TONIGHT IN DURHAM

Boston University opens a home-and-home weekend with New Hampshire in a rematch of last year's NCAA Northeast Regional championship game.

SERIES HISTORY

- The Terriers and Wildcats have played 155 times since the 1924-25 season, and BU holds a decided advantage, 94-43-18 (.665).
- No team has had more success as an opponent at the Whittemore Center than BU, which holds an 9-6-5 (.575) record in the facility.
- In league play, the Terriers are 41-22-13 (.625).
- Twenty-nine meetings have gone into overtime, and the Terriers hold a slight edge, 8-6-15 (.534).
- BU has nine of the 15 shutouts in the series.

GO FIGURE

The road team in the BU/UNH series is 10-3-4 (.706) in league play since the start of the 2003-04 season (excluding UNH's 4-3 victory at Verizon Wireless Arena on 11/5/04).

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Despite its 3-6-2 record, New Hampshire has won three of its six Hockey East games and sits in a four-way tie for second place in the league standings. UNH is 2-1-2 at home and 1-5-0 on the road.
- The Wildcats split two games at No. 11 UMass last

weekend, earning a 4-2 victory on Saturday after the Minutemen won a 4-3 overtime contest on Friday after scoring an extra-attacker goal with 11 seconds left in regulation.

- Senior Bobby Butler, who was named the Hockey East Co-Player of the Week, leads the Wildcats in points (14) and goals (9). Defenseman Blake Kessel has had a strong start to his sophomore season with 12 points (3g, 9a) to rank tied for second in the country amongst blueliners in points per game (1.20). Senior Peter LeBlanc has added 11 points (4g, 7a).
- Senior goaltender Brian Foster has started all 11 games thus far and has posted an .878 save percentage and a 3.95 goals-against average.
- Only Harvard (4.40) is giving up more goals per game than New Hampshire (4.00) this season.

LAST MARCH IN MANCHESTER

- A power-play goal by Jason Lawrence with 14.4 seconds left in regulation lifted BU to its first Frozen Four in 12 years, as the Terriers edged New Hampshire, 2-1, in the NCAA Northeast Regional final on March 29 at Verizon Wireless Arena.
- Kieran Millan was outstanding for the Terriers, making a handful of standout stops in a 12-save first period and collecting 27 saves in the game.
- A UNH hooking penalty at 19:14 of the third allowed Lawrence to score the winner by taking a shot from the left of the crease that was headed wide,

but a UNH defenseman sprawled on the ice in an attempt to block the pass and knocked the puck into the goal.

- The Terriers got on the board first 13:43 into the game on a goal by freshman Corey Trivino, but the Wildcats recorded an equalizer just under six minutes into the second.

- The Wildcats had back-to-back breakaway chances near the 15-minute mark of third, first a 3-on-1 and then a 2-on-1, but Millan was up to the task both times, capped by a fantastic glove save.

LAST YEAR'S SEASON SERIES

- After UNH handed BU its first loss of the season in a tightly-contested 2-1 contest in Durham on Oct. 19, BU earned its first home-and-home sweep of New Hampshire in eight years on Jan. 23-24, posting a 5-0 home shutout before earning a 3-1 road victory the following night.

- The Terriers' 2-1 setback against UNH was the only time they lost last season when allowing three or fewer goals.

- The shutout victory marked BU's first win over UNH at Agganis in seven tries, as the Wildcats were 4-0-2 in the building since its opening in January 2005.

- UNH went 0-for-14 on the power play during the home-and-home weekend.

SHOTS AREN'T EVERYTHING

The Terriers are undefeated (9-0-1) in their last 10 games in which they have been out-shot. This streak dates back to Jan. 26, 2008, as UNH was the last team to top BU while recording more shots.

CONNOLLY HONORED

- After tallying four points and posting a plus-3 rating in BU's split with Merrimack, sophomore forward Chris Connolly was named the Hockey East Co-Player of the Week along with UNH's Bobby Butler on Monday.

- Connolly scored a career-high three points (2g, 1a) in Saturday's 6-4 home win over the Warriors. He also earned the primary assist on junior Kevin Shattenkirk's goal in the opening minute of play.

- Classmate David Warsofsky was named Hockey East Player of the Week on Nov. 2 after scoring two goals, including a shorthanded tally, in BU's 5-4 overtime victory at UMass Lowell. He added an assist in the loss to the UML and turned in a plus-4 rating for the weekend.

