The Terriers also are tied for first in the country in scoring margin (1.81).
• Dating back to Feb. 8, the Terriers are 31-8-1 in their last 40 games.
• BU has scored more than twice as many goals as its opponents in both the first (30-15) and third (34-17) periods this season.
• The Terriers' offense is tied for second in the country, averaging 3.73 goals per game. The defense is allowing just 1.92 goals per contest, good for fifth. BU is the only school in the country to be ranked in the top five in both.
• BU has outshot its opponent in all but two of their games this season, but won both times.
• The Terriers are a perfect 13-0-0 when they record 30 or fewer shots, but just 7-5-1 when they record more than 30 shots.

ON BOTH ENDS

Among Hockey East teams, BU has scored the most goals (97) and allowed the fewest (50).

SIBLING RIVALRY

Freshman Chris Connolly is tied for 14th nationally among freshmen in points per game (0.81). His younger brother, Jack (a freshman at Minnesota Duluth), is tied for 17th at 0.79.

FACE LIFT

After winning just 47 percent of their faceoffs (238-of-505) in their first eight games, the Terriers have won 54 percent of their faceoffs (588-of-1091) since.

POSITIVE IMPACT

Led by freshman David Warsofsky at plus-15 - the second-best rating in the league - 21 of the 22 BU skaters that have played this season have a positive plus/minus rating.

HOME RUN

The Terriers are 11-3-1 at home this season and are 19-4-1 in their last 24 contests at Agganis Arena. They had a stretch of 11 straight regular-season home wins snapped in a 4-3 setback against Vermont on Nov. 21.

SOPHOMORE SENSATIONS

• Sophomore Colin Wilson has a team-best 32 points on the year with nine goals and 23 assists and classmate Nick Bonino has recorded 25

- Eighteen different Terriers have scored at least one goal so far this season. Only Wisconsin (21), St. Cloud State (20), North Dakota (20), Michigan (19) and Minnesota State (19) have spread out their scoring more.

- Senior Jason Lawrence has a team-high 11 goals, while classmates Chris Higgins and Brandon Yip are right behind with 10 each. Sophomores Nick Bonino and Colin Wilson both have nine goals and freshman Chris Connolly and junior Zach Cohen have each tallied seven.

FIRST-HALF FLIP

The Terriers went 11-4-1 in the first half this season after posting a 4-10-2 record before the semester break during the 2007-08 campaign.

GET SHORTY

The Terriers already have four shorthanded goals this season after tallying just two in 2007-08.

TWO TERRIERS AT WORLD JUNIORS

- Sophomores Colin Wilson and Kevin Shattenkirk served as alternate captains for the U.S. National Junior Team at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship, in Ottawa, Ont., on Dec. 26 - Jan. 5. Team USA placed fifth in the tournament.

- Wilson, Shattenkirk and UNH's James van Riemsdyk were named Team USA's three best players of the tournament. Shattenkirk was the top scoring defenseman in the event and tied for eighth overall with nine points (1g, 8a), while Wilson recorded eight points (3g, 5a).

- Wilson played at Juniors for the second straight year, as the centerman scored seven points, including a tournament-best six goals, for the 2008 U.S. squad that finished fourth. Shattenkirk made his World Junior debut.
- BU was one of five schools (Michigan, Minnesota, UNH, Notre Dame) to have multiple players named to the team and Hockey East led all conferences with five players selected.

HIGGINS TALLIES 100TH POINT

Senior Chris Higgins became the 75th Terrier to reach the 100-point mark with an assist on Colin Wilson's second-period power-play goal in a 4-1 win over St. Lawrence on Nov. 29.

OFF AND RUNNING

The Terriers won six of their first seven games for the first time since winning 11 of their first 12 games during the 1997-98 campaign.

DEFENSE MAKES OPENING STATEMENT

For the first time in program history, BU allowed two or fewer goals in each of its first six games.

PENALTIES PILING UP

The Terriers are averaging 18.5 penalty minutes per contest — the 16th-most in the nation. Last season, BU ranked 41st with just 13.2 penalty minutes a game.

RANK AND FILE

On Nov. 10, BU was ranked first in both national polls for the first time since March 20, 2006. The Terriers had not been at the top of the polls during the regular season since Jan. 5, 1998. In just its fourth season at the varsity level, the Terriers' women's ice hockey team earned its highest ranking ever in November when it was fourth in the USCHO.com poll.

OCTOBER REVERSAL

Last season, BU went 0-4-1 in October, resulting in its worst start since 1976. This year, the Terriers posted a 4-1-0 record in October.

TERRIER TRIO

- Three Terriers have earned Hockey East Reebok Player of the Week honors this season.

- Sophomore Colin Wilson earned the accolade on Nov. 10 after scoring a career-high four points (2g, 2a) in a 6-4 come-from-behind road victory over UMass Lowell.

- After scoring two power-play goals in a 7-2 victory over perennial power Michigan, senior Jason Lawrence earned the honor on Oct. 27.

- Sophomore Kevin Shattenkirk was the first honoree on Oct. 13 after scoring two goals in the Ice Breaker, including the game-winner against Michigan State, and bolstering a defense that held each opponent to one goal.

NTDP REPRESENTATION

Nine current BU players played for the Ann Arbor-based USA Hockey National Team Development Program, marking the highest total of any school in the country. Minnesota has eight former NTDP players on its roster, while Michigan has six. Each of the last three captains of the U.S. National Under-18 Team (Brian Strait, Kevin Shattenkirk, David Warsofsky) is part of the Terriers' defensive corps this season.