QUICK HITS

- With the 1-0 loss at Northeastern on Nov. 6, the Terriers were shut out in an opposing rink for the first time since March 12, 2004.

- The Terriers' 2-6 start was its worst through eight games since the 1998-99 season, when they went 1-6-1 to open the year.

- Last season, the Terriers were 5-0-0 when allowing exactly three goals. This season, BU is 0-4-0 when allowing an opponent to score three goals.

PRETTY MUCH A SURE THING

- BU is undefeated in the last 36 games when Nick Bonino has scored at least one point, posting a 33-0-3 mark during the span.

- The last time Bonino notched a point in a loss was Feb. 4, 2008, when he scored a goal

in the Beanpot semifinals against Boston College.

- In last year's national title season, BU went 24-0-3 in the games he tallied at least one point.

BU SPLITS SERIES WITH MERRIMACK

- BU split a home-and-home series with Merrimack last weekend, as each team won on its home ice. The Terriers saw their losing skid reach four games on Friday night in a 6-3 loss to the Warriors before posting a 6-4 victory at Agganis Arena on Saturday.
- On Friday in North Andover, freshman Wade Megan opened the scoring at 12:30 of the opening period with his first collegiate goal, but the Warriors scored five unanswered goals.
- Sophomore Vinny Saponari recorded a goal and an assist and classmate Corey Trivino potted his first goal of the season for BU, which scored all three of its goals on the power play.
- Merrimack, which remained a perfect 6-0 at home this season, was led by a two-goal effort from Brandon Brodhag.
- On Saturday, sophomore Chris Connolly tallied two goals and an assist for the Terriers, who jumped out to a 4-0 lead after the opening period.
- Sophomore goaltender Grant Rollheiser made his first start of the year after missing the first month with a high-ankle sprain and recorded a career-high 25 saves, including 12 in the third.
- Merrimack rallied to make it a 5-4 contest midway through the third but the Terriers held on to prevent the Warriors from winning consecutive games for the first time in the all-time series.

TERRIERS EDGED IN ORONO

- Boston University suffered its third consecutive one-goal defeat on Nov. 8, dropping a 3-2 road decision against Maine. It was the Terriers' first regular-season loss against the Black Bears since Jan. 22, 2005.
- Freshman Alex Chiasson and sophomore Chris Connolly each scored a goal for the Terriers, who held a 28-18 shot advantage for the game.
- Maine scored two early goals with the first one coming on a 5-on-3 advantage before Chiasson tallied his team-leading fourth goal of the season to cut the deficit to one before the end of the opening period.
- BU controlled the run of play for the vast majority of the second period but the Black Bears ended up scoring the lone goal of the stanza with what ended up being the game-winning tally.
- Connolly got the Terriers back within one on another power-play marker with just under seven minutes left in regulation, but Maine held on.

BU SUFFERS 1-0 LOSS AT NORTHEASTERN

- Despite a strong team effort throughout the game, Boston University dropped a 1-0 deci-

sion to Northeastern on Nov. 6 at a sold-out Matthews Arena.

- The Huskies, who got a 43-save performance from freshman goaltender Chris Rawlings, scored the game's lone goal with 7:29 left in regulation.
- The teams came up empty on the first 11 power plays of the contest until the Huskies cashed in on their sixth and final chance with the man advantage following a BU penalty at the 11:37 mark of the third. Junior Wade MacLeod knocked in a rebound for the game winner on assists from classmate Mike Hewkin and sophomore Alex Tuckerman.
- The Terriers were given a prime opportunity to knot the game late when Hewkin was whistled for a five-minute major and a game misconduct on a hitting from behind call with 4:09 left in the third. Rawlings, however, continued to thwart everything that came his way and he and the Husky defense held off 95 seconds of 6-on-4 play in the final minutes to hold on for the victory.
- BU, which was shut out in an opposing rink for the first time since March 12, 2004, held a 43-20 shot advantage for the contest, including a 19-6 margin in the second period.

TERRIERS SPLIT LOWELL WEEKEND

- BU split a home-and-home series with then-No. 8/9 UMass Lowell on Oct. 30-31.
- On Friday, Colby Cohen netted the game-winner with 1:06 remaining in overtime and David Warsofsky had his first career two-goal game to lead the Terriers to a 5-4 victory over the River Hawks at Tsongas Arena.
- Alex Chiasson opened the scoring in the second period with his third goal of the season, but Lowell tied it up soon after. Warsofsky potted a shorthanded goal to help the Terriers regain the lead only to watch the home team score twice before the stanza ended to take a 3-2 lead into the third.
- Zach Cohen squared the game at 3-3 and Warsofsky put the Terriers up 4-3 with 5:38 remaining on his second score of the night. Nick Schaus brought the score to 4-4 at the 4:13 mark to bring the game to overtime.
- At Agganis on Saturday, UMass Lowell never trailed and posted a 3-2 victory. Sophomore Vinny Saponari and junior captain Kevin Shattenkirk each netted their first goal of the season in the second period for BU.

TERRIERS TOP MICHIGAN WITH LATE GOAL

- After two third-period goals by the visitors evened the score at 2-2 with five minutes left in regulation, junior Joe Pereira took advantage of a miscue behind the Michigan net and tallied an unassisted goal at 17:29 of the third period to give BU an exciting 3-2 victory over No. 4/5 Michigan on Oct. 24 at Agganis Arena.
- Sophomore Kieran Millan matched his career high of 33 saves and made 19 saves in the

BU BLANKED BY NOTRE DAME

- BU was blanked, 3-0, by No. 9/10 Notre Dame in its home opener on Oct. 20.
- Notre Dame was led by Brad Phillips' 34-save performance in goal, as he and the Irish withstood every scoring opportunity by the Terriers, including a 17-shot barrage in the final stanza.
- Billy Maday, Ben Ryan and Calle Ridderwall each tallied a goal and an assist for Notre Dame. Maday and Ryan opened the scoring in the 16th minute of the second period with goals just 12 seconds apart. Ridderwall capped the scoring with a power-play tally at 2:53 of the third.
- The Terriers went 0-for-8 on the power play, while the Fighting Irish went 1-of-6 with the man advantage.

SHUTOUT STORY

- The Terriers went 99 consecutive games without being shut out before being blanked by Notre Dame on Oct. 20. It was the longest active streak in the country.
- BU had not been handed a shutout loss in 112 games (1-0, vs. BC, 12/2/06), as the last time it came up empty was a 0-0 draw with UMass Lowell on Feb. 2, 2007.

NON-CONFERENCE STREAK ENDS

- The Terriers' loss to Notre Dame on Oct. 20 was its first against a non-Hockey East team since Dartmouth on Jan. 15, 2008, which was a span of 10 straight wins.
- BU was the only team in the country to post a perfect non-conference record (9-0-0) during the 2008-09 regular season.

TERRIERS EDGED IN SEASON OPENER

- Despite a pair of goals by freshman Alex Chiasson in his collegiate debut, Boston University fell to Massachusetts, 3-2, in its season opener on Friday evening at Mullins Center.
- Junior Paul Dainton turned in a 39-save performance for the Minutemen, stopping the final 27 shots he faced on the night.
- UMass jumped out to an early 2-0 lead, but Chiasson got the Terriers within one with his first collegiate goal at the 13:17 mark of the first on BU's first power play of the season. Chiasson scored the only goal of the second to make it a 2-2 contest.
- Will Ortiz provided the game-winning goal for the Minutemen when he scored on an odd-man rush just under two minutes into the third.
- Sophomore netminder Kieran Millan had a strong effort between the pipes for the Terriers and made 23 saves.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Sophomore goaltender Kieran Millan suffered his first-ever loss away from Agganis Arena in the season opener at UMass. As a freshman, his record away from home was an incredible 16-0-1.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BU has not lost a conference game in overtime since Feb. 21, 2003, at Providence.

PRESEASON HONORS

Three Terriers - one at each position - were named to Inside College Hockey's 2009-10 Preseason All-America Second Team. Junior forward Nick Bonino, junior defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk and sophomore goaltender Kieran Millan were the only Hockey East players among the 18 selected to one of INCH's three preseason All-America squads.

SCORING LOAD

Although BU returns just one of its top six scorers from its national title season, all four of its players (Nick Bonino, Colby Cohen, Zach Cohen, Chris Connolly) who scored a goal in the national title game are back for the 2009-10 campaign.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

All three of BU's goaltenders from last season, including reigning national rookie of the year Kieran Millan. Millan had one of the best seasons by a freshman netminder in NCAA history, breaking a single-season school record with 29 victories as part of a remarkable 29-2-3 record. He also posted a 1.94 goals-against average to go along with a .921 save percentage.

BIG PLUSES

Juniors Nick Bonino and Kevin Shattenkirk finished first and second in the nation last season in plus/minus rating at +29 and +28, respectively.