FUTURE PROS

Boston University has 13 NHL draftees on its roster this year, tying it with Michigan and North Dakota for the second most in the country. Minnesota has a nation-high 17 NHL picks. The 13 Terriers were taken by 10 different clubs between 2004-08. Three of the them were taken by the Colorado Avalanche (Kevin Shattenkirk, Colby Cohen, Brandon Yip).

BU PICKED SECOND IN HOCKEY EAST

Boston University was picked second in the Hockey East Preseason Coaches' Poll, as announced at the league's annual media day on Sept. 29. The Terriers, who finished second in last year's regular-season standings, received 80 points, including three first-place votes, and trailed only Boston College, who received six first-place votes and 86 total points. BU has claimed seven Hockey East regular-season crowns and six conference tournament titles.

WEARING THE "C"

Senior forward John McCarthy (Andover, Mass.) and classmate Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, N.Y.) are serving as co-captains of the Terriers this season. Junior defenseman Brian Strait (Waltham, Mass.) is an assistant captain.

HONORING HIS BROTHER

Senior Matt Gilroy is just the second Terrier to wear a number higher than 40 (Jason Tapp wore 83 for his sister from 1998-02). The North Bellmore, N.Y., native made a promise to his mother, Peggy Ann, that he would always wear 97 to honor his brother, Timmy, who died after a bike accident. Timmy wore 97 while playing hockey at the Mite level. His brother, Kevin, is his freshman teammate this season.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Senior defenseman Matt Gilroy, who earned first-team All-America honors last season, was named to the Inside College Hockey Preseason All-America Third Team and the All-College Hockey News Preseason Second Team. Sophomore forward Colin Wilson earned a spot on the INCH Preseason Second Team, while freshman defenseman David Warsofsky was selected to the INCH Preseason All-Rookie Team.

WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcome 10 freshmen to their roster this season, including six forwards, two defenseman and two goaltenders. The class was ranked third in the country by Inside College Hockey and half of the class has been drafted by an NHL team. The 10-man group represents eight different states and Canadian provinces.

88TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 88th season of intercollegiate play and currently hold a 1351-777-128 (.627). BU's 1,351 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,589 wins - 88 seasons) and Michigan (1,467 wins - 87 seasons). The three geographically separated programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 18 national titles between them.

COACH PARKER NOTES

36th SEASON

Jack Parker is now in his 36th season and holds an overall record of 801-411-98 (.649). His 801 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution. He ranks second among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage.

VS. THE RIVER HAWKS

Parker has coached all of BU's 85 games against

the River Hawks, dating back to the 1983-84 season, posting a record of 60-17-8 (.753).

GOOD COMPANY

Head coach Jack Parker ranks second among active coaches with 801 career victories. Of the seven other active bench bosses with 400 or more career wins, BU has faced six of them (Jerry York, Boston College; Rick Comley, Michigan State; Red Berenson, Michigan; George Gwozdecky, Denver; Dick Umile, New Hampshire; Joe Marsh, St. Lawrence) this season.

GAME RECAPS

TERRIERS POST WEEKEND SWEEP VS. UNH

• BU earned its first home-and-home sweep of New Hampshire in eight years on Jan. 23-24, posting a 5-0 home shutout before earning a 3-1 road victory the following night.

• Colin Wilson tallied two goals and an assist and Kieran Millan made 22 saves to earn his second career shutout in the first game.

• It marked BU's first win over UNH at Agganis in seven tries, as the Wildcats were 4-0-2 in the building since its opening in January 2005.

• Wilson's linemates also had three-point nights, as Jason Lawrence tallied a goal and two assists and Chris Higgins had three helpers.

• The Terriers' all-freshman line of Corey Trivino (1g, 1a), Chris Connolly (2a) and Vinny Saponari (1g) also turned in a strong performance.

• On Saturday, Kevin Shattenkirk opened the scoring on a power play in the final minute of the first period and the goal held up until the third, when UNH tied the contest with 7:03 left in regulation when a pass went off the skate of Mike Sislo at the goalmouth.

• Just 25 seconds after the Wildcats' goal, Connolly sent home a cross-crease pass from Saponari for the eventual game-winner. Higgins added an empty-netter to cap the scoring.

• Millan turned in a standout 29-save performance and Colby Cohen added two assists for the Terriers.

• UNH went 0-for-14 on the power play during the weekend, including 0-for-8 on Friday.

POWER PLAY LIFTS TERRIERS PAST EAGLES

• After giving up a goal in the first minute of play, BU reeled off five unanswered goals, including four on the power play, to post a 5-2 home victory over No. 12 Boston College on Jan. 17.

• Five different players scored a goal for the Terriers, who earned five points (two wins, one tie) in their season series with the Eagles, marking their best showing against their arch-rival since the 1994-95 season, when they won all three contests.

• Colby Cohen recorded a goal and an assist for the Terriers, while David Warsofsky earned a career-high three assists. Matt Gilroy, Nick Bonino, Kevin Shattenkirk and Vinny Saponari all scored a goal. In all, 12 different BU players recorded at least one point.

- Senior Matt Gilroy, who scored the eventual game-winner against Denver, was named tournament MVP, and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by classmate Jason Lawrence (2 goals vs. RPI), freshman David Warsofsky (4 assists in the tournament) and freshman goaltender Kieran Millan, who recorded a career-best 33 saves against the Pioneers.

- It marked just the fourth time in the 17-year history of the tournament that Denver was not the champion, and just the second time the Pioneers had fallen in the championship game.

- Denver (13-6-2) came up empty on seven power-play chances, while Gilroy's goal came

on a man advantage and gave BU a 2-0 lead at 11:05 of the first.