OUR HOUSE

The Terriers went 16-4-2 at home last season and are now 26-7-2 in their last 35 contests at Agganis Arena. Since it opened in January 2005, BU has posted a 56-26-10 record in the building.

RED HOT RENEWAL

Following the sold-out success of the 2007 contest, Boston University and Cornell will once again take to the ice at Madison Square Garden for Red Hot Hockey on Nov. 28. The first Red Hot Hockey contest took place on Nov. 24, 2007, with the Terriers earning a 6-3 victory over the Big Red in front of 18,200 fans at MSG.

TERRIERS, EAGLES TO MEET AT FENWAY

The home of the Boston Red Sox will become the Hub's hockey haven in the first week of 2010, as Boston University will face archrival

Boston College on Jan. 8 at Fenway Park, just one week after the Boston Bruins take on the Philadelphia Flyers on the same sheet of ice for the NHL Winter Classic.

BU FAVORED TO REPEAT IN HOCKEY EAST

After winning both the Hockey East regular-season and tournament titles last season en route to its fifth national title and a school-record 35 wins, Boston University has been picked to repeat as league champions in 2009-10. The Terriers earned six first-place votes in the preseason coaches' poll to finish with 84 points. UMass Lowell (79) and Boston College (76) rounded out the top three and each received two first-place nods.

WEARING THE "C"

Junior defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk (New Rochelle, N.Y.) will serve as captain of the Terriers this season. He becomes the first junior to wear the "C" since Jack O'Callahan in 1977-78 and the first lone junior captain since Bob Smith during the 1961-62 season. Senior defenseman Eric Gryba (Saskatoon, Sask.) and junior forward Nick Bonino (Unionville, Conn.) will be assistant captains for this year's team.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

For the first time ever, more players on the Terriers' roster are from New York than Massachusetts. Three freshmen (Sean Escobedo, Wade Megan, Ben Rosen) are from the Empire State, joining sophomore Kevin Gilroy and junior Kevin Shattenkirk for a total of five. Just three players on this year's squad (Ross Gaudet, Andrew Glass, David Warsofsky) are from Massachusetts.

WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcomed seven freshmen to their roster this season, as four forwards and three defensemen join BU for its defense of the national title. The class was ranked sixth in the country by Inside College Hockey and four members of the group have been drafted by an NHL team.

NHL HOPEFULS

Fourteen of this year's Terriers have been chosen by a professional team in the National Hockey League Entry Draft. The 14 players were taken by 12 different clubs between

2006-09. Three of the them were selected by the Colorado Avalanche (Colby Cohen, Kieran Millan, Kevin Shattenkirk). Only Minnesota (20) and North Dakota (15) have more NHL draftees on their current roster.

PRO PIPELINE

- 13 former Terriers began the 2009-10 NHL season on one of the league's 30 rosters.
- Three players from last year's national championship squad have reached the NHL ranks, as Matt Gilroy earned a spot on the New York Rangers and Colin Wilson (Nashville) and Brandon Yip (Colorado) began the year on injured reserve for their respective clubs.
- The other 10 are Adrian Aucoin (Phoenix), Chris Bourque (Pittsburgh), Rick DiPietro (New York Islanders), Chris Drury (New York Rangers), Mike Grier (Buffalo), Freddy Meyer (New York Islanders), Jay Pandolfo (New Jersey), Tom Poti (Washington), Keith Tkachuk (St. Louis) and Ryan Whitney (Anaheim).
- Gilroy made his NHL debut on Oct. 2 against Pittsburgh, while Wilson played in his first NHL game on Oct. 12 against Edmonton. With Wilson's appearance, 59 former Terriers have now reached the NHL ranks.

89TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 89th season of inter-collegiate play and currently hold a 1368-784-131 (.629) record. BU's 1,368 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,597 wins - 90 seasons) and Michigan (1,480 wins - 89 seasons). The three geographically separated programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 19 national titles between them.

COACH PARKER NOTES

37th SEASON ON THE BU BENCH

Terrier head coach Jack Parker is now in his 37th season and holds an overall record of 819-420-101 (.649). His 819 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution, while he ranks second among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage.

VS. THE WILDCATS

- Parker has faced off against the Wildcats 116 times and holds a 64-36-16 (.621) record.
- The 64 wins mark the fourth-highest total he has had against any team. He has a personal-best 88 vs. Northeastern, 72 against Boston College and 65 against Providence.
- In league play, Parker holds a 41-22-13 (.625) record against UNH.
- Parker is 31-25-11 (.545) in the 67 games he has coached against Dick Umile.
